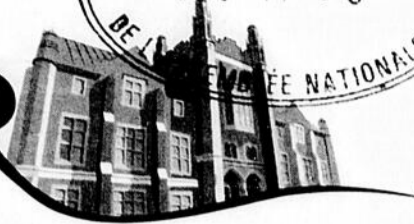

## Election 2009

# Mix of old and new form council

While most Montrealers were glued to their computers and televisions to watch the big showdown between Gerald Tremblay and Louise Harel on Sunday night, Westmount city hall was abuzz with activity as local officials and residents gathered to watch an unfolding drama of their own — the incoming results of Westmount's 2009 municipal election.

And when the dust finally settled after nearly an hour of computerized updates projected onto a big screen, three of the four incumbent councillors had retained their seats and a few new faces were added to the eight-member council.

Mayor Peter Trent's council now consists of Patrick Martin (Dist. 1), Tim Price (Dist. 2), Victor Drury (Dist. 3), Kathleen Duncan

(Dist. 4), Gary Ikeman (Dist. 5), Nicole Forbes (Dist. 6), Cynthia Lulham (Dist. 7) and Theodora Samiotis (Dist. 8).

In the only instance of an incumbent councillor losing his seat, John de Castell was defeated by Samiotis by a margin of only 24 votes. When the final results of that district were projected, a disappointed de Castell was among the first to congratulate his clearly delighted opponent.

Notable races also occurred in District 2, where 20-year-old Philip Cutler — grandson of former mayor May Cutler — came within just 43 votes of victory, and in District 7, where Mavis Young and incumbent Lulham were running neck-and-neck right up to the final poll count.

But perhaps the most closely watched competition of all took place in the heavily

contested District 5, where four candidates sought the seat vacated by former councillor George Bowser. This was the last district to report results, and the anticipation in the city council chamber built up for more than an hour before the numbers flashed on the screen — showing that the vote between main contenders Georges Hébert and Gary Ikeman had been split by the other two candidates, Douglas Leahey and René Pelletier.

Among those in attendance to watch the incoming results were Director General Duncan Campbell, former city councillors Margaret Lefebvre, David Laidley and Peter Duffield, as well as former Westmount Municipal Association presidents Doug McDougall and Stanley Baker.

The new city council is scheduled to hold

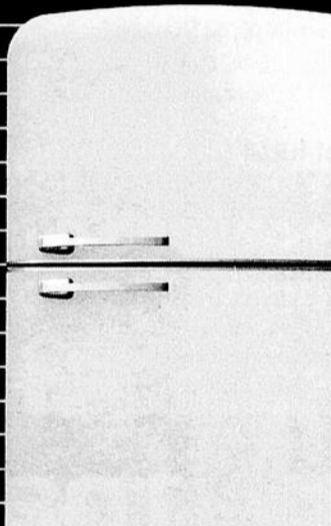

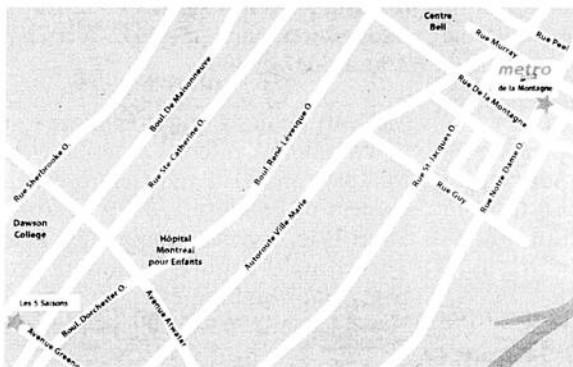

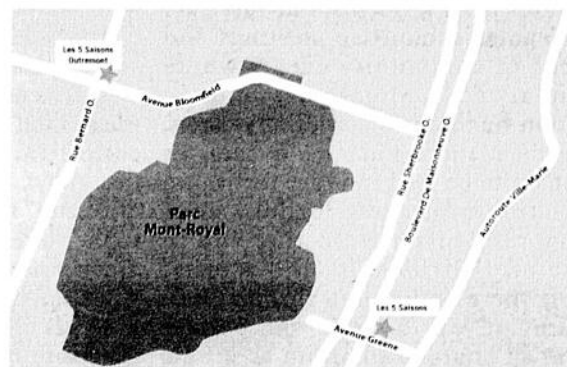

## Council life is no picnic

**D**uring my opening remarks at the Oct. 19 Meet the Candidates evening in Victoria Hall, I collectively praised all of the city council candidates, not only for their courage in crowding onto the stage for two intense hours of debate under hot lights at uncomfortably close quarters, but also for the very fact that they had offered to serve their community in the first place.

My back was to the stage at the time, so I don't know if any of the non-incumbent candidates squirmed a bit when I reminded the audience that anyone offering to represent their community on city council is willing to give up a considerable amount of their privacy and leisure time, and that we should be grateful to them all for putting themselves forward to undertake what is too often a thankless job.

I only had about 30 seconds or so to make my point, which bears repeating here in a bit more detail now that the new council is in place. Being elected to a municipal council involves a serious four-year commitment, and anyone who has ever won a seat at the council table is sure to tell you that with the glory and respect comes great responsibility. Not only are there the monthly public meetings where you vote on motions, pass bylaws and answer questions from residents, but there are also regular committee meetings and dozens of community events where attendance is obligatory — not to mention hundreds of pages of reports, recommendations and other documents that have to be read in order for you to make the informed decisions your fellow residents are trusting you to make on their behalf. And then of course there is that one chronic malcontent in your district who phones you at all hours to complain about the most ridiculous problems that require your immediate attention.

And with the controversial — and at times downright volatile — arena/pool project hanging over Westmount like some massive storm cloud, Mayor Trent and the new city councillors certainly have their work cut out for them. For this we owe them our sincere thanks, as they are sure to be giving a lot of themselves over the next four years in order to serve their constituents.



## Countertenor Meyer awes Rotarians

**O**kay I will admit it. As a dyed-in-the-wool rocker, I know very little about classical music. But countertenor Mikah Meyer's presentation to the Rotary Club of Westmount last week was so excellent that I had to write about it.

For those like me who do not know, the Wikipedia encyclopaedia defines a countertenor as "a male singing voice whose vocal range is equivalent to that of a contralto, mezzo-soprano, or (less frequently) a soprano, usually through use of falsetto." In other words he compared it to the voice of Michael Jackson or Jason Timberlake.

At 23, Meyer is a young man who not only has a striking voice but is also an articulate speaker. He gave an excellent presentation of the history of the coun-

tertenor and shared his career goal is to have a regular gig with the Cirque du Soleil and to establish and teach at an institute for countertenor studies that would answer the question how the countertenor came to be. He also refuted the myth that countertenors have been castrated to give them the voice but rather that any man has the voice within him if it is developed.

Meyer is an Ambassadorial Scholar with Rotary and is working on his Masters at McGill University. After much anticipation, Meyer delighted his audience with a singing the American anthem acappella just as he had done at a game for his home team the Memphis Tigers. That I could understand. He encored with a portion of the George Frederic Handel opera Agrippina.

A documentary that began life as a Humanities project at St. George's School last year premiered last week in a high profile venue — as part of the Holocaust Education Series at Cinéma-thèque québécoise.

'Life in an Open Prison,' a video documentary about the Cambodian Genocide, was produced by Megan Webster's Grade 11 Humanities class. It made student-led learning a reality as participants oversaw all aspects of production: research, shooting, interviewing and editing.

The Oral History Association described

'Life in an Open Prison' as "exemplary in integrating life stories in a Secondary classroom setting," and recognized Webster by presenting her with the 2009 Martha Ross Teaching Award.

"In doing so, they demonstrated teamwork, cooperation and great intellectual curiosity. But what they really got out of the experience was a deeply personal understanding of the Cambodian Genocide, in ways that no lectures or textbooks could ever match."
