Students set stage for Shakespeare's Twelfth Night

Senior drama students at Bishop's University have been working hard this week (and have even given up their Spring Break) to prepare for their biggest production of the year — William Shakespeare's Twelfth Night.

"I chose Twelfth Night because I think it's the greatest romantic comedy ever written — it's timeless," said the play's director and Bishop's professor George Rideout. "That, and one doesn't get to see a lot of Shakespeare in the area."

Composed by Shakespeare in either 1600 or 1601 as the last of his three mature comedies (the other two being *Much Ado About Nothing* and *As You Like It*), the play has many of the elements common to Elizabethan romantic comedy, including the devices of mistaken identity, separated twins, and gender-crossing disguise, and its plot revolves around overcoming obstacles to "true" love.

The impressive group of 27 is not only responsible for memorizing lines. Students are also required to build a great set, and make spectacular costumes.

"This way, they are covering every aspect of a production. As for the acting, seven roles have been doubled, to give more students the opportunity to play a lead role," explained Rideout. "This means we alternate between two casts, but when students aren't playing lead roles, they're extras — so everyone is still on stage every night. Each cast is equally strong."

Third-year student Ivana Stojanovic, one of the actresses who plays lead role Viola, said it was a great idea given the size of the class.

"I see what Anne Brown (who also plays Viola) is doing and I learn from and feed off of that," said Stojanovic. "It's very neat, because sometimes I think 'I'll try what she's doing,' or 'I think what I do now works better for me.'"

Jeremy Freed, one of the actors who plays Malvolio, said it's a rare opportunity to get perspective on one's character.

"It's not often you get to see the play you're in; let-alone someone playing your part," said Freed. "I think it's useful to be able to explore our roles."

Some of the young actors said the most challenging part was developing into their characters.

"You have the words and you have the actions to a certain extent, but creating that person is an experience in itself," said Freed.

Added Stojanovic: "My character is pretending to be a guy most of the time, so I had to research how to pick up the right amount of masculinity. Transferring today's masculinity into Victorian masculinity is not easy, not knowing what it was like back then."

Students working on the production side also face their own challenges.

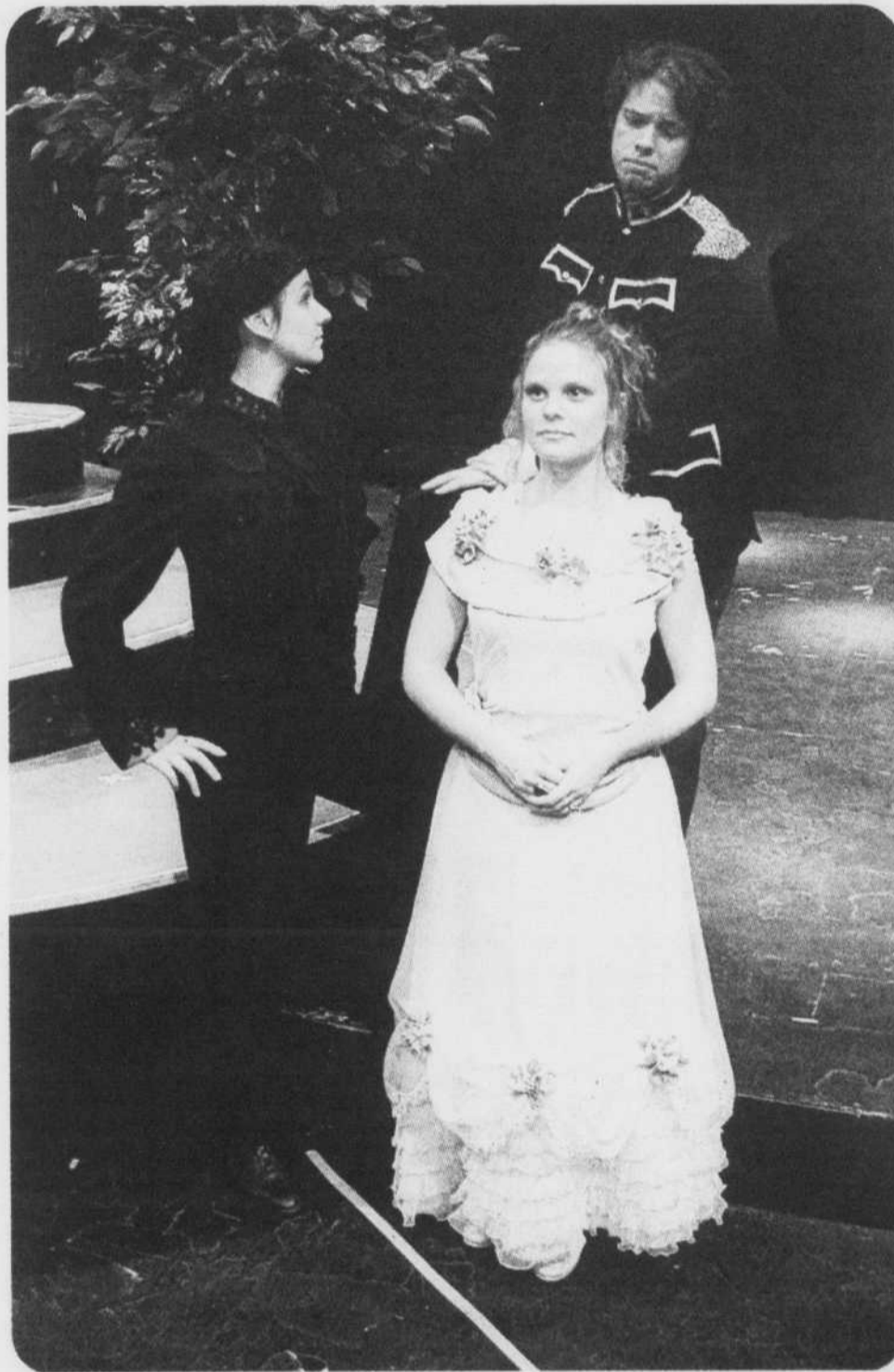
"My job is to make sure everything was organized," said stage manager Cat MacKeigan. "With the help of two assistant stage managers, our endless list includes taking down blocking notes, prop set-up, and letting one cast know what the other is doing at all times. It's stressful, but absolutely worth it. It gives me a lot of foresight in stage managing itself, which is what I want to pursue professionally."

Even if you're not into Shakespeare, participants are confident the play will be a hit with all who see it.

"One of the storylines is pretty hilarious, which peaks most people's interest," said Stojanovic. "You have the Duke chasing Olivia, and then Olivia chasing Cesario — who is actually a girl; and then Cesario chasing the Duke. It's a perfect love triangle."

"It's also a very visual event," said Rideout. "There's dancing, sword fights, and we have a costume team that rivals that of professional theatre. This is a must-see."

Simple, yet satisfying entrees

In the summer, when produce is ripe and rich with flavour, you don't need to do much to make a great meal. Fresh corn on the cob, just-picked peas, new potatoes with butter or juicy ripe tomatoes — any of these will make a sensational supper with grilled meat or fish.

Not so at this time of year. Root vegetables are fine, but hardly exciting. This is the time to add some soul-satisfying sauces to your main courses.

Here are two simple-to-make main courses that are immensely satisfying because of their savoury sauces. A bonus is that these sauces will fill your home with wonderful, rich aromas of simmering stock and herbs or sauteed leeks with white wine.

Then take the humble potato, boil it and mash it, and serve some of the sauce over top. It's enough to make you like the cosy evenings of winter.

While the sauces are hearty, they are not overly rich.

The Normandy Chicken, from Foodland Ontario, is made flavourful by the use of fresh herbs, mushrooms and Calvados or brandy, but it's thickened only by a little cornstarch.

The pork tenderloin recipe, from Epicurious.com, is a little more rich, with creme fraiche or sour cream, but at least one website user said she substituted yogurt and that worked well too.

I tried out both recipes on guests and both were big hits.

PORK MEDALLIONS WITH

MUSTARD-CHIVE SAUCE

Serves six

Preparation time: about 30 minutes
2 tablespoons (25 mL) butter, divided
2 tablespoons (25 mL) olive oil, divided
2 cups chopped leeks (white and pale

green parts only; about two medium)
1 cup (250 mL) low-salt chicken broth
1/2 cup (125 mL) dry white wine
2 garlic cloves, minced
1/2 cup creme fraiche or sour cream
3 tablespoons whole-grain Dijon mustard
Two one-pound (500 g) pork tenderloins, each cut crosswise into 6 slices
2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives
1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

Directions: Melt 1 tablespoon (15 mL) butter with 1 tablespoon (15 mL) oil in large skillet over medium-high heat. Add leeks and cook until beginning to turn golden, stirring frequently, about five minutes. Stir in broth, wine and

garlic. Boil until mixture is reduced to 2/3 cups (375 mL), about four minutes.

Whisk in creme fraiche and mustard; set aside. (Sauce can be made two hours ahead. Let stand at room temperature.)

Melt 1 tablespoon (15 mL) butter with 1 tablespoon (15 mL) oil in another large skillet over medium-high heat. Sprinkle pork with salt and pepper. Saute until browned and cooked, about five minutes per side. Transfer pork to platter. Add sauce to skillet; simmer sauce over medium heat until slightly thickened, scraping up any browned bits, about two minutes. Stir in chopped chives and tarragon. Season with salt and pepper. Return pork to skillet. Cook over medium heat just until rewarmed, stirring frequently, about one minute. Transfer to

platter, sprinkle with parsley, and serve.

NORMANDY CHICKEN

Serves four

Preparation time: about 40 minutes
2 teaspoons (10 mL) vegetable oil, divided

8 ounces (200 g) cremini (brown) mushrooms, sliced
1 small onion, sliced
1 clove garlic, minced
4 boneless chicken breasts
3/4 cup (175 mL) chicken stock
3/4 cup apple cider or apple juice
1/4 cup Calvados or brandy (optional)
1 tablespoon (15 mL) chopped fresh thyme (or 1 teaspoon/5 mL dried)
1 teaspoon (5 mL) chopped fresh or dried rosemary
1/2 teaspoon (2 mL) salt
1/4 cup (50 mL) water
1 tablespoon (15 mL) cornstarch

Directions: In large nonstick skillet, heat 1 teaspoon (5 mL) of the oil over medium heat. Add mushrooms, onion and garlic; cook, stirring often, five minutes, or until softened. Remove and set aside.

Heat remaining oil in skillet. Add chicken breasts; cook until golden brown, about five minutes. Return mushroom-onion-garlic mixture to pan, along with chicken stock, apple cider or juice, Calvados or brandy, thyme, rosemary and salt. Bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer, turning chicken several times, for 12 to 14 minutes, or until chicken is no longer pink inside. Transfer chicken to platter; tent with foil.

Increase heat to high, boil liquid until reduced by half, three to five minutes. Whisk water with cornstarch; whisk into liquid and cook over low heat until sauce is thickened. Spoon over chicken.

Warm up on chilly days with roasted squash

We still have a few chilly days ahead, so why not make soul-satisfying meals that include the earthy, naturally sweet flavour of roasted squash?

Butternut squash has a rich, buttery taste, and roasting it intensifies and sweetens its flavour, making it the perfect ingredient for Gingered Squash and Carrot Soup. You can easily double the payoff for time invested in making this soup (though the oven does most of the work, it still takes about 1 1/2 hours) by stashing a portion away in the freezer

for another weekday meal.

GINGERED SQUASH AND CARROT SOUP

Serves 8

3 pounds (1.5 kg) butternut squash
1 pound (500 g) carrots
2 medium onions
2 tablespoons (30 mL) olive oil
5 unpeeled garlic cloves
6 cups (1.5 L) chicken broth
1 1/2 teaspoons minced fresh ginger
1/4 teaspoon (1 mL) grated nutmeg
1/4 cup (50 mL) fresh orange juice
Salt and pepper
1/2 cup (125 mL) light sour cream
Chopped fresh parsley

Directions: Slice the butternut squash in half lengthwise; seed, peel and cut into four-centimetre pieces, filling nine cups (2.25 L). Peel carrots and cut into four-cm pieces, filling three cups (750 mL). Peel onions, leaving root end intact; cut each into six wedges.

In large bowl, combine squash, carrots and onions. Add oil and toss to coat. With slotted spoon, remove vegetables from bowl and place on a large greased rimmed baking sheet in a single layer. Wrap unpeeled garlic cloves tightly in piece of foil. Place on baking sheet with vegetables. Roast at 375 F (190 C) for about 60 minutes or until tender, turn-

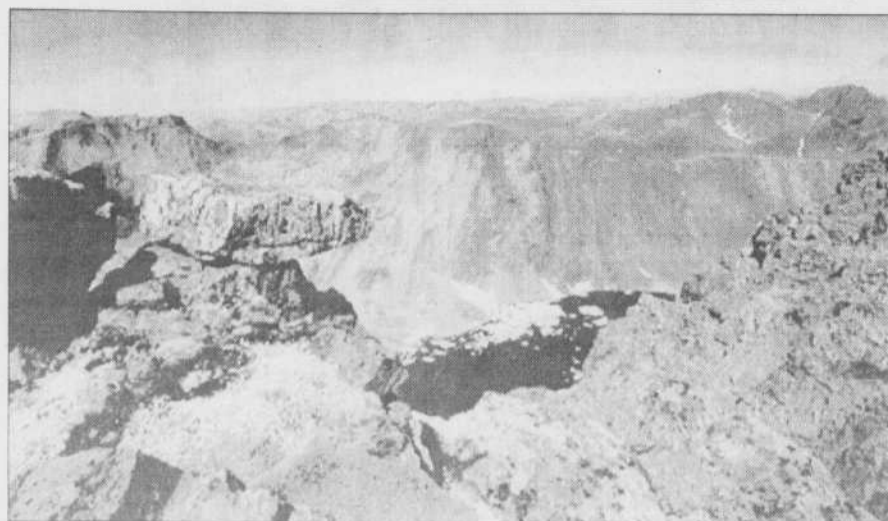
ing vegetables halfway through roasting time.

Squeeze garlic cloves out of their papery skins. Puree roasted vegetables and garlic in blender in batches, adding enough broth to each batch to keep the blade from clogging. Transfer puree to large pot. Add remaining broth, ginger and nutmeg; bring to a simmer, stirring frequently. (If you prefer a thinner soup, add more broth.) Add orange juice, and salt and pepper to taste.

Garnish each serving with 1 tablespoon (15 mL) sour cream. Sprinkle with parsley.

Trews honoured again at indie music awards

The Trews' disc, *House of Ill Fame*, continues to rake in awards, nearly two years after it was released.

The latest came Wednesday night at the fifth annual Canadian Independent Music Awards, when the muscular riff-rock of the Nova Scotia band's full-length debut was named favourite album during a party at the Phoenix Concert Theatre.

The soldout event marked the start of Canadian Music Week, the music industry's annual five-day conference and festival.

The Trews' meat-and-potatoes rock emerged victorious out of a field of critics' favourites, including Feist's *Let It Die* and the Sadies' *Favourite Colours*. Other contenders were Sum 41's *Chuck and controller.controller's History*.

The Trews, recently named group of the year in the East Coast Music Awards, are also up for a Juno Award for single of the year for their song 'Not Ready To Go.'

But Wednesday night, the Trews lost the favourite single award to Thornley, the rock act fronted by Ian Thornley, for his song 'So Far, So Good.'

And they weren't even a contender for favourite group, which went to Win-

nipeg's the Waking Eyes, a surprise win considering the deafening buzz of fellow nominees Alexisonfire and the Arcade Fire.

Another surprise was Randy Bachman's nod as favourite jazz artist, a vote of confidence for the Guess Who/B.T.O. guitarist's jazz tribute disc *Jazz Thing*. To no one's surprise, Alberta's best-selling country singer, Paul Brandt, was selected as favourite country artist.

The favourite blues artist award went to teenager Jimmy Bowskill and his band, beating out Ottawa's JW-Jones Band, Hot Toddy, Jim Byrnes and John & the Sisters. Another young act, Great Lake Swimmers, was awarded the Galaxie Rising Stars Award of the CBC.

Meanwhile, Metric earned the indie award for favourite pop artist or group, sweeping away competition from its friends in Stars, not to mention MIR, Maren Ord and Gordie Sampson.

The hard-hitting duo Death From Above 1979 won for best rock artist/group, while soulful Canadian Idol finalist Gary Beals snatched the favourite urban artist/group away from the likes of Ray Robinson, the Sweatshop Union and Dead Celebrity Status.

In the Realms a disturbing and surreal doc

In 1973, an elfin recluse named Henry Darger died in a poor house in Chicago. He was 81 years old, and he had worked as a janitor most of his life.

When they looked in the rented room where he had previously lived for 40 years, they found what he had been doing for all that time, unknown to anyone.

Bereft of family, friends, radio or television, Darger had produced hundreds of watercolour paintings and a 15,000-page novel entitled *In The Realms of the Unreal*.

The book told a fantasy story that was as different as you could imagine from Henry Darger's life, but you don't have to be Sigmund Freud to see the connections. *In The Realms of the Unreal* was an epic about seven little girls — he called them the Vivian girls — who were abused by the evil Glandelinian empire, and who led a child slave rebellion decorated with Christian imagery.

On their side was a leader named Col. Darger (later promoted to General) who could not stand seeing children

being mistreated. The leader of the Glandelinians, for what it's worth, was named John Manley.

Henry also left a memoir in which he told of a sad life: He was raised in an orphanage but expelled for making "funny noises" with his mouth and throat. He was sent to the Illinois Asylum for Feeble-Minded Children, although Henry claimed, "I knew more than the whole shebang in that place."

The children were forced to work on a farm from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. with a half-hour break for lunch. Henry ran away and walked 175 miles back to Chicago, where he wound up in a Catholic home that made him sorry he had fled the asylum.

Darger's novel is both childlike and wounded, a psychological salve that was the product of a disturbed but creative mind. The pictures that illustrated it are more disturbing.

The depiction of little girls is done in a clip-art style reminiscent of old department store catalogues, early school readers, or ancient Coppertone ads, drawings of curly-haired innocents that

Henry traced or copied or pasted onto the page.

The girls are often naked, and have penises, which is probably due to Henry's sexual naivete. In some scenes they are being crucified, torn open, tied naked to trees in winter, or being choked. The combination of innocence and horror is nightmarish.

The drawings became an example of so-called "outsider art," an untrained style that made Darger famous for a while. Now director Jessica Yu — who won an Oscar for her 1997 documentary *Breathing Lessons* about the writer Mark O'Brien, who was confined to 40 years to an iron lung — has made a film that tries to explain the lonely existence and flowering fantasy life behind the book and the pictures.

In the Realms of the Unreal succeeds only fitfully in making Darger's work occupy a more important space than his cloistered room.

The documentary has a dreamlike tone that partly comes from having the child actress Dakota Fanning read from the novel, her unformed persona lend-

ing an air of creepy sweetness to what is already a borderline fascination.

Darger's pictures are compelling in their directness: Little girls whose images should be used to sell sweater sets or teach the alphabet involved in a religious war that is taking place under the surface of the artist's consciousness.

It's postmodernism that is nonetheless meant sincerely, although you can't escape the feeling that you're looking at the diaries of a schizophrenic. (Darger also had a 10-year project to catalogue each day's weather and compare it to the forecast, looking for meteorological hubris, perhaps.)

Yu talks to a few people who knew Henry, and adds visual interest by animating some of his drawings, or placing them on top of old newsreels of Chicago, so that the Vivian girls can be seen riding in the skies above the city while a 1950s voice talks about skyscrapers and transportation.

It's surreal packaging for an odd and very sad story, one that remains just out of the edges of our understanding.

Five questions with David Elias

Q & A

David Elias is another one of the vast number of Eastern Townships artists/composers who can trace their history in music back to their childhood days.

As a young boy, Elias was surrounded by music and accomplished performers such as his father, Raymond, a well-known artist from the Sherbrooke area. While his father's instruments of choice were the piano and bass, Elias chose the saxophone and work as a lyricist and arranger as a means of expressing his musical talent.

Elias is often seen combining his talents with others such as Mike Goudreau, Fred Farrugia, Richard Bergeron and groups such as Octane and Daze in various venues in Sherbrooke, Montreal, the Laurentians and New Brunswick.

THE RECORD: Who were your early influences in music?

ELIAS: "I feel very privileged to have been exposed to the incredible talent that lies in this area. Many talented musicians either worked with my father (member of Big Ben) or were associated with him. It was a great inspiration that soon got me hooked, increasing my appreciation for jazz and the original big band sound. My grandfather was also a composer. When he passed away, we found work that he had left unfinished as well as many of the pieces he used to often play — years and years of research."

"Since then, I have been working to complete some of these. Many of the finished ones are very rare today — they are the original works used by many of the big bands during that era."

THE RECORD: How do instruments play an important part in what you do as an arranger?

ELIAS: "When it has been decided what the actual composition will be, it is then important to choose the right instruments to create the colour that

we want to hear. For example, the last song on Mike Goudreau's Christmas CD was best created with a background of the piano, and two violin-cellos. A violin-cello is more subtle while a sax tenor comes off soft. An open trumpet has a much different sound than one that is covered, which creates a muted jazzy effect. A piano has a very warm sound that seems to cradle you as you listen."

THE RECORD: "What do you like about the big band style?"

ELIAS: "The big band sound is much stricter. You must read and try to understand what the composer was thinking when he wrote the piece. The musicians are usually grouped according to their sound so if even one musi-

cian tries to add his own twist to the piece, it will be very apparent and will spoil the performance for everyone. Your performance is much more confining than that of someone who plays jazz. The very essence of the music and the liberties that you may take with the original composition is what makes the jazz sound so appealing, both to the musician and the listener."

"It is the excitement of the instant creation — something that can never be duplicated. While the music is very different, I personally enjoy both sounds."

THE RECORD: What did you experience while on a tour of France a few years ago?

ELIAS: "I was very impressed by the experience. We performed 12 shows in

28 days. We toured the whole of France — never staying in the same place. I noticed that here in North America the music is more straight — swing, chill, rock, blues and jazz — while in Europe the music is more techno. The people really tripped when we played jazz or pop numbers. They couldn't get enough."

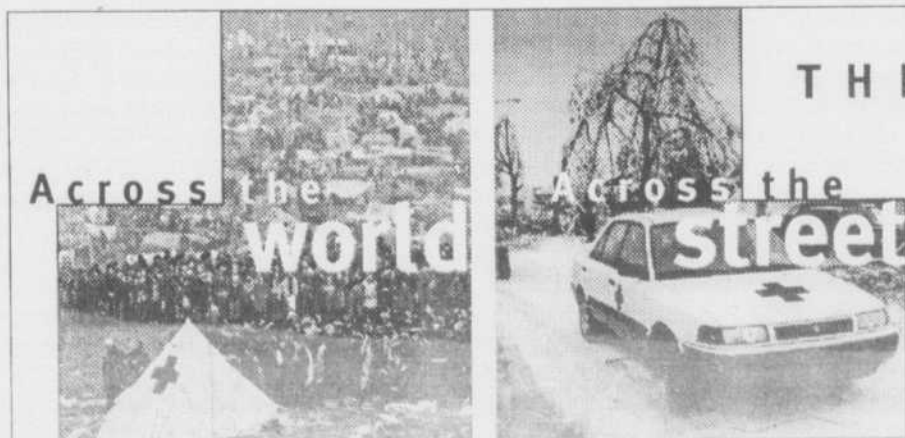
"In Canada, musicians are well-received and respected for what we do. We seem to be more open culturally, more willing to try new things — maybe the fact that Europe is so much bigger makes this more difficult there."

THE RECORD: What have you been working on lately?

ELIAS: "I have been performing with a Sherbrooke group called Octane whose style is more rock/jazz. I play the pedal-guitar and the sax. I like to explore all avenues of music like when I worked with an all-instrumental band with Michel Ouellet — playing traditional Cuban music. I'm not sure that I should say too much about my new project — don't want to jinx it."

"I will say that it is helping and composing for a project involving a rock singer in this area. The one thing that is very special to me is that I am now enjoying performing with my father in a four-man ensemble, every Saturday evening at Burrough's Falls. We are joined by talented Richard Bergeron on drums who recently came back on the scene after several months performing on a cruise line and Fred Farrugia who has played with such greats as Ginette Reno and Nana Mouskouri."

"Everyone in the audience is in a good mood, after finishing a delicious roast beef meal, and is ready for an evening of melo jazz and social dancing. We play from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. so folks who don't like to party late anymore can still go out and enjoy themselves."

Brody balancing post-Oscar career

There is one picture of Adrien Brody that seems to say it all. It's a portrait by his mother, art photographer and Village Voice shooter Sylvia Plachy, taken before Brody became the youngest man to win the best actor Oscar and subsequently rose to the upper rungs of Hollywood's A-list.

Framed by empty white walls on either side, the photograph shows Brody spliced in two by his reflection in a mirror. Standing slightly to one side as he peers around an open door, the mirror captures his head and only part of his body, giving one the impression he's a two-headed creature with three eyes, giving himself a confident sideways glance.

The image suggests self-awareness, but not vanity. He is not studying his reflection, only acknowledging its seemingly random presence.

It's hard to forget that image when you see Brody in person, because everything about the Queens-born actor communicates two-headedness: a psychic schism between personal and public personae.

Sitting in a private booth at a Park City restaurant as his co-star Keira Knightley entertains cameras across the room, Brody's body language is all knots. He curls into his designer's version of a military surplus winter coat, looking around the room with furtive glances.

It seems a bit strange until you remember it's celebrity weekend at the Sundance Film Festival. Brody is here with his new film, a John Maybury (*Love is the Devil*) thriller called *The Jacket*, a psychological horror story centred on a Gulf War veteran who is sentenced to time in a mental ward — where he is forced to wear a straight jacket that seems to give him the ability to move through time.

The Jacket opens in select Canadian markets Friday and will appeal to the high school scream crowd as well as established Brody fans. After winning an Academy Award for *The Pianist*, Brody's decision to star in a gimmicky horror reel might seem like a step in the wrong direction — until you realize his co-stars in the film include Knightley, Kris Kristofferson, Daniel Craig, Kelly Lynch and Jennifer Jason Leigh.

"I make decisions based on who I am and the kind of roles I feel I can connect with, because once you show up, you have a responsibility to be connected to the individual you are playing.

"Obviously, certain performances are easier or more difficult based on the subject matter and the dramatic focus, but I think I am drawn to characters like

Jack in *The Jacket*. He represents a lot of people who are powerless."

Brody looks over his shoulder at the door, now cluttered by publicists talking on cellphones.

"I like the characters who are overwhelmed by forces greater than themselves, beyond their control, it's how we all live."

Yes. Even Academy Award-winning actors must face the same mortal challenges. Brody says he may have gained more control over his career now that he has more choices, but every other element of his life feels more chaotic.

"I don't have enough time. I try to control as much as I can — but a lot of what you deal with isn't really controllable. At least I'm at the point now that if I make a mistake, it will run its course and hopefully, I can continue to find great roles after that. So much of what I deal with right now is just a matter of finding a balance," he says.

"I want to balance my career with interesting choices, different characters. I want to find balance in my life with work and personal space. (The Oscar) really changed the way I can exist. In so many ways it's great because I don't have to chase things I would have had to chase before, but it restricts life itself. I have to be prepared to be out there, and when people approach me with a question or a comment about my work, it's a huge honour, but it's also draining. Anonymity apparently only has value to those who've lost it — but it's something to be cherished."

Brody has finally stopped scoping the room. His glance gently rests on his hands, the table and the reporter's notepad.

"I've worked very hard to get noticed, and when the world recognizes that work, it's an incredible feeling of validation. It's a huge high, but those are feelings one should always be wary of. In general, I'm an open and sociable person. But I'm also a very private person and I've always felt comfortable being alone and socializing on my own."

Brody says growing up in a mostly black neighbourhood meant he was constantly aware of being an outsider, but he always worked hard to find acceptance in the group.

"I had to take four trains to get to school. I had to get out there, and I met people from all walks of life. There's something incredibly affirming — personally — about meeting different kinds of people because you realize the richness of the human experience and you begin to feel connected to a much larger world that even has room for you. I think having that in my life has really shaped who I am, and certainly my ap-

proach to life, more than anything else — even my parents," he says.

"My parents taught me to love, but it was really only through engaging in the bigger world that their very specific love translated into tolerance and a broad world view. When you're in the entertainment industry, there are many ways to pull out and be in your own world, but it's important to be humbled by 'normal life.'

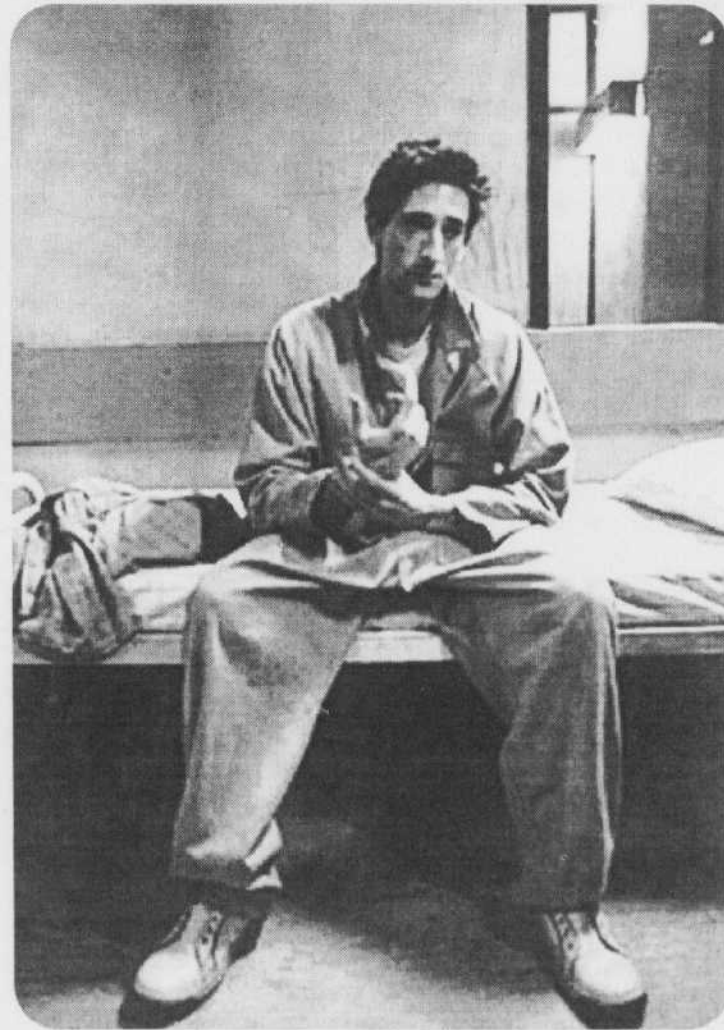
"When I want that connection, I put my motorcycle helmet on, or a hoodie at night, and I can find that again. It's not easy, but it's not worth complaining about. I'm an incredibly lucky person."

Brody didn't always feel so lucky. When he first tried to break into the business, his different look led him to bit parts and character roles — from a juvenile delinquent in Steven Soderbergh's *King of the Hill* to outsider punk in *Summer of Sam*. He thought his big break would be Terrence Malick's *Thin Red Line*, but was disheartened when he discovered his role had been cut drastically in the edit.

"I think disappointment can be a good thing because it makes you really treasure the successes. None of this comes easy, and just being a working actor is a gift. My parents taught me to love myself regardless, and that kind of support is so important because it gives you the confidence to take risks."

Acting is all risk, but Brody finds a way to make it look easy. Behind every character, he finds a human being. You can see it in his eyes. They communicate a sweet, gentle sorrow normally associated with saintly icons and Pietas.

Just being an artist in America is a complicated ordeal these days, says Brody. He says the movie industry has never been into social criticism, but it's

even less so now, which is why he was happy to take on *The Jacket* as a veiled piece of commentary.

"I think there are going to be a lot more lost men like Jack once our soldiers come home. We're just starting to see the long-term emotional damage of the Gulf War, and the war in Iraq will be no different. There are people out there who have witnessed incredibly painful things, and they will try to reintegrate into society — but they will bring the weight of those experiences with them," he says.

"We will feel them, which is why I think this movie is incredibly relevant for young people because they aren't just the ones fighting the war, they will have to deal with the long term effects of what's happening right now. We will have a different reality. As a New Yorker, I already live in that different world sometimes it's just surreal to think about the time before the WTC," he says, giving me a saintly look.

"There's a break between those two worlds — and I think this movie hints at that fractured reality."

MacInnis searches for Aliens of the Deep

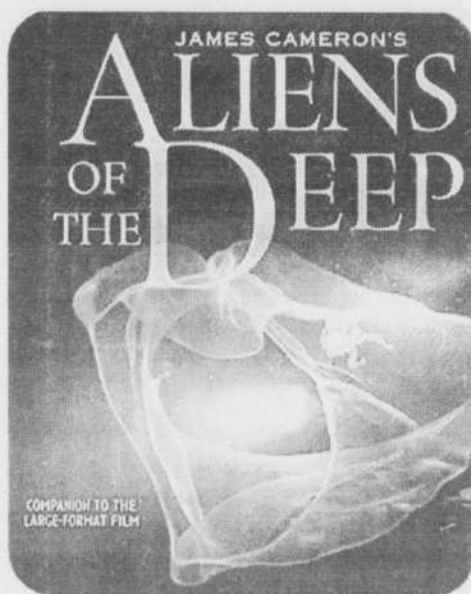
Dr. Joe MacInnis may be unknown to the majority of his countrymen, but in the closed circle of ocean exploration he is one of the revered. A physician, environmentalist and recipient of the Order of Canada, the Toronto resident has ventured into the deep in some of the most spectacular vehicles ever built, with adventurers like Jacques Cousteau and Robert Ballard, discoverer of the Titanic.

In eight books to date, he describes feats that include becoming the first Canadian to view the doomed ocean liner up close, crafting Canada's first federal oceans policy. If there is still a Maple Leaf flag frozen directly beneath the North Pole, it's because MacInnis, the first human to dive in polar seas, planted it there in 1974.

His latest book is James Cameron's *Aliens of the Deep*, a companion volume to the new documentary by the director, a good friend. The book hit stores Jan. 25, but the movie, which opened throughout the United States on Jan. 28, won't be coming to Canada anytime soon.

Although it was made using Canada's own IMAX 3-D technology and directed by an Oscar-winning Canadian, its distributor, Disney's Buena Vista Pictures Inc., doesn't plan to release it here until at least mid-summer or fall.

That doesn't surprise MacInnis, who



laments the tendency to understate Canada's prodigious record of achievement in plumbing the uncharted deep.

"We are a country roughly the size population-wise of California, and yet we make a disproportionately large contribution in some areas," he said. "It's about getting the job done."

The association with Cameron began coincidentally, decades ago, when on a high school trip to the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto the future Oscar winner became captivated by a four-windowed, converted railway container parked on the museum's front lawn.

It was Sublimnos, one of two experimental submerged air-filled stations where divers could live and work, which MacInnis designed during the 1960s and 1970s. (The other, Sub-Igloo, the world's first polar dive station, is now a popular tourist attraction at Disney's Epcot Center, in Florida.)

The teenaged Cameron, with his brother, decided to build a small scale replica of Sublimnos. They put a mouse inside and dropped it into a creek behind their home, outside of Niagara Falls, Ont. The mouse survived.

Cameron told MacInnis the experience inspired him to create the eerie-looking habitat featured in his 1989 thriller *The Abyss*, about a deep-ocean military salvage operation gone wrong.

Since winning Hollywood's highest honours for *Titanic* in 1998, Cameron

has turned his attention to making non-fiction dramas about the sea.

From an expedition to the wreck of the Second World War German battleship *Bismarck* in the North Atlantic, which screened in 2002, to the following year's *Ghosts of the Abyss*, which revisited the *Titanic* site, he has logged a total of four major undersea expeditions, including 41 deep-submersible dives.

During much of this time, MacInnis has been along for the ride, as a dive physician and scribe.

MacInnis and Cameron spent eight weeks diving in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans while making the \$14-million US *Aliens*, and will team up again in February, when Cameron begins planning a new ocean-themed film that will be shot this July.

Montgomery wins non-fiction prize

Vancouver journalist Charles Montgomery won the \$25,000 Charles Taylor Prize for Literary Non-Fiction on Monday for his first book, *The Last Heathen: Encounters With Ghosts and Ancestors in Melanesia* (Douglas & McIntyre).

The prize, currently in its fourth year, commemorates the late journalist and writer Charles Taylor and is given to the author — either a Canadian or resident of Canada — whose work comprises the best style, perceptiveness and command of the English language in the non-fiction genre.

An award-winning freelance writer, photographer and self-declared "habitual wanderer," Montgomery was shocked at his win over fellow nominees Paul William Roberts, Christopher Dewdney and Patrick Lane.

"Well, I just lost \$100 because I was betting it would be Paul Roberts," he joked after accepting his cheque and crystal statuette at a luncheon at the Windsor Arms Hotel in downtown Toronto.

In *The Last Heathen*, Montgomery recounts his adventures in the South Pacific where, in 1892, his great-grandfather had travelled on a mission to rescue islanders from black magic and cannibalism.

In retracing his predecessor's steps, Montgomery meets preachers, sorcerers and armed rebels and learns of the culture's true beliefs regarding ghosts, ancestor worship, shark gods and more. It is part travelogue, part history lesson and part self-discovery.

"We spoke about all of the books at length, but *The Last Heathen* kept coming to the surface," said jury member Jan Walter of Montgomery's latest work.

"It's exotic, seductive and mesmerizing, it covers terrain out of the ordinary. We loved the narrative arc it had and the way the writer, himself, is transformed by the end. It's extraordinary, especially for his first book."

Walter and her two fellow judges — the award-winning poet Robert Kroetsch and the popular children's writer and critic Bill New — met this past Sunday and debated for more than

two hours about which author should take the prize. Last month, they narrowed the search down to four contenders from a record number of 96 submissions from 28 publishers.

"I believe in creative non-fiction, in narrative journalism," continued Montgomery in his speech. "I'm part of a gang of emerging young writers in Vancouver — we believe that, in telling stories that are true to us, non-fiction writers can achieve what fiction writers can: We can draw characters, have narratives with a beginning, middle and end, but most of all we can speak essential truths."

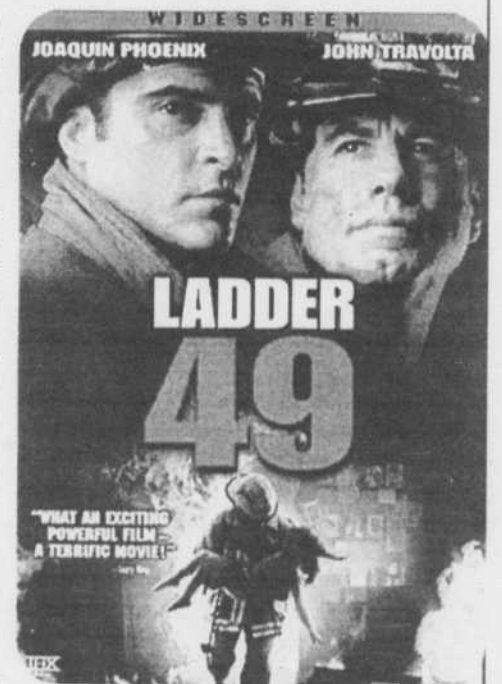
Ladder 49: John Travolta and Joaquin Phoenix star in this earnestly underwhelming firefighter epic that tries so hard, it incinerates itself in the process.

Williams keeps falling apart in Robots

The first thing Robin Williams notices when he sits down with reporters is the assortment of tape recorders in front of him. It sets him off immediately.

"This is like a history of recorders," he quips. Then he spots a nifty new product from Apple. "Oooh! Somebody's got swag." He lapses into an imitation of Apple head honcho Steve Jobs, "Hi, I'm Steve Jobs. Thanks for buying this."

Ever restless, Williams pounces on another topic — the colourful shirt adorning one Los Angeles journalist, recently back from a Pacific honeymoon.

Williams is amiably uncharitable about the garment, and then turns the discussion back on himself.

"Did I attack you?" he asks the journalist. "Yes. Was that unnecessary? Yes. Am I wearing a T-shirt that I shouldn't wear at my age? Yes. Do I have arm warmers on my hands? Yes. Am I wearing a watch that looks a little gay? Yes. Does that make any difference? No." For the record, the watch has an orange wristband.

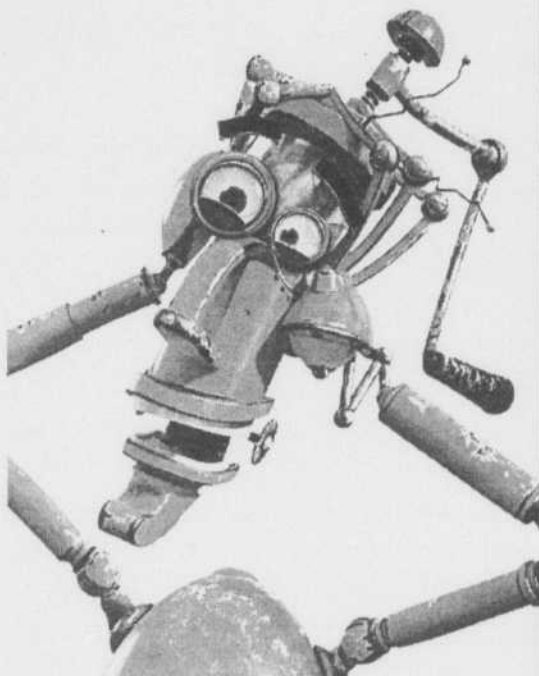
He's here to talk about his return to the world of animation March 11 in *Robots*, in which he supplies the voice for a guy named Fender — a wise-cracking robotic creation who is constantly falling apart, on various occasions losing his arms, legs and eventually his head.

The screenwriters didn't even bother giving him dialogue: As was the case for his famous foray as the Genie in Disney's 1992 *Aladdin*, Williams was simply encouraged to cut loose with his own impromptu comic riffs. Then the best was kept for the actual film, provided it was suitable for family viewing.

"Kind of like looking through shit for gold," he says candidly, "but they basically say, 'Okay, try this,' and then we adjust knowing that, Number One, this is for kids and you don't want them to go through puberty during the movie."

Williams did start with certain information — storyline and early artist's impressions of what the awkward Fender looked like — and then took it from there.

"Two years ago, they showed me a

drawing. I saw the drawing and realized he was part coffee pot, and I went: 'I'm in. Pull my crank, baby. The fact that he's falling apart — you can start to play with that. That gives you the idea of where you can go with it.'

At one clankingly memorable moment, Fender breaks into a jaunty song-and-dance takeoff on 'Singing In The Rain' — renamed on this occasion as 'Singing In The Oil.'

As he cuts loose for the media this morning, the 53-year-old actor sometimes lapses into R-rated chatter as well. Reminded that at one point in the movie, Fender almost loses a vital part, just like Janet Jackson at the Super Bowl, Williams is right off the mark.

"Oh, lose a nipple? We, she's metal too. When that thing popped out, it was not a tit, it was a door knocker." Then he adds: "What's offensive about that? Every other TV ad's for Viagra."

Williams, political and social satirist, also shows his sardonic face this morn-

ing. As he did at the Oscars he comes to the defence of cartoon character SpongeBob Squarepants who has recently been targeted by the anti-gay right.

"I don't know any gay men who wear square pants. Cuffed, yes. Secondly, I asked a gay friend: 'Would you be SpongeBob?' He said: 'No, I'd rather be the starfish — more hands.'

"If you think of all the great animated characters who could be gay," Williams muses, "I would say Chip and Dale. They live in a tree. They have nuts."

He also loves some of the "great outrageous transvestite characters" in the world of animation. Like Cruella in *101 Dalmations*. "If that's not Barbara Bush, we're close."

Although a Fox release, *Robots* is a product of Blue Sky, the innovative computer animation company also responsible for *Ice Age*. Williams says he's had a good relationship so far with both the creative people at Blue Sky and the corporate people at Fox, whereas he had a

major blow-up with Disney when the studio used his vocal performance as the Genie in *Aladdin* for merchandising purposes.

"The Fox corporate entities have been good so far, but we'll have to see. There's the long term, the other part of the equation, the merchandising, the selling of stuff. I'll make a movie but it's how you sell it. They own the character, the physical character, but it's my voice. I don't want to sell stuff. That's been a kind of no fly zone, and that's why we had the falling out and then the reconciliation and then the falling out again. I just want to make films. I don't want to sell burgers — even if they offered millions of dollars."

All of which is a cue for him to comment on Disney's corporate style by resurrecting one of his favourite Mickey Mouse jokes.

"Mickey has only three fingers because he can't pick up a cheque."

Wright will be a star thanks to new album

Music

C hely Wright is an award-winning artist who has scored quite a few hits. Despite her immense talent, the singer/songwriter hasn't reached the status of superstar yet.

With the release of her brand new album she might be on the road to the top. Metropolitan Hotel is a wonderful collection of highly personal songs, most of them penned or co-penned by the singer.

Wright went through a lot of struggle in order to release the new album. First, she left MCA Records when her previous album failed commercially and went Vivaton Records in 2004.

Before her first single, 'Back Of The Bottom Drawer', could reach the peak on country music charts, Wright and the new label parted ways because of creative differences.

Wright then decided to release, herself, a personal song called 'Bumper Of My S.U.V.' With hardly any promotional support and no big label behind the new song, it still climbed the country charts.

That got her a recording contract with Dualtone Records. This is how Metropolitan Hotel came to life.

The first song on the album is the Katrina Elam-penned number 'It's The Song', which tells the story of how a singer becomes a star. This is a well written song and suits Wright's style very well.

Songs such as 'The River' and 'Between a Mother and a Child' are deeply personal. Wright wrote them a while back, more as a therapy for herself, than with the intention of using them one day on a record.

'The River' is the sad and haunting true story taken from Wright's teenage years. There's a lot of tenderness found in the rendition. Vince Gill handles the harmonies with his beautiful tenor.

'Between a Mother and a Child' is all about the emotions and scars left when a child lives through a divorce. You can hear the woman revisiting her childhood, when she sings "You want me to just agree/With everything you say/Call my dad the bad guy/Make him pay and pay and pay/It's really not my business/It never was or it never will be/But I

know nobody's perfect/But the fault is not mine."

With most of the songs penned from Wright's life experiences, the album offers raw honesty, and shows her more vulnerable side. It also showcases her ability as a songwriter.

The previously released 'Back Of The Bottom Drawer' is included on this new album and this time around maybe it will make it to the top of the charts.

There's also the cover of an old Chuck Berry hit, 'C'est La Vie' also recorded by EmmyLou Harris many years ago. Wright sings 'C'est La Vie' with such ease, it is easy to figure out that she has been singing that one since she was a child.

This record also offers great instrumentation but not once does it get in the way of Wright's beautiful voice. Of course, there are many more ballads than up-tempo material but somehow it comes as easy listening music where the lyrics take all the importance.

'I Got Him Ready For You' is the story of a breakup, which could be very sad but it's not the case. Instead, the girl (the one who's left alone) takes pride in telling the other woman that it is because of her teachings that he is now much better.

'Just The Way We Do It' is a love song with a nice groove while 'Your Shirt' has a melody made especially for Wright's voice.

It is evident that this album was not recorded for commercial success, although many of the tracks are radio friendly. We also realize that Wright had the freedom to write songs that had a deep meaning to her. Sometimes the lack of obligation can trigger greater creativity and artistry.

Looking at Canadian design from the '60s

It was 1967, Canada's centennial. Crowds flocked to the World's Fair in Montreal. Moshe Safdie, a talented young architect, created a stir with Habitat, a breathtaking housing complex that gave Canada a brilliant foothold in the design world.

Habitat, still standing on the St. Lawrence River, spreads its tentacles high and wide. Some 150 boxy concrete apartments — each with its own terrace — press into the sky, looking much like the ancient adobe and stone cliff dwellings of Colorado's Mesa Verde National Park.

Canadian designers outfitted 12 of Habitat's original suites. Thirty-eight years later, some of those fixtures form part of a striking exhibit at the Canadian Museum of Civilization.

The show, Cool '60s Design, which

continues until Nov. 27, includes some 150 objects of Canadian craft and design, 1960s-style. The sounds of the Guess Who and Leonard Cohen form the soundtrack for the display, while videos play images of the Alouette satellite and lessons in social department for women. It's a spring tonic for any flower child: Contempra telephones come in nine hues, plastic meets macrame.

"Some people think of the 1960s in terms of hippies, the ecologically concerned and craft-oriented," says Alan Elder, the exhibit's curator. "Other people think of the decade as being filled with plastic globes and plexiglass. Another group thinks of the Scandinavian influence on design."

Exhibit items come from various sources, including the Confederation Centre in Charlottetown, Toronto's Design Exchange, the Museum of Civiliza-

tion's permanent inventory, plus private collections like that of designer Hugh Hamilton.

In the 1960s, John Tyson convinced Bell Northern Research the company needed an industrial designer.

"I was the first one there," Tyson says from his Barrhaven home. During his 35-year stay, he created the Contempra telephone, a unique phone that could be used on a desk or mounted on a wall. Some 25 or 30 million phones, engineered at Bell Northern, were manufactured in London, Ont., and Nashville until the late 1980s and exported around the world. Available in vivid colours, the telephone became a fashion accessory, says Elder.

It was then that people thought Canada had arrived and could take on the world, he recalls.

Why stage a '60s design exhibit now at

the Museum of Civilization? According to Elder, this show is one of several with a '60s theme at Canadian sister museums.

"One of the things is: We hadn't looked at the 1960s. I think we had felt that the 1960s was now far enough behind us that we could start taking a look at it with a little bit more perspective."

At the moment, Montreal's Canadian Centre for Architecture is staging The Sixties: Montreal Thinks Big. Think Place des Arts, Habitat and Place Ville Marie for starters. Last year the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts presented Global Village: The '60s, an exhibit that explored cultural trends in various fields including art, fashion and design.

Currently, both the Canadian Museum of Contemporary Photography and the National Gallery of Canada are staging exhibits with a '60s theme until April 24.
