SUMMARY OF NEWS.

DOMINION

Digby County, Nova Scotia, has adopted the Canada Temperance Act by a large majority.

The training ship to be sent out by the Imperial Government is to be stationed at St. John's, N. B.

Great dissatisfaction is felt in Lincoln and Welland Counties at the slow progress made in the new Welland Canal.

The inquiry into the charges against the Sheriff of Carlton County, Ont., still continues. The Commissioners are now taking evidence.

On Sunday the remains of Charles Osborne, a single man about 40 years of age, were found in the water near the shore of the lake near Burlington, Ont.

An empty whiskey jug was found by his side. He, no doubt, perished from cold while intoxicated.

UNITED STATES

The Chief of the American Marine Bureau discredits the report that the Arctic steamer "Jeannette," which is missing, was lost.

The Post-office Department of the United States has issued an order for the stoppage of all registered letters from the United States addressed to J. Goldsmith & Co., St. Stephens, New Brunswick.

GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND

Mr. Forster told a press representative in Dublin yesterday that the Government would protect the men sent to Fotherly Boycott's residence.

The 25th Regiment, now at Devonport, has just received orders to embark for the Curragh on a date not yet fixed. This is not a relief as they were to be sent to the Curragh on the 10th of October.

The Liverpool Emigration returns for the month of October show that 14,000 emigrants left the United Kingdom during the month, chiefly for the United States and Canada.

Large tracts of land are again flooded in Sussex and Surrey. Some of the streams and rivers have overflowed, and low-lying lands on both sides of the Mid-Sussex railway are inundated.

Delegates representing 50,000 miners assembled at Pontyfrid, South Wales, yesterday, and resolved to take a conference of all the trades to take action in reference to the tariff question.

The United States Gazette says the Duke of Cambridge, as Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Artillery, has approved of a regimental memorial being erected by the officers and men of the 1st and 2nd regiments of the Artillery in Afghanistan and South Africa.

The Government of New Zealand has decided to take steps to fortify the principal sea ports, as a protection against a naval attack, and the Home Government has been requested to contribute to the cost of the fortifications.

A mass-meeting of men engaged in the iron ship-building of the Clyde was held in Glasgow, on Saturday, to discuss the wages question. It was argued that the Clyde workmen were better paid than those in London, Liverpool, Hull, Newcastle, Sunderland and elsewhere.

The meeting was held in the presence of the employers and an advance of 10 per cent. on the present rate of wages. It was stated that several employers are favourable to a rise.

Vessels that have recently arrived after crossing the Atlantic have encountered very heavy seas, and in some cases, with many disasters have occurred. A large quantity of wreckage and several boats have been washed ashore in the last few days.

A vessel, and another passed a ship floating bottom upwards, while other vessels report having received damage amounting to partial disablement. During the homeward passage of the White Star steamer "Celtic" a heavy sea was encountered, and the vessel was damaged.

The King of Greece will shortly issue a martial order to his army, and afterwards to his fleet.

American Missionaries are sheltering and feeding 50 Mohammedan and Christian fugitives in the Mission building at Urumbia, Persia.

There are still some small parties of insurgents roving about Cuba. On the 5th instant, a party led by the insurgent chief Nanez, was defeated in the jurisdiction of Ciego Viejas, and some of them surrendered with their arms and ammunition.

The Republican party in Italy has shown very aggressive recently under the stimulus of Garibaldi's proclamation, and his more moderate leaders among whom are Aurelio Saffi, are in favour of a military and legal action exclusively, the programme of the extreme is "No king on earth or in heaven!"

OBSCURITY IN THE CIVIL SERVICE

Our morning contemporary takes us to task for the remarks which we made, on our issue of Saturday, regarding the relations between the civil service, the High, and Government contractors. It is evident that the warmth exhibited by the Gazette on this occasion is a mere piece of affectation; and is every reason to believe that our article—which the Gazette is kind enough to reproduce—reflects more correctly the views of the editor than the piece of feeble and unlaboured prose of the Gazette, which is an apology for Mr. Chaplain and the Government.

We did not charge, as is asserted, that the whole Civil Service was corrupt because of the recent exposures. On the contrary, we gave it as our opinion that the majority of the Ottawa Departmental officials were capable and trustworthy men. It is true, nevertheless, that, for many months past, all tenders called for by the Public Works Department have passed through the hands of an official who has admitted being employed, at \$30 a month, by Mr. Mowbray, to furnish information regarding contracts. An official admitted a contract for lock-gates on the Ottawa Canal, under very peculiar, and to say the least, suspicious circumstances. So much for the Civil Service, and what we have given are only "specimen bricks." If the Government is disposed to give up the idea of a "specimen-gate" of Chaplain, while more hardened sinners still go unpunished. Mackintosh, the hero of the Printing Job, and the Whitehead fraud, still stalks in the smile of the Ministry; and remains the chief exponent of Conservative policy in Canada. Not a word of condemnation have we seen from either the Civil Service or Mackintosh. Is not the patronizing manner in which the Ministry treat Mackintosh sufficient encouragement to others, who have the opportunity, to go and do "likewise"? There was, also, another official mixed up in the Printing Scandal, who, we believe, is still retained in the public service. We should like to hear our contemporary's views on the \$100,000 Underclerk bonus, which transaction, that eminent and unbiased Jurist, Judge Clarke, has attempted to excuse. All these things are but the outcroppings of the rotten and corrupt system by which contracts are let under the present Conservative regime. Consistent papers which have dared to honestly criticize the doings of Mackintosh, Chaplain & Co. have been promptly checked by a withdrawal of patronage. What stronger evidence can be adduced that the Government is practically run in the interest of contract-breakers, and men of ill stamp.

GROWTH OF MORMONISM

The Mormons of Utah appear to be putting forth vigorous efforts to secure converts, and are sending out missionaries in all directions. It was these efforts, probably, which attracted the attention of Messrs. Moody and Sankey, and induced them to undertake a revival in Salt Lake.

A despatch from that city states that the Evangelists attracted crowded meetings, and made a strong impression on the disciples of the late Prophet Wm. Moody. Mr. Sankey left on Monday for San Francisco, against the wishes of many who thought they should remain and endeavour to convert the Mormons. That Mormonism is constantly growing from immigration is an undoubted fact. England, Scotland, Germany, Norway, Sweden, Italy, Russia and Holland, as well as the Eastern States of the Union, all contribute to swell the population of Salt Lake City and of all other places in Utah where Mormonism most flourishes.

What is Mormonism? Nothing but polygamy raised into a pseudo-religion. It tends to the destruction of all other religions, for it is their faith, for it gratifies the wandering passions of the man, and makes the woman, instead of a helpmeet for him, the unwilling instrument of his desires.
