Skaggs has airplane marriage problems

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Sometimes country music star Ricky Skaggs has to fly halfway across the United States to be with his wife.

Skaggs and his wife, Sharon White, have separate music careers. She, her sister, Cheryl, and their father, Buck, are The Whites, a country music trio known for their lilting harmony.

Skaggs and White are separated nearly every weekend. In the summer, the separations can be two or three weeks at a time.

"Thank God for Ma Bell," the 33-year-old Skaggs said in an interview. "It's not uncommon for us to talk two hours on the phone."

On Memorial Day, Skaggs decided the telephone was not intimate enough. He jumped on an airplane in Nashville and flew unannounced to Huntington, W. Va., to be with his 33-year-old wife at one of her performances.

Their separate careers, however, recently united when they released a duet, *Love Can't Ever Get Better Than This*. The song was in the Top 10 of the country music charts in mid-July.

STAYS SOLID

"People expected this for a long time," said Skaggs, whose solo hits include *Country Boy*, *Heartbroke*, *Uncle Pen* and *Cajun Moon*.

"We waited until it felt right and we found the right song," he said. "This was the ideal song and obviously the people thought so, too." Because they have independent and successful careers, more work together is unlikely. So this means additional time apart.

Skaggs is often asked how he and White manage to keep their marriage together. "We make it

work," he said.

"This business will eat you up," White said.

When traveling separately, they keep a list of each other's hotel reservations, the concert venue and even the phone number of the concert promoter. They talk by phone almost every day. They've hired an older couple to take care of Molly when they are out of town.

"They're like a member of the family," Skaggs said. "They are like another set of grandparents for her. She's really close to them, but she knows who her real grandparents are."

SPENDS HOURS

Even during their time together, their careers are usually the main topic of conversation.

"When we go to eat, we end up talking about music the whole time," White said.

"It's just us. We have music in common," said Skaggs who received the prestigious entertainer of the year award in 1985 by the Country Music Association.

A year ago, 7-year-old Andrew Skaggs, Skaggs' son by a previous marriage, was shot while riding in his mother's car on Interstate 81 near Troutville, Va. A truck driver, sentenced to 40 years in the case, said he was in a daze from drugs and lack of sleep.

Andrew has required extensive medical treatment for the .38-caliber bullet that penetrated his upper lip and lodged in his neck.

"He's recovering and he's doing well in a lot of ways," his father said.

"He forgave the man before anyone else did," White said. "He didn't want the man to go to prison."

Dirty comedian has other art

MONTREAL (CP) — Blair MacLean and his brother Gary make their living by talking dirty.

Their humor is so raw, smutty and raunchy that the Ontario Liquor Control Board once threatened to revoke the licence of any club that booked them.

But the feisty Cape Breton natives, who believe there is no room for censorship in art, fought back.

They challenged the liquor board in court, winning an injunction and a \$25,000 settlement.

"But that took us five years and cost us \$50,000," explained Blair. "So we had to go out and keep committing the crime to pay for the lawyers."

As well as being a first-rate comedian, Blair is also a "painter" who specializes in what he calls "grain art."

MacLean, his wife Anne MacLean, and Bob Boyson, a long-time friend and commercial artist, spend hundreds of hours gluing thousands of grain seeds on to boards, plexiglass and plywood.

"Basically, we take the seeds and arrange them from white to black, and that becomes our palette," said MacLean.

The seeds are then glued down, with careful attention being paid to the textures.

TEDIOUS TASK

MacLean acknowledges that the work is tedious. He figures that it takes 100,000 seeds and 600 hours of work to produce paintings which sell for up to \$8,000.

"It's done one seed at a time with your ordinary Bondfast glue," he explained without a trace of humor.

There are peculiar hazards to the technique. Twice, mice ate off the face of one figure when one of the works was at the framing shop.

"They only ate the best grain. Once was funny, but twice was too much. We told the framer to get rid of the mice or we would take our business elsewhere."

Another time, some of the seeds that had already been glued, began to sprout.

How did a foul-mouthed guy from Glace Bay end up doing

seed paintings of Prairie scenes and paintings by 19th century French masters?

MacLean says he liked drawing as a child and learned more by hanging around a commercial artist on a Canadian Forces base.

It was only four years ago, however, as he was recovering from a major heart operation, that MacLean began the grain paintings.

At the time, the Canadian Wheat Board commissioned Boyson to come up with an appropriate gift to thank the Soviet Union for buying an extra large shipment of wheat. MacLean was called in to collaborate, and their art form was born.

That first painting now hangs in the Soviet agriculture ministry in Moscow, MacLean said proudly.

MacLean takes the art form seriously.

"Laughs are ephemeral. They don't last long, sort of like drugs. This is permanent. It is our chance to leave our permanent mark."

Collins involved in ugly divorce

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Dynasty star Joan Collins testified Tuesday that she resisted marrying former Swedish rock musician Peter Holm until he agreed after 18 months of bickering to sign a pre-nuptial agreement.

"I've never met a man yet who was able to take care of me," said Collins, 54, in explaining why she wanted the agreement before marrying Holm, 40.

Despite assurances by Holm that he would remain in love with her forever, the actress said, "I have seen in the past that men have a tendency to change."

Collins, who entered a downtown

courtroom flanked by four bodyguards, took the witness stand in the first day of testimony in the divorce trial to end her 13-month marriage to Holm.

The actress darted through the courthouse hallway under a blaze of television lights and the flash of cameras, followed by her lawyer, Marvin Mitchelson.

Because she and Holm were allowed into the courtroom before reporters, none witnessed the court-ordered search for weapons that both parties underwent before proceedings began.

Holms and Collins are involved in a bitter divorce in which Holm is

seeking \$80,000 US a month to sustain what he called his accustomed style of life, pending final settlement.

The divorce trial, expected to last three days, will decide the validity of the pre-nuptial agreement.

PACT BINDING?

Holm's lawyer, Frank Steinschriber, maintains the document was simply an informal one, compensating Holm while the couple was married. Mitchelson insists it is a binding pre-nuptial agreement limiting any claims by Holm.

In his opening remarks, Mitchelson portrayed Holm as a penniless failed entrepreneur who was well paid before and during the couple's 13-month marriage.

"He got \$1.3 million in cold, hard cash and \$700,000 in expenses," Mitchelson said. "He took the benefits of the agreement. This is what he bargained for."

But Steinschriber said the one-page agreement was only a "continuance of this informal relationship."

"It had nothing to do with community property," Holm's lawyer said.

The actress said Holm initially wanted 50 per cent of her gross income from the Dynasty show and her Gemini Star Productions. But Collins thought 10 per cent to 15 per cent was adequate.

"He thought it was unfair," she said. "Since I was making \$3 million to \$5 million a year, I thought 10 per cent or 15 per cent was fair. I wanted to be absolutely certain this would be upheld. I didn't want any nastiness or viciousness in court. He knew for two years how strongly I felt about a pre-nuptial agreement."



Reiner does not always have to be top banana...

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Carl Reiner is a performer of rare comedic talent willing to subordinate his own ego to enhance the work of others.

He has played second banana to Sid Caesar (Your Show of Shows) and Mel Brooks (The 2,000-Year-Old Man). He created and occasionally appeared in the classic TV comedy series, The Dick Van Dyke Show.

More recently, Reiner has written and/or directed films for such comics as Van Dyke (The Comic), George Burns (Oh, God!), Steve Martin (The Jerk, All of Me) and John Candy (Summer Rental).

Reiner's new film is Summer School, a high school farce starring Mark Harmon.

Reiner has a brief role in Summer School as an English teacher who quits when he wins a lottery. He often makes Hitchcock-like cameos in his films, and that's enough for him.

Reiner didn't always play second banana.

"I was an actor before I went into the army," he recalls. "But they couldn't find plays for me, so I started getting up in rec halls, and I was the main comedian. Then I got into Maurice Evans' entertainment outfit, and I went overseas as the top comedian.

"After the war I was a top banana in Call Me Mister, a Broadway revue about people coming back from the service. Then I slowly slipped from top bananaship.

"My next show was Inside USA,

in which I understudied Jack Haley. After a couple more shows in which I was a ...top banana, I met Sid Caesar."

STARTS AT 16

Reiner was born in the Bronx 64 years ago and started work at 16 as a machinist's helper. He took drama lessons at night. His first job was singing second tenor in a tour of The Merry Widow. His experiences in a summer theatre in Rochester, N.Y., later produced a novel, Enter Laughing, which provided his debut as a film director in 1957.

Between 1953 and 1967, Reiner collected 11 Emmys for his work on Your Show of Shows and The Dick Van Dyke Show. Today his public performances are largely limited to the cameos in his own films.

Does he miss the laughter and the applause?

"I still have my moments. For instance, for Summer School, I did 10-minute television satellite interviews — 45 of them in two days. Each one is a performance. I have to get charged up for them.

"And I also get my kicks by emceeding dinners and benefits here in town. They scare me because I don't prepare for them. I work without a net.

"I'm also beginning to feel like a top banana. There has been enough input from the world that says, 'Hey, you did OK.'

"For instance, recently the Museum of Broadcasting had a showing of the original Dick Van Dyke pilot, which was called Head of the Family, and the first episode of The Dick Van Dyke Show.

AUDIENCE GOES CRAZY

"I didn't want to go because I

thought, 'Who wants to pay \$6 to see this old stuff?' But when I came out, the audience went crazy. They really were nuts. I never got a reaction like that in my life.

"Most actors have a lack of self-esteem, even though they look like they've got a lot of it. Yes, I enjoy hearing the applause."

But he also enjoys providing others with applause.

Next, he will guide the Tony award-winning musical comedy star Robert Lindsay of Broadway's Me and My Girl. After seeing the show, Reiner was inspired to write a script for Lindsay titled Bert Rigby, You're a Fool, which he will film for Lorimar.

Said Reiner: "Robert Lindsay is the single most impressive talent I have seen since — well, since Sid Caesar."

The movie Summer School is playing at the Carrefour.

The Cosby Show survives battle

NEW YORK (AP)—A U.S. federal judge has thrown out a lawsuit against NBC by a black network employee who said *The Cosby Show* television series was developed from his idea, for which he was never paid.

Lawyers for Hwesu Murray said Wednesday they will appeal the decision granting summary judgment in favor of the network and NBC Entertainment president Brandon Tartikoff. Bill Cosby was not named in the suit.

The Cosby Show, a weekly comedy series about a black, upper-middle-class family, has been one of the most popular and successful shows in TV history since it premiered on NBC in 1984.

The next year, Murray, a unit manager in NBC Sports, sued the network for race discrimination, fraud and breach of implied contract, saying the hit series was based on his proposal for a weekly show about a black, upper-middle-class family starring Cosby and Diahann Carroll.

Murray's proposal for *Father's Day*, was submitted to the network in June 1980 and rejected five months later.

In an opinion signed last week, U.S. district judge Miriam Goldman Cedarbaum said the sole is-

sue was whether Murray's proposal "was sufficiently novel to support a claim for its unlawful use."

Murray, 37, of Mount Vernon, N.Y., said there are many similarities between *The Cosby Show*, and *Father's Day*.

FAMILY INTACT

Father's Day called for the portrayal of an "intact, black family in a color-blind, non-stereotypical manner," which is also the premise of *The Cosby Show*.

Like *Father's Day* the family consists of parents who are working professionals and five children with the eldest child away at college.

NBC said except for the all-black cast, which Cosby suggested as early as 1965, the concept of an up-

per-middle-class family situation comedy was not original and Murray had "no legally protected right to an idea that is not new."

Cedarbaum agreed, finding Murray's proposal "cannot be considered sufficiently novel to create a property interest."

A lawyer for NBC, Susan Buckley, said the evidence presented by the network "made abundantly clear to us that *The Cosby Show* was a natural outgrowth of Mr. Cosby's talent and material over the last 20 years."

Murray's lawyer, Joseph Santora, said he will appeal Cedarbaum's ruling.

"We feel very strongly that we have an excellent chance of getting it reversed on appeal," he said.

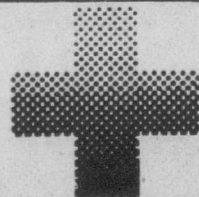



Advertising the key to Lennoxville's antique future

LENNOXVILLE — There is a boom going on in Lennoxville, in case you have not noticed, it is quiet but steady. It is the antique business. It is not a dog fight for competition, but as in all businesses, the market will have to find its level.

On Queen street just past the elementary school, there are five antique shops. From Antiques Jean Coates to Royal Antiques to Victoria Antiques to the Coin Center and the Lennox Gift Shop and Antiques, the street is becoming a veritable antique row. If fact it is starting to be called the strip — a rather apt nickname for a row of antique shops.

There is soon to be a new kid on the block, so to speak. Le Grenier Marie-Ange is suppose to be opening up next to Victoria. So there will soon be six shops, and the list would be even longer, if extended to Wellington Street South in Sherbrooke, where there are a couple more of such stores.

In some businesses, the opening of a new shop, and hence more competition, would be enough to make the other owners' blisters boil, but antiques are not necessarily like other merchandise.

Competition is not always competition, in some ways it can be more helpful than harmful. The point here is that shops really do not compete against each other. Jean Coates says if she does not have an item a customer is looking for, but one of the other shops does, then she will send them over.

The crux of situation, as Marie-Thérèse Rodrigue of Victoria Antiques puts it, is "if you are leaving Montreal and you have the choice of going to a place with one shop or to a place with six, which one would you choose?" The question, besides being rhetorical, is an academic one for antique shoppers.

The whole boom started shortly after Colin McLeod died a few years ago. McLeod had been a long-time antique dealer, and when he died the business was not kept up by the family. This created a vacuum, and people like the Coates were more than happy to fill it. Jean Coates has nothing but praise for the reputation McLeod

built up for Lennoxville.

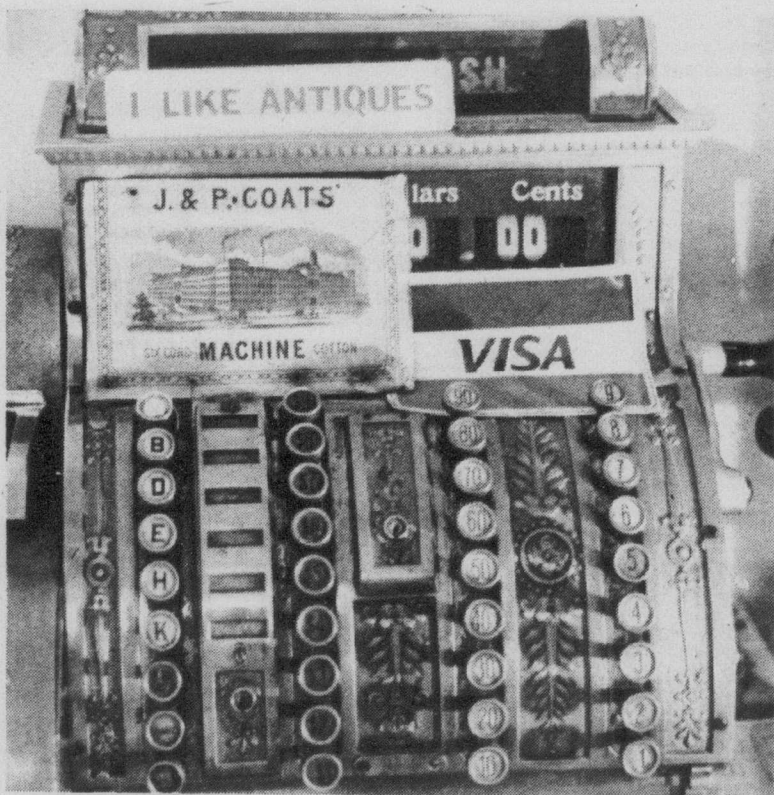
"Colin McLeod brought a lot of people to this area, every merchant in town benefitted from this, and they still are." His reputation lives on, as Coates put it, because people still come asking for him.

A man from Texas is a particularly good example of how Lennoxville has developed a name in antique circles. He was in the area on vacation, when he saw a old church pew at the Coates' shop. A week later he called from Houston, Texas, to say he had cleared it with customs, and arranged to have it sent down, because he could not find one like it at home.

Madeleine Mc Lellan, who runs Antique Royal, thinks all the shops complement each other, "nobody has two things the same, so there is room for everyone. It is my personal opinion, but the more shops you have, the more people you are going to attract." This is one thing the owners can agree on. The thing that they are not so close on is how

best to advertise the area.

Rodrigue and the others recognize the need to advertise. There have been suggestion of collective advertising to draw more people in. Rodrigue likes the idea, "I think that would be an excellent idea, because all the people in the area already know about Lennoxville, we just have to reach people in Montreal and Ontario."

While the talk is there, the action has not followed. The high gloss magazine *Estrie Living* wanted to get an advertising section on antiques, but only Coates was willing to advertise. The magazine is widely distributed in hotels and other such tourist sites. Coates thought it would be perfect time to advertise together. She said the other owners "don't feel as strongly as I do about placing ads. They don't seem to un-

derstand the importance of advertising in the right places."

The answer to that is different owners place different priorities on different aspects of their business. Coates realizes that, but she still says the way to improve Lennoxville's standing in the antique business is to go out and get people, "we need an influx of people."

In Knowlton, the antique dealers there, in conjunction with the local merchant association, got together and took full-page ads out in magazines that cater to the trade. Coates says it has paid huge dividends. This year is too later for collective advertising, but next year she hopes to get something going, because as she puts it, a full-page ad is slightly more impressive than one small one.

Caputo tells about war in a captivating, honest way

Indian Country by Philip Caputo (BANTAM): \$23.95, 419 pp.

About Philip Caputo's first novel, *A Rumor of War*, William Styron was moved to say: "Some of Caputo's troubled, searching meditations on the love and hate of war, on fear, and the ambivalent discord that warfare can create in the hearts of decent men, are among the most eloquent I have read in modern literature".

In *Indian Country*, Caputo puts these themes to an even more severe test and the winner is anyone who reads this compelling book about a Vietnam veteran whose life has been immeasurably transformed into a living nightmare by his war experiences.

Choosing as his setting the Upper Peninsula of Michigan state, Caputo weaves his story in and around Hemingway country with a dexterity that allows him to suggest the early Nick Adams stories with his prose without ever becoming derivative. Caputo's hero is a young son of a minister, Christian Starkmann, and the book opens with the young boy encountering for the first time his lifelong friend Bonny George St. Germain, an Ojibwa Indian. Bonny George later saves Starkmann's life in a fishing mishap, and the emotional bond between the boys is strengthened when the minister's son defies his own father's resolute defiance of the war in Vietnam by allowing himself to be drafted and follow his Indian friend into the conflict in Asia.

The resident of the Starkmann family in Oak Park, Illinois, their summer retreats to the Ojibwa Indian country of the North Michigan woods, and the careful descriptions of the lore involving fishing for steelhead trout, not to mention the comradeship of young males battling against the great outdoors, are all constant reminders of the Hemingway heritage that Caputo acknowledges with his fine characters and realistic settings, and with his gift for storytelling as well.

Christian Starkmann has returned to the Michigan wilderness at the conclusion of his Vietnam stint, taken a wife named June who has a daughter Lisa from a previous marriage, and has fathered his own daughter, Christine. Together they live in a remote shack, surrounded by forty acres of scrub pine, near the little town of Vieux Desert, not far from Marquette, Michigan. Starkmann is an out-ri-der for a large lumber company, whose job requires him to differentiate the various species of trees so that the lumberjacks can go about their jobs of defoliating the forests. This occupation does not jibe well with Starkmann's feelings about large corporations and the future of the north woods, and he is also haunted by the schism between he and his family, especially his father, Lucius, the fire and brimstone preacher who led protests against the war in which his son has become so deranged.

Caputo does a superb job of following the Hemingway dictum of "getting the weather right", as he

fills his novel with realistic descriptions of the wilderness and the terrain that constitute Indian country. But the novel is also a vivid portrait of the interior terrain as well, with Starkmann's shattered mind becoming the focus. His taciturn nature, exacerbated by some unspeakable horrors that he has witnessed "over there", begins to turn Starkmann away from his family as he falls prey to the "Post-traumatic stress disorder" that afflicted so many returning soldiers in the sixties.

June, his wife, is not merely the mirror against which this sad illness is reflected, but she becomes a clearly defined, memorable female character whose own life has been subject to assaults on her sanity. As a social worker dealing with the sixty percent unemployment rate in the region, attempting to hold together fragmented families, June has her own past as a deserted wife, and a reputation as a "loose" woman to deal with, even as her husband becomes more distant and psychotic.

Caputo's ability to blend together elements of mental disintegration, flashbacks to a war unlike any that came before it, and the tenuous condition of a fragmenting marriage, while keeping the rea-

der enthralled with this very special kind of love affair between Starkmann and his wife June, makes *Indian Country* a unique kind of contemporary novel.

Fittingly, the climax of Caputo's novel is every bit as engrossing as his complex story has been. The themes have all been handled before, in such stories as "Coming Home", the Jon Voight film, or in countless television dramas, but *Indian Country* really gets down to the difficult task of tracing the complex patterns of trauma, guilt and pride which were shared by the veterans of the war nobody wanted.

RECORD REVIEWS
John Hiatt BRING THE FAMILY (A&M)

As an artist who has recorded seven previous albums, John Hiatt must now be counted among the number of singers who discover what difference a producer and a tight band can make.

John Chelew was formally the concert coordinator at a joint called McCabes in Santa Monica, where John Hiatt had been doing solo acoustic shows for almost ten years. Noting that Hiatt's concert gigs bore no resemblance whatsoever to the bland stuff he put out on albums, Chelew approached Hiatt

with an offer. How about Hiatt getting together with a super band, going into the studio with a bunch of recently written tunes and just laying down some almost-live tracks and see what happens? What happens is that Chelew and Hiatt decide to press-gang a superb trio of players into working on this most exciting album of '87.

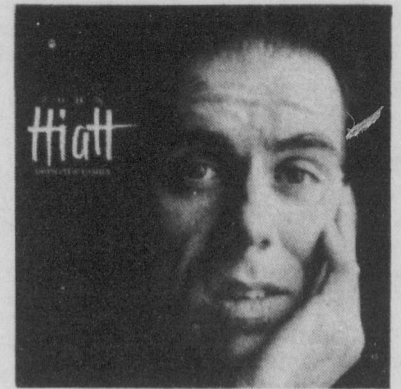
Nick Lowe had both produced a record for Hiatt, plus covered one of his songs, so he was the first choice for bass player (he adds in a tasty harmony on "Learning How To Love"); the inspired appeal to have Ry Cooder sit in on the guitar end of this album turns out to have been the decision of record — Cooder had used Hiatt on several of his albums, *BORDERLINE*, *THE SLIDE AREA*, *THE BORDER*, and *ALAMO BAY*—Cooder's guitars are the key to Hiatt's success here; Jim Keltner as drummer was not such a tough roster move, considering that he's worked with every heavyweight in L.A. rock from Carly to Zevon.

A lot of albums boast of classic studio accompaniment, but on Hiatt's record this quartet just jelled the way Elvis did with a couple of Memphis cats named Scott Moore and William Black a few decades back. "Memphis In The Meantime" is a jumping, driving track that concedes that "Ronnie Milsap will never record this song", nevertheless Hiatt wants to escape that "heartfelt steel guitar" of Nashville and get a bit of grease under his pork-pie hat and boogie to the Memphis sounds.

Perhaps the truest accolade to Hiatt's songs on this album is that most of them sound like they were R&B classics pulled out of some old Memphis/Stax vaults, rather than having been written less than two months or so before this fortuitous session.

There's not a clinker among the ten tracks here, with some, like "Lipstick Sunset" or "Thing Called Love" sounding like they will be covered by a lot of artists in a lot of years to come. On the latter, Cooder chimes in on harmony, when he isn't chugging along with some incredible, solid picking on the thick strings. The songs are written with Hiatt's droll wit, "take off your kid gloves, I ain't no porcupine", a playful penchant for cute rhymes and some insightful and perceptive analysis of Baby-boomers such as the lines in "Your Dad Did": "The food is cold and your wife feels old/ But all hands fold and the two-year old says grace/ She says, help the starving children to get well/ But let my brother's hamster burn in hell".

Almost lost in the midst of this superb album is the piano accompaniment that Hiatt throws in on "Have A Little Faith In Me", against his throaty vocal delivery that conjures up touches of everybody from the Boss to the scads of black performers that Hiatt has obviously gone to school in. *BRING THE FAMILY* is an album that just hits on every cylinder — vocally, instrumentally thanks to Cooder's wonderful guitars, songwriting-wise, and in the overall



concept of setting John Hiatt up, live, in Ocean Way Studio 2 in Los Angeles for four fateful days from February 17th through 20th, last winter.

THE MORNING AFTER (LORIMAR)

A murder mystery with a bit of a twist to it, *THE MORNING AFTER* features Jane Fonda as an aging chippy who is a faded actress with something of a drinking problem. As the film opens Fonda's character finds herself in bed with a strange man and she is suffering from a gigantic hangover.

So far this appears to be merely par for the course for this lady — the problem arises when she realizes that the man beside her on the bed has a large knife protruding from his chest. In a total blackout, she can remember nothing about who the man is or where she encountered him during the previous evening, and has no notion of how he came to be killed.

As she is making a getaway she encounters the ex-cop from Bakerfield played by Jeff Bridges and the movie's slender plot develops from there. Bridges seems to be walking through the same kind of role he played in *STARMAN*, or else we are supposed to buy the kind of grinning, taciturn characterization he effects as a fine piece of acting. He has little to act with here, granted, but the interaction with Fonda is not as stilted as it might have been supposed to be: indeed Fonda is quite convincing as the starlet on the downside of mid-life crisis.

Between them they set out to find out who has killed this man, or even who he may be. The ending appears a bit tacked on, or at least fairly unbelievable, but the plot of this movie needed something to turn on and Bridges and Fonda find out the nitty gritty the hard way. None of the elements that might be expected to be developed fully are, thanks to the rather stiff portrayal by Bridges which renders the romance between the two leads rather insignificant.

The Los Angeles scenery is not even exploited very dramatically by Sidney Lumet the director, but he must have figured that the two box office personalities would do the job. After consulting the United States calendar of bottles exhibits I realize that there were no less than 10 major exhibitions in May 1987 alone in the States of Connecticut, Virginia, Ohio, Arkansas, Illinois, New York, etc. I participated in an exhibition in Keen N.H. two years ago and I can assure you that the atmosphere is, unique.

These exhibits attract all kind of people. Some collect old poison bottles while others look for white ones, lovely black ones or a "Hutchinson". It is a true bottle "Jobbery". You cannot begin to imagine what joy the collector who can buy a bottle which partially completes his collection experiences. One rejoices after discovering that a \$350 ink-bottle is selling for only \$50. It's a real fair.

As far as I am concerned I do not buy nor sell bottles. I hope one day they will serve for museum purposes.

I consider my collection unique since every piece was found in Lake Memphrémagog. Special care is always given at the time of discovery and I must admit that my patience is tested by everyone I wash.

DORMANT BOTTLES

Everyone interested can become a collector. Invariably they will turn to history to find ancient dumping grounds. In the past every farm had its one. Take the case of Oliver's Corner, a bygone hamlet, where surely sites dating more than a century with dormant bottles can be found. Searches have to be taken.

All the collectors I have met are stinging when it comes to divulging

information as to where their lovely bottles were found. I am one of them and I am like others. One fact is sure. More we know about bottles more we realize their association with history.

You must surely have heard about the famous Gauvin Anis Sirup for children. Our grandmothers praised its merits and with very good reason. The formula contained: "White Pine, Rochel salt, Licorice, alcohol, ¼ of a grain of Morphine acetate by ounce, etc." All this for \$0.30 cents a bottle. This little drink would sell very well in 1987 and not necessarily for young children. Once I found a bottle: "Payne Celery Compound". I later discovered that its content consisted in a "licensed" medication made of coca leaves and alcohol. I could not help but laugh when I read of its curative capacity being sedative. This medicine sold for 75 cents in the 1880.

GUARANTEED CURE

Another medication, from Dr. Shooshone, guaranteed a cure for all illness to the exception of "consumption". He pretended to be an Indian chief. He probably had obtained a doctorate in marketing, but surely not in medicine for his product did not possess the curative virtues he attributed it except for the 85% of alcohol it contained.

I was very taken in by the book:

"Les Brasseries de Sherbrooke de 1825-1930" written by Pierre Rousseau (1981) and published. I own almost all of the bottles from the Sherbrooke Brasseries namely, Wiggist, Fletcher, Odell, Nutter, Silver Springs and even the Milwaukee Beer which made the town of Milwaukee in Wisconsin famous driving Sherbrooke's brasseries to close. This beer is no longer made in Sherbrooke, but is still very popular in the United States. Sherbrooke has known many effervescent water bottlers: Pelletier, Mercier, Bryant, Lucien Lavigne etc... Waterloo with Forand, Magog with Garneau, St-Jean with Thisdale. These manufacturers

used stoneware bottles, some Hutchinson (the name "soda pop" comes from the noise made in opening the bottle), bottles round bottoms (they should be kept lying down) and bottles with crown stoppers which appeared on the market around 1900. They are of all colours, blue, white, green, aquamarine, yellow and black. We must remember the "Mummy" and the "Jumbo" bottled in Magog by Mr. Dupuis. They contained 60 oz. of soft drink and were sold at \$0.05 each. Today the empty bottles are sold between \$15.00 and \$25.00. They are also the Newport bottles at the head of the lake. The main bottler was "Darling" for efferves-

cent water (also for some magic stuff-non publicized). The pharmaceutical bottles were: Hall, Bigelow, Davis, Livingstone, and Green.

BOOKS RECOMMENDED

Many books on the subject can be found. The Canadian Government Publishing Centre as recently published a book entitled: "Cylindrical English Wine & Beer Bottles 1735-1850". This publication is available at 200 book stores associated with this Center. They are also available for reading and consultation in 800 libraries in Canada, I highly recommend this book since many bottles have to be identified by their form. If you are interested I suggest you go to: Relais Copp's Ferry in Georgeville where you will see a real interesting collection of bottles. Collectors will appreciate them, others will discover them...

Penn was on probation in connection with a nightclub scuffle. He was sentenced to jail after being charged with reckless driving and punching an extra on the set of the movie Colors.

LONDON (AP) — Academy Award-winning lyricist Sammy Cahn is drawing critical acclaim for his show Words and Music, in which he reminisces about five decades of writing for theatre and movies.

The two-hour show, which received a standing ovation at Monday's opening, was first seen on Broadway in 1974.

Among the 74-year-old Cahn's most celebrated songs are Love and Marriage, High Hopes, Thoroughly Modern Millie and Three Coins in a Fountain.

Harry Eyres in The Times newspaper wrote: "Whatever it takes to write immaculate lyrics under pressure seems to have

kept him enviably young." Robin Stringer in The Standard said the show was "highly polished."

Other finalists for the Horizon award are: T. Graham Brown; Holly Dunn; Steve Earle; Nanci Griffith; Highway 101, a four-piece band; Michael Johnson; Lyle Lovett; the O'Kanes, a duet; and the Sweethearts of the Rodeo, a sister duet.

The 10 finalists will be cut to five next month. The winner will be announced Oct. 12 at the annual Country Music Association awards show, which is to be broadcast live on the CBS network.

Country jamboree to see old musicians come out

DANVILLE — Richmond-Danville residents are in for a music-filled weekend at the Mont Scotch Hill resort, as the area will play host to a country music jamboree - the first ever in the region on Saturday.

Scheduled to get underway at 2 pm and continue until the wee hours of Sunday, the event has been organized to open the door on closet musicians in the area as well as bring out some of the regions favorite bands.

The musical event is the brain-child of Janice Rodgers, new owner-operator of Scotch Hill. The jamboree is sort of a life long dream for Rodgers. Taking over the premises on May 1 this spring was the first step towards developing a country music resort. Plans for the Jamboree include making it an annual event, eventually held outside in conjunction with other activities such as a folk or handicraft fair.

"But this year we'll start out inside. This hall can accommodate 300 people easily and that's exactly what we're hoping to see," said Rodgers.

Rodgers, a computer program-analyst, has been motivated by her dream of being in the service industry "I've never really worked in this particular type of entertainment business, I just sort of loved it from afar," she admitted. "But coming here to dances and receptions and living in an area where country music is almost never

heard on the electronic media, we toured the area Saturday nights to find a country music band playing."

Scotch Hill was one of those places. The Rodgers family supported her plans and when the place went up for sale, moving heaven and earth to buy it wasn't too much.

Bobby Patrick of the Country Plus band has been Rodger's right-hand man organizing this event. "I've been in the music business 15 years so it seemed logical for me to try and rouse out the dozens of country music players who haven't played in public for years. Twenty-five years ago there were several groups in the area now it's hard to find more than one or two. We want to wake-up local interest in that folksy music and work towards making Scotch Hill a top-spot for this type of entertainment," said Patrick.

Scotch Hill lends itself well to this type of down-home entertainment. Built of split logs and situated on the brow of a hill with a 20-mile view in three directions, the atmosphere is already well established. Future events will probably be held outside but finances are slim this first year for Rodgers and organizers are depending on success this first-time before enlarging on the Rodgers's dream.

Overnight accommodation is already available at the campground further up the mountain but plans are already laid to provide inn or motel-type services in the near future. The site is ideal for

receptions and business events such as seminars or workshops as well.

Rodgers, who celebrated her 22 birthday this week bubbles with enthusiasm as she talks of future plans. But getting out members of former bands has kept her going night and day lately. "Bobby and I have probably made hundreds of phone calls. The surprising thing is the enthusiasm people seem to have for the Jamboree. Participants such as Norman Menard, professional guitarist for several years, Roger Desrochers of fiddle fame, Mark Oakley and Raymond Trippear, former members of Country Pride, Nelson Willey, famous rhythm and blues specialist, and many others including Mike Patrick and Mike Doyle of Country Plus, back-up band for the day have all expressed relief and enthusiasm at the efforts to revive country music and bring out local musicians.

We have no country radio station nor do we get much of this type of music on television. Short of buying tapes and records the area is thirsty for this type of event. At least that's what we're banking on this weekend..." concluded Rodgers.

Mont Scotch Hill is located about six miles from Richmond on the Danville highway. Music begins at 2: p.m. and admission is \$1. A corn roast and cantine-style lunch will also be available at reasonable prices. For information call Janice Rodgers at (819) 826-2787 or Bobby Patrick (819) 826-5618.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Country singer Johnny Paycheck and the evangelist who introduced Jim Bakker to Jessica Hahn are teaming up for a gospel music album titled The Outlaw and the Preacher.

Charles Ammerman, Paycheck's manager, said Tuesday that the singer and John Wesley Fletcher hope to record the album next month.

Paycheck has been sentenced to 9½ years in prison for his 1986 conviction in a barroom shooting in Ohio. He is free while his case is under appeal. He is best known for the 1978 hit Take This Job and Shove It.

Fletcher has said he introduced PTL founder Bakker to Hahn, a church secretary from New York. Bakker resigned as head of the PTL ministry last spring after saying he had a sexual encounter with the woman.

NEW YORK (Reuter) — Actor Keven Marcum, who was preparing to take over the leading role in the Broadway hit musical Les Miserables, has been found dead in his apartment.

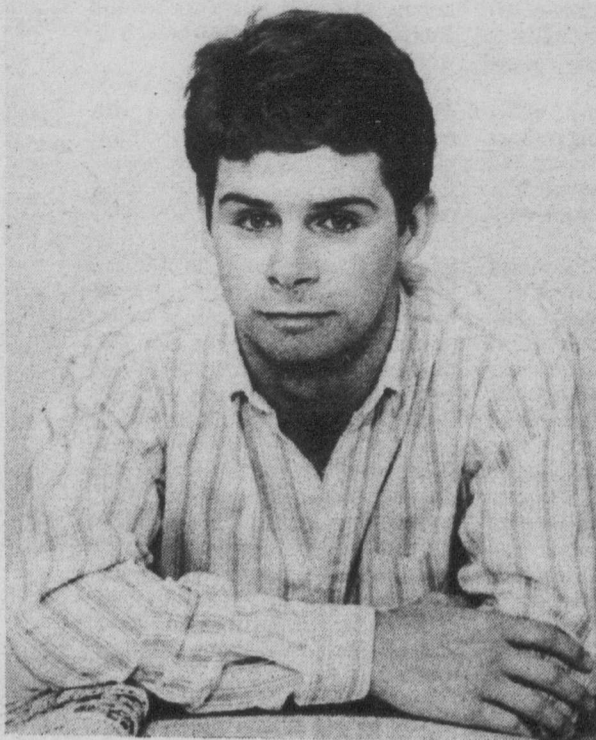

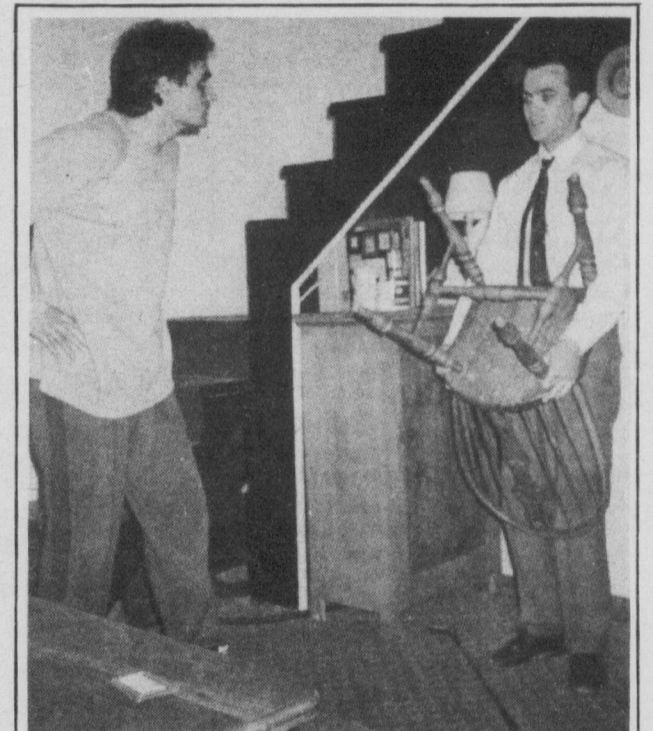

Kauai: A lost paradise can certainly be found here

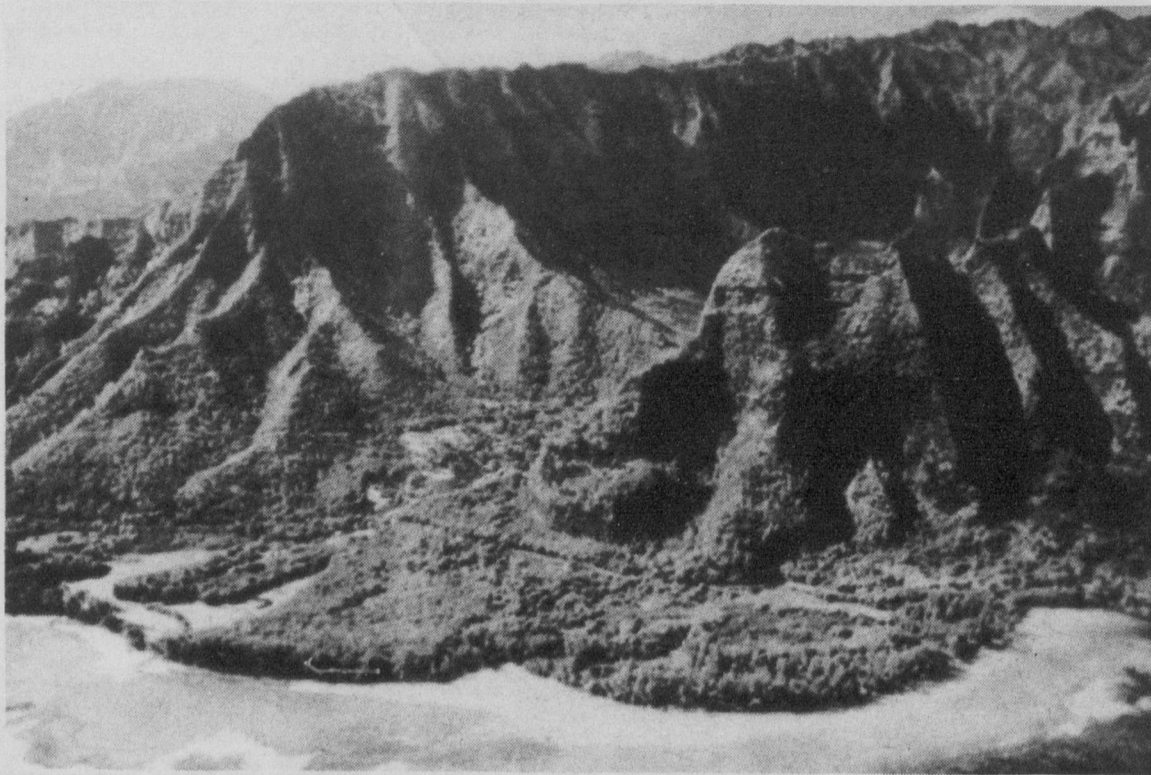

KAUAI, Hawaii — For years, one vision of tropical paradise has been Kauai's north shore. Just consider some of the movies shot here: Rita Hayworth's "Sadie Thompson," the Bali Hai scenes of "South Pacific," and the jungle scenes in "King Kong 2".

What makes this part of Kauai so extraordinary? It's one gorgeous scene after another: hillsides covered with wild orchids and red bougainvillea, crescent-shaped beaches with hardly a footprint to be seen, the pungent smell of wild ginger in the soft, humid air, and the sound of waterfalls tumbling into crystal-clear lagoons.

Better yet, Kauai's north shore can easily be enjoyed by all visitors, whatever their age, physical abilities, or budget, because many of these sights are along the well-maintained two-lane Kuhio Highway between Hanalei and Haena, a distance of only nine miles.

Start your drive where the highway crosses the Hanalei River and enters the Hanalei Valley, which is surrounded by steep jungle-covered mountains on three sides and the ocean on the other. For the next few miles, the road passed taro fields and rice paddles, grazing cattle and horses, flower-draped cottages, and modest 19th-century wooden churches.

TAKE A SWIM

Off the Kuhio Highway, unpaved one-lane roads head into the fields or lead down to unseen beaches. The highway also crosses half a dozen bridges, usually wooden and just one lane wide. From the bridges you can watch ducks, fish, even crayfish and shrimp in the water below. Feel adventurous? Jump off the bridge into the water — check the depth first — and

swim downstream to the nearby turquoise-colored ocean.

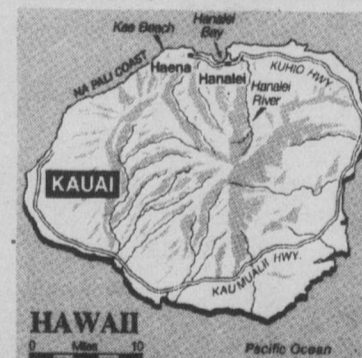
After passing through Hanalei Valley, the Kuhio Highway runs along the coastline. On the left are several-hundred-foot-high hillsides, covered with vegetation that absorbs moisture with dangling several-foot-long "air roots." On the right lies one perfect white sand beach after another, such as palm-lined Haena Beach, which was Bali Hai in "South Pacific."

Just beyond Haena Beach, look for the well-marked Maninihola Dry Cave in the hillside to the left. Named for a legendary fisherman, this cave is actually a mile-long lava tube, which was formed when the outside of a lava flow cooled down and the still-hot core exploded outward. Farther ahead are the Waikapalae and Waikanaloe Wet Caves, filled with water.

Within a mile, Kihio Highway ends at Haena Point and splendid

Kee Beach, but this is not the last of Kauai's north shore charms. Ahead lies the Na Pali coastline — a succession of needlelike mountains and steep, rocky cliffs where waterfalls drop hundreds of feet into the rolling ocean surf.

Although the Na Pali coast is too rugged for any road, agile visitors can follow an ancient Hawaiian trail that alternately passes through jungle-filled ravines and



runs along the knife-edged cliffs high above the ocean. Wild apples, guavas, bananas, nuts, and orchids grow along the narrow path.

Only experienced hikers should consider following this trail for any length. The pathway is treacherous, and the water in some streams and waterfalls contains a nasty parasite. But these practical constraints don't prevent visitors from experiencing the majestic Na Pali coast.

RAFTING ALTERNATIVE

A good alternative is to take one of Captain Zodiac's several-hour cruises up the coast in a 20-foot long inflatable rubber raft. Passengers sit on the edge, and the captain maneuvers the twin-engine raft into three coastal caves. One cave roof is open to the sky. Another has a waterfall. In the third, the raft sails into pitch darkness, then makes a sharp turn and leaves by another entrance to everyone's oohs and aahs.

Farther up the Na Pali coast, the raft lands on the beach at the once-inhabited Nualolo Valley. Here passengers can sun bathe, explore the verdant landscape, or snorkel in clear offshore waters. Captain Zodiac provides all the snorkel gear and a light lunch. Call 808-826-9371 for information.

Travelers who don't want to feel every bump and bounce of the ocean waves on the exhilarating Zodiac raft rides should consider boarding the Lady Ann Cruises 36-foot custom-built boat, which also sails up the Na Pali coast and stops at the beach near Kalalau Valley for snorkeling. Take a roll from the shipboard lunch, rip it into tiny morsels, and throw the pieces on the surface of the water. Within seconds, hundreds of fish will chase the bread or jump out of the water in the feeding frenzy. Call 808-245-8538 for Lady Ann Cruises information.

AERIAL VIEW

For a totally different view of the Na Pali coast, take one of the half dozen helicopter tours. Zipping in and out of the clouds, you come face to face with cascading waterfalls, spot wild goats along the rocky paths below, or see the valleys that stretch several miles from the coast to the inland mountains.

These tropical valleys were the home of native Hawaiian tribes for centuries. Indeed, Kalalau was so remote that it was inhabited by them until the 1920s.

"In Ka'alau, several hundred Hawaiians lived much like their ancestors — worshipping their gods, catching the brightly colored fish from the ocean, eating the fruits and vegetables that grew wild, and raising taro in terraced fields in the floor of the valley," says helicopter pilot Will Squyres. "When I spot the remains of the taro terraces from the air and see the taro that now grows wild along the streams, I realize that there really was a Garden of Eden after all."

Sammy's has the remedy for those poultry blues

By this time, most of the more dedicated carnivores among us are probably completely turned off by anything that once wore feathers, be it turkey, goose, duck or chicken. Enough is enough of any good thing.

With the holidays only just behind us, the visions of sugar plums have turned, most likely, to visions of thick, juicy steaks or even nice, lean fish. Despite what the health experts tell us, the true carnivore at this time seems to develop a craving for real meat and poultry just doesn't qualify.

Should one suffer such an attack, it might be a good time to check out Sammy's at the top of Victoria Ave., corner of de la Savane St., a place that was known for at least a dozen years as Victoria Station. The Victoria Station chain went bankrupt last spring in Canada and there are only seven or eight left in the United States, out of 97.

The Montreal facility was bought, as is, by Sam Rubin, long-time owner of La Diligence on Decarie Blvd., and renamed in October. It now specializes in meaty beef and pork spare ribs, along with roast beef, barbecued chicken and burgers. All are good, the servings are mountainous and the prices are modest.

Old railway cars

Apart from the new ownership, name and menu, nothing has changed about the place physically. The novel collection of old railway cars, all adjoined and opening into a central station, still stands. Inside is the familiar pine cladding, barnwood booths, oak tables, railway lanterns and the like. Unfortunately, the place is very tired looking, especially the dirty worn carpeting, and could have done with a general face lifting when it changed hands. There are, by the way, smoking and non-smoking "cars."

We were hungry and confident that we could sample a pretty good cross-section of the modest menu. Instead of starting with an order and onion-ring loaf, potato skins, onion soup, steak finger or boboli pizza offered as starters, we chose instead the combo platter (\$4.95) to share. Before it arrived, we were served generous dishes of good coleslaw, bread and butter.

The platter was enormous with a veritable mountain of onion rings, zucchini, eggplant and mushrooms, deep-fried

in a light, tasty batter and served with a mayonnaise-type dip. Had we even attempted to finish the plate, we could have eaten nothing else after.

For the main event, we ordered a rib combo (\$8.95) that combined honey-glazed long pork ribs with barbecued chicken, and the extra large rack of beef ribs (\$11.95) since both of us really wanted these and planned to share. It's a good thing Sammy's has its own designer doggie bags at the ready.

Meaty and delicious

The two long, pork spareribs with their sweet honey glaze were meaty and delicious. The quarter breast of chicken, golden skinned but fairly moist inside and served with barbecue sauce on the side, was also excellent. The french fries were not.

The extra large rack of beef ribs was truly gargantuan, enough to feed an army and then some. They were very meaty and succulent with a dark mahogany honey-based glaze that, for my liking, is a bit too sweet but which my companion found admirable. Two were enough, the rest went into a doggy bag. A baked potato served with them was first-rate and was served with sour cream.

For dessert there were all kinds of gooey, rich delights which somehow failed to interest me, but my faithful friend ordered the key lime pie (\$2.95), a nice tart finish and nicely made, although I have sampled better. Coffee was good, served in large mugs, and the service was both friendly and efficient throughout.

Sammy's does offer lunch specials and in addition to the regular evening menu, there is a fresh catch of the day for those determined to be healthy.
