TORONTO CANOE CLUB REGATTA.

OF the above illustrations, Nos. 1 and 2 depict an aquatic sport that is rapidly increasing in popularity among canoeists in Canada. It is called canoe tilting, and it is not only exciting, but mirth-provoking. Each canoe contains a paddler and a tilter. The paddler controls and guides the canoe, and the tilter does the tilting. The tilting is done with long bamboo poles to the end of which are attached balls of some soft material. As the paddlers guide their respective canoes the tilters with these poles try to push each other into the water. The successful competitors then overturn the canoes of their opponents.



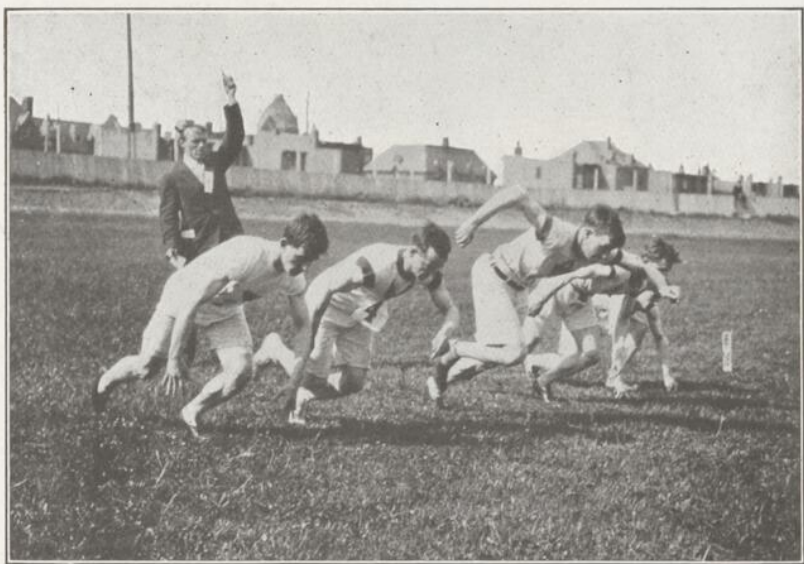
REGATTA DAY ON TORONTO BAY.

THE annual regatta season in Canada was opened recently at Hanlan's Point, Toronto, when what is known as the "Civic Regatta" took place on Toronto Bay. As usual, the scene was a pretty one—the large number of yachts, canoes, and pleasure boats making a picturesque ensemble. No 2 of the above illustrations shows the pleasure craft lined up on each side of the course. A race is in progress, and the occupants of these boats are watching the event with considerable interest.

On a public holiday such as Dominion Day or the annual Civic Holiday, the waters of Toronto Bay carry on their bosom hundreds of canoes, sailing craft and launches. A wise supervision is exercised by the police over these boats, with the result that few accidents occur. Throughout each day and evening in the summer season the Bay is patrolled by police boats, and all owners of launches, canoes, yachts, etc., are made to obey the requirements of the law.

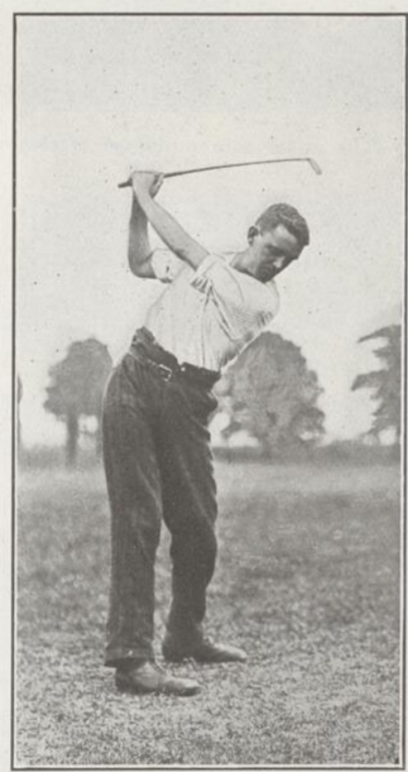

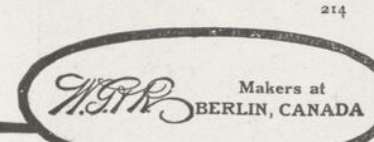

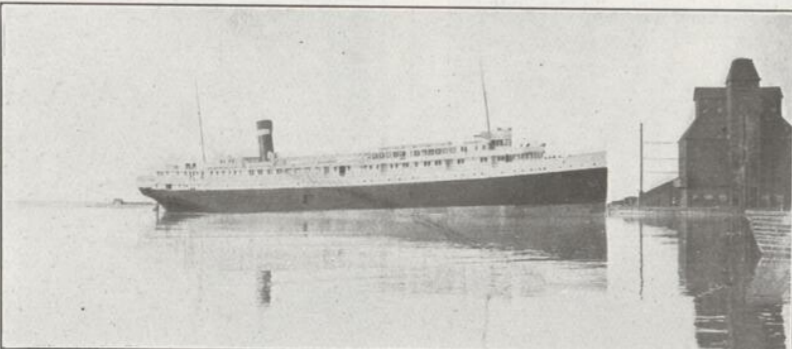
