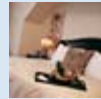

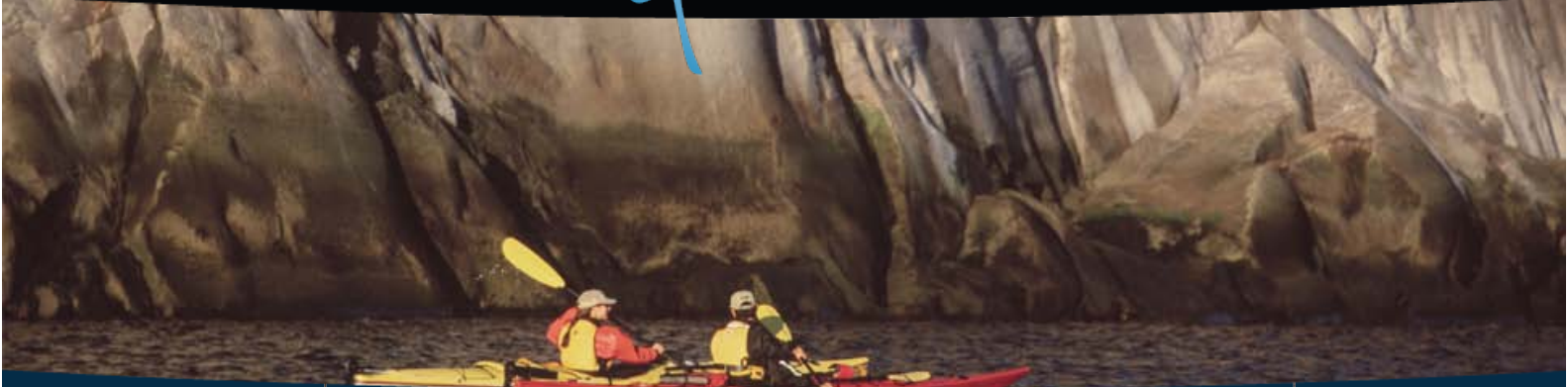

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Duplessis

Endless miles of coastline on the Gulf



From Labrador to the Gulf of St. Lawrence, Duplessis offers up forests as far as the eye can see and a coastline punctuated with broad, powerful rivers, with beaches that are among the finest in Québec. Along the Whale Route, rorquals and other large [cetaceans](#) (sea mammals) can be seen frolicking on the water's surface. Parallel to the easternmost tip of Île d'Anticosti, a boat takes up where the road leaves off, bringing supplies to the string of villages on the Basse-Côte-Nord. Duplessis, the ancestral home of the Montagnais, attracts hunting and fishing enthusiasts, snowmobilers and adventurers of every stripe. To appreciate the region's true worth, let curiosity and time be your guides!

Where nature stands proud

Almost the size of Corsica, [Île d'Anticosti](#) is the realm supreme of the white-tailed deer: nearly 20 deer per square kilometre, or over 50 per square mile! Countless ships have perished on the reefs that ring the unruly isle, which boasts a remarkable, though little-known, [national park](#) of unsurpassed wild beauty, complete with cliffs, canyons, grottos, falls and rivers. Between the island and the mainland, sea and wind have joined forces to sculpt the imposing and strangely shaped monoliths of the [Mingan Archipelago](#) National Park Reserve of Canada, home to innumerable puffins and seabirds. The [Réserve faunique de Port-Cartier-Sept-Îles](#) has over 100 bodies of water (including magnificent Lac Walker) and many rivers teeming with brook trout and salmon—paradise for nature lovers and sport fishermen alike.

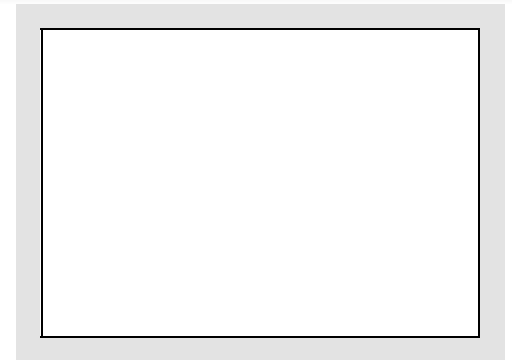


Sea, shore and iron ore



Jump aboard a coastal vessel and discover the 15 or so seaside hamlets and communities (of which Harrington Harbour is perhaps the best known) that dot the shoreline from Natashquan to Blanc-Sablon, right up to Newfoundland. North of Port-Cartier, deep in the region's interior, pay a visit to [Fermont](#), home to one of North America's largest strip mines. You'll find that the friendly city of [Sept-Îles](#) perfectly embodies the dynamic personality of a region whose gaze is half turned seaward, half inland toward its rich backcountry resources.

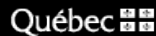

Delightful and delicious



Discover the Laurentides' rural character: fertile grasslands, flavoursome products, charming country homes and history everywhere you look. Along the way a fabulous panorama will unfold, setting before you the Ottawa River, the majestic Lac des Deux Montagnes and the bucolic Oka hills.

Heritage treasures

Old Saint-Eustache is home to a superb attraction, the [Légaré mill](#), which valiantly milled flour for two and a half centuries. If heritage architecture piques your interest, you'll be delighted by other municipalities: Sainte-Scholastique and Saint-Benoît (Mirabel), Lachute and Saint-André-d'Argenteuil, where you'll find the [Argenteuil Regional Museum](#), housed in a former military barracks. The [Carillon Canal National Historic Site](#), with the highest lock in Québec, is the perfect spot for a family picnic. Another site that's steeped in history is the Calvary at Oka, where a row of 18th-century oratories and chapels overlooks the hillside.



Delicious terroir delights



Follow the Farmlands Route (Chemin du Terroir) and discover an itinerary peppered with savoury tasting opportunities. Looking to quench your thirst? Go for a locally produced wine or cider, or try a glass of mead. Want to satisfy your sweet tooth? The maple goods or tasty apples at Saint-Joseph-du-Lac will do the trick. Include a wedge of cheese on your menu and—why not—the scent of lavender on your outing. Take the kids to pick

fresh fruit and vegetables or visit farms where exotic animals are raised... and your day is complete!

Embrace nature!

The focal point of the route is—quite naturally—the [Parc national d'Oka](#), whose woods climb the sides of Oka's hills, along the shores of Lac des Deux Montagnes. The park is a big draw among swimming enthusiasts, campers, hikers and cyclists, and hosts a wide variety of activities and events throughout the year. To fully appreciate the lake's beauty and serenity, treat yourself to a ferry crossing between Hudson and Oka. Another peaceful spot that promises fun for the entire family is the [Parc régional éducatif Bois de Belle-Rivière](#), in Mirabel.

Going swimmingly

Fresh and salt water fun



With its countless lakes and rivers, Québec has made quite a splash among serious swimmers, simple bathers and those who enjoy a quick dip! What's more, the calibre of its swimming waters is closely monitored by the Ministère québécois du Développement durable, de l'Environnement et des Parcs, which analyzes the water quality at nearly 400 public beaches throughout Québec each summer!

Like a fish in water

Finding a place to swim during your holidays in Québec couldn't be easier. Resort areas and establishments usually have access to a private or public beach. And for fans of waterslides, the [Laurentides](#) region—a popular summer vacation spot—has water parks in Pointe-Calumet, Piedmont, Saint-Sauveur-des-Monts and Sainte-Adèle. Not to be outdone, [Québec City](#) (Valcartier), the [Eastern Townships](#) (Bromont) and the [Outaouais](#) region (Cantley) also have fantastic facilities guaranteed to thrill the whole family!



Québec's [national parks](#) are also great spots for enjoying a swim. Among the parks that are prized for their beaches or the quality of their swimming water are Pointe-Taillon (Saguenay—Lac-Saint-Jean), with its 15 km (9 mi.) of fine sand; Frontenac, located along Lac Saint-François; Yamaska and Mont-Orford (Eastern Townships), and Mont-Tremblant and La Mauricie.

Dipping your toes in the St. Lawrence

The St. Lawrence River is dotted with beaches and coves that are perfect for swimming. Upstream from Montréal, Saint-Timothée is a typical family destination with high-quality water. But it's in the [Gaspésie](#)—in the Baie des Chaleurs and the [Îles-de-la-Madeleine](#)—that you will enjoy a truly exceptional swimming

At 2,100 km² (810 sq. mi.), Lac Mistassini is the largest natural lake in Québec, while the largest artificial body of water is the Canapiscou reservoir (4,285 km² / 1,654 sq. mi.). Québec boasts 12 watercourses exceeding 400 km (250 mi.) in length, including the St. Lawrence River and the Ottawa River, which is 1,270 km (789 mi.) long.



experience. The archipelago is home to pretty lagoons and beaches that stretch as far as the eye can see, bathed by the sea and sun. It's a veritable paradise for swimmers, surfers and sandcastle builders!

Urban swimmer

Once surrounded by public beaches and waterside resorts, today the island of [Montréal](#) has three small family beaches, at the Cap-Saint-Jacques and Bois-de-l'île-Bizard nature parks and Parc Jean-Drapeau, which are easily accessible from downtown. Also worth mentioning is nearby Parc national d'Oka, a recreational park on Lac des Deux Montagnes that boasts a wooded campground and pleasant beach.



Gatineau Park's delightful lakes offer [Gatineau](#)'s city slickers a refreshing oasis. In [Québec City](#), you can swim at the Sainte-Foy outdoor recreation centre or in the St. Lawrence River, in the Baie de Beauport. The region also has many other interesting bodies of water, including Saint-Joseph and Beauport lakes. Lastly, for truly hardy souls, there's nothing more stimulating than the traditional "snow bath" that takes place during the Québec [Winter Carnival](#)!

Adventure courses

Between earth and sky



More and more, outdoor enthusiasts are becoming hooked on treetop adventure courses, via ferratas and canyoning. Across Québec, in forests, gorges and escarpments, challenges big and small await you and your family or friends. You'll encounter plenty of obstacles, true, but they sure won't obstruct your fun!

Treetop aerial courses

More than 20 sites offer beginners and seasoned adventurers alike a bird's-eye view of the immense boreal forest. Most are located in the forest massif north of the [St. Lawrence](#), and many are less than two hours from Montréal, Québec City or Gatineau.



In [autumn](#), a visit to an adventure park nestled in a maple forest is a great opportunity to feast your eyes on the brilliant fall foliage. Some parks offer gorgeous views of the St. Lawrence River or the Saguenay Fjord. From up to 30 metres (almost 100 ft.) above the ground, you'll soar along zip lines—the longest line is nearly 400 metres (1,300 ft.)!

Via ferratas and canyoning



If taking a stroll along cliff-side paths rather than gliding among the treetops is more your style, then you'll want to try a [via ferrata](#). Enjoy thrilling sensations and spectacular views while exploring the via ferratas of the Rivière Sainte-Anne canyon (Québec City), the Les Palissades park in Saint-Siméon (Charlevoix) or the Jardin des glaciers in Baie Comeau (Manicouagan), among others.

For something a little more adventurous—but still very safe—[canyoning](#) attracts thrill-seekers who enjoy the water. Gaspésie, Charlevoix, Mont Sainte-Anne and the Mauricie boast turbulent waterfalls and cascades in pristine natural settings. Prepare for an adrenaline rush!
