BERLIN, June 27.—The National Gazette announces that the Anglo-German agreement relative to East Africa has been concluded. It is stated that England has ceded to Germany the island of Zanzibar, and the East African coast from the Indian Ocean to the Gulf of Aden, about 125 miles south of the island of Zanzibar.

IMPERIAL PARLIAMENT

FRANCE AND CANADA

LONDON, June 27.—In the House of Commons this evening Sir James Ferguson, Under Secretary of State, admitted that a communication had been exchanged with France on March 1890, whereby France and England engaged to respect the independence of Zanzibar, leaving to the latter the right of annexation. The German included a secret clause forming an alliance between England and Germany in the event of war, but that the latter had not undertaken any new obligations toward any European power, either in the present agreement or otherwise.
