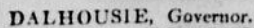

Review of the Market for the week—May 28th.
COTTON.—The demand was less active, and purchasers unwilling to give previous prices. St. Domingo, 27 a 27 1/2; Porto Rico, very little at market.
PROVISIONS.—Beef has been in more request; prime, 6 50 a 6 62 1/2; mess, 10 50 a 11. Pork not so brisk; prime, 8 50 a 8 75; mess, 11 75 a 12.
SUGAR.—Have been bought up as quick as they have come to market; and Pils have advanced to 46 1/2; Pearls, 47 1/2 a 48.
FLOUR AND GRAIN.—Flour has been dull for the last week, and the imports from the South have been considerable. The prices however remain without material alteration. New York, Rich-
mond country, Alexandria, Petersburg, and Fredericksburg su-
perfine Flour, 5 1/2 a 5 7/8; Philadelphia, Baltimore Howard Street,
and Richmond City, 4 5/8 a 4 7/8; Rye Flour, 18; Corn Meal,
2 50; do. in hds. 10 1/2 a 11; Southern Wheat, 75 3/4 a 76 1/4;
Northern, 74 7/8 a 75; Rye, 45 cents; Northern Corn, 44 a 45;
Southern do. 37 1/2 a 40 cents.
EXCHANGE ON ENGLAND, has advanced to 9 1/2, sales, and 10 per
cent premium asked.

Old Bailey, Friday, April 18.—Bank Proceedings.—No less
than 50 individuals of whom 25 were men, 4 females and one a
child under 15 years of age, pleaded guilty before the common
Serjeant to the offence of having forged notes in their posses-
sion, knowing them to have been forged, and were sentenced to
transportation for 14 years.
Forged Bank Notes.—In the British House of Commons on
the 26th of March, Mr. Hobbhouse presented a petition from a
respectable tradesman in the Strand, who stated that in the space
of a very few days he had taken 29 forged £1 notes and ten in one
day. Mr. Hobbhouse stated that no less than 50,000 forged notes
had been presented to the Bank in one year, and that the loss fell
principally upon shopkeepers.

Letter from Brazil.—By the brig Bordeaux, captain Butman,
who left St. Salvador, on the 16th April, we learn that the Con-
stitutional Government had gone peacefully into effect, and that
the country was in a quiet state; all classes appeared satisfied with
the present government. A Portuguese 74 was at Rio Janeiro,
which was to take out to Portugal the King and part of the royal
family. It was understood they were to embark in a few days.

Boston, May 22.
From Rio Janeiro.—We learn by Cap. Wallis, from Rio de
Janeiro, that after the Constitution was adopted, the Bank was
strictly examined, and a deficiency of several millions discovered.
The Judge of the Custom-House, the President of the Bank, and
several other persons, were committed to prison. But it was said
just before Capt. W. sailed that the King had deposited diamonds
in the Bank to cover the loss. His Majesty was making prepa-
rations to depart for Lisbon.

Jamaica.—We perceive by the late English papers, that a peti-
tion was lately presented to George IVth from the House of As-
sembly, Jamaica, in which the petitioners represent, in expres-
sive terms, the state of distress to which Jamaica, and the old
British West India colonies generally, are reduced, by the inade-
quate returns which their staple commodities obtain at market,
owing to burdensome duties, oppressive regulations, and to the
advantages which rival colonies and possessions enjoy, unfettered
by the restrictions of the colonial system.

A declaration of Independence was made in the Spanish Pro-
vince of Texas, (contiguous to Louisiana,) on the first of March,
by an Officer who calls himself President of the Supreme Junta
of that Province.

Lake Navigation.—The Steam Boat Walk-in-the-Water, Capt.
Rogers, left here on Sunday last, for Detroit, on her first trip
this season, with about 40 passengers, and a full freight. The
ice is now nearly out of the Lake and business begins to revive.

Halifax, May 14.
Extract of a letter from Scotland, dated Stirling, 8th March,
1821, to a Gentleman in this town.

"We have had a remarkable mild and open winter; the plough-
ing is almost over, most part of the Beams, and a considerable
quantity of Oats, were sown in the Corse, last month, a thing
quite uncommon at so early a period. The mercantile and me-
chanical and labouring parts of our community have for years past
undergone severe pressure, and privations, and, as to the Farmer,
he appears now to be almost overturned. If any alteration does
not take place soon, either by the advance of the markets, or the
reduction of rents, you need not be surprised at seeing, in a short
time, whole shoals of them arriving on your coast, with bare heads,
ragged breeches, and clouded shins."

A very fine Stallion, of the Clydesdale breed; 7 Bull Calves
and 5 Heifers, of the Ayrshire breed, for the improvement of the
dairy, were brought from Greenock in the ship Thetis. We re-
gret to learn that a Heifer died on the passage. These fine ani-
mals are clients for the Provincial Agricultural Society—4 of the
Heifers for individuals.—W. C.

YORK, (U. C.) May 24.—We have been requested to state that

SIR.—Complaint having been made to the Lieut. Governor
that great inconvenience is sustained by Suitors from a general
neglect on the part of the Sheriffs to execute and return the pro-

consequence of which suits are sometimes lost, and the payment
of them at all events improperly and injuriously delayed.—I have
received His Excellency's commands to call your particular at-

a fair ground of public and general complaint.

last, but they contain nothing new.

THE ITALIANS.

The Italian character has been subject to much obloquy all over
the world, by the late failure of the Neapolitans and Piedmontese
in their attempts to ameliorate their political constitutions. The
necessity of calling in a foreign force, to controul them, however,
shows that there is a general disposition in favor of a better sys-
tem, among the people of Italy, which, in time, will probably pro-
duce the wished for change, either by concessions of the existing
governments, or otherwise. The people were either not suffi-
ciently prepared to resist a powerful foreign force, marching in the
name of their acknowledged sovereigns, or they have been be-
trayed by the selfishness or incapacity of many of their chiefs.
That the Italians are not destitute of personal courage, when pro-
perly organized and led, we conceive the following testimony of
Sir Robert Wilson, who was an eye witness to the facts which he
relates, as unexceptionable.
At a public meeting in London, on the 4th April, Sir Robert
stated as follows:
"It had been a part of his fortune to see the Italian army on the
field of battle, and were he required to cite the most signal and
memorable instance of military conduct, he would say that it
was that in which Eugene Beauharnois took and retook eleven
times a town in Russia, notwithstanding all the efforts of 60,000
men, who kept up a constant cannonade of the most murderous
description. He had been present within a few years at the battle
of Leggio, where he had seen an Italian army engaged, he him-
self being at that time a military correspondent of this Govern-
ment. He could aver that nothing could possibly exceed the
good discipline and conduct of the Italian troops on that occasion."
The fate of the Italians will be a warning to the people of the
Continent generally, who have been deceived in the promises
which were made to them when they rose en masse to expel the
French. The great Military Sovereigns, not only forgetting their
promises, have leagueed together against all changes, and given an
example of the mode in which they intend to proceed, which
nothing can now conceal or disguise. Governments which will
secure equally the interests of all classes of the community, will
either before long be voluntarily established throughout the Con-
tinent, or the next effort will be simultaneous and irresistible.

DISTRICT OF QUEBEC.

AGRICULTURAL REPORT; MAY 1821.

We published no Report for April, because the labours of the
field had then not generally recommenced in this District, owing
to the backwardness of the season. Some wheat was however
sown in favorable situations during the last days of that month.
The first eight days of May were dry and favorable for putting
the seed in the ground. All the dry grounds which had been
ploughed last fall, were sown during that time with wheat or
pease. From the 10th to the end of the month the weather was
wet, which has prevented some low lands from being sown in
season. The sowing of oats has been retarded from the same
cause. New land intended to be cleared off and sown this spring,
has also been prevented from being prepared in time for wheat
and pease. They will however all be in good time for barley and
turnips.
Potatoes planting was commenced towards the close of the
month, and latterly, owing to a favorable change of weather, has
been nearly completed in good season.
The young wheats, pease and oats have a very favorable ap-
pearance, and the late dry and warm weather has brought them
forward rapidly. In some fields the wheat and pease begin to
cover the ground and shade the roots against the scorching rays
of the sun. The quantity sown upon the whole has been less
than usual, although, from the abundance of seed, it is greater
than could have been expected, seeing the unfavorable state of
the markets.
The meadows, although they have suffered in some places
from the frosts of last fall, when there was but little snow on the
ground to protect them, have now a more promising appearance
than usual. The patches of fall wheat which have been sowed
about the town have stood the weather well, and are luxuriant.
Turnips left in the ground last fall have also stood out the win-
ter in favorable situations, with very little injury.
The pastures have been better than usual in affording sufficient
food for cattle. Indeed there are no good pastures in the coun-
try generally, excepting those in which the white clover and franc
join spring up naturally after a grain crop, and they are always
late. Where red clover and timothy were sown on clean land and
of tolerable heart last spring, immediately after sowing the grain,
and properly harrowed in, they have stood out the drought of last
summer and are now rank and strong. Portions of the same, from
which a hay crop was taken last year, afforded good food by the
20th of the month.
Hay and all kinds of fodder have been scarce and dear through-
out the month. Hay sold as high as 26 Dollars per 100 bundles
of 16lbs. in the Quebec Market. All kinds of stock are lean and
would not bring now, the price of the last two months fodder.
Milk Cows are selling at from 15 to 20 dollars, working oxen
from 20 to 30 dollars, good working horses from 30 to 50.
Flour is selling on the Market at Quebec, from one dollar and
a half to two dollars, per 120lbs. Day labour has fallen from one
dollar, which was still paid in several lumber establishments last
year, as low as half a dollar, the labourer finding his own provi-
sions. The value of all kinds of property is diminishing nearly in
the same proportion. Butchers' meat is the only article of Do-
mestic produce that maintains its price, and that only owing to
the scarcity of cattle fit for slaughter, which is the unavoidable

result of a deficiency of proper food, and for which there is no re-
medy but an improvement in our agriculture.

Quebec, 6th June, 1821.
The Steam-Boat, the New-Swiftsure, left this port yesterday
forenoon for Kamouraska, being her first trip. We understand,
if sufficient encouragement offer, she will continue to go to that
place weekly, during the season, which will greatly facilitate the
communication between Quebec and the fine country on the south
shore of the St. Lawrence.
