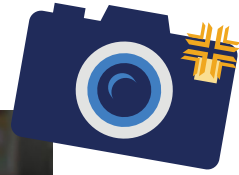
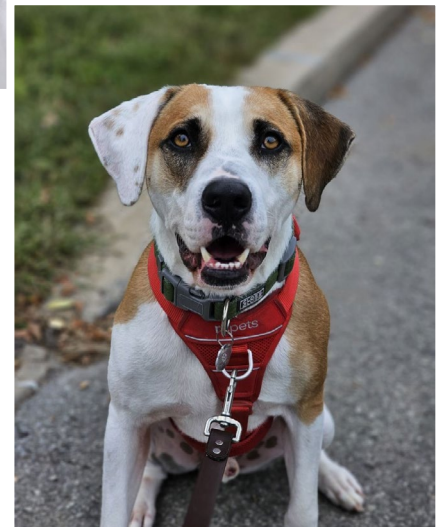
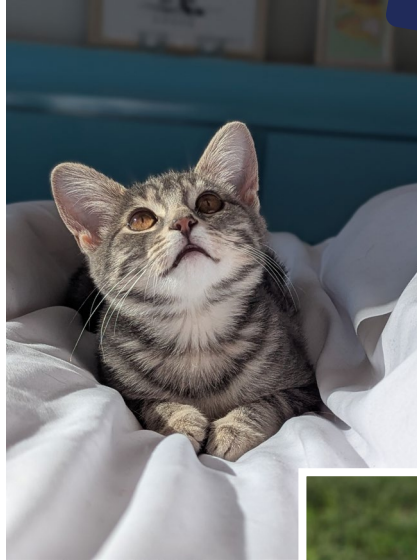
FOUR-LEGGED MODEL CITIZENS INSPIRE GOOD BEHAVIOUR

GETTING READY TO MAKE WAVES

Pierrefonds-Roxboro will soon unveil a brand-new aquatic complex that is sure to become a source of pride for the entire community. Modern, sustainable, and created with everyone in mind, the Pierrefonds-Roxboro Aquatic Complex is set to impress... and make everyone want to dive right in!

A SUSTAINABLE BUILDING AT THE HEART OF THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

The new aquatic complex is aiming for LEED Gold v4 certification, proof of a sustainable, energy-efficient building designed with the future in mind. This approach includes improved energy efficiency, reduced greenhouse gas emissions, the use of geothermal systems to optimize mechanical operations, and responsible water management.

In terms of amenities, the complex will feature a 25-metre pool with eight lanes, 1-metre and 3-metre diving boards, a recreational basin with a wading area, a slide and water games, a hammam, a multi-functional room, welcoming gathering spaces, and an observation area for cheering on athletes.

Located at the heart of the borough, steps away from the borough hall, the library, the cultural centre, local schools, active transportation routes, and the REM, this new facility will be easily accessible to everyone and is poised to become a true community hub.

DESIGNED FOR COMFORT, SAFETY AND INCLUSION

Designed with accessibility in mind, the complex offers ramps, an elevator, spacious walkways, and easy pool access through a gradual-entry beach and a ramp, ensuring a smooth, barrier-free visit for all.

Universal changing rooms

One of the major features of the complex will be its universal changing room: an inclusive space designed to make everyone's experience easier. Families can stay together, children can be accompanied more easily, and people with reduced mobility will benefit from a better-adapted environment when assisted by caregivers. School groups, day camps, and community organizations will also appreciate this modern setup.

The system is simple: everyone changes in a private cabin, and nudity is not permitted in shared areas to ensure the comfort of all. Safety is provided by trained staff, supported by appropriate monitoring and facilities designed with the well-being of all users in mind.

In short, the complex will offer an inclusive, safe, and easy-to-use environment where everyone can fully enjoy their experience, regardless of age, situation, or level of mobility.

Our neighbourhoods are changing



A NEW SKATEPARK ROLLS INTO À-MA-BAIE PARK

A new chapter is unfolding for urban sports enthusiasts as the borough's very first skatepark takes shape at À-Ma-Baie Park. Construction began this spring and will progress toward the delivery of a fully completed space by July.

Designed by skaters, for skaters, the skatepark will offer a variety of runs suited to all skill levels, along with dedicated areas for spectators.

An investment of \$1.7 million has been made in this project, which aims to create a welcoming, safe and accessible gathering place for users of all ages and experience levels, while also becoming a true focal point for the community.

Its strategic location further reinforces this key role. Located near the Youth Centre, the Gerry-Robertson Community Centre, and directly across from the Sunnybrooke REM station, the site is naturally positioned as a dynamic hub for action sports enthusiasts and neighbourhood residents.

Special attention is being given to landscaping and water management. Vegetated planting areas will provide welcome shade on sunny summer days while capturing rainwater to prevent pooling on concrete surfaces. Retention basins installed near the skatepark structures will complement this system, helping to protect the stormwater drainage network.

A FUTURE PUBLIC SQUARE AT THE HEART OF CIVIC LIFE

The future Pierrefonds-Roxboro public square has reached a key milestone with the announcement, last November, of the winning team of the landscape architecture competition. Following a rigorous selection process, the jury chose the proposal submitted by WAA Montréal inc., in collaboration with Ponton Guillot.

Envisioned as a true civic hub, the public square will take shape between the borough hall and the new aquatic complex, just steps from the Pierrefonds Library. The project stands out for its balanced integration of event spaces and everyday uses, encouraging social interaction and year-round activity. The inclusion of a water square and misting features highlights the community's connection to water, a strong reference to the Rivière des Prairies, which borders the borough for nearly 27 kilometres.

The design also incorporates innovative approaches to development in flood-prone areas, allowing the site to better adapt to future high-water events. As part of a broader vision focused on mobility and sustainability, the future public square will play a key role in revitalizing the area by blending green spaces with modern amenities.

Construction is expected to begin in spring 2027, with the site opening planned for spring 2028.



Our neighbourhoods are changing



OUR NEW SPEED CAMERAS ARE PROVING EFFECTIVE

Since last year, 44 educational speed cameras have been installed near the borough's 22 primary and secondary schools. Just a few months after their installation, we are already seeing a change among drivers: the average speed is reduced by just over 10 km/h according to our collected data. This reduction certainly contributes to improving the safety of students, parents, teachers, and all road users of the surrounding areas. The installation of educational speed cameras is a crucial step in the operation to improve safety in all school zones in Pierrefonds-Roxboro, which is a part of a comprehensive approach to make our streets safer for the little feet that cross them!



ENHANCING SAFETY ON BOULEVARD LALANDE

Lalande Boulevard and Promenade-Lalande Park will undergo a transformation this year to make the area safer, greener and more enjoyable to use.

Starting in July, Boulevard Lalande will be redeveloped between Saraguay East and Colonial Streets. Beginning in September, the boulevard will become one-way eastbound, with the addition of two protected bike lanes and a safe, year-round sidewalk along the river. Narrowing the roadway will help slow traffic, while maintaining access to schools and private residences.

At Promenade-Lalande Park, vegetation work began this spring. Lawns will be replaced with native plant species to promote biodiversity, reduce erosion and better protect the Rivière des Prairies. The park's landscape design will also be enhanced with new street furniture.

The work is scheduled to be completed in the fall, marking a crucial step toward a more sustainable and safer living environment for the community.

OLYMPIA PARK GETS A FRESH NEW LOOK

Work to refurbish the play areas at Olympia Park began this spring. The goal is to offer families and visitors an even more welcoming, safe and enjoyable space to spend time.

The project includes upgrades to park lighting, with the replacement and addition of new lampposts to improve visibility in the evening. Existing play structures and site furniture will be refurbished, while new equipment will be added to enhance the play experience for children.

The play areas will also benefit from a new impact-absorbing surface, helping to improve safety for youngsters. A drinking fountain will be installed, and the park's network of pathways will be refurbished and expanded to make moving through the park easier.

Finally, new plantings will round out the improvements, adding greenery and freshness to this much-loved neighbourhood space. A transformation that promises to restore Olympia Park's full appeal for the warmer months ahead.

WELCOME A TREE, CULTIVATE THE FUTURE

Would you like to help make your neighbourhood greener while strengthening the urban canopy? Pierrefonds-Roxboro is continuing its tree-planting program. You can submit your address to have a tree planted on the municipal right-of-way, the space between your property and the street.

The planting team will then assess feasibility. If the location is eligible, the borough will plant and maintain a tree.

What are the benefits of having trees in urban areas:

- They reduce heat islands.
- They help protect human health, particularly by filtering air pollutants.
- They enhance the visual appeal of neighborhoods and increase biodiversity.
- They strengthen our resilience to climate change.

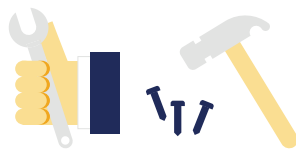

Better-suited solutions to dispose of your hazardous waste

The City of Montréal no longer offers mobile household hazardous waste (HHW) collection. The public now has a wide range of options for safely disposing of HHWs. Thanks to the establishment of an extensive network of permanent drop-off points throughout the region. For example, at retail stores, auto repair shops, pharmacies, and other specialized locations—it is now possible to drop off these items at any time, without being restricted by operating hours.

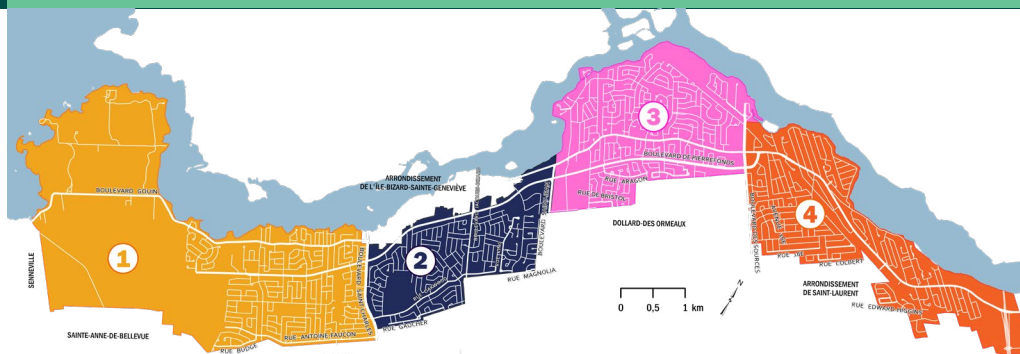
Ecocentres: A Popular Choice Among Residents

In addition to the 360 drop-off points throughout the metropolitan area, ecocentres remain a preferred option for disposing of paint, batteries, gas cylinders, aerosol cans, and other potentially hazardous products. In fact, they collect most hazardous waste on the island, which speaks to their effectiveness and widespread use by the public.

Important reminder

Do not dispose of these items in the environment, in the trash, or in the recycling bin. If in doubt, check with Recyc-Québec's "Ça va où?" tool.

By using permanent drop-off points and centers, we help protect the environment and ensure responsible waste management.
