Whereas it is expedient to erect into a Township a certain tract
of Our waste land situate, lying, and being in Our District of Quebec, in Our said Province and in
and by the report of The Honorable John A. McDonald, Esquire, Our Commissioner of Crown Lands
of and for Our said Province made and certified to the Governor General of Our said Province,
described as follows that is to say, "All that certain tract or parcel of the waste lands of the Crown
situate in the County of Megantic in the District of Quebec, bounded and abutted as follows, to wit,
on the north west by the Township of Lambton, on the south east by the Township of Gayhurst, on the
south west by the County line of Sherbrooke, on the north East by the Township of Forsyth and on the
East by the Township of Dorset. Beginning at a squared post standing on the line of division between
the Counties of Sherbrooke and Megantic marking the north westernmost corner of the Township of
Aylmer and the southernmost corner of the Township of Lambton, thence running along the division line
between the said Townships magnetically north forty eight degrees East variation thirteen degrees west
five hundred and sixty chains more or less to a squared post marking the northernmost corner of the said
Township of Aylmer and the easternmost corner of the said Township of Lambton, thence running along
the division line between the said Townships of Forsyth and Aylmer magnetically south forty two degrees
East three hundred and seventy three chains more or less to the rear line of the Township of Dorset, at a
squared post marking the easterly angle of the said Township of Aylmer thence along the rear line
of the Township of Dorset magnetically south thirteen degrees west two hundred and ninety chains
more or less to a squared post marking the south east angle of the said Township of Aylmer, thence
along the line dividing the Townships of Aylmer and Gayhurst south forty eight degrees west three
hundred and seventeen chains more or less to a squared post standing on the line dividing the Counties
of Sherbrooke and Megantic aforesaid and marking the southernmost corner of the said Township
of Aylmer, thence along the said County line magnetically north forty two degrees west five hundred and
forty chains more or less to the place of beginning, containing twenty seven thousand eight hundred and
forty two acres more or less and the usual allowance for highways. - The said tract or parcel of land
being laid off and divided into ranges of seventy chains each in depth numbered from the South west
towards the north East that is to say from the first Range to the Eighth Range inclusively, each of the
said Ranges being subdivided into lots of the dimensions of Eighteen chains in perpendicular breadth
by the depth of seventy chains more or less and containing one hundred and twenty acres of Land more or less
and the usual allowance for highways as near as the nature and circumstances of the case will com-
mand and except the irregular or broken lots that is to say, the first, second, third, fourth and fifth Ranges
subdivided

subdivided into thirty lots each, the Sixth Range into twenty eight lots, the Seventh Range into twenty five lots and the Eighth Range into twenty three lots all numbered from the north west towards the south east, as near as the nature and circumstances of the case will permit conformable to the actual survey of the said Township of Aylmer.

Now Know Ye that We of Our especial grace certain knowledge, and mere motion have created, erected, and constituted, and by these presents do create, erect, and constitute the said tract of Our waste land so as aforesaid, herebefore described and every part and parcel thereof, a Township for ever from and after the first day of February next to be, continue and remain a Township and by the name of Aylmer for ever hereafter to be called, known and distinguished. And We do moreover of Our especial grace, certain knowledge and mere motion declare that these Our Letters Patent shall be good and effectual in law to all intents, constructions, and purposes whatsoever, notwithstanding any misbeheading, misnaming or other imperfections or omissions of or concerning the said tract of land hereby erected into the Township of Aylmer aforesaid.

In Testimony Whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness Our Right Trusty and Right Well beloved Cousin James Earl of Elgin and Kincardine Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle Governor General of British North America and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over Our Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and the Islands of Prince Edward and Vice Admiral of the same &c. &c. &c.
At Montreal in Our said Province this Eighteenth day of January in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight and in the Eleventh year of Our Reign.
