"Of course you are not holding out any financial support, but if this is seriously and promptly tendered there will be no lack of willing workers."

"There is a well-organized committee, and the expenses of the Carnival should be borne by those who derive a direct benefit from it, such as hotels, restaurants, and amusements."

"The skating rink should come forward too. It is not fair that gentlemen who have no special interest in the event should be asked to subsidize the whole thing."

"There can be no doubt of the fact that the skating rink should be one of the best of good things by attracting large numbers of the most desirable class of visitors who left a great deal of money with our people by coming to the Carnival."

"How much money will be required this year?"
