DRAIN TILES.

TO THIS MACHINE has been awarded several Prizes in England, including the PRIZE MEDAL OF THE GREAT EXHIBITION OF INDUSTRY OF 1851.

The attention of AGRICULTURISTS is invited to the subject of TILE DRAINING, which has been found to be the cheapest and best mode of Draining Land; and improving both the quantity and quality of the Crops.

It is no longer an experiment, but a well ascertained fact, that in order to obtain early and abundant crops, the land must be thoroughly drained; and no system of draining is so cheap or so durable, as that of Earthen Pipes or Tiles. These tiles are made in lengths of one foot each, with a hole in the center, and a small notch at each end, to fit them together.

All lands require draining, and no country stands more in need of it than Canada, where the Frost retards the work of the Farmer so long the Spring. Not only does thorough drain-
