REIGNING KING AND EMPEROR.

Edward VII., born November 9, 1841, son of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha; married March 10, 1863, to Princess Alexandra, eldest daughter of King Christian IX. of Denmark; succeeded to the crown on the death of his mother, January 22, 1901.

The Queen, Alexandra, daughter of Christian IX., King of Denmark, was born at Copenhagen, December 1st, 1844, and was married to His Majesty (then Prince of Wales) at Windsor, March 10th, 1863.

SURVIVING CHILDREN OF THE KING.

I. George Frederick Ernest Albert, Prince of Wales Earl of Chester, Duke of Cornwall and Duke of York, the heir apparent, born January 3, 1865; married July 6, 1893, to Victoria Mary, (born May 26th, 1867) daughter of the Duke of Teck. Offspring: (1) Edward Albert, born June 23, 1894; (2) Albert Frederick, born December 14, 1895; (3) Victoria Alexandra, born April 25, 1897; (4) Henry William, born March 31, 1900.

II. Princess Louise, Duchess of Fife (Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar) born February 20, 1867; married July 27, 1889, to the Duke of Fife. Offspring: (1) Alexandra Victoria, born May 17, 1891; (2) Maud Alexandra, born April 3, 1893.

III. Princess Victoria Alexandra, born July 6, 1868.

IV. Princess Maud Charlotte, born Nov. 26, 1869; married July 22, 1896, Charles, second son of the Crown Prince of Denmark.

The deceased children of the King and Queen are Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, born Jan. 8, 1864, died January 14, 1892. Prince Alexander John Charles Albert, born April 6, died April 7, 1871.

THE SURVIVING BROTHER AND SISTERS OF THE KING.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, now the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879, and has issue one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, born April 14, 1857; married to His Royal Highness Prince Henry of Battenburg, July 29, 1885, who died January 20, 1896; issue three sons and a daughter.

Postage.—Letters addressed to places in Canada and United States, 2 cents per oz., or fraction thereof.

Great Britain (by Canadian or New York Mail Steamers), 2 cents per ½ oz., or fraction thereof.

Letters addressed to places in Canada must be at least partially prepaid, and those addressed to the United States must be prepaid at least a full rate, 2 cents, otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Letters addressed to places in Canada, and partly prepaid, will be forwarded, subject on delivery to double the amount of deficient postage.

Re Directed Letters.—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable.

Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office Box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination.

Request Letters.—Letters from places in Canada and the United States covered by envelopes bearing a "Request," either printed or written, that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated.

Printed or written requests for direct return may be complied with in the case of undelivered letters from Newfoundland.

Special Delivery.—The senders of letters posted at any Post-office in Canada and addressed to a city Post-office now having free delivery by letter carriers shall, on payment by special delivery stamps of the face value of 10 cents, affixed one to each letter in addition to the ordinary postage to which the same are liable, will secure their special delivery to the persons to whom they are addressed within the limits of letter carrier delivery at any of the following Post-offices in cities, via: Hali fax, St. John, N. B., Fredericton, Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Kingston, Toronto, Brantford, Hamilton, London, Winnipeg, Victoria and Vancouver.

Post Cards.—For Canada and the United States, 1 cent each. For Great Britain, Newfoundland, and all Postal Union countries, 2 cents each. Reply cards, for Canada and U. S., 2 cents each. Nothing must be attached to a Post Card.

Second Class Matter.—Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication are authorized to pass at the bulk rate of a half cent per lb. to regular subscribers in Canada, the United States, and Newfoundland.

An exception is made in favor of newspapers and periodicals published not more frequently than once per week, and addressed (for regular subscribers) to post offices situated within a circular area of 40 miles in diameter, the centre of which must either be the place of publication or some point not more than 20 miles distant therefrom. Such papers will continue to enjoy exemption from postage as heretofore.

The postage on newspapers and periodicals issued less frequently than once a month and addressed to regular subscribers or news agents, and on all specimen newspapers, is 1 cent per lb. or fraction of a lb.

British periodical publications, and other foreign publications, can be remailed by newsdealers to subscribers in Canada and the United States at the bulk rate of 1c. per lb.

Third Class Matter, Newspapers and Periodicals.—Transient newspapers for any place in Canada or United States, 1 cent per 4 oz. For Great Britain and other European countries, see Foreign Postage Table.

Books, etc., and Miscellaneous Matter.—The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars (wholly in print), occasional publications, etc., addressed to Canada, is 1 cent per 4 oz. To the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The postage on Bank pass books, Exhibitors Entry Tickets, Manuscripts, Printed Stationery, Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, Sheet Music (whether printed or written, including music books, whether stitched or bound), etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any European country is 1 cent per 2 oz. No package must exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight for Canada and United States is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada is 7 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 4th Class Matter; when posted for delivery in Canada the postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States, and all Foreign countries, at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter rate—but Deeds, Wills, Insurance Policies and Mortgages may be sent if prepaid 1 cent per 2 oz.

Patterns and Samples.—*Bona fide* Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

The limit of weight to United Kingdom is 5 lbs; limit of size, 2 ft. in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

The limit of weight to other postal union countries is 12 oz; limits of size: 1 ft. in length by 8 in. in width and 4 in. in depth.

The postage on sample packets to postal union countries 2c. for the first 4 ozs., and 1c. for each additional 2 ozs.

Fourth Class Matter.—Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight 5 lbs.; of size, two feet six in. in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 4th Class must be open to inspection, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of Fourth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs Inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobster, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 4th Class Matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 4th Class, if securely put up.

PARCEL POST.

Registration.—Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. The fee on all classes of articles addressed to countries to which matter may be registered is 5c.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of the said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents. All Classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

The public are reminded that registered letters are only carried on trains that are accompanied by railway mail clerk. Hence a registered letter and an ordinary letter posted simultaneously will often be received at different times.

Prohibited Articles and Publications.—Explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, or liquid, or any matter likely to injure usual contents of the mails, or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office.

Glass, in any form, matches, liquids, fish, fruit and oils are prohibited unless put up in the manner prescribed under 4th class matter. Any obscene or immoral book, or other publication of an indecent, immoral, seditious, disloyal, scurrilous or libellous character, or any post card or post band or wrapper upon which there are words of the character aforesaid, or any letter or circular concerning an illegal lottery, so-called, gift-concert or other similar enterprise offering prizes or concerning schemes devised and intended to deceive and defraud the public, and newspapers, etc., containing advertisements of any obscene and immoral prints, publications, etc.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries, except to the United States.

Odd cents may be made up by affixing Canadian Postage Stamps, not exceeding nine cents in value, to the face of a Postal Note, which stamps may be purchased at time of obtaining the Postal Note.

Postal Notes are payable only at Money Order Offices in Canada.

Persons can purchase at one time Postal Notes to the number of ten or upwards, with a view to using them at a future time. In that case a cover will be supplied for the purpose of making a book.

The holder of a Postal Note may cause payment to be deferred for any period not exceeding 10 days by writing across the face of the note: "Payable after—days."

For every three months that elapse after the date of the issue of a Postal Note, the payee must affix Postage Stamps equivalent to the commission.

The third-class shall include all carts, wagons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid,

Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses employed in drawing the above mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

TARIFF OF CARTAGE.

From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance does not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile.

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts.; beef, pork or fish, five barrels of 3 tierces, 15 cts.; coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts.; crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts.; flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts.; grain, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; lumber, sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet, broad measure, 15 cts.; salt or rice, six bags or six bar-

rels, 15 cts.; firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts.; firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts.; furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts.; lumber, green or hard, from rafts, 500 feet board measure, 20 cts.; molasses, sugar or oil, one pancheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts.; pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts.; bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods, 10 cents, and from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

From any place in the western section of the first division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 20 cts.; the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents.; the stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents.; the St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents.; St. Bonaventure Street from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 25 cts.; and vice versa for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 30, 20, 25 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First division.—The first division shall comprise the east, centre, and west wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub-divided into two sections, eastern and western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste. # 4

Second division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence wards (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

Third division.—The third division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St. Louis, St. James and St. Mary wards.

TARIFF OF WATER RATES.

Dwelling houses, $\frac{7}{8}$ per cent on the assessed rental; stores, shops, offices, &c., \$4 on the 1st \$50 of assessed rental, and \$4 on each additional \$25 or part thereof; churches at shop rates on rental based at 4 per cent on their assessed value; hotels, taverns, eating houses and restaurants, \$12 on 1st \$100 of assessed rental and \$5 on each additional \$50 or part thereof, provided that when the rent is \$1000 and over and at least twenty furnished rooms exist, water shall be charged by meter at \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet; horses, \$2 each; cow \$1 each; horse stalls, livery stable keepers, horse dealers, tavern keepers, &c., shall pay \$1.50 for each stall whether occupied or unoccupied; public baths, or baths for the use of which a charge is made, \$6 each tub; baths in dwelling houses or tenements assessed on a yearly rental of \$150 or over, each \$1 per annum; water closets in business premises, suites of offices, studies, &c., pan with cistern, \$4, where water runs continuously \$15 each; urinals in stores, offices, &c., \$1, hotels, taverns, &c., \$3, continuous running, \$15 each; steam engines, \$6 per horse-power or \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet by meter; building materials, 6 cts. per 1000 bricks, 3 cts. per toise of masonry and \$3 per 1000 yards plastering; fountains, \$2 for every 1000 cubic feet, supplied by meter; hand hose, of not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch orifice, \$2 per annum; meter rates, distilleries, breweries, railways, laundries, hotels, colleges, seminaries, boarding schools, nurseries, hospitals, asylums, &c., dye houses, photographic studios, and all manufacturing establishments generally, \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet; meter rent per annum, $\frac{1}{2}$ '' \$2, $\frac{3}{4}$ '' \$2, $\frac{1}{4}$ '' \$3, 1'' \$4, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ '' \$8, 2'' \$12, 3'' \$25, 4'' \$40, 6'' \$75.

Dates of Payment.—The water rates are due and payable on the 1st day of September in each year, up to which

date there will be allowed a discount of 3 per cent. But payment may be made in two instalments, without discount, provided not less than one half is paid on or before the 8th of September, and the balance on or before the 8th November, and in default of payment of the first instalment within the specified time the whole rate shall become due and exigible. All charges for specific supplies, or for fractional parts of the year shall be payable in advance, before the water is turned on. Meter rates—Water supplied by meter is payable quarterly.

Stopping Supply.—The water supply will be cut off if not paid when due.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court, as a high Court of Appeal, constituted by Dominion Statute: Revised Statutes of Canada (Chap. 135), is composed of a chief justice and five puisné judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions; the first beginning on the third Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May, and the third on the first Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-52 Vict., chap. 16, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the Crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties; in cases respecting patents of invention, trade-marks, copyright and industrial designs and in respect to land patents; cases against Crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the Crown is plaintiff or petitioner. Admiralty jurisdiction is vested in the Exchequer Court of Canada, under 53-54 Vic. (Imperial) ch. 27 and 54-85 Vic. (Canadian) ch. 29. The Exchequer Court is also an Imperial Prize Court in time of war.

The Court sits at Ottawa every Monday at 11 a.m., except during vacation or the absence of the judge, for hearing motions, demurrers, etc., and for the trial of causes at such places and times as are fixed by the judge, by general or special orders.

TARIFF OF WHARFAGE.

The following rates shall be levied as hereinafter set forth on the after mentioned articles when landed or

shipped in the harbour, or moved by rail on the harb tracks or deposited within the harbour. No DISCOUNT ALLOWED.

- Grain, 3 cents per ton.
- Chit rice, coal, coke, corn starch, flour, glucose sugar, glucose syrup, lard, lard-oil, malt, meal, meat, oil cake, seeds of all kinds, tallow, unhulled rice, wood pulp, 6 cents per ton.
- Asbestos, asphalt, ballast, bone dust, bone black, cement, charcoal dust, clay, coarse salt in bags and bulk, earthen drain pipes, fire-bricks, ganister, gypsum, iron ore, marble and all other stone phosphates, sand, slate, scoriae-blocks, whiting, 8 cents per ton.
- Apples, boxes in crates or mats, crates and their contents, fish (not in tins), hay, horses, neat cattle, onions and vegetables, oranges, lemons and other green fruits, pitch, potatoes, sheep, steel rails for railways and tramways, straw, swine, tar, tobacco, zinc and lead ores, 12 cents per ton.
- Pig and scrap iron, pot and pearl ashes, raw and refined sugar, scrap steel, scrap tin, 16 cents per ton.
- Bricks, 8 cents per thousand.
- Cordwood, 4 cents per cord.
- Lumber and timber, 8 cents per thousand feet board measure.

On all goods, wares and merchandise, except bullion and specie, not elsewhere specified, 20 cents per ton.

On goods upon which, in the opinion of the Harbour Commissioners, it is not convenient to ascertain the rates according to the above provisions, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to levy a rate of one fifth of one per cent. on the value thereof.

On packages measuring under 10 cubic feet and weighing less than two hundred and fifty pounds, 5 cents.

No entry shall be less than 5 cents.

Barges landing bricks, cordwood, sand and hay allowed ten running days in which to discharge their cargo on which the above wharfage rates will be paid. After that delay they will pay one half of one cent per day on their registered tonnage for every day that they remain at the wharf.

No fish is allowed to be sold on the property of the Harbour Commissioners.

On all goods except bricks, cordwood, sand and hay remaining on the wharves more than four clear working days after notice given for their removal by the Harbour Master in the case of goods imported, there shall be levied additional rates as follows:—

- On cement, one cent per barrel per day.
- On salt, one-half cent per bag per day.
- On iron, one-half cent per hundredweight per day.
- On bricks, 10 cents per thousand per day.
- On drain-pipes and ALL NON-ENUMERATED ARTICLES, one half cent per hundredweight per day.
- For the purpose of this By-law a ton shall be calculated as being 2,000 pounds weight, or forty cubic feet measurement, according as the goods to which the same applies have been or shall be carried by water by ton weight or ton measurement.

The weight of the articles hereinafter described may be estimated as follows:—

- Ashes, pot or pearl, three barrels to one ton.
- Apples, flour, meal, potatoes, nine barrels to one ton.

Course of Study.

FOR THE DEGREE OF B.A.

First year.—Greek or Latin English and History, Mathematics Physics, Latin or Greek or French or German.

Second Year.—Any three of which (d), (e) or (g) must be one:—(a) English; (b) Latin or Greek; (c) Greek or Latin or a Modern Language; (d) Mathematics, including Dynamics or Elementary Biology; (e) Chemistry, Laboratory work in addition; (f) Logic and Psychology; (g) Hebrew; (h) German or French.

Third or Fourth Years.—Language and Literature—English, Latin, Greek, Sanskrit, French, German, Italian in alternate years, Semitic Languages, Comparative Philology (half course), History, Philosophy and Law—History, Logic and Metaphysics, Moral Philosophy, Political Science, Economics, Roman Law, Constitutional Law and History; Art (History of) and Archaeology (two half courses in successive years); History of Philosophy, Science—Mathematics, Mechanics, Geometrical, Optics and Astronomy (two half courses); Physics: Sound, Light, Heat (full course), Electricity and Magnetism (full course), Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Geology (full course), Physiology, Anatomy in the Faculty of Medicine.

Each will be studied in lecture courses extending over not more than four hours per week, with collateral reading, and, in the case of the science subjects, laboratory work. One subject chosen in the Third Year *must* be continued by every student in his Fourth Year; two subjects *may* be continued if application to that effect be granted by the Faculty or the Advisory Committee of the Faculty. Of the whole six courses, one must be chosen by all candidates from the list of subjects (other than Mathematics) included under the head of Science, except in cases where Chemistry or Biology has been selected as an option in the Second Year.

Students of other Universities may be admitted in any year by certificate and by examination.
