THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Sri Rani Victoria, Kaisar-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel PRINCE CONSORT, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879; issue, a daughter, born Jan. 15, 1882; a son, born Jan. 13, 1883, and a daughter born March 17, 1886.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 22, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 29, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 26, 1883, and a son born July 19, 1884.

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class.....

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for, in the first-class.....

1. For every hearse drawn by one horse.....	10 00

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts.; beef, pork or fish, five barrels or tierces, 15 cts.; coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts.; crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts.; flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts.; grain, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; lumber, sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet, broad measure, 15 cts.; salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts.; firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts.; firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts.; furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts.; lumber, green or hard, from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts.; molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts.; pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts.; bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods, 10 cents, and from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within ¼ mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed 1¼ mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

From any place in the western section of the first division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 20 cts.; the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents.; the stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents.; the St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 40 cents.; St. Bonaventure Street from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 25 cts.; and vice versa for one load.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond

the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid extra for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First division.—The first division shall comprise the east, centre, and west wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub-divided into two sections, eastern and western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St Lambert and St Jean Baptiste streets.

Second division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St Ann, St Antoine, and St Lawrence wards (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

Third division.—The third division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St Louis, St James and St Mary wards.

TARIFF FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

One horse vehicle.—Time allowed—fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 25 cents; for three or four persons, 40 cents. Time allowed—thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 40 cents; for three or four persons, 60 cents.

For the first hour.—For one or two persons, 75 cents; for three or four persons, \$1; for every subsequent hour, for one or two persons, 60 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

Two horse vehicle.—Time allowed—fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 50 cents; for three or four persons, 65 cents. Time allowed—thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 65 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

By the hour.—For one or two persons, \$1; for three or four persons \$1.25.

Baggage.—For each trunk carried in any such vehicle, 10 cents.

No charge for travelling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry by the hand.

a. When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rate to be charged; fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged at pro rata hour rates as above established for drives by the hour;

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty per cent. shall be added to the tariff rates above established;

c. The tariff by time shall apply to all drives extending beyond the city limits, provided the engagement be made within said limits.

CHIMNEY SWEEPING.

Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates for sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, etc.

Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, namely:—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

The said inspector may grant licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whensoever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

The inspector may, for the purposes aforesaid, divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Such sweepers will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents; for sweeping each chimney in a two story house, ten cents; for sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents; for sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents. When any sweeper is especially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties, in cases in which it is sought at the instance of the attorney-general of Canada to impeach or annul any patent of invention or any patent case or other instrument respecting lands; cases against crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the crown is plaintiff or petitioner.

- For the pilotage of any seagoing vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, 62½c.; downwards, 62½c.
- For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.00; downwards, 70c.
- From the harbor of Quebec to Three Rivers and the opposite side of the River St Lawrence, or any place above Portneuf and below Three Rivers:
- For the pilotage of any vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.50; downwards, \$1.50.
- For the pilotage of any seagoing vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.75; downwards, \$1.75.
- For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$2.60; downwards, \$1.90.
- From the harbor of Quebec to Sorel and the opposite side of the River St Lawrence, or any place above Three Rivers and below Sorel:
- For the pilotage of any vessel, in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.50; downwards, \$1.50.
- For the pilotage of any seagoing vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.87½; downwards, \$1.87½.
- For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$3.15; downwards, \$2.10.
- From the harbor of Quebec to the harbor of Montreal, or to any place above Sorel, and below the harbor of Montreal:
- For the pilotage of any vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$2; downwards, \$2.
- For the pilotage of any seagoing vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$2.50; downwards, \$2.50.
- For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$4.30; downwards, \$2.80.
- From the harbor of Montreal to Sorel or to any place above Sorel, and below Hochelaga, and from Sorel, or any place above Sorel and below Hochelaga, to the harbor of Montreal, for each foot of draught of water for each such pilotage, upwards, \$1; downwards, \$1.
- For the removal of any vessel from one wharf to another in the harbor of Montreal, the sum of 55c.

Tariff of wharfage dues to be levied on all merchandise, animals and things whatsoever landed or shipped in the Harbor of Montreal:

- 25c. per ton on all goods, wares and merchandise not elsewhere specified.
- 20c. per ton on hay, straw, pig and scrap iron, pot and pearl ashes.
- 15c. per ton on apples, crates and their contents, flour, meal, fish, meats, pitch, potatoes, tar, horses, neat cattle, sheep, swine.
- 10c. per ton on ballast, clay, fire-bricks, gypsum, lime, marble, phosphates, sand, salt.
- 7½c. per ton on coal and coke, grain and seeds of all kinds.
- Special: bricks, 10c. per 1000; cordwood, 5c. per cord; lumber, 10c. per 1000 feet, board measure.
- Free — bullion, specie.

On all goods wares and merchandise whatsoever, the quantity of which by weight, measurement or other mode of estimate provided for in the tariff, cannot be conveniently ascertained, it shall be lawful for the Harbor Commissioners to levy a rate of ¼ of one per cent. on the value thereof.

Each entry shall pay not less than 5 cents.
 All property landed on the wharves for re-shipment shall only pay one wharfage.
 The ton mentioned in the Tariff of wharfage dues shall be 2000 lbs. weight, or 40 cubic feet measurement, according to the bill of lading.

POSTAL INFORMATION.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada, addressed to any place within the Dominion, 3 cents per oz. If unpaid, such letter cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter office. If insufficiently prepaid, the letter will (provided at least a partial prepayment is made) be forwarded to its destination, and double the deficiency charged on delivery. Letters mailed at any office for delivery at or from the same office, provided that the office is not one at which free delivery by letter carriers is established, are charged 1 cent per oz., and must be at least partially prepaid; otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter office.

All postage must be prepaid by postage stamps. Letters of this nature mailed at and for delivery from an office at which there is a free delivery by letter carriers are liable to 2 cents per ounce.

Post Cards.—From any place in Canada to any other place in Canada or to the United States, 1 cent each. British and Foreign, 2 cents each.

United Kingdom.—Postage on letters, 5 cents per ½ oz., whether by Canadian or New-York Steamers. If sent unpaid, double postage will be charged.

Newfoundland.—Letters, post cards, newspapers and parcels, same rates and regulations as to United Kingdom. Other matter same rates and regulation as for domestic post.

Bermuda.—Letters, 5 cts. per ½ oz. Newspapers and printed matter generally, 1 cent per 2 oz.

United States.—The rate on letters to the United States is the same as in Canada, and at least one rate must be prepaid.

Registration of Letters.—Persons posting letters containing value should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the postmaster a certificate of registration.

The charge for registration (use registration stamp), in addition to the postage, is, on all classes of matter, five cts.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must, in all cases, be prepaid by stamp.

Registered letter stamps have been issued of the denomination of 5 cents, which may be obtained at any Stamp Agency.

Registration stamps cannot be used in payment of postage.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a letter; but a registered letter can be traced where an unregistered letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven.

Book Post, etc.—A book packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of literature or

art, maps or prints, photographs, daguerreotypes when not on glass, or in frames containing glass; and the books, maps, etc., may be either written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the three, provided that no letter be enclosed or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter; and may be either British, Colonial or Foreign. Limit of weight for domestic post, 5 lbs.; for foreign post, 4 lbs. Limit of size, 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width or depth.

Book packets must be open at both ends or both sides, and must not contain any letter or sealed inclosure.

The rate on book packets between any two places in Canada is 1 cent per 4 oz., which must be prepaid by stamps.

The rate to Great Britain, the United States and Newfoundland is 1 cent per 2 oz.

Miscellaneous Matter.—Miscellaneous matter, described as under, may pass between places in the Dominion of Canada upon prepayment of a rate of 1 cent per 4 oz. The limit of weight is 5 lbs. The regulations of the British Post-Office do not admit of the transmission by mail to the United Kingdom (or other countries beyond the sea) of miscellaneous matter as such; but a great part of the matter referred to under that head may be forwarded to the United Kingdom by book post.

1. On all books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, handbills, and other matter wholly in print, and on packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions or grafts, patterns or samples of goods or merchandise, the rate of postage is one cent for each four ounces or fraction thereof.

2. On book and newspaper manuscripts, printers' proof sheets, whether corrected or not, maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass; sheet music, whether printed or written; documents partly printed or written, not being letters, or intended to serve the purpose of letters,—such as deeds, insurance policies, militia and school returns, or other documents of like nature,—and on all other miscellaneous matter transmissible by post, and not otherwise herein expressly provided for, the rate of postage is one cent for each two ounces or fraction of two ounces; and the postage rate must in every case be prepaid by postage stamps, or stamped post bands or wrappers; provided that no letter or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter be sent or inclosed in any such package or thing mentioned, and that the same be sent in covers open at the ends or sides, or otherwise so put up as to admit of the contents being, if necessary, easily withdrawn for examination by the officers of the Post Office, to ensure compliance, with this provision (if enclosed in sealed envelopes notched at the ends or sides, or with the corners cut off, letter rate of postage will be charged); and that the postage rate be prepaid by postage stamps or stamped post bands or wrappers in all cases. Limit of weight, 5 lbs.

No packet of miscellaneous matter can be transmitted by mail if it exceed 24 inches in length or 12 inches in width or depth.

Legal and commercial papers generally (including bank pass-books) are liable to letter rate of postage, except when sent as parcels by parcel post, and the exceptions above given to matter of that class are restricted to the documents specified, such as deeds and insurance policies.

Newspapers and Periodicals.—Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada, and issued not less frequently than once a month from a known office of publication or news agency, and addressed and posted to and from the same for transmission by mail to regular subscribers or news agents in Canada and the United States, are sent free; if addressed to Great Britain, they may be posted by the same on prepayment of a rate of one cent for each pound weight in bulk, or fraction of a pound; and such newspapers and periodicals are to be put up into packages delivered into the Post Office, and the postage rate thereon prepaid by the publisher or news agent, being the sender thereof, under such regulations as the Postmaster-general may from time to time make.

To Newfoundland rate is one cent per four ounces. On all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, other than those addressed to regular subscribers or news agents, and *bonâ fide* specimen copies, from office of publication or news agency, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the rate will be one cent per 4 oz., to be invariably prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than 1 oz. each may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp ½ cent each.

The postage on specimen newspapers is one cent per lb.
