REIGNING KING AND EMPEROR.

Edward VII., born November 9, 1841, son of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha; married March 10, 1863, to Princess Alexandra, eldest daughter of King Christian IX., of Denmark; succeeded to the crown on the death of his mother, January 22, 1901.
The Queen, Alexandra, daughter of Christian IX., King of Denmark, was born at Copenhagen, December 1st, 1844, and was married to His Majesty (then Prince of Wales), at Windsor, March 10th, 1863.

SURVIVING CHILDREN OF THE KING.

George Frederick Ernest Albert, Prince of Wales Earl of Chester, Duke of Cornwall and Duke of York, the heir apparent, born January 3, 1864; married July 6, 1893, to Victoria Mary, (born May 26th, 1867) daughter of the Duke of Teck. Offspring: (1) Edward Albert, born June 23, 1894; (2) Albert Frederick, born December 14, 1895; (3) Victoria Alexandra, born April 25, 1897; (4) Henry William, born March 31, 1900.
II. Princess Louise, Duchess of Fife (Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar) born February 20, 1867; married July 27, 1889, to the Duke of Fife. Offspring: (1) Alexandra Victoria, born May 17, 1891; (2) Maud Alexandra, born April 3, 1893.
III. Princess Victoria Alexandra, born July 6, 1868.
IV. Princess Maud Charlotte, born Nov. 26, 1869; married July 22, 1896, Charles, second son of the Crown Prince of Denmark.

The deceased children of the King and Queen are Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale born Jan. 8, 1864, died January 14, 1892. Prince Alexander John Charles Albert, born April 6, died April 7, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1870, and has issue one son and two daughters.
Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodora, born April 14, 1857; married to His Royal Highness Prince Henry of Battenburg, July 29, 1885, who died January 20, 1896; issue three sons and a daughter.

POSTAL INFORMATION.

Postage.—Letters addressed to places in Canada, United States and Mexico, 2 cents per oz., or fraction thereof.

Great Britain and British Colonies and Possessions, 2 cents per ½ oz., or fraction thereof.

Suburban Offices.—For Cote-des-Neiges, Cote des Neiges West, Outremont, Outremont Junction, Ville St. Paul, Cote Visitation, De Lorimer, Notre Dame de Grace, Maisonneuve, Villeneuve, Mount Royal Vale, St. Lambert, Longueuil, Montreal South and Montreal West, 2 cents per oz.

Drop letters for the city, Westmount, St. Henri de Montreal, Cote St. Louis, Mile End, St. Cunegonde, 2 cents per oz.

Letters addressed to places in Canada must be at least partially prepaid, and those addressed to the United States must be prepaid at least a full rate, 2 cents, otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Letters addressed to places in Canada, and partly prepaid, will be forwarded, subject on delivery to double amount of deficient postage.

Re-Directed Letters.—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable.

Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination.

Request and address Letters.—Letters from places in Canada, the United States, Mexico and Newfoundland covered by envelopes bearing a "Request," or the address of the sender either printed or written, that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated. Address letters having no time for return specified are held for a week in cities and for 15 days in other places.

Special Delivery.—The senders of letters posted at any Post-office in Canada and addressed to a city Post-office now having free delivery by letter carriers shall, on payment by special delivery stamps of the face value of 10 cents, affixed one to each letter in addition to the ordinary postage to which the same are liable, will secure their special delivery to the persons to whom they are addressed within the limits of letter carrier delivery at any of the following Post-offices in cities, viz: Halifax, St. John, N. B., Fredericton, Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Kingston, Toronto, Brantford, Hamilton, London, Winnipeg, Victoria and Vancouver.

Post Cards.—For Canada, Mexico and the United States, 1 cent each. For Great Britain, Newfoundland, and all Postal Union countries, 2 cents each. Reply cards, for Canada, Mexico and U. S., 2 cents each. Nothing must be attached to a Post Card.

Second Class Matter.—Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication are authorized to pass at the bulk rate of one quarter of a cent per lb. to regular subscribers provided the distance in Canada which such newspapers and periodicals are required to be transmitted does not exceed 300 miles from the place of publication and provided the newspapers and periodicals are not to be delivered in Canada under the free letter carrier delivery system.

Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication to regular subscribers which do not comply with the foregoing conditions as to distance are subject to a rate of a half cent per lb.

An exception is made in favor of newspapers and periodicals published not more frequently than once per week, and addressed (for regular subscribers) to post offices situated within a circular area of 40 miles in diameter, the centre of which must either be the place of publication or some point not more than 20 miles distant therefrom. Such papers will continue to enjoy exemption from postage as heretofore.

The postage on newspapers and periodicals issued less frequently than once a month and addressed to regular subscribers or news agents, and on all specimen newspapers, is one cent per lb. or fraction of a lb.

British periodical publications, and other foreign publications, can be remailed by newsdealers to subscribers in Canada and Mexico at the bulk rate of 1c. per lb.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals.—Transient newspapers 1 cent per 4 oz.

The above postage rates apply to Canadian Newspapers and periodicals addressed to any place in Canada, Mexico and the United Kingdom and the following British Possessions: Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Guiana, British Honduras, British North Borneo, Ceylon, Cyprus, Falkland Islands, Fiji, Gambia, Gibraltar, Hong Kong, Jamaica, Leeward Islands, Malta, Mauritius, Newfoundland, New Zealand, Northern Nigeria, Sarawak, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Southern Nigeria, Transvaal, Trinidad and Tobago, Turks Islands and Zanzibar.

All newspapers and periodicals addressed to the United States will be subject to the rate of 1 cent per 4 ounces on and after 8 May, 1907, whether posted by Publishers, newsdealers or private individuals.

Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to other countries are subject to the rate of 1 cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof.

Books, etc., and Miscellaneous Matter.—The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars (wholly in print), occasional publications, etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Mexico, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The postage on Exhibitors Entry Tickets, Manuscripts of books or news papers, Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, Sheet Music (whether printed or written, including music books, whether stitched or bound), etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, and Mexico is 1 cent per 2 oz. Most of these articles can be sent to Great Britain and all other countries at the rate of 1c per 2 oz.; but, in the case of manuscript of books or newspapers and manuscript music, minimum prepayment of 5 cents (covering a weight of 2½ ounces) is required. No package must exceed 30 inches in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight in Canada and United States is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada is 10 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 4th Class Matter; when posted for delivery in Canada the postage is 2 cents for the first four ounces or fraction thereof, and 1 cent for each additional 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States, and all Foreign countries, at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter rate.

Patterns and Samples.—*Bona fide* Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 3 lbs. in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 2 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

The limit of weight to United Kingdom is 5 lbs.; limit of size, 2 ft. in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

The limit of weight to other postal union countries is 12 oz.; limits of size: 1 ft. in length by 8 in. in width and 4 in. in depth.

The postage on sample packets to postal union countries 2c. for the first 4 ozs., and 1c. for each additional 2 ozs.

Fourth Class Matter.—Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight 5 lbs.; of size, two feet six in. in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 4th Class must be open to inspection, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of Fourth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs Inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobster, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labeled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 4th Class Matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 4th Class, if securely put up.

Registration.—Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. The fee on all classes of articles addressed to countries to which matter may be registered is 5c.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any place in Canada or to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of the said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents. All Classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and all classes of matter except Parcel Post packages to places throughout the Postal Union; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

The public are reminded that registered letters are only carried on trains that are accompanied by railway mail clerk. Hence a registered letter and an ordinary letter posted simultaneously will often be received at different times.

Prohibited Articles and Publications.—Explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, or liquid, or any matter likely to injure usual contents of the mails, or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office. Celluloid is prohibited, unless mailed in a tin box with tightly fitting cover.

Glass, in any form, matches, liquids, fish, fruit and oils are prohibited unless put up in the manner prescribed under 4th class matter. Any obscene or immoral book, or other publication of an indecent, immoral, seditious, disloyal, scurrilous or libellous character, or any post card or post band or wrapper upon which there are words of the character aforesaid, or any letter or circular concerning an illegal lottery, so-called, gift-concert or other similar enterprise offering prizes or concerning schemes devised and intended to deceive and defraud the public, and newspapers, etc., containing advertisements of any obscene and immoral prints, publications, etc.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries, except to the United States.

Postal Notes are payable at any Money Order or Postal Note office in Canada, and to any Post Office in the United States transacting Money Order business (if the payee resides in a City the Notes must be drawn on the Main City Office — not on a sub office or station.)

Postage stamps must not be affixed to Postal Notes remitted to the United States.

The licenses for carts, trucks and other vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, etc., are divided into three classes, as follows:—

The first class includes all carts, trucks, waggons and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward.

For every cart, truck, or other 2-wheeled vehicle... \$ 5 00

For every wagon or 4-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse..... 9 00

For every wagon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses..... 12 00

For every dabble..... 10 00

The second class includes all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of articles or effects.

For a 2-wheeled cart or truck..... \$8 00

For a 4-wheeled wagon..... 12 00

For a 4-wheeled wagon, 2 horses..... 15 00

The third class includes all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers or gardeners:

For a 2-wheeled cart or truck..... \$10 00

For a 4-wheeled wagon..... 14 00

For a 4-wheeled wagon, 2 horses..... 15 00

1. For every horse drawn by one horse..... 1

2. For every horse drawn by two horses..... 1

No charge shall be made for travelling-bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry by the hand.

a. When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rate to be charged; fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged at *pro rata* rates as above established for drives by the hour.

N.B.—The first sentence of paragraph a, reading as follows: "When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rates to be charged" has always been held by the Courts to mean that, in the event of the drive exceeding half an hour, the hackman must only charge according to the number of minutes occupied for the drive, taking as a basis for calculation the rate of the first hour.

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty p. c. shall be added to the tariff rates above established.

c. The tariff by time shall apply to all drives extending beyond the city limits provided the engagement be made within the limits.

d. Children under 5 years of age and sitting on their parents or guardians' lap will be admitted free of charge, and shall not be held as being included in the word "person" in the said tariff.

e. The word "drive" wherever it occurs in the said tariff, shall be held to admit stoppages within the time fixed for said drives.

TARIFF OF CARTAGE

No return for 1907

From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance does not exceed 1/4 of a mile.

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts.; beef, pork or fish, five barrels of 3 tierces, 15 cts.; coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts.; crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts.; flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts.; grain, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; lumber, sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet, broad measure, 15 cts.; salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts.; firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord three feet long, 15 cts.; firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts.; furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts.; lumber, green or hard, from rafts, 500 feet board measure, 20 cts.; molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts.; pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts.; bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods, 10 cts. s. and from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within 1/2 a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed 1/4 mile,—instead of 15, 20 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

From any place in the western section of the first division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 20 cts.; the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cts.; the stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cts.; the St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cts.; St. Bonaventure Street from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 25 cts.; and *vice versa* for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 30, 20, 25 cts, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cts.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First division.—The first division shall comprise the east, centre, and west wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub divided into two sections, eastern and western, the line of demarkation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste.

Second division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence wards exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

Third division.—The third division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St. Louis, St. James and St. Mary wards.

TARIFF OF WATER RATES.

No return for 1927

Dwelling houses, 7½ per cent on the assessed rental; *tores*, shops, offices, &c., \$4 on the 1st \$50 of assessed rental and \$1 on each additional \$25 or part thereof; hurries at shop rates on rental based at 4 per cent on their assessed value; hotels, taverns, and restaurants, \$12 on 1st \$100 of assessed rental and \$5 on each additional \$50 or part thereof, provided that when the rent is \$1000 and over and at least twenty furnished rooms exist, water shall be charged by meter at \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet; horses, \$2 each; cow \$1 each; horse stalls, livery stable keepers, horse dealers, tavern keepers, &c., shall pay \$1.50 for each stall whether occupied or unoccupied; public baths, or baths for the use of which a charge is made, \$6 each tub; baths in dwelling houses or tenements assessed on a yearly rental of \$150 or over, each \$1 per annum; water closets in business premises, suites or offices, studies, &c., pan with cistern, \$4, where water runs continuously \$15 each; urinals in stores, offices, &c., \$1, hotels, taverns, &c., \$3, continuous running, \$15 each; steam engines, \$6 per horse-power or \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet by meter; building materials, 6 cts. per 1000 bricks 3 cts. per toise of masonry and \$3 per 1000 yards plastering; fountains, \$2 for every 1000 cubic feet, supplied by meter; hand hose, of not more than ¼ of an inch orifice, \$2 per annum; meter rates, distilleries, breweries, railways, laundries, hotels, colleges, seminaries, boarding schools, nurseries, hospitals, asylums, &c., dye houses, photographic studios, and all manufacturing establishments generally, \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet; meter rent per annum, ½" \$2, ¾" \$2, 1" \$3, 1 1/8" \$4, 1 1/2" \$5, 2" \$6, 2 1/2" \$7, 3" \$8, 4" \$10, 6" \$15.

Dates of Payment.—The water rates are due and payable on the 1st day of September in each year, up to which date there will be allowed a discount of 3 per cent. But payment may be made in two instalments, without dis-

count, provided not less than one half is paid on or before the 8th of September, and the balance on or before the 8th November, and in default of payment of the first instalment within the specified time the whole rate shall become due and exigible. All charges for specific supplies, or for fractional parts of the year shall be payable in advance, before the water is turned on. Meter rates—Water supplied by meter is payable quarterly.

Stopping Supply.—The water supply will be cut off if not paid when due.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court, as a high Court of Appeal, constituted by Dominion Statute (Revised Statutes of Canada (1906, Chap. 139), is composed of a chief justice and five puisné judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions; the first beginning on the third Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May, and the third on the first Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-52 Vict., chap. 16, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the Crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties; in cases respecting patents of invention, trade-marks, copyright and industrial designs and in respect to land patents; cases against Crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the Crown is plaintiff or petitioner and in respect of Railway debts under 3 Ed. VII., ch. 21. Admiralty jurisdiction is vested in the Exchequer Court of Canada, under 53-54 Vic. (Imperial) ch. 27 and 54 85 Vic. (Canadian) ch. 29. The Exchequer Court is also an Imperial Prize Court in time of war.

The Court sits at Ottawa every Monday at 11 a.m., except during vacation or the absence of the judge, for hearing motions, demurrers, etc., and for the trial of causes at such places and times as are fixed by the judge, by general or special orders.

From Montreal to Three Rivers.
For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$2.60; downwards, \$1.90.

From the harbor of Quebec to Sorel and the opposite side of the River St Lawrence to any place above Three Rivers and below Sorel.

For the pilotage of any vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.50; downwards, \$1.50.

For the pilotage of any sea-going vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.87½; downwards, \$1.87½.

For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$3.15; downwards, \$2.10.

QUEBEC TO MONTREAL.

From the harbour of Quebec to the harbour of Montreal, or to any place above Sorel and below the harbour of Montreal:

For the pilotage of any vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned) for each foot of draught of water—upwards \$2.00; downwards \$2.00.

For the pilotage of any sea-going vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water—upwards \$2.50; downwards \$2.50.

For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water—upwards \$4.20; downwards, \$2.82.

From the harbor of Montreal to Sorel or to any place above Sorel, and below Hochelaga, and from Sorel, or to any place above Sorel and below Hochelaga, to the harbor of Montreal, for each foot of draught of water for each such pilotage, upwards, \$1; downwards, \$1.

For the removal of any vessel from one wharf to another, within the limits of the harbor; or from any of the wharves into the Lachine Canal; or out of the said Canal to any of the wharves in the harbor; or from the foot of the current; or from Longueuil into the harbor; or from the harbor to the foot of the current or to Longueuil; for a such service, \$5.

TARIFF OF WHARFAGE.

The following rates shall be levied as hereinafter set forth on the after mentioned articles when landed or shipped in the harbour, or moved by rail on the harbour tracks or deposited within the harbour. No DISCOUNT ALLOWED.

Grain, 3 cents per ton.

Chit rice, cinders, coal, coke, corn starch, degreas, flour, glucose sugar, glucose syrup, lard, lard-oil, malt, meal, meat (not in tins), oil cake, pulp board, seeds of all kinds, talc, tallow, unhulled rice, wood pulp, 6 cents per ton.

Asbestos, asphalt, ballast, bone dust, bone black, cement chalk, charcoal dust, clay, coarse salt in bags and bulk earthen drain pipes, fire-bricks, ganister, grindstones, gypsum or plaster made of same, iron ore, marble and all other stone unmanufactured, phosphates, sand, slate, scoria-blocks, whiting, 8 cents per ton.

Alumino ferric, apples, bauxite ore, bottles in crates, mats or bags, corundum ore, crockery, earthenware, felspar, fish (not in tins) glassware, hay, horses, neat cattle, onions and vegetables, oranges, lemons and other green fruits, pitch, potatoes, reeled newspaper, sheep, steel rails for railways and tramways and fish plates, straw, swine, tar, tobacco in leaf, zinc and lead ores, 12 cents per ton.

Corkwood scrap, pig and scrap iron, pot and pearl ashes, raw and refined sugar, scrap steel, scrap tin, spiegeleisen, steel billets, 16 cents per ton.

Building bricks, (ordinary) 8 cents per thousand.

Pressed bricks, 12 cents per thousand.

Enamelled bricks, 20 cents per thousand.

Cordwood, 4 cents per cord.

Lumber and timber, 8 cents per thousand feet board measure.

On all goods, wares and merchandise, except bullion and specie, not elsewhere specified, 20 cents per ton.

For the purpose of this By-law a ton shall be calculated as being 2,000 pounds weight, or forty cubic feet measurement, according as the goods to which the same applies have been or shall be, carried by water, by ton weight or ton measurement, but the following goods, wares and merchandise shall in all cases pay wharfage by measurement, whether carried by ton weight or otherwise, as may appear by the bill of lading:—Agricultural implements, basket ware, books, boots and shoes, brass and bronze goods, builders' hardware, caps, carpets, carriages, church ornaments of all kinds, cigars and cigarettes, clocks, confectionery, corks, crockery, cutlery, dry goods, druggists' sundries, drugs in cases, earthenware, electric apparatus, fancy goods, feathers, fireware, fire arms, fishing apparatus, frames, furniture, furs, glassware, gold leaf, groceries in cases, hairdressing, hats, hollowware, instruments of all kinds, jewellery, lamps and lanterns, liquors, ocher of all kinds, mathematical instruments, matings,

medicines in cases, meters, millinery, mineral waters mouldings, musical instruments, notions, optical instruments, organs, pianos, pictures, plants, plate glass-saddlers' hardware, sauces, settlers' effects, sewing machines, silver leaf, sleighs, small wares, soap, stationery, statues, surgical instruments, tea, textiles, tobacco, tools, toys of all kinds, trees, trunks, umbrellas, valises, wall paper, wines.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, crockery, earthenware and glassware, for which bills of lading show the weight but not the measurement, wharfage shall be paid on the weight at the rate of 18 cents per ton.

The weight of the articles hereinafter described may be estimated as follows:—

Ashes, pot or pearl, three barrels to one ton.

Apples, flour, meal, potatoes, nine barrels to one ton.

Fish, meat, pitch, tar, seven barrels to one ton.

Horses, two to one ton.

Neat cattle, three to one ton.

Raisins, 72 half boxes to one ton

Sheep, fifteen to one ton.

Swine, ten to one ton.

Molasses, Imp. gal., 13 lbs; packages, puncheons, 124 lbs; hdds. and tierces, 80 lbs.; barrels, 46 lbs.; ¼ barrels 23 lbs.

No entry shall be less than ten (10) cents, except for packages measuring under 5 cubic feet or weighing less than one hundred pounds, upon which the wharfage shall be five (5) cents.

All goods landed on the wharves shall be removed therefrom forthwith.

Barges loading bricks, cordwood, sand and hay allowed ten running days in which to discharge their cargo, on which the above wharfage rates will be paid. After that day they will pay one half of one cent per day on their registered tonnage for every day that they remain at the wharf.

On all goods remaining on the wharves or in the sheds for more than five clear working days after the complete discharge of the vessel from which they have been landed, except as hereinafter provided, shall be subject to additional charges as follows:—For each of the first five days, an amount equal to the wharfage paid on said goods and—For each of the second five days double the amount of the wharfage paid on said goods, and,—For each and every day thereafter, five times the amount of wharfage paid on said goods. The Commissioners may remove and store at the expense of whomsoever it may concern all goods not removed within ten clear working days after the complete discharge of the vessel from which the goods were landed.

Consignees who may claim that their goods could not be removed within the above delay on account of the action of H. M. Customs shall furnish to the Commissioners a certificate signed by the Collector of Customs, setting forth the date that their goods were released by Customs.

Goods requiring to be gauged by H. M. Customs shall be allowed a further delay of four days for removal, in addition to the five days above mentioned, before the additional charge will be made.

The agent of every vessel discharging in the harbour the cargo of which is subject to the payment of wharfage dues shall deliver at the Office of the Commissioners, within twenty-four hours after the final discharge of the vessel, a certificate to that effect and immediately after the expiry of five days after the final discharge of the vessel, a list of the goods not removed, with their weight or measurement marks and the names of the consignees as appear on the manifest of the vessel from which the goods were discharged.

After the expiry of the delay given for the removal of goods from the wharves, the Agent of any vessel shall not deliver to the consignee such goods as may not have been removed, unless said consignee produces a certificate from the Secretary of the Commissioners that the additional charges have been paid and when the delay granted by said certificate for the removal of goods has expired, the Agent of any vessel shall discontinue the delivery of said goods until the consignee produces another certificate from the Secretary that the further additional charges accrued have been paid.

Green fruit landed on the wharves and sold by public auction shall be liable to additional charges as herein provided, unless removed within five clear working days after the date of the auction sale of the cargo of the vessel from which it was landed.

No fish is allowed to be sold on the property of the Harbour Commissioners.
