Two Familiar Sayings.

The following letter from a Montreal friend, now resident in New York, appeared in last Saturday's STAR:

To the Editor of Notes and Queries:

MY DEAR SIR.—To settle a dispute with a learned friend, you kindly give the familiar saying, "oil on troubled waters," and "settle the storm."

Though considerable information may be given about both the phrases, "to pour oil on troubled waters" and "to settle the storm," it is impossible to state who originated them.

As regards the former, I clipped from the St. James Gazette, of March 20, the following reference to the above mentioned use of oil:

My friend, the talented author of "Les Vieux Temps" maintains that most modern discoveries were known to the ancients. The use of oil to calm the sea is mentioned by one of these rediscovered discoverers, Mr. Edward Fry, in his "History of the Sea."

So long ago as December 30, 1882, I wrote in the STAR as follows:
