THE WALDENSES AND THE WAR. Nestled amid the deep glens and valleys of the Cottian Alps, are the Waldenses; those primitive Christians of whom Milton wrote in 'Paradise Lost'— 'Even then who kept the truth in pure of all, When all our fathers worshipped devils and idle things.'

This wonderful and interesting people are the subjects of the King of Sardinia, and of all the honors conferred by the liberal constitution granted by the late Carlo Alberto, their views were the most moderate and most approved. From the revolution of 1848 Sardinia recovered the greatest benefit: but the crowning event of that troublesome year was the liberation of the Waldenses from petty persecution, the annoyance of priestly bigotry, and the disability of secular law. Under this Constitution the Waldenses have not only built churches and dissipated the truth openly in Sardinia, and silently in the neighbouring States, but they have been enabled to print the Bible in the Italian language, at that very Turin where, in the latter part of the 17th century, more than ten thousand of their ancestors perished.

In 1850, General Beckwith said to a correspondent of the Journal of Commerce, 'Sardinia will advance in enlightenment, if the King of France and Austria will let her alone.' Twice within the last four years, when the House of Hapsburg have invaded Sardinia, but for the fear of France and England.—N. Y. Journal of Commerce.

THE TRAGEDY AT NIAGARA.—The enquiry into the manner in which Oluf Olsson came by his death at Niagara Falls, was resumed on the evening of Tuesday last, and brought to a close. The jury were about two hours in consultation, after which they returned to a Court and declared themselves unanimously of opinion, that Oluf Olsson came to his death by foul means at the hands of George Reid. They are also of opinion that Olsson was thrown over the bank by Reid. The Globe which reports the evidence at length says:— 'Reid, during the delivery of the verdict, did not betray the least emotion, and seemed the most unconcerned person in the room. The verdict having been recorded, the warrant for Reid's arrest was committed to the custody of the Sheriff of the County of Welland. Reid was taken into custody and handed over to the charge of a constable, who conveyed him to Merrittville, and at four o'clock in the morning, the witnesses having been bound over to appear at the ensuing assizes, the jury were discharged, and the proceedings terminated. The utmost credit is due to Coroner Cornwall for the efficient manner in which he conducted the investigation.'

HEAVY DAMAGES ASKED.—The Court of Common Pleas at St. Louis is engaged in the trial of the case of a Miss. Edie Carrington, versus Henry Shaw, for breach of promise of marriage, in which the damages are laid at One Hundred Thousand Dollars. The fair plaintiff is about twenty-five years of age, while the ungallant defendant is sixty-five years old, but is said to be a Millionaire.

GOOD TIMES IN OTTAWA.—The Banner, of the fortunate city of Ottawa, says:—'In almost every nook and corner of this city improvements are rapidly going on, and the sound of the hammer and the saw is heard in all directions. Houses are being built of all grades and sizes, from the small slab cabin up to the stately mansion of three and four stories in height, and as varied in their architectural form and structure as the state and opinion of their proprietors.

DR. KING'S ARREST.—There is abroad a rumor that the American Government has been asked to demand the surrender of Dr. King (murderer), on the ground of his having been arrested in New York State in an informal manner. His having been imprisoned, brought away, and presented to the authorities, although it might require the establishment of the offending officer. It is now at all events too late to think of such a remedy as delivering over the criminal upon whom judgment has been pronounced, and who is in the eye of law, a prisoner. It may be taken, if any are suitable, but King is a subject of the Canadian Government, and came back voluntarily, rather than fight his enraged relative; we do not see what claim to his person the United States authorities could set up.—Toronto Colonist.

WEATHER WISDOM.—'The late Marshal Bugeaud,' says the Emancipation of Brussels, 'when only a captain, during the Spanish campaign under Napoleon I., found a manuscript which by chance fell into his hands, that from observations made in England and Florence during a period of fifty years, the following law respecting the weather had been proved to hold true:—Eleven times out of twelve the weather remains the same during the whole month as it is on the fifth day; if it continues unchanged over the sixth day; and nine times out of twelve like the fourth day, if the sixth resembles the fourth. From 1815 to 1830, M. Bugeaud devoted his attention to agriculture, and guided by the law just mentioned, avoided the losses in hay time and vintage, which many of his neighbors experienced. When Governor of Algiers, he never entered on a campaign until after the sixth day of the month. His neighbors at Excideuil and his lieutenants in Algiers, would often exclaim, 'How lucky he is in the weather!' What they regarded as mere chance was the result of observation. In counting the fourth and sixth days, he was particular in beginning from the exact time of new moon, and added three quarters of an hour for each day for the greater length of the year, as compared with the solar year.'
