This faculty, when completely organised, will be composed of eleven professors. Two only have as yet been appointed.

In 1662 was founded the Quebec Seminary, which afterwards became a regular College; and it had, by successive additions, acquired a high degree of importance, when it was erected, by Her Majesty's Royal Charter, into a University, under the style and name of *The Laval University*. By this charter, which bears date December 8th, 1852, no change was effected in the constitution of the Seminary itself; but a Council, composed of the directors of the Institution, and the three senior professors of the several faculties, was empowered to possess and enjoy all the privileges granted to the Universities of the United Kingdom, and especially that of conferring degrees in the Faculties of Divinity, Law, Medicine and Arts. His Grace the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec is, by virtue of his office, Visitor of the University. The superior of the Seminary for the time being holds the office of rector.

The *Collegiate Department* is the Seminary as it was till 1852, and is under the control of a board composed of a Superior and at least four Directors. It is divided into two parts, called the *Grand* and the *Minor Seminary*.

## RAILWAY AND STEAMBOAT ROUTES.

The Grand Trunk Railway depot is situated at Point Levy, opposite Quebec. The company's ferryboat plys on the arrival and departure of each train between the depot and the ferry-landing in Champlain st. From Point Levy the line extends eastward to St. Thomas, a distance of 48 miles, and will shortly be opened to Rivière du Loup en Bas, a distance of 72 miles further. Westward the line extends to Stratford, C. W., branching at Richmond to Portland, Maine, and connecting, at different distances, with the Cobourg and Peterborough, the Great Western, the Buffalo and Lake Huron, the Ontario, Simcoe, and Lake Huron, the Androscoggin and Kennebec, the Kennebec and Portland, the Boston and Maine, the Ottawa and Prescott, the Champlain and St. Lawrence, and the Montreal and New York Railways. The line is being extended still further west, to Sarnia, 72 miles from Stratford.

Trains leave Point Levy daily (Sundays excepted) at 4.30 p.m. for St. Thomas, and arrive thence at 10.05 a.m.; and at 6.30 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. for the western and southern termini and connections, arriving at Point Levy from these directions at 2 p.m. and 9.45 p.m.

The Richelieu Company's steamers leave at 4 o'clock daily (Sundays excepted) for Batiscan, distant 69 miles; Three Rivers, 90 miles; Sorel, 135 miles; and Montreal, 180 miles. The Company's steamers from Montreal arrive daily between 7 and 8 a. m.
