Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act

QUEBEC

● PREAMBLE

Pursuant to the provisions of the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act, a census was taken in 1971 of the population of the Province of Quebec; said population was then fixed at 6,027,764. Accordingly, and in conformity with the statement of the Representation Commissioner, the territory of the province shall be divided into 72 electoral districts instead of the 74 which exist at present.

The Act provides that the population of each electoral district shall correspond as nearly as possible to the provincial electoral quota, which for Quebec stands at 83,719 inhabitants per district. It is however necessary to take into consideration certain factors stated in Section 13 of the Act. A provision of the Act makes it imperative that the population of any given electoral district in no way exceed or be less than 25% of the above-mentioned quota.

Notice of Public Sittings

Pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Quebec has prepared a report showing the proposed division of the province into 72 electoral districts, the names and boundaries of which are set out in the following maps and descriptions.

In order to give interested parties an opportunity to make before the Commission representations on the matter of the proposed boundaries, the Commission will hold public sittings at the following places:

- Trois-Rivières, The Court House, Tuesday, February 13, 1973, 2:00 p.m.
- Québec, The Court House, Tuesday, February 20, 1973, 10:00 a.m.
- Hull, The Court House, Tuesday, February 27, 1973, 2:00 p.m.

The Commission wishes to bring to the attention of interested parties the imperative provisions of Section 17 (4) of the Act:

"No representation shall be heard by a commission at any sittings held by it for the hearing of representations from interested persons unless notice in writing is given to the secretary to the commission within twenty-three days from the date of publication of the advertisement referred to in subsection (2) (advertisement in newspapers), stating the name and address of the person by whom the representation is sought to be made and indicating concisely the nature of the representation and of the interest of such person."

Accordingly, the Commission is precluded from hearing and shall not hear any person desiring to make observations or representations, who has not given notice in the form and/or within the delay provided for in the above-quoted section.

Rules of Practice

Notice is hereby given that the following Rules of practice, made pursuant to Section 16 of the Act, have been unanimously adopted by the Commission for Quebec.

Rule 1: The following rules may be cited as: "The Rules of the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Quebec, 1972".

Rule 2: In these rules:

- (a) "Act" means the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act (Chapter E-2, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1970);

- (b) "Advertisement" means the advertisement published pursuant to Section 17 (2) of the Act and giving notice of the time and place of public sittings the Commission will hold with a view to hearing the representations of interested parties;

- (c) "Commission" means the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Quebec;

- (d) "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission;

- (e) "Sitting" means a public sitting of the Commission;

- (f) "Representation" means a comment made in accordance with Section 17 of the Act by a person interested either in the matter of the boundaries of one or more electoral districts or in the name of said districts;

- (g) "Written notice" means a notice given by a person wishing to be heard at a sitting;

- (h) "Map" means the drawing of proposed electoral districts as published in the advertisement defined in paragraph (b) of this rule;

- (i) "Description" means the detailed outline of each proposed electoral district as published in the advertisement defined in paragraph (b) of this rule;

- (j) "Place" means any one of the cities or towns mentioned in the preamble.

Rule 3: For the purpose of interpreting Section 17 (4) of the Act, it is understood that the twenty-three (23) day delay shall apply to the date of mailing of the written notice by the person wishing to be heard by the Commission. The postmark on the envelope containing the written notice shall be proof of mailing within the proper delay. If it appears to be impossible to determine the date of mailing, the Commission will have discretion as to the admissibility of the written notice and may, for such purpose, require from the sender a statement under oath.

Rule 4: A person giving written notice of intention to make a representation may be heard at any sitting of the Commission and shall not be required to appear at the place closest to where the written notice originates.

Rule 5: However any such person shall indicate in the written notice in what place this person wishes to be heard.

Rule 6: If the written notice bears no mention of a place, the Secretary shall take all steps necessary to obtain that information.

Rule 7: One person only shall be heard in the presentation of a representation being the subject of a written notice.

Rule 8: The sittings shall be held pursuant to the provisions of Section 17 of the Act.

Rule 9: If, for some reason, a sitting cannot be held, the Chairman may postpone the sitting to a later date and the Secretary shall then give at least three (3) days' notice of said date to all persons having indicated their intention to be heard at that particular sitting. Concurrently, the Chairman shall give at least three (3) days' public notice of the later sitting in a newspaper published as close as possible to the place where the sitting will be held.

QUEBEC

Quebec is divided into seventy-two electoral districts, named and described as follows, each returning one member to the House of Commons.

Reference to "county" signifies a "municipal county" as named and described in the Territorial Division Act of the Revised Statutes of the Province of Quebec.

The cities, towns, and local municipalities comprise all their territories, including islands, unless otherwise described.

The words street, avenue, road, access road, boulevard, canal, and river signify the median line thereof, except where otherwise specified.

The population figures for each electoral district are those of the 1971 census.

1. ABITIBI includes:

- (a) the Towns of Amos, Barville, Chapais, Chibougamau, La Sarre, Lebel-sur-Quévillon, Macamic, Matagami and Senneterre;
- (b) the municipality of la Baie James;
- (c) in the County of Abitibi: the village municipalities of Barraute and La Reine; the parish municipalities of Macamic, Sainte-Hélène-de-Mancebourg, Saint-Janvier, Saint-Lambert, Saint-Marc-de-Figuery, Saint-Mathieu and Senneterre; the township municipalities of Clermont, Landrienne, La Sarre, Launay, Privat and Trécesson; the municipalities of Amos East, Amos West, Authier, Belcourt, Champneuf, Clerval, Colombourg, Fiedmont and Barraute, La Motte, La Reine, Normétal, Palmarolle, Poularies, Roquemaure, Saint-Félix-de-Dalquier, Sainte-Germaine-Boulé, Saint-Jacques-de-Dupuy, Saint-Laurent, Taschereau and Val-Saint-Gilles; the Indian Reserves of Amos No. 1 and Obedjiwan No. 28; all the territory without local municipal organization situated north of the Townships and part of Townships of Hébecourt, Duparquet, Destor, Aiguebelle, Bousquet, Cadillac, Malartic, Vassan, Senneville, Pascalis, Tiblemont and Tavernier, and east of the Townships and part of Townships of Aiguebelle, Cléricy, Tavernier, Pershing and Denain;
- (d) that part of New Quebec situated north of the municipality of la Baie James and west of the prolongation of the eastern limit of the municipality of la Baie James.

2. ARGENTEUIL includes:

- (a) the Cities of Deux-Montagnes, Lachute and Sainte-Scholastique;
- (b) the Towns of Barkmere, Oka-sur-le-Lac and Saint-Eustache;
- (c) the County of Deux-Montagnes;
- (d) in the County of Argenteuil: the village municipalities of Brownsburg, Calumet, Carillon, Grenville and Saint-André East; the parish municipality of Saint-André-d'Argenteuil; the township municipalities of Arundel, Chatham, Gore, Grenville, Harrington, Montcalm and Wentworth; the municipalities of Huberdeau, Lac-des-Seize-Îles and Wentworth North.

3. BEAUCE includes:

- (a) the Towns of Beauceville, Beauceville East, Lac-Etchemin, Saint-Georges, Saint-Georges West, Saint-Joseph-de-Beauce and Sainte-Marie;
- (b) in the County of Beauce: the village municipalities of East-Broughton-Station, Lac-Poulin, Saint-Elzéar, Saint-Victor, Tring Junction and Vallée Junction; the parish municipalities of L'Enfant-Jésus, Notre-Dame-de-la-Providence, Sacré-Cœur-de-Jésus, Saints-Anges, Saint-Benoît-Labre, Sainte-Clothilde, Saint-Frédéric, Saint-Georges East, Saint-Jean-de-la-Lande, Saint-Joseph-de-Beauce, Saint-Jules, Sainte-Marie and Saint-Séverin; the municipalities of Aubert-Gallion, East Broughton, Saint-Alfred, Saint-Elzéar-de-Beauce, Saint-François-de-Beauce, Saint-François West, Saint-Joseph-des-Érables, Saint-Pierre-de-Broughton, Saint-Simon-les-Mines and Saint-Victor-de-Tring;
- (c) in the County of Bellechasse: the parish municipalities of Saint-Camille-de-Lellis and Sainte-Sabine; the municipality of Saint-Magloire-de-Bellechasse;
- (d) in the County of Dorchester: the parish municipalities of Sainte-Claire, Saint-Cyprien, Saint-Édouard-de-Frampton, Sainte-Germaine-du-Lac-Etchemin, Sainte-Justine, Saint-Léon-de-Standon, Saint-Luc, Saint-Malachie, Sainte-Marguerite, Saint-Nazaire-de-Dorchester and Saint-Odon-de-Cranbourne; the municipalities of Louis-Joliette, Saint-Benjamin, Saint-Louis-de-Gonzague, Saint-Prosper and Sainte-Rose-de-Waterford;
- (e) in the County of Mégantic: the village municipalities of Robertsonville and Sainte-Anne-du-Lac; the parish municipalities of Sacré-Cœur-de-Marie south part and Saint-Antoine-de-Pontbriand.

4. BEAUHARNOIS includes:

- (a) the Cities of Beauharnois and Salaberry-de-Valleyfield;
- (b) the Towns of Huntingdon and Maple Grove;
- (c) the Counties of Beauharnois and Huntingdon;
- (d) in the County of Châteauguay: the village municipalities of Howick, Ormstown and Saint-Chrysostôme; the parish municipalities of Saint-Antoine-Abbé northeast part, Sainte-Clothilde, Saint-Jean-Chrysostôme, Saint-Malachie-d'Ormstown and Très-Saint-Sacrement.

(Population: 76,968)

5. BELLECHASSE includes:

- (a) the City of Montmagny;
- (b) the Towns of La Pocatière, L'Islet and Saint-Pamphile;
- (c) the Counties of L'Islet and Montmagny;
- (d) in the County of Kamouraska: the village municipalities of Kamouraska and Saint-Pacôme; the parish municipalities of Sainte-Anne-de-la-Pocatière, Saint-Denis, Saint-Louis-de-Kamouraska, Saint-Onésime-d'Ixworth, Saint-Pacôme and Saint-Philippe-de-Néri; the municipalities of Mont-Carmel, Rivière-Ouelle and Saint-Gabriel-Lallemant; the territory without local municipal organization comprising part of the Townships of Chapais and Ixworth;
- (e) in the County of Bellechasse: the village municipalities of Armagh, Saint-Raphaël and Saint-Vallier; the parish municipalities of La Durantaye, Notre-Dame-Auxiliatrice-de-Buckland, Saint-Cajetan-d'Armagh, Saint-Damien-de-Buckland,

Saints-Gervais and Protais, Saint-Lazare, Saint-Michel, Saint-Nérée, Saint-Philémon, Saint-Raphaël and Saint-Vallier; all the territory without local municipal organization.

(Population: 80,033)

6. BONAVENTURE includes:

- (a) the Towns of Carleton, Chandler and New Richmond;
- (b) the Counties of Bonaventure and Îles-de-la-Madeleine;
- (c) in the County of Gaspé East: the municipalities of Grande-Rivière, Grande-Rivière West, Newport, Pabos, Pabos-Mills, Petit-Pabos, Saint-François-de-Pabos and Sainte-Thérèse-de-Gaspé;
- (d) in the County of Matapédia: the Township of Milniket and that part of the Township of Assemetquagan without local municipal organization.

7. BOURASSA includes the City of Montreal North. (Population: 89,139)

8. CHAMBLY includes:

- (a) the City of Chambly;
- (b) the Towns of Brossard, Carignan and Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville;
- (c) in the County of Laprairie: the municipality of Notre-Dame;
- (d) that part of the City of Saint-Hubert bounded by a line commencing at a point where the southern limit of the Town of Greenfield Park meets the southwestern limit of the City of Saint-Hubert; thence northeastward and northwestward, following the southeastern and northeastern limit of the Town of Greenfield Park and the northwestward prolongation of the northeastern limit of the Town of Greenfield Park to the southwestward prolongation of the southeastern limit of the City of Longueuil; thence northeastward, following the said prolongation to the southern limit of the City of Longueuil; thence following an irregular line separating the City of Saint-Hubert from the City of Longueuil, the Towns of Boucherville, Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville, Carignan and Brossard and from the municipality of Notre-Dame to the point of commencement.

9. CHAMPLAIN includes:

- (a) the City of Cap-de-la-Madeleine;
- (b) the Towns of La Tuque and Saint-Tite;
- (c) in the County of Champlain: the village municipalities of Champlain, La Pérade, Parent, Saint-Stanislas and Sainte-Thècle; the parish municipalities of Grandes-Piles, La Visitation-de-Champlain, Saint-Adelphe, Sainte-Anne-de-la-Pérade, Saint-François-Xavier-de-Batiscan, Sainte-Geneviève-de-Batiscan, Saint-Louis-de-France, Saint-Luc, Saint-Maurice, Saint-Narcisse, Saint-Prosper, Saint-Roch-de-Mékinac, Saint-Séverin, Saint-Stanislas, Sainte-Thècle, Saint-Timothee and Saint-Tite; the township municipality of Langelier; the municipalities of Boucher, Haute-Mauricie and Sainte-Marthe-du-Cap-de-la-Madeleine; the Indian Reserves of Coucoucache No. 24A and Weymontachi No. 23; all the territory without local municipal organization;
- (d) in the County of Quebec: the municipality of Lac-Édouard; the territory without local municipal organization situated northwest of aux Éclairs River, of the southeastern limit of the Township of Perrault and its northeastward prolongation to the limit of the County of Quebec.

10. CHARLESBOURG includes:

- (a) the Cities of Charlesbourg and Loretteville;
- (b) in the County of Quebec: the parish municipality of Saint-Michel-Archange; the municipality of Charlesbourg West; the Indian Reserves of Lorette No. 7 and Lorette No. 7A;
- (c) that part of the City of Giffard situated west of the northeastern limit of the parish municipality of Saint-Michel-Archange;
- (d) that part of the City of Québec bounded by a line commencing at the point of intersection of the limit of the City of Québec, in the Saint Charles River, and the Scott Bridge; thence southeastward, following the bridge and du Pont Scott Avenue to Saint-Vallier Street; thence westward to Saint-Sacrement Avenue; thence southeastward to the northern limit of the right of way of Charest Boulevard West; thence westward to the easternmost point of the City of Sainte-Foy; thence northwestward and westward, following the northern limit of the eastern part of the said city to the northern limit of the right of way of Charest Boulevard West; thence westward to the limit of the western part of the City of Sainte-Foy; thence northward and westward, following an irregular line separating the Cities of Quebec and Sainte-Foy to the southeastward prolongation of O'Neil Avenue; thence northwestward following the said prolongation and O'Neil Avenue to Hamel Boulevard; thence westward to Masson Boulevard; thence northwestward to the Lorette River; thence northeastward to the Saint Charles River; thence northeastward to Père-Lelièvre Boulevard; thence eastward to Neuville Boulevard; thence northward to the Capital Autoroute; thence westward to the Saint Charles River; thence northwestward, following the Saint Charles River upstream to Chauveau Avenue; thence southwestward to the limit of the City of Québec; thence northward, eastward and southward, following an irregular line separating the City of Québec from the City of Sainte-Foy, the Town of Bélair, the City of Loretteville, the village municipality of Saint-Émile, the municipality of Charlesbourg West and the Town of Vanier to the point of commencement;

- (e) that part of the City of Québec bounded on the north by the Saint Charles River, on the east by the village municipality of Saint-Émile, on the south and on the west by the City of Loretteville.

11. CHARLEVOIX includes:

- (a) the Towns of Baie-Saint-Paul, Beaupré, Château-Richer, Clermont, Forestville and La Malbaie;
- (b) the Counties of Charlevoix East, Charlevoix West and Montmorency No. 1;
- (c) in the County of Chicoutimi: the township municipalities of Dumas and Saint-Jean;
- (d) in the County of Saguenay: the village municipalities of Chute-aux-Outardes, Grandes-Bergeronnes, Pointe-aux-Outardes, Pointe-Label, Sacré-Cœur-de-Jésus, Sault-au-Mouton and Tadoussac; the parish municipalities of Ragueneau and Sacré-Cœur-de-Jésus; the township municipality of Bergeronnes; that part of the united townships municipality of Les Sept-Cantons-Unis-du-Saguenay situated west of the Manicouagan River; the municipalities of Colombier, Escoumins, Sainte-Anne-de-Portneuf, Saint-Luc-de-Laval and Saint-Paul-du-Nord; the Indian Reserves of Bersimis No. 3 and Escoumins No. 25; all the territory without local municipal organization situated west of the Manicouagan and Mushalagan Rivers and the creek draining Atticoupi Lake, west of Atticoupi and Mushalagan Lakes, and east of that part of the western limit of the County of Saguenay, south of the northernmost point of Atticoupi Lake.

12. CHÂTEAUGUAY includes:

- (a) the Towns of Candiac, Châteauguay, Châteauguay-Centre, Delson, La Prairie, Léry and Mercier;
- (b) in the County of Châteauguay: the parish municipalities of Sainte-Martine and Saint-Urbain-Premier; the municipality of Saint-Paul-de-Châteauguay;
- (c) in the County of Laprairie: the parish municipalities of Sainte-Catherine-d'Alexandrie-de-Laprairie, Saint-Constant, Saint-Isidore and Saint-Philippe; the municipality of Saint-Mathieu; the Indian Reserve of Caughnawaga No. 14.

13. CHICOUTIMI includes:

- (a) the Cities of Chicoutimi and Chicoutimi North;
- (b) the Towns of Bagotville, Port-Alfred, Rivière-du-Moulin and Saguenay;
- (c) in the County of Chicoutimi: the village municipalities of Laterrière, Saint-Fulgence and Saint-Honoré; the parish municipalities of Bagotville, Notre-Dame-de-Laterrière, Saint-Fulgence, Saint-Honoré and Sainte-Rose-du-Nord; the township municipalities of Chicoutimi, Otis and Tremblay; the municipalities of Grande-Baie and Saint-David-de-Falardeau; the townships and part of township situated south of the Saguenay River and east of the Cyriac River without local municipal organization; the townships, part of townships and the territory not divided into townships situated north of the Saguenay River, north of the Townships of Aulneau and Rouleau and east of the Township of Aulneau.

14. COMPTON includes:

- (a) the Towns of Cookshire, East Angus, Lake Mégantic, Scotstown and Waterville;
- (b) the Counties of Compton and Frontenac;
- (c) in the County of Beauce: the village municipalities of Linière, Saint-Éphrem-de-Tring and Saint-Théophile; the parish municipalities of Saint-Côme-de-Kennebec, Saint-Éphrem-de-Beauce, Saint-Honoré, Saint-Martin, Saint-René and Saint-Théophile-de-la-Beauce; the township municipality of Shenley; the municipality of Saint-Philibert; all the territory without local municipal organization;
- (d) in the County of Dorchester: the village municipality of Saint-Zacharie; the municipalities of Sainte-Aurélien and Saint-Zacharie;
- (e) in the County of Stanstead: the village municipalities of Ayer's Cliff, Dixville, Hatley, North Hatley and Saint-Herménégilde; the township municipalities of Barford, Hatley and Hatley west part; the municipalities of Sainte-Catherine-de-Hatley, Saint-Herménégilde and Saint-Mathieu-de-Dixville;
- (f) in the County of Sherbrooke: the village municipality of Compton; the township municipalities of Ascot and Compton; the municipalities of Ascot Corner, Compton Station and Fleurimont.

- (a) the Town of Roxboro;
- (b) that part of the City of Pierrefonds situated northeast of the Town of Roxboro;
- (c) that part of the City of Pierrefonds bounded on one side by des Prairies River and on the other three sides by the Town of Roxboro;
- (d) that part of the Town of Dollard-des-Ormeaux situated northeast of Montée des Sources;
- (e) that part of the City of Montreal bounded by a line commencing at a point where the limit of the City of Montreal meets the northeastern limit of the City of Pierrefonds, in des Prairies River; thence northeastward, following the said river to the prolongation of Saint-Hubert Street; thence southeastward, following the said prolongation and Saint-Hubert Street to Fleury Street East; thence

southwestward to Saint-Laurent Boulevard; thence southeastward to the track of the Canadian National Railways Company; thence southwestward, following the said track to the railway track of the Canadian Pacific Limited Company; thence southeastward, following the said track to Metropolitan Boulevard; thence southwestward to the northeastern limit of the Town of Mount Royal; thence southwestward, following the northwestern limit of the Town of Mount Royal to the northeastern limit of the City of Saint-Laurent; thence northwestward, southwestward and southeastward, following an irregular line separating the City of Montreal from the City of Saint-Laurent to the northeastern limit of the City of Pierrefonds; thence northwestward, following the said limit to the point of commencement.

DES RAPIDES includes that part of the City of City of Laval bounded by a line commencing at the point of intersection of the limit of the City of City of Laval, in des Prairies River, and the Power transmission line of Hydro-Québec, west of du Tremblay Island; thence northwestward, following the said power line to the southwestward prolongation of du Souvenir Road; thence northeastward, following the said prolongation and the said road to Châtelaine Street; thence southeastward to Notre-Dame Boulevard; thence northeastward to Chomedey Boulevard; thence northwestward to du Souvenir Road; thence northeastward, following du Souvenir Road, du Trait Carré Road and the prolongation of du Trait Carré Road to the Power transmission line of Hydro-Québec, east of Laval Boulevard; thence southeastward to the railway track of the Canadian Pacific Limited Company; thence northwestward, following the said track to Saint-Martin Boulevard; thence northeastward to Notre-Dame de Fatima Street; thence southeastward to De Lucon Street; thence northeastward to Notre-Dame de Fatima Street; thence southeastward to Dauphin Street; thence southwestward to Notre-Dame de Fatima Street; thence southeastward, following Notre-Dame de Fatima Street to Lévesque Boulevard; thence continuing southeastward, following Lévesque Boulevard and its prolongation to the limit of the City of City of Laval, in des Prairies River; thence southwestward, following the said limit to the point of commencement. (Population: 79,633)

17. DOLLARD includes:

- (a) the City of Dorval;
- (b) the City of Saint-Laurent;
- (c) the Town of Île-Dorval.

18. DRUMMOND includes:

- (a) the City of Drummondville;
- (b) the Towns of Drummondville South and Warwick;
- (c) in the County of Arthabaska: the village municipalities of Chesterville, Daveluyville and Sainte-Clothilde-de-Horton; the parish municipalities of Saint-Albert-de-Warwick, Sainte-Anne-du-Sault, Sainte-Clothilde-de-Horton, Sainte-Élisabeth-de-Warwick, Saint-Rémi-de-Tingwick, Saint-Rosaire and Sainte-Séraphine; the township municipalities of Chester West, Maddington and Warwick; the municipalities of Chénier, Saint-Jacques-de-Horton, Saint-Valère and Tingwick;
- (d) in the County of Bagot: the parish municipality of Saint-Nazaire-d'Acton;

- (b) that part of the City of Montreal bounded by a line commencing at the point of intersection of Monk Boulevard and Allard Street; thence northward, following Monk Boulevard and its prolongation to Lachine Canal; thence northeastward to the track of the Canadian National Railways Company; thence southeastward, following the said track to the prolongation of the northwestern limit of the City of Verdun; thence southwestward, following the said prolongation to the northernmost point of the City of Verdun; thence southwestward and southward, following the northwestern limit of the City of Verdun to the prolongation of Allard Street; thence westward, following the said prolongation and Allard Street to the point of commencement.

72. WESTMOUNT includes:

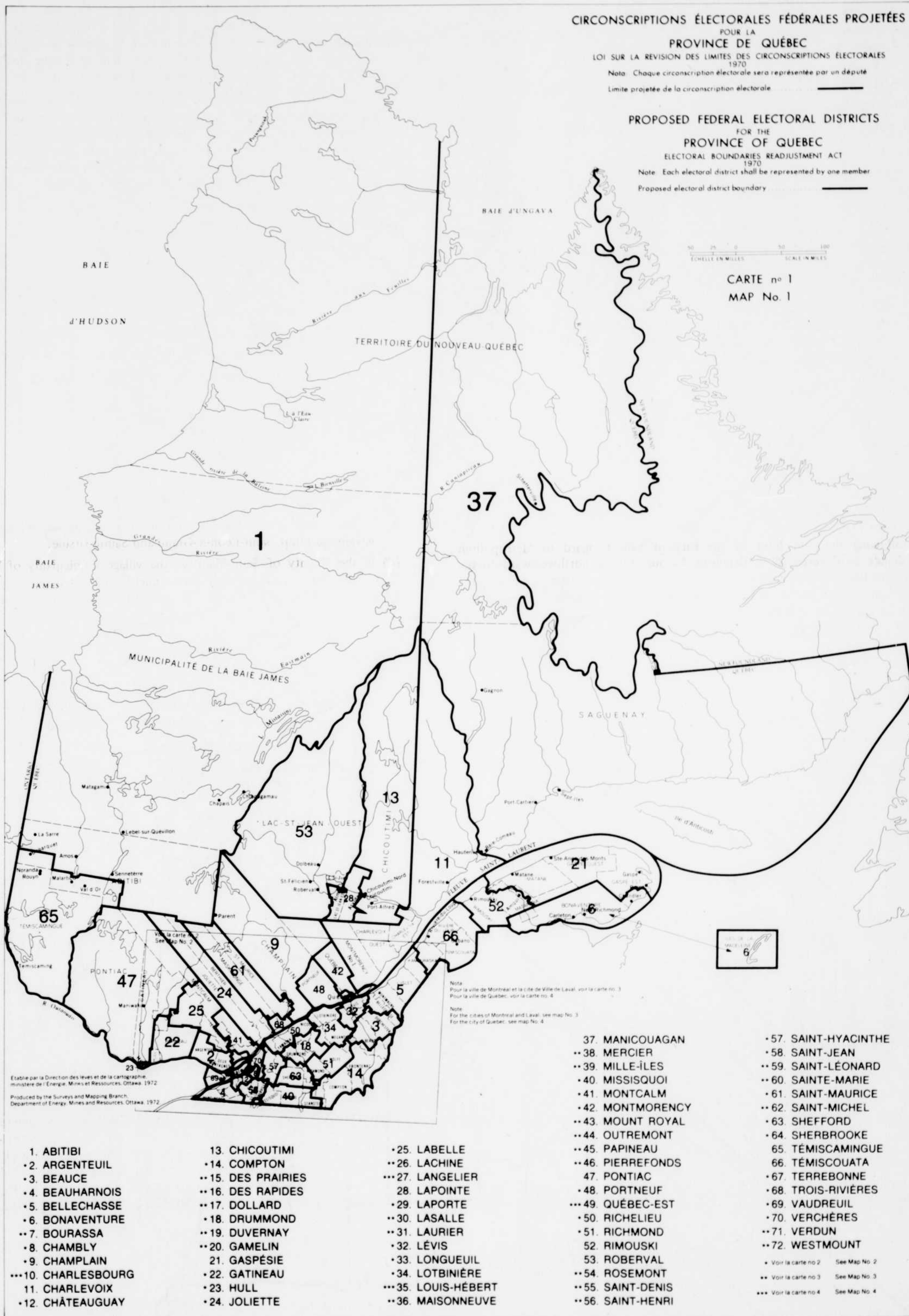

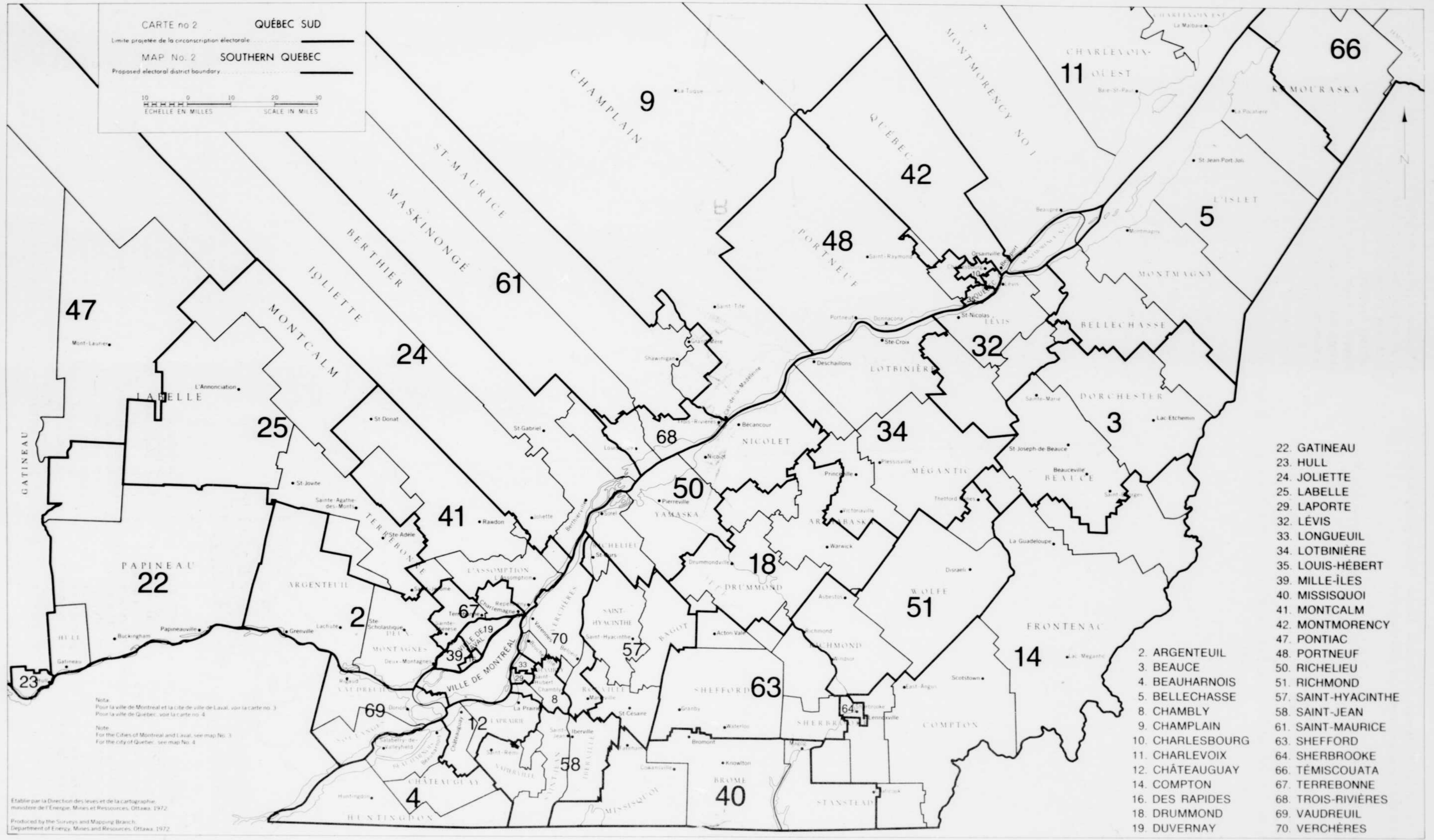
limit of the City of Westmount to Victoria Avenue; thence northwestward, following the said avenue to the point of commencement;
