THE WRECK OF THE "DRUMMOND CASTLE" STORY OF THE SURVIVORS. MOTHERS CARE FOR THEIR CHILDREN. A NUMBER OF BODIES RECOVERED.

LONDON, June 18.—A despatch received from Ushant Harbour at 4.30 p.m., said that the man Marquardt, who was saved from the wreck of the steamer "Drummond Castle" and picked up at Ushant, states that there was no moon, but a bright light from the ship struck, which he thinks he can describe.

It is learned that among the first-class passengers on board the "Drummond Castle" was a young American named Hughes, who boarded the ship at Durban, Natal. His place of residence in America is not known.

THE "DRUMMOND CASTLE" (Continued). The survivors said that they could not remember exactly what did happen when the ship went down. Goldbolt succeeded in getting a plank from the boat, but he also caught a loose plank as it was washed past him. For a long time after the ship sank despairing cries filled the air mingled with cries for help, to which response was impossible. The cries gradually ceased and there was a gruesome silence. Each man believed himself to be the sole survivor of the ill-fated ship, and felt in constant fear of being washed off the plank or under him.
