Four Days Later from Europe.

ARRIVAL OF THE CANADA OCEANO STEAMSHIP. ANGLLO-SAXON. The steamship Anglo-Saxon arrived in port this morning about 9 o'clock.

The London Globe of the 26th April, estimates the political character of the new Parliament. The Ministerial gain is reckoned at 13, making their total strength 273.

Although the London Stock Exchange was much firmer on the 26th, and an advance established in the Funds and Railway Shares, the advices from the Continent do not tend to a pacific conclusion.

The Lord Mayor of London gave his usual Easter banquet at the Mansion House on Monday evening, the 25th April, upon which occasion Lord Derby was present, and in responding to the toast of her Majesty's Ministers he announced that England had within the last twelve hours made one more effort for peace.

THE BRUSSELS INDEPENDENCE publishes the following from Berlin:—"There is a marked difference between the protest sent to Vienna by the three Powers mentioned by the French Minister.

THE Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Countess of Eglington, will return to Ireland this day, (Wednesday.)

ON the 23rd the Channel squadron left Castletown (Berehaven,) and were off Mizen Head at noon, steering due south, with a brisk head wind.

THE state of uncertainty on the question of peace or war has produced immense excitement on the Stock Exchange. The markets are exceedingly wild and unsettled.
