GENERAL POST-OFFICE, QUEBEC, 24th May, 1813.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that, from and after the 31st instant, a new arrangement will take place, at the Post-Offices of Quebec and Montreal, respecting the conveyance of the Mails, and that the departure and arrival of the Post at both places will be on the following days, viz.

Table with columns for 'Mails closed' and 'Arrival of Mails'. Rows list days from Monday to Saturday with corresponding times for evening and day mail arrivals.

THE Mails of Quebec, Montreal, and Three Rivers are to be positively closed on the evening of each Post Day at eight o'clock precisely, at which hour the doors of the Offices will be punctually shut, and no letters whatever will be thereafter received for such Mails.

DISTRICT OF GENERAL QUARTER SESSIONS OF MONTREAL. THE PEACE, April 30, 1813.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Court, that sundry persons calling themselves Ferry-men, undertake for hire, to pass people and effects, over the rivers in different parts of this District without Licence, to the great detriment of the regular and licenced Ferry-men; and that those who have licences neglect to renew them annually, so that the Magistrates cannot know the actual number of licenced ferries established; to prevent which, in future, it is hereby ordered and directed, that from and after the publication of this regulation, any person or persons who shall, for hire, in the day time, or in the night, ferry or pass any person, or effects of any kind whatsoever, over any of the rivers in this District, whereon any regular licenced ferries are established without first having obtained a licence for that purpose from the Court of Quarter Sessions, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, the sum of Twenty Shillings, such licence to be signed by the Clerk of the Peace.

And it is further ordered and directed, that all persons holding licences for ferries in this District, or who may hereafter obtain such licences, shall renew the same at the Court of Quarter Sessions, in the month of April of every year; and all and every person or persons who shall neglect to renew the same accordingly, shall be considered to have given up their claim to renew such licence.

That all licences obtained or to be obtained for ferries within this District, shall be in force until the first day of May, from and after the date thereof and no longer.

And in order to avoid the difficulties which may arise respecting the rates payable at the different ferries by and for His Majesty's Troops, their wives, children and baggage, on their march through this District; It is hereby ordered and directed: That where any troops or parties upon command, have occasion to pass regular ferries, it shall and may be lawful for the commanding officer, either to pass over with his party as passengers, or to hire the ferry boat entirely to himself and his party, detaining others for that time, in his option; and in case he shall chuse to take passage for himself and party as passengers, he shall only pay for himself and for each person, officer and soldier under his command, half of the ordinary rate payable by single persons at any such ferry; and in case he shall hire the ferry boat for himself and party, he shall pay half the ordinary rate for such boat or boats; and in such places where there are no regular ferries, but that all persons hire boats at the rate they can agree for, officers, with or without parties, are to agree for boats at the rate as other persons do in like cases.
