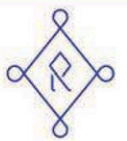

Local higher education institutions join forces to raise awareness about current and past Indigenous Peoples' realities

Next week Bishop's University, Champlain College – Lennoxville, Université de Sherbrooke and the Cégep de Sherbrooke are inviting their communities and the general public to take part in a series of activities to raise awareness about the present and past realities of Indigenous Peoples from Sept. 26 to 30, and to participate in a large commemorative walk on the occasion of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also known as “Orange Shirt Day” on Friday, Sept. 30.

According to a press release from Pôle régional en enseignement supérieur de l'Estrie (PRESE), the program of activities will begin on Sept. 26 with an online opening conference, in the presence of Suzie

Lennoxville “repair café” offers tools to dismantle planned obsolescence

This coming Sunday afternoon, Lennoxville's Square Queen will host its first “repair café,” a free activity aimed at encouraging people to fix up their broken or run down belongings by both offering repair

services on site and teaching them how to do it themselves.

Evelyne Verette, coordinator of the event, said that the goal of this event is to help cut down on household waste and combat planned obsolescence; the idea that products are designed to break and be replaced on a regular

basis.

“The goal of the repair café is to help people learn about repairing things themselves to avoid having to buying more but also to give a longer life to the items,” Verette said.

The activity will take place from

Niche Lit: The Lost Shtetl by Max Gross

Imagine my surprise finding the words “shtetl” and “Drummondville” in the same sentence! In The Record! Well, that happened just a few weeks ago, in the Aug. 24 headline for an article promoting a talk and concert (klezmer) entitled “*Stories of a Small ‘Shtetl’: Jewish History in Drummondville*”. Sadly, I didn’t make it to this Sept. 11 event, but reading about local Jewish history that has almost been forgotten sparked my decision to write this week’s book review on the 2020 novel, *The Lost Shtetl*.

(FYI, A shtetl or shtetel is a Yiddish term for the small towns with large Ashkenazi Jewish populations that existed in Eastern Europe before the Holocaust. Wikipedia)

As the story opens, it is the year 2020. The village of Kreskol, located somewhere in the wilds of Poland, is a town that has been forgotten by history. As a result, not only has it avoided the horrors of the Holocaust, but the villagers don’t even know there was a holocaust. The old ways are the only ways: Yiddish is spoken exclusively, transportation is via horse-drawn cart, rabbis are the local authorities, and trade is conducted only with the local gypsy caravans that pass through periodically. [Souls of discretion and very trade-savvy, the gypsy travelers never alert the Kreskolians about the changes that have occurred outside their forest hideaway.]

Among the many traditions that have remained alive and well in Kreskol is that of arranged marriages, and early on, the reader is introduced

to Pesha Rosenthal and her new spouse, Ishmael Lindauer. As with marriages everywhere, they are not all successful, and this one is particularly ill-advised. Ultimately, Pesha appeals to the local rabbis for permission to divorce, and after much discussion, the divorce is granted. Following a brief period of goodwill, the parting turns nasty, and Pesha leaves for parts unknown, which is essentially everywhere, followed by the disappearance of Ishmael. What to do? Yankel Lewinkopf, the orphaned baker’s apprentice (who would not be missed if he left), is summoned and equipped for several days travel. His mission is to get to the town of Smolskie and report the situation to the Polish authorities there.

Several weeks passed, with no sign of any of the missing Kreskol residents, when “an iron chariot appeared in the sky, thrashing its metal wings in the air like the sound of a thousand scythes busily at work.” Is this the long-awaited Messiah, as many believe? No, it is Yankel Lewinkopf, who has returned to Kreskol by helicopter after spending the past several weeks in a mental hospital being questioned about his “delusions” regarding a shtetl that has been lost in the mists of time, but is actually alive and well.

Without going into story-spoiling detail, the rest of the book recounts Yankel’s experiences at the Smolskie mental hospital and beyond, Pesha’s circumstances as a denizen of modern-day Poland, and the fateful sequence of events that await Kreskol when news of its existence eventually comes to light.

First time novelist Max Gross is also the author of *From Schlub to Stud: How to Embrace Your Inner Mensch and Conquer the Big City*, a combination memoir/dating guidebook, so I was expecting a comic novel when I first picked up *The Lost Shtetl*. As it turns out, it was much more than that: thoughtful, perceptive, poignant, a bit violent, more than a little raunchy, but also, very funny.

Like Klezmer music, Yiddish and Jewish literature in general occupies a special “niche” (denoting products, services, or interests that appeal to a small, specialized section of the population. Oxford Languages.)



Ashkenazi Jews, those who settled in Eastern Europe following the diaspora, have, like many other non-mainstream groups, established and proudly maintained their own literature and other cultural traditions, such as music, art, and theatre. Particularly in these trying times, when “differences” equal “threats” to so many in western societies, learning about and experiencing other cultural niches can only be applauded and encouraged. Max Gross has been likened to such esteemed Jewish writers as Philip Roth, Bernard Malamud, Sholem Aleichem, Isaac Bashevis Singer, and Michael Chabon. His remarkable and well-received first novel is bound to lead to further efforts, or at least we can hope that is the case!

PS. While we’re on the subject of Jewish life, Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New year, runs from sundown Sept. 25 to sundown Sept. 27 this year. Shana Tova!

Investigators submit more sexual assault charges against 25-year-old man

The Sherbrooke Police Service (SPS) has informed the public that its investigators have submitted new underage sexual assault charges against Raphaël Bélisle to the Directeur des poursuites criminelles et pénales (DPCP).

In a press release, the SPS noted its criminal investigation unit arrested the 25-year-old Bélisle on Sept.

6 over sexual assault allegations involving two victims under the age of 16 years old. The SPS investigators had said at the time that the suspect may have had other victims.

Bélisle was involved in the local scout community. And he was an elementary school teacher for the Centre de services (CSS) scolaire des Hauts-Cantons. He was also acting as a foster family for the Direction de la protection de la jeunesse (DPJ). The investigation is ongoing.

However, the SPS added it will not reveal any more information about the case out of respect for the court. Although, the police service noted that, through its work with criminal prosecutor and the DPJ, more charges may be laid in the future. Several victims have been identified.

The SPS urges anyone with information, or who may have been one of Bélisle's victims, to call 819-821-5555. The gestion des enquêtes

sur les crimes en série (GECS), a serial crime unit, has been activated since there is more than one victim, as well as the Sûreté du Québec (SQ).

It is a sensitive case and one that demands a unique command structure, according to the SPS. It involves a partnership between the provincial police services to identify and arrest crimes committed by sexual predators. The partnership allows for a pooling of resources.

1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and is free to attend. The coordinator invited people to bring their broken bicycles, small appliances, electronics, dull knives, ripped clothes, and small furniture.

"You cannot bring your fridge," Verette said, emphasizing that people should focus on small items. The coordinator also put microwaves and small-engine repair on the no-go list, but other than that she argued that almost anything is repairable, provided the right materials are on hand. "If there are parts needed, participants will need to go and buy them," she added.

"Repair Cafés allow for the free repair or diagnosis with the help of volunteer-specialists," Verette said, pointing out that the concept is not unique to

Sherbrooke. The items that can be repaired vary greatly depending on the capabilities of the volunteers present, but they make an effort to ensure that if something cannot be fixed on site, then the owner knows where they can take thing from there. "(The events) are also an opportunity for neighbours to meet and share knowledge and experiences," the coordinator added.

This will be the fourth edition of the repair café in Sherbrooke, and the second such event this year. The last event, held at Cafe Baobab in the Ascot neighbourhood in May, saw more than 40 people participate, and more than 50 household items were brought. According to Verette the cafés were started in Sherbrooke in 2019 before being stopped by the pandemic. With

the Return of organized activities, the hope is to significantly increase the frequency of the events.

"It is a free event, it is open to

families, and it will be bilingual," the coordinator said, encouraging people to dig up their broken stuff and come see what they can do.

Open to the Spirit

Today's word: Relinquish

1) The word for this week is “relinquish”, which means many things: to let go, to abandon, to give up your control, to cease your obligations, and in some cases to let go of your rights. The word is used in many modern questions: “Should the monarchy relinquish their power in the Commonwealth”, “If you choose not to vote, do you relinquish your right to complain”, “Should Canada relinquish the land they took from First Nations tribes?” Since September 30 is a National day of acknowledgment for truth and reconciliation, that last question is very relevant to all of us this week.

I struggled at first with ‘relinquish’. Then my memory kicked in. My father was very careful with his tools. We could borrow an axe, or screwdrivers, or even the tool kit, but had to return it. He encouraged us, as children to use them carefully, and never said no, but there was a condition. He used a word “custodian” to ensure they were returned in good condition. “Children you can borrow hammer to build your tree house, here are some used nails.” Then he would pick one of us and say “Remember though, I make you custodian. I want

them back.” This gradually changed as we got older and we learned to be more careful and he learned to trust us. We were all driving his car at 16, and when I was 18 I was given his old Toyota. I became the owner. I was a custodian no longer. It felt good. He trusted me.

The Bible does not use the word “relinquish” specifically, but does talk about giving up control of our lives to God. Jesus used that method himself in the Garden of Gethsemane when He prayed the same prayer three times. In it he said, “Yet not my will, but yours be done”. He is our example. We all should be more open to relinquishing our need to own things and have power over others. Let’s all be like my father and show trust to others. Perhaps some Commonwealth countries should stop simply being “custodians” of their own lives but have more independence. Perhaps many of us need to relinquish some of our privileges too. Lots to think about with this week.

2) I live in a country that has 4 distinct seasons and I am grateful for the yearly reminders from the outer world that parallel themes from my inner world. In the autumn we witness the graceful and spectacular way in which trees relinquish their crowning glories and we, humans, are permitted the pleasure of rustling

through, falling into and gathering up these colourful reminders of past summer days. These days we are in a period of transition, closing down the cottage for the year, putting up storm windows, and preserving the last of the garden’s bounty. Unlike the deciduous friends that surround me, I sometimes have difficulty with transitions. My inner world becomes fraught with regrets and nostalgia. I harken back to days that seemed simpler and my role in life more obvious. I remember times when I was reluctant to let go of some urgent desire or past reality in order to make room for the new and the life-giving.

As the wise author of Ecclesiastes tells us, “To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven.” And although we cannot spend all our time looking back there is value in honouring the thoughts and emotions that make us reluctant to relinquish the past. As author Linn explain in the book “Don’t Forgive Too Soon”, until we have unearthed the source of our reluctance we cannot be healed of the wounds of the past. Acceptance of the mistakes of the past, our own and that of others, can only come by sitting with those thoughts that make us uncomfortable. Finding the peace that allows us to relinquish the past is the work of a lifetime and the reward of a life well examined. Each one of us is unique and precious, courageous and imperfect. Blessings on YOUR journey.

3) In just a few days, we will enter the Yamim Noraim, the season of the Jewish High Holidays. Beginning with Rosh Hashanah, the New Year, and heading into Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, it is a time of community celebration, but also of deep introspection. We gain strength from gathering together as a community and the knowledge that we are all working to fix the brokenness in ourselves and the world with the support of each other, and we do the spiritual work through prayer, reflection, song and learning to enter the New Year with more clarity and hope.

Yet the problem is, each and every year, we are still not perfect people! We still have problems, and the world is still broken. When we leave the season through the holiday of Sukkot, “dwelling” for a week in sukkahs, shabby outdoor huts exposed to the elements, we are asked to let this reality sink in. We relinquish all desire for perfection and know that we should above all be happy with who we are and our situation in life. We relinquish the need for riches, and for a stable protection from the world around us. Literally surrounded by only thin walls and a roof filled with holes, we practice being “happy with our lot”.

Heading out of the holiday season, we hold on to all of the lessons we have learned, but let go of the spiritual and physical baggage that is holding us down. Simply put, we don’t need to be perfect, and we don’t need to be in a perfect world, as long as we are on the path. With this more clear and

simple outlook, we can better make our way through the year, and have more space to experience the world with fresh eyes. Sometimes, you have to let go to move forward.

4) This week we marked the Autumn Equinox, summer’s end and the first day of Fall. Otherwise known as Mabon, it is the point in earth’s pathway round the sun when day and night are equal, twelve hours each of light and darkness. Since the Summer Solstice, sun has risen later and set earlier, light decreasing by a mere two-three minutes daily. The Equinox (Autumn in the Northern Hemisphere, Spring in the South) is that brief pivotal moment of cosmic balance, before the season shifts from blossoming to dormant rest.

Interconnected as we are to all of nature and the cycles of the seasons, we humans are reminded that impermanence is integral to the grand design. We have observed the change of seasons and learned from earliest times to celebrate the world over. In what I like to call the Earth School, the Autumn curriculum includes such essential life lessons as change, mystery, preservation, protection, comfort, balance and letting go.

This past Wednesday evening a circle of us gathered to celebrate the turning of the great Wheel of the Year. We spoke of the themes of the season, and declared our intention to live in the present moment, not wishing for summer warmth but embracing the crisp fall air, giving thanks for the harvest. Preserving summer’s abundance by storing up food for the coming cold.

What can we learn from nature now? As much as we wish to hold onto summer, the season has past and we must move on with it. How to relinquish what we want desperately to hold onto is taught us by the very leaves now changing colours before they fall. A dance they do so brilliantly, bursting into flaming oranges, reds and golds –in one last fling before fluttering to ground. Aligning ourselves with nature, we might learn to do the same. To relinquish not only summer but whatever holds us back from living more fully in the present moment. What would you relinquish and let fall away in this season of transition? During my morning haiku practice among the trees just beginning to turn I had a wish that it could be this easy:

leaf lets go
floating gracefully to ground
my own hands fall open

How's pumpkin season looking?

It is nearly pumpkin-carving season in Quebec, as October, and Halloween, are right around the corner, but a large, plump, misshapen, orange gourd might not be so easy to find this year.

According to several farmers in the Eastern Townships, the pumpkin harvest has been challenging due to the sporadic weather in the province. The mix of cold, hot, incessant rain, and humidity levels have left much to be desired for many pumpkin patches in the region.

Verger Heath Orchard co-owner Chris Rawlings said the last time he checked his pumpkin patch was before the province's almost nonstop rainfall. He plans to head out to the patch located in Stanstead with his wife on Friday. But he has no idea how the rain affected his crop.

"I did a bit of a count. I walked between two rows of the big ones, and they were averaging about 15 pumpkins per row, so I would have seen about 30 pumpkins walking in between. If all of those were roughly the same, we should have a couple hundred," Rawlings told The Record.

The humidity even affected his orchard. Rawlings has noticed the maple trees on his property have developed a certain type of fungus. And the apples have developed scabs, which, he noted, is fairly common every summer. But it was harder to control with the unruly weather.

October is also the final month before Rawlings and his orchard go into hibernation. While he may lose some pumpkins to rot, he explained, the pumpkin harvest season is also great for attracting customers in the late fall. Although, he noted, it does come at a significant cost.

"Well it helps because you know the people who are coming for pumpkins will also take a little bit of this and that and the other thing. If you don't have them, you don't sell them, but that said, the input is pretty expensive. It's just another thing that adds to the overall cost," he said.

Verger Le Gros Pierre Manager Jean-François Foucault, on the other hand, said the current pumpkin harvest is on track to equal last year's crop. They are colourful and large, he told The Record, adding he is hoping folks will make the trip to the Compton farm for their pumpkins.

The pumpkin picking option will be available starting in October. And this year there will be a witch watching over her pumpkin patch, according to Foucault, as well as decorating stations He doesn't know how much pumpkin season brings in, but he knows it makes a difference.

"Honestly, I can't tell you that. It certainly extends our season. When the apple-picking season starts to slow down, pumpkins for us give us a second life and we're able to keep going just until the end of October. The last apple picked here is in mid-October," said Foucault.

Owner David Lafond, the owner of Verger La Pommalbonne, also in Compton, said the humidity has already affected his harvest. The pumpkin harvest began two weeks ago, he explained, and although there are many options available, it hasn't been a great season.

Unfortunately, it all has to do with weather and timing, Lafond continued, but in the end, the pumpkin picking portion of his business does little to his overall financial growth. Verger familial et Compagnons Owner Caroline Niquette has also felt the poor harvest, but in a different way.

Niquette told The Record that normally she purchases pumpkins for re-sale from the Plantations Stéphan Perreault in Val-Joli. Her operation is mostly geared towards apple picking, but every October she likes to throw pumpkins around her orchard as an added accessory.

She also sells them and in turn offers a type of promotion for the Perreault pumpkin farm. This year, however, Niquette was told there was a shortage of pumpkins and that they weren't even sure they would be able to provide any to her family farm in Magog. The prices also increased.

"We would put pumpkins in the orchard for the clients and they could do a you-pick but the pumpkins were always a bit isolated, so they were just a bit everywhere in the orchard. This year, unfortunately, there won't be any, though," Niquette explained in a phone interview.

She said Perreault was asking for \$7 per pumpkin. Niquette was selling the pumpkins for \$5 a pop last year. It wasn't going to add up financially this fall, she explained, as she would have to raise her prices and in a way, gouge her clients who are picking pumpkins with their children.

When I was growing up, my mother worked for the Montreal Gazette at their offices on Saint-Antoine Street, and the building had giant windows that looked down on the big yellow printing presses from the sidewalk.

I never got to see the presses in action, only visiting in the daytime, but I always looked down and imagined the energy in that room when the time came to go to print. It made starting to

work for The Record, years later, feel a bit like coming home.

That old Gazette building is a hotel now and while the big windows are still there there's no magic left inside, just a lobby.

When I hear about newspapers across the country cutting back their print editions, I can't help but think of those sleeping giants of childhood and wonder where we'll find them in the years to come.

Before a newspaper hits the stand or reaches your door it passes through a lot of hands.

I want you to know how many before you chuckle at the impending demise of print media like it was going the way of the dodo bird.

Editorial, advertising, production, printing, distribution.

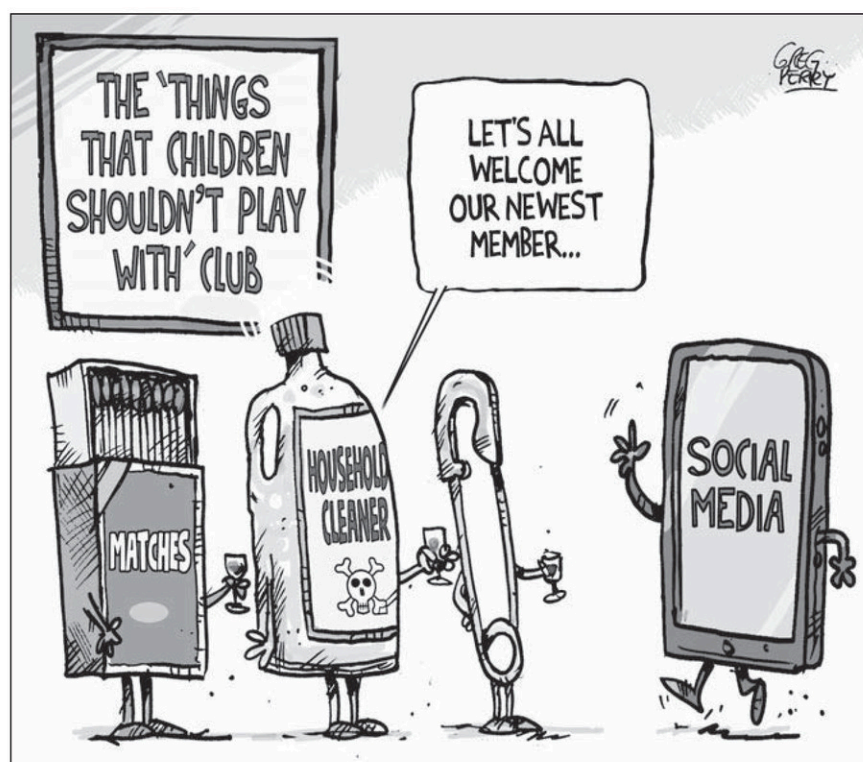

Quebec election: Party leaders' to debate one more time ahead of Oct. 3 election

Quebec party leaders will face off one final time ahead of the Oct. 3 election during a French-language televised debate tonight.

The incumbent Coalition Avenir Quebec led by Francois Legault continues to enjoy a solid lead in the polls, and the other four main parties are in a fight for second place with just 11 days left before election day.

The debate, hosted by Radio-Canada, offers one more chance for the Liberal, Quebec solidaire, Conservative and Parti Quebecois leaders to make their pitch to Quebecers.

None of the five party leaders have scheduled events today ahead of the debate, which will be divided into five sections: environment; the cost of living and the economy; health; education and services to citizens; and French language, immigration and identity.

All five party leaders are also scheduled to appear live on "Tout le monde en parle," on Sunday night, a popular prime time talk show.

Some good news came late Wednesday for Liberal Leader Dominique Anglade when a Quebec Superior Court justice ruled that her party's candidate in Matane-Matapedia, who had initially been disqualified, can run, meaning the Liberals will have candidates in all 125 ridings.

Mint teams up with National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation to create keepsake

The experiences of residential school survivors are woven together with First Nations, Inuit and Metis teachings and traditional art forms that were stripped from students in the design of a new commemorative coin unveiled at a special ceremony Thursday.

The Royal Canadian Mint teamed up with the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, Indigenous artists and survivors to create a keepsake that acknowledges the truths and traumas behind the residential school system.

“For far too long, the terrible harms committed by the residential school system were not shared. The children (were) made to feel ashamed? they were ignored,” said Stephanie Scott, executive director of the centre.

“This keepsake acknowledges the truth. More than that, it does so through the voices and the vision of the survivors themselves.”

The two-sided coin, which can be displayed or worn, was designed collaboratively by Cree artist Leticia Spence, Inuk artist Jason Sikoak and Metis artist JD Hawk. The trio consulted survivors.

Eugene Arcand said working with the designers and the Mint gave survivors the space to share their truths without fear of embarrassment, shame or blame.

Arcand is Cree from Muskeg Lake First Nation in Saskatchewan. He spent a total of 11 years attending the St. Michael Indian Residential School and the St. Paul’s Lebret Students Residence in Saskatchewan.

The discovery of what are believed to be 215 unmarked graves at a former school site in Kamloops, B.C., last year woke up the country to the atrocities Indigenous children and their families faced, said Arcand.

“For years we’d been sharing our stories, and nobody believed us. The 215 validated that we were telling the truth. We can never forget that.”

He said the release of the keepsake, a little more than a week before the second annual National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, is part of a larger push to educate the public and help heal intergenerational wounds.

On one of side of the coin, “Every Child Matters” is written in English and French. Footprints appear on each side, representing ancestors walking with younger generations. In the centre, orange handprints form the shape of a sun.

The three artists created a collection of symbolic elements that form an expression of Indigenous cultures and perspectives on the other side of the coin.

Traditional tattoo line work, the northern lights and an ulu, a curved knife used in the North, represent Inuit.

The Metis sash, floral beadwork and a

bison represent the Metis Nation.

A teepee, two women holding a cradle board, or tikanagan, and the sun are used to represent First Nations rights, culture and teachings.

Spence, who is from Pimicikamak Cree Nation, said she drew on her grandmother’s experiences of being raised by a family member in her design: “That idea of matriarchal love, and the love that a child feels.”

Spence added residential schools altered the way Indigenous Peoples showed love and affection, so she wanted to imagine a world where this wasn’t the case with her design.

Marie Lemay, president and CEO of the Mint, hopes Canadians can wear the keepsake with pride.

“It will be a signal of their willingness to walk the path to reconciliation.”

Proceeds from the coin will go to the Na-mi-quai-ni-mak Community Support Fund established by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation. The fund assists survivors and their communities carry out healing and commemoration activities.

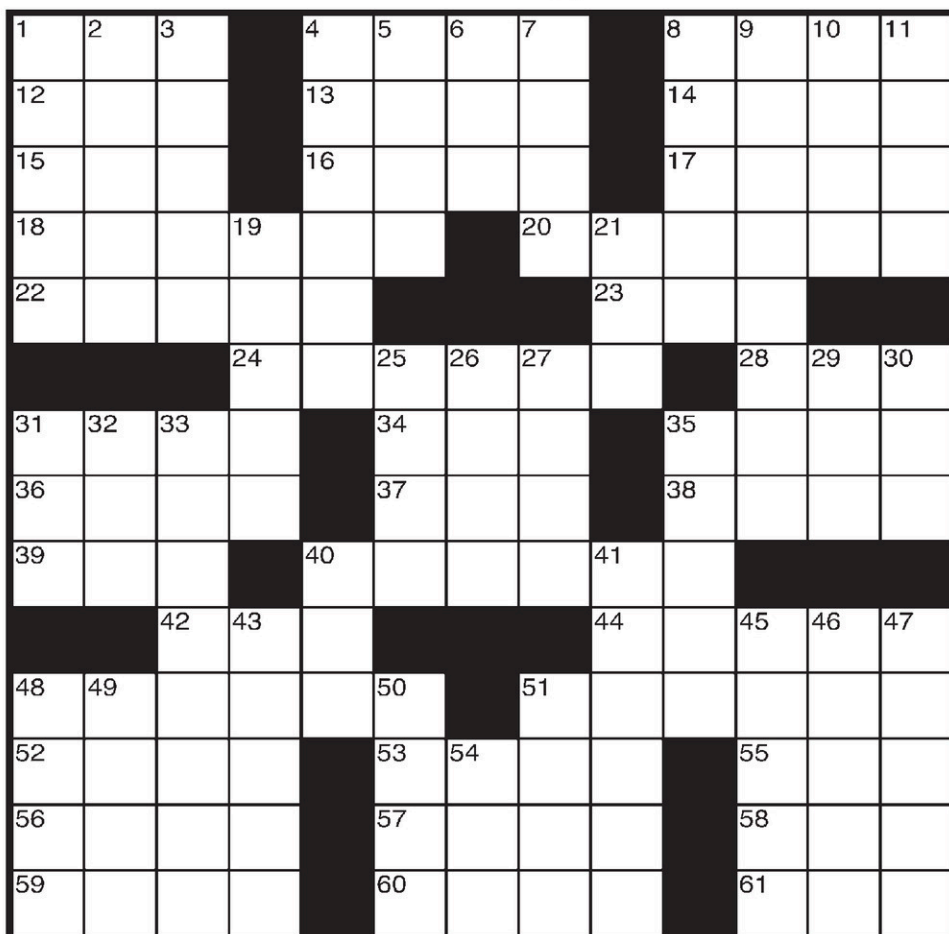

Don't waste time -- keep thinking!

Raymond Chandler once wrote, "Chess is as elaborate a waste of human intelligence as you can find outside an advertising agency." It is probably true that people who spend all of their time playing chess (and bridge) could make a more beneficial contribution to society at large by applying their minds elsewhere. Still, I doubt that Chandler objected to having his books advertised.

However, if you are going to play any game, you might as well spend that time concentrating on it to the exclusion of all else. So many contracts are easy to make or defeat if only the declarer or the defenders analyze the situation. For example, in today's deal, South is in four spades. How should he plan the play after West leads the club queen?

North's three spades was a limit raise. This was an accurate evaluation because of the eight losers and sterile 4-3-3 distribution.

Declarer, with no losers to ruff in the dummy, took the first trick and immediately ran the spade 10. East won with the queen and returned a club. Suddenly South stopped in his tracks. He had four losers: two spades, one diamond and one club. Eventually he played on and finished down one.

If only South had checked his losers at trick one, he could have foreseen that outcome. All he had to do was lead the diamond jack from his hand at trick two. He establishes a discard for his club loser, with the heart king in the dummy as an entry if East holds up his diamond ace for one round. Instead of down one, the contract makes in comfort.

When playing in a suit contract, count your losers at trick one.
