We publish this morning a letter from Messrs. W. P. They are now eclipsed by the new engine, to which reference is made in the correspondence which we publish; and at a time when fuel is of enormously increased value, having reached almost famine prices, such an engine is a matter of great interest to all parties engaged in navigation or manufacture. We congratulate Messrs. Bartley & Co. upon having produced an engine which is thus certified to effect a saving of thirty-three per cent. over the best engines now in use of the high pressure or condensing types.—Gazette.
