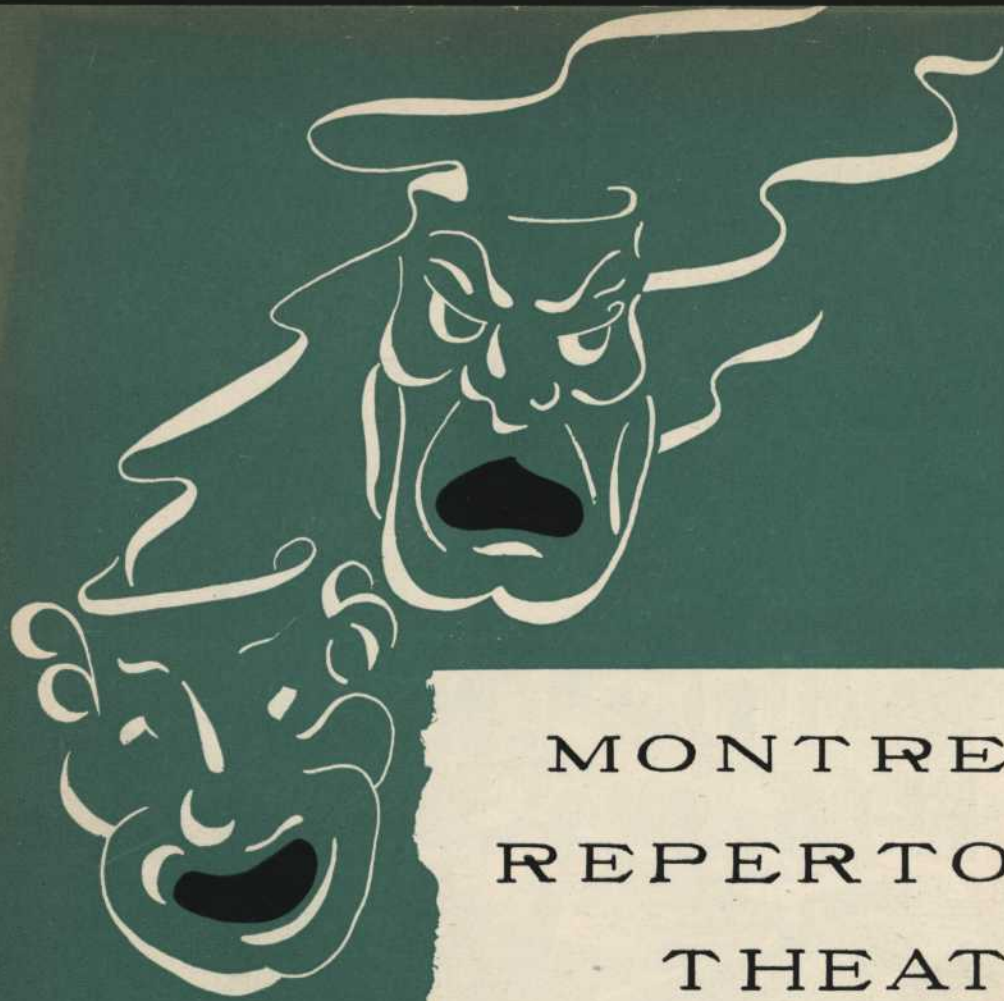

MOLSON'S REMEMBERS...



CANADA'S FIRST RAILWAY...1836

Molson's was completing its first half century when railroading commenced in Canada — on July 21, 1836. That day The Champlain and St. Lawrence Railroad made its first run from Laprairie to St. Johns, Que. — a distance of 15 miles.

The engine was the little "Dorchester", weighing 12,563 pounds, its smoke-stack towering eleven feet above the rails. Its wheels were of wood with iron tires.

The steamer "Princess Victoria" carried passengers across the St. Lawrence from Montreal to Laprairie to connect with the railway.

ABOUT THE CAST

GWYN WILLIAMS (*Ethel Savage*) has in a few short years become one of MRT's most dependable young actresses. Miss Williams has the versatility of an experienced player and despite her youth has specialized chiefly in character work. A few of her most outstanding characterizations at MRT have include appearances in *The Corn Is Green*, *Amphytrion 38*, *Dear Octopus*, *Cradle Song*, *Trelawny of The Wells*, *The Heiress*, *The Infernal Machine* and *A Doll's House*.

BETTY TAYLOR FENWICK (*Fairy May*): Another MRT veteran, Mrs. Fenwick's most recent appearance was as the young girl in *The Glass Menagerie*. Other performances have included those in *Watch On The Rhine*, *Hotel Universe* and *Romeo and Juliet*, in which she played Juliet.

MARJORIE ROOT (*Mrs. Paddy*) makes her first appearance at MRT in this role. She has had, however, a considerable amount of theatrical experience in the past, having appeared for three summers at Brae Manor, a summer at the Peterboro theatre with Bruce York and Michael Sadlier and has done a considerable amount of work with the McGill Drama Group.

SYLVIA K. READ (*Lily Belle*) was last seen at MRT in the Christopher Fry play *A Phoenix Too Frequent*. During the past summer she was one of the Joannas in the Mountain Playhouse production of *Present Laughter* in which she played opposite Barry Morse, and previous to coming to Canada Miss Read was active in Rep Theatre in England. Miss Read has also studied at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in England.

GRIFFITH BREWER (*Jeffrey*) needs no introduction to MRT audiences, for in a comparatively short lifetime Mr. Brewer has appeared in more MRT productions than even he can remember without a careful check on his memory. Besides acting Mr. Brewer's activities in the theatre have evolved into a full-time career, as scene designer and director. A few of Mr. Brewer's appearances at MRT have been those in *This Way To The Tomb*, *Joan of Lorraine*, *Trelawny of The Wells*, *The Two Shepherds*, *Uncle Harry*, *There Shall Be No Night*, *Fortune*, *My Foe* and *Will Shakespeare*.

PETER ARMSTRONG (*Dr. Emmett*) makes a welcome return to the stage of MRT after an absence of a season or so. Recently Mr. Arm-

strong has been active as a director in various groups throughout the city. He has appeared before at MRT in *Joan of Lorraine* and at Trinity in *The Linden Tree*, *The Hasty Heart* and *This Happy Breed*.

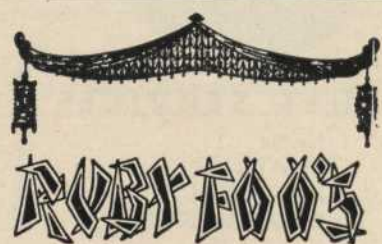
JOHN GIBBON (*Titus*), whose name appears on MRT's rostrum of actors with consistent regularity every season, needs no more introduction to MRT audiences than many others in this present cast. He will be remembered for his performances in *Joan of Lorraine*, *The Barretts*, *This Way To The Tomb*, *Coriolanus* and *Will Shakespeare*.

PEGGY HORTON (*Florence*) has appeared previously at MRT in *The Two Shepherds*. She has been active in theatrical work at Queen's University prior to her debut at MRT and has been a student of the MRT School of the Theatre.

JAMES H. DONNELLY (*Samuel*) has appeared previously with the Batavia Players in N.Y. where he has played in such productions as *Admirable Crichton* and *The Hasty Heart*. This is Mr. Donnelly's first appearance at MRT.

JOHN SEXTON (*Hannibal*) is also making his first appearance at MRT though he has played with various other groups in the city including The Mountain Playhouse, Trinity Players and Open Air Playhouse.

MARY LINDSAY KERR (*Miss Wilhelmina*) who won the award as best actress in the regional festival for her performance in the Canadian Play *Jupiter In Retreat* has appeared before at MRT in *Uncle Harry* and *The Constant Wife*. She has been an active member of Trinity Players and has appeared at Brae Manor.

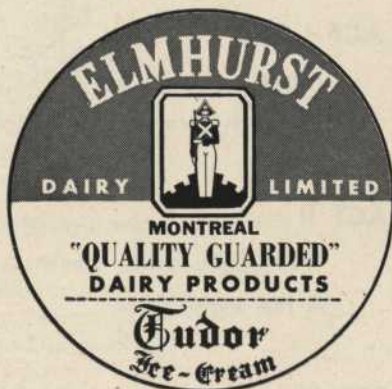
