THE ARMED PEACE.

THE DUBLIN FREEMAN of the 16th inst.

says: When the three Emperors met
the other day in August, Prince
Bismarck assured the world that the
meeting was the harbinger of a period
of universal peace, prosperity, and
tranquillity. An opportunity now arises
for ascertaining how accurate the possi-
ble truth of this prophecy. It is true
that peace now reigns throughout
Europe; but it must be remembered
that there are two kinds of peace—one
a healthy and happy repose; the other
a morbid and deadly calm. The latter
precedes a terrible awakening. A writer in
the *Post* has been industrious enough to
arrange a number of facts throwing con-
siderable light on the subject of the
European peace. He says that the
Austrian Prime Minister, Count Andri-
assy, has proposed an increase of the military
budget, when he is sensible that the de-
ficit in the Hungarian budget of 1873 will
be thirty-one million florins; and he
goes a step still further by expressing
his "alarm and expression is tantamount
to a declaration that the peace of Europe
should be doubted." These two impor-
tant matters he sets about to accomplish,
the writer reminds us, within seven
days after he had parted from the
military from Prince Gortschakoff and
Prince Bismarck. France seems also
"more sincerely absorbed with the re-
construction of her shattered empire,
with the consideration of the financial
peril which surrounds her." In the face
of the north "Russia bristles with
bayonets; and barely twelve months
ago she showed her bad temper by tearing to
pieces the convention which held the
Europe to be a neutral sea. Turkey has
been negotiating a fresh loan; and if the
money should not be wanted for arms,
precision, for what earthly reason, then,
has the Grand Turk been begging and
chattering in the markets of London and
Frankfurt? "There is slight cause," the
writer continues "for the people over-
whom Victor Emmanuel reigns to over-
step the bounds of rigid economy, to which
they have almost sworn to confine them-
selves. But even Italy is not free from the
war-like taint, removed, as proudly
availed, by the august concave which
has just closed its debate. Berlin is
scarcely less prone to the warlike taint,
lines of forts, and the air is rent with the
noise of welding into shape all conceivable
kinds of 'murderous implements.' How
rational and far-sighted are the orders
issued on the fulfilment of pacific pro-
phecies blown already to the winds! The
writer then goes on to draw attention to
one of the most curious phenomena of
the age. The Irish are a people who
are eclipsed by the gigantic proportions of
the Prussian emigration. In the one case
the people fled from a land stricken by
misery, law, and unpopularity; in the
other, the greatest, strongest, most pow-
erful nation in the world. This greatness,
however, is purchased by a frightful price,
and thousands of Prussian youth prefer
exile to the iron discipline and the
dull monotony of a German soldier's life.

THE IRON AND COAL TRADES.

The Times of the 17th inst. says:—A
large number of vessels continue to arrive
in the Tyne. At present the supply of
coals is in excess of the demand, and
a good few ships will have to wait for
employment. It is estimated that the
demand is much less than in the northern
coal trade from last week and the week
before. Merchants appear to hold back;
at any rate, a limited number of orders
come into the open market in the steam
coal trade, and terms, as a rule, are short
at the shipping places. The quoted
prices are unaltered, but, as usual, there
are rumours that some of the major col-
lieries and middlemen who hold contracts
have had to submit to a slight reduction
upon the quoted rates to make business.
During the past ten days a good few
large Liverpool and American sailing
ships have loaded up large cargoes of
steam coals in the Northumberland Dock
and in the open space in the Tyne for
Borlase and South American ports. In
consequence of the demand for ready
steamers to bring coals from the
Black Sea moderate rates have been
taken upon the outward voyage
where quick despatch has been guaran-
teed. The household coal trade in the
North has continued to sympathize with
business in the London market, in which
market prices have considerably fallen,
and the tendency of which, if anything,
has been downwards. It has been noted
on the Tyne that, though the quoted
prices at the pits remain with very little
alteration, the price of the same class of
coals in the London market is lower than
it was, and the difference is not corrected
by a reduction in the cost of freight,
therefore it is argued that the colliery
owners seem determined to sacrifice a
portion of the cost of freight upon coals
that may happen to be sent by them to
the London market sooner than yield in
price at the pit. The demand for gas

coals is tolerably well sustained, though
the shipping turns are now quoted at
from 10 to 14 days. There are more ma-
nufacturers in the market, though
there is still a great demand for them,
both for home use and shipment. The
pitmen and all classes of workmen in the
district are now working very steadily.
There are no trade disputes moment in
any part of the district. The high prices
of coal and iron, while they are
greatly tending in the direction of
developing new collieries and iron
works, check other classes of enterprise
in the north. For instance, a large
amount of new work and extensions,
which the railway companies have Parlia-
mentary powers to carry out, stand over-
ment. Other sorts of building operations, not
immediately connected with the coal and
iron trade, are affected in the same way;
so that if coal and iron were reverting to
something like reasonable prices, a good
deal of steady business would flow into
the market, and there is no danger of a
panic collapse of business, even if the
low prices in either the coal or iron trade
this winter. One or two good orders for
a large class of iron steam shipping have
recently come to the Tyne, and some bet-
ter prospect, however, but that the iron
steamship building trade of the north of
England will be in a poor way during the
winter months.

Improvement Commissioners intend to com-
mence in the spring of next year with the
works for making a large export and im-
port dock at the Colne Dene, in Shields
Harbour. They are likewise expending
over £100,000 in making new shipping
places to load large steamers with coals
in the Tyne.

There was a thin attendance on 'Change
at Middleborough on Tuesday. Business
was flat. The pig iron makers continue
to quote as much as 115s. per ton for No.
3, prompt delivery, but it is not known
how many sales have been effected on
these terms. It is said, however, that No.
3 can now be bought at 105s. per ton, and
that business has been beginning to pick
up. In fact, there is evidently a diver-
gence on several instances from the quoted
rates upon sales that have been made,
and it is quite clear that the excessive
high prices for iron are beginning to yield
in the Cleveland district, as in most other
parts of the country. The whole of the
blast furnaces are in full operation. In
the manufacturing district the high prices
quoted at 111 to 112 1/2s.; plates, 112
1/2s.; and angles, 122, per ton.

Special Correspondence.

Quebec, October, 1872.—It is intimated
from Washington that the President is
anxious to complete the Washington
Treaty, so-called, by giving practical effect
to its fishery clause. We notice that the
press is representing our Government as
being more friendly to the free trade
visions for fish and oil than a year ago.
It is undoubtedly the result of the
meeting with the Emperor of the Austro-
Hungarian Empire, and a disposition to
conform to the wishes of the Emperor.
The Emperor is a great fisherman, and
deems best for the general interests of
the country. It has been the judgment
of the writer that an exchange of rights
between the two Governments would be
beneficial. The N. A. colonies and the United
States would prove, by a fair test, mutually
beneficial. We want free fishing on all
fishing grounds, and the highest prices for
fish. An event of this kind, if it
you want a free market in the United
States for the product of Dominion fish-
men. The treaty accommodates both
sides, and hence it is the part of wisdom to
give it full effect. An event of this kind
will not fail of increasing the commerce of
the St. Lawrence, as certain kinds of fish from
the northern part of Canada will be likely
to find the transit up the St. Lawrence to
Chicago and other points more advantage-
ous to the buyer than through New
York or Boston. Boston, however, must
be by its central position, but the best
and the best fishing grounds, to which
buyers will resort, the natural market of
the continent. The Quebec merchants,
in order to build up a healthy fish trade,
will find all the inducements of the
