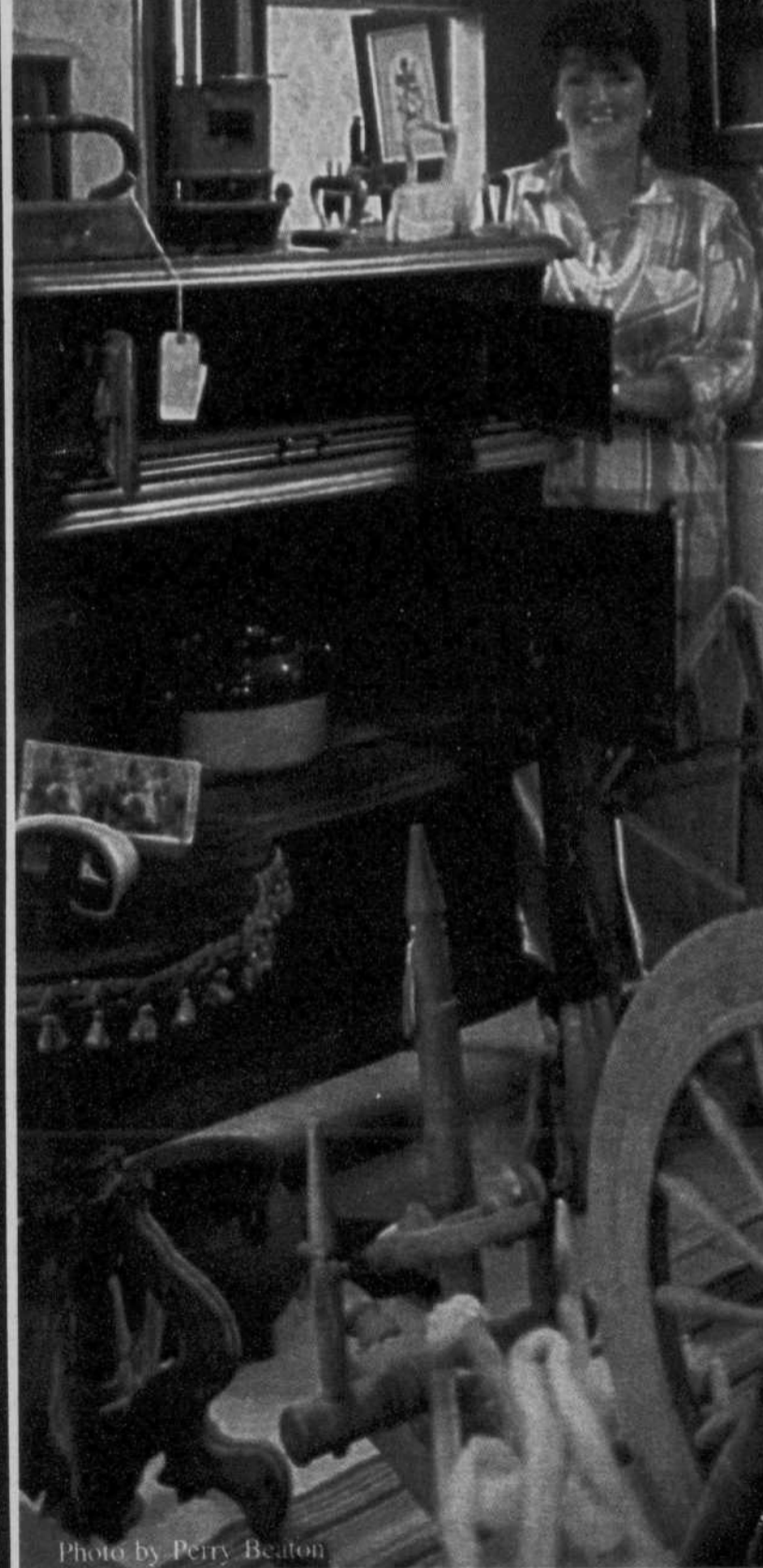

Valtellina has enjoyable spicy touch

Every once in a while the *Société des Alcools* surprises me and comes up with a wine that is not only an excellent choice but is offered at a reasonable price. Such a wine is the *Sassella Valtellina Superiore*.

Valtellina, itself, is the name of a valley, in the Lombardy district of Italy, which runs along the Adda River into Lake Como. Here, both Swiss and Italian workers tend the vines that produce several fine red wines. Valtellina also lends its name to the DOC district (Denominazione di Origin Controllata) which covers both Valtellina and Valtellina Superiore.

For those of you who are fond of the magnificent *Barolo* of Piedmont and its cousins *Barbaresco* and *Gattinara*, the wines of Valtellina will undoubtedly jog your memory since they too are made primarily from the Nebbiolo grape. And although they rarely reach the level of quality of the Piedmontese wines, the wines of Valtellina, particularly the Superiore, have a bouquet and complexity of taste far above the ordinary.

Valtellina Superiore includes four different wines — all red and

all interesting. Of these, *Sassella* is perhaps the best closely followed by *Inferno*, *Grumello* and *Valgella*. Each contains 95 per cent Nebbiolo grapes (here the grape is called *Chiavennasca*) with the remaining 5 per cent made from grapes such as the *Sassella*. To be labelled Superiore, each must also contain a minimum of 12 per cent alcohol by volume.

Essentially, these wines show many of the characteristics of other Nebbiolo wines. They have a tendency towards hardness in their youth which tends to mellow somewhat after two or three years in cask and another three to six in bottle. The time taken to mature, however, depends on the vintage and some reach their peak considerably more quickly.

The 1981 version of the Valtellina Superiore that I sampled, for

example, is ready to drink now. Already showing a slight orange-ness of color around the edges, it is garnet red at the heart with an almost woody aroma reminiscent of wild flowers. The taste is quite complex for a wine of this quality and has a spicy touch to it that is most enjoyable.

Although, as I mentioned earlier, the Valtellina wines hardly ever reach the level of quality of the Piedmontese wines from the same grape, they don't usually reach the same price levels either. This particular bottle sold for \$10.85 and was worth, in my opinion, every cent. But then again, that's just my opinion. Cheers!

Opera festival opens today

GLENS FALLS, N.Y. (JM) — The Lake George Opera Festival celebrates its 25th anniversary this year and the season opens with Strauss' *Die Fledermaus* on July 18. It also plays on July 25, 29, 31, Aug. 4, 6 and 9. Puccini's *Tosca* will be performed on July 26, 28, 30, Aug. 1, 5 and 7. Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Carousel* will be staged on Aug. 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 18. The operas are all in English.

The American Lyric Theatre performs a triple bill of Ravel's *The Spanish Hour*, Dorizetti's *Rita*, and Moore's *Gallantry* on Aug. 17 and 19. Then there's *Opera-On-The-Lake* at 7 p.m. July 20,

27, Aug. 3 and 10, on board the Mohican for four hours of music, champagne, and glorious scenery as festival artists and musicians serenade with operatic and popular songs.

The undoubted highlight will be the 25th anniversary birthday concert and party on Aug. 2, at 8:15 p.m. It will feature major artists who have performed during the past 25 years and will be followed by a gala party at the Queensbury Hotel.

Canada Post has done well this year

Canada Post has given us some rather nice stamps so far this year. Granted, there are a couple that leave a lot to be desired. However, on the whole, not bad.

Things started well with the release of the Expo 86 series on March 7. The theme being communication and transportation, or, World in Motion, World in Touch, these first two denominations of 34 cents depicting the Canada Pavilion and 39 cents showing communication satellite, receiver and old telephone are very attractive.

On April 28, two more stamps commemorating Expo 86 were released to complete this four stamp series. The 34 cents shows the Expo Centre while the 68 cents denomination features World in Motion with an old steam carriage, a conventional rail car and a modern mono rail train.

On April 14, two stamps were released commemorating Molly Brant and Philippe Aubert de

Gaspé. Thank goodness these are both domestic rate stamps. No more need be said.

The Canadian Forces Postal Service was commemorated on May 9. It was a long time in coming. During the last two great wars this unit did yeoman service considering the conditions.

Canada Post went back to giving us a little wildlife in the issuing of a se-tenet block of four different

birds native to Canada. Jean-Luc Grondin was commissioned to provide paintings for the stamps, which show a Great Blue Heron, a Snow Goose, Great Horned Owl and a Spruce Grouse.

Canada Post changed its format for the Canada Day stamps this year. It can be said that it's for the better. Science and Technology is this year's theme, featuring Canadian Innovations in Transportation. Four domestic rate stamps in se-tenet form were issued depicting a railway rotary snowplow, variable pitch propeller, an anti gravity flight suit and Canadarm. The stamps were released on June 27.

Canadian commemorative stamps are available for six months from date of release. You may purchase these stamps through your local post office or in the case of plate blocks, through Philatelic Service, National Philatelic Centre, Antigonish, N.S., B2G 2R8. You may also purchase plate blocks, first day covers and other Canadian philatelic matter through a philatelic counter of the post office, the nearest one being in the main post office in Sherbrooke.

Horn player laments public's reluctance to try new things

ORFORD — There's not much routine in a successful concert musician's life. He's on the move much of the time, hopping from country to country on concert tours.

This can be tiresome. Like most of us, French horn

player Ifor James might crave a little routine, but not the kind he gets.

"The only routine I have is a sad one," he says, and that's the necessary repetition of familiar French horn music, when there's so much more to choose from.

Everywhere he goes, he says,

people want to hear the same Mozart and Strauss concertos. "They're so stiff in their approach," he says. "If you mention to them a concerto by Rosetti, they say they would rather hear Mozart."

James, a celebrated horn player originally from the North of En-

gland, has been teaching at the Orford Arts Centre over the past week, and will put on a concert there tonight.

PERFORMED ONCE

This mind-set among music lovers is particularly sad, says James, because new compositions don't get the exposure they deserve. Four years ago, for example, Hans Ola Ericsson, a young Swedish composer, wrote a piece called *Inferno*. It has only been performed once.

"It's wonderful but nobody wants to hear it," says James. "They won't go and listen to anything new." This is partly because modern composers have "served up so much rubbish" in recent years, he says. As with modern art, some modern music, written by "charlatans" who know nothing about music, has turned people off anything new.

Similar biases affect the way the public takes to certain instruments. A horn player could never pack the concert halls the way flutist James Galway can, says James, no matter how good he or she is.

"The funny thing with trends of this kind is that generally speaking people tend to get excited with things which go fast and things which are high," he says.

TENORS MAKE NAMES

That's why trumpet players can become stars. In string instruments, the public goes for the violin. Similarly, although there are great bass singers, the tenors make big names for themselves.

As frustrating as these predilections may be for a musician, James finds it hard to condemn them.

"That's what music's about; it's about fantasy," he says. "If it speaks to you, however it speaks to you, that's good."

The flutists and trumpeters may tend to make more money, but the really good horn players are by no means starving, he says. And horn players do become stars in certain circles.

Among the stars today (besides himself), James lists Australia's Barry Tuckwell, Great Britain's Allan Civil, Sweden's Iblansky Otto, Norway's Frøydis ReWekre and West Germany's Herman Baumann. In Canada, James Summer-ville shows a lot of promise, he says.

There's a healthy spirit of competition among the better-known horn players, says James, but no nonsense. "In our business you try to be nice to everybody," he says, "because you can be sure as they're coming up, you'll meet them on your way down."

There's too much emphasis on competition in the music world today, he says. It's not the same world as when he launched into music. "If you carried a horn case you were in work," he says with a laugh.

James began to play trumpet professionally at age 7. His father was an amateur musician who so-

NOT THE BEST WAY

Now auditioning is the only way to get a job, and in most cases young musicians have to win competitions to get anywhere. Sometimes these competitions don't result in the best musicians being chosen, says James. And it's not always the best way to get to the top.

"When you find yourself pitched into the top, it takes a toll," he says. Young musicians are suddenly forced to put on 60 to 70 concerts a year, and they can't be at their best with this kind of demand.

"I mistrust competitions," he says. "Music wasn't meant for people to compete against each other; it was meant for people to play to each other."

The concert tonight includes works by Mozart, Jean François, Paul Dukas, Francis Poulenc, Joseph Rheinberger and some "little tunes" of James' own composition. He will be accompanied by Carmen Picard on piano.

"I'm going to go out there and have a lovely time," he says. "The audience wants to have a lovely time too, so I hope we can do so together."

Book illuminates musical statements of the Beach Boys

The Beach Boys by David Leaf (GENERAL PUBLISHING): \$12.50, 208pp., b&w illustrations.

Had the Pythons not already used it as a title, David Leaf could as easily have called this retrospective of the chequered recording career of Hawthorne, California's ambassadors of sun and surf **The Life of Brian**.

The Beach Boys, as carefully argued by author Leaf, were predicated on, and devoted to nurturing, the life of their prime creator, burly Brian Wilson, whose first three years of creativity — circa 1961 through 1965 — represent a high point in American rock composition. Leaf traces the stormy years of early Beach Boys glory, with the Wilson boys' (Brian, Carl & Dennis, plus cousin Mike Love and pal Al Jardine) father Murray at the helm of their breakout career, revealing the tempestuous in-fighting, competition and jealousies that have long been part of their fabric.

Gauging the development of the group according to Brian's creativity, Leaf emphasizes that the abandoned, ill-fated album to be called **Smile**, and the subsequent hostility that Brian's eccentric composition began to bring out in the other Boys, notably Mike Love, led to the hermitic existence that the elder Wilson sibling lapsed into along about 1967.

Leaf argues that the depression brought on by drugs and a waning musical muse's reluctant presence brought on the "sandbox in the living room" phase of Brian's escape from reality. **The Beach Boys**, as well as exploring the personality tensions within the band, gives definitive background information about the creation of the many album projects, provides a running commentary on the constantly fluxuating dramatic personae of the on-stage configuration of the Boys. It assesses the roller-coaster ride of fervor, disinterest, madness, indifference, and lately sainthood, that American audiences have felt for their favorite band, "The Spirit of America".

The death of drumming brother Dennis Wilson on December 28, 1983, in a drowning incident in Marina Del Rey harbour did not diminish the impact that the Beach Boys have had in the eighties. Da-

Kaleidoscope

David Leaf's update of this book originally published in 1977, concludes with the exact same theme dominating the tone of his earlier narrative — if only Brian Wilson can get healthy again, and if the remaining Beach Boys allow him the freedom to create outside of the group context, then the very next Beach Boys album could be more of the magic that Brian spun out so effortlessly in the mid-sixties. For Beach Boys aficionados, this book is a verbal accompaniment to the discography of the band that will more than illuminate the musical statements over the years.

Sara Will by Sue Ellen Bridgers (FITZHENRY & WHITESIDE): \$23.50, 307 pp.

This quite touching, often poignant book touches on the lives of a pair of lonely women, one a spinster, the other a widow, who live together in a modest home in the southern United States in a remote kind of existence removed from the modern world.

Access to their family burial plot has been flooded by the Tennessee Valley Authority, and their repeated letters to the bureaucrats in charge fail to win them the bridge to the burial island that has been promised. Into the lives of Sara Will and Swanee Hope, the Burney sisters, come three generations of unexpected, and at first completely unwelcome, visitors. A middle-aged man, Uncle Fate he is called, arrives with his young niece named Eva, who is accompanied by her illegitimate baby, Rachel, and the Burney household is slowly transformed from a lifeless, unhappy dwelling into a thriving, homey place of happiness.

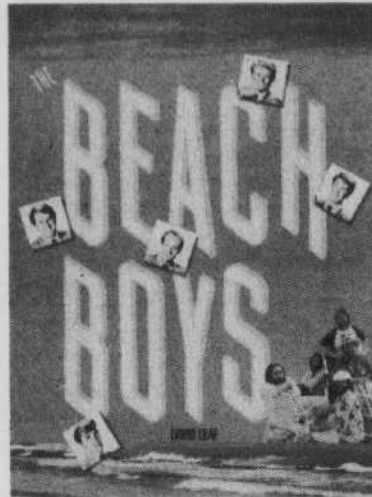
When the suitor of Eva arrives, in the form of a young, awkward man named Michael, who thinks that the baby is his, the strange, multi-generational family unit appears to have reached a point of stasis and well-being. **Sara Will** is a moody, thought-provoking, tender tale about the change that Sara Will undergoes as the outside world impinges on her solitude in ways that she never expected could be possible.

The book turns into a love story at the same time as it develops themes of social alienation, lack of family understanding, and the normal resistance that people have to social change. Sue Ellen Bridgers is a storyteller in the Ann Beattie mold, with Margaret Laurence's knack of creating believable, and loveable female characters.

Death, Glory and Retribution (CAPITOL-EMI)

What a weird and wonderful collection of 15 rock rarities is captured under that catch-all of a title for a retrospective of novelty and



"answer records".

Ranging away back to June of 1958 for one of those haunting "one-shot wonder" singles, Jody Reynolds makes an appearance with his only hit, the eerily pulsating "Endless Sleep", while Jan & Dean continue the morbid tone with their cruelly ironic "Dead Man's Curve" a premonition of the tragic automobile accident that almost sent these surfers to Rock and Roll Heaven.

A trio of songs that indirectly may have been inspired by the Vietnam War, Glen Campbell's "Universal Soldier", Jody Miller's "Home of the Brave", and Johnny Burnette's patriotic sap, "God, Country and My Baby", is a reminder of the way the protest era took any grist into its mill. A Beach Boys' version of "Then I Kissed Her", produced by Brian Wilson, is an answer to the Crystals' 1963 hit "Then He Kissed Me", while Weird Al Yankovic's "My Balogna" is a clever response to the Knack's 1979 hit "My Sharona".

Other responses to hits include Jeanne Black's "He'll Have To Stay", inspired by Jim Reeves' "He'll Have To Go"; Sammi Lynn's "Young Should Know I'm Still Your Baby", a reply to "Take Good Care of My Baby", by Bobby Velline (Vee); and Wendy Hill's "(Gary, Please Don't Sell) My Diamond Ring", the ringing argument given to Gary Lewis and the Playboys who crooned "This Diamond Ring".

Bob Gibson's "Sam Stone", is a rendering of a brutally frank John Prine song with the ahead of its time (1970) chorus: "There's a hole in Daddy's arm where all the money goes/ Jesus Christ died for nothin' I suppose/ Little pictures have big ears/ Don't stop to count the years/ Sweet songs never last too long on broken radios". Sometimes the fillers on these albums have more going for them than the supposed hits from the past. But as collections go, this eccentric gathering of old material has as many surprises as it does nostalgic strains to tweak old memories.

VIDEO SCREENINGS

JEWEL OF THE NILE (CBS-FOX VIDEO)

The comic confusion begun with "Romancing The Stone" is continued with the sequel — **JEWEL OF THE NILE** — with the main cast intact and the plot perhaps a bit more focused if none the less unbelievable.

Michael Douglas, trying to become the next George Lucas or Steven Spielberg, has a few bucks in this project, and places himself back in the starring swashbuckling role opposite the extremely talented Kathleen Turner. Turner, with an array of odd roles to her credit, again plays the wide-eyed romantic comedy lead role with just enough innocence and facial expressions denoting fear to make her character the most impressive in the film. Danny DeVito flits around the periphery of the movie's action plot, playing a demented, but mildly comical, wisecracking New York City type who dogs the trail of Douglas and Turner.

The subject of the title turns out to be a religious leader of the mystical variety, and the story unfolds in a north African setting, with a maniacal Muammar Quadaffclone putting the end to the honeymooning couple who ended up with the "stone" in the original film. Anyone who ever viewed one of the old Bing Crosby-Bob Hope "Road" movies will find a lot of the visual trickery and the comedic situations in this film old hat, but there are several generations of wonderfully comic.

JEWEL OF THE NILE was just popular enough in the first-run movie houses that we may look for a sequel to the sequel as this opened style of adventure flick has no end in sight.

THE BEST OF TIMES (EMBASSY VIDEO)

Once again a director (this time

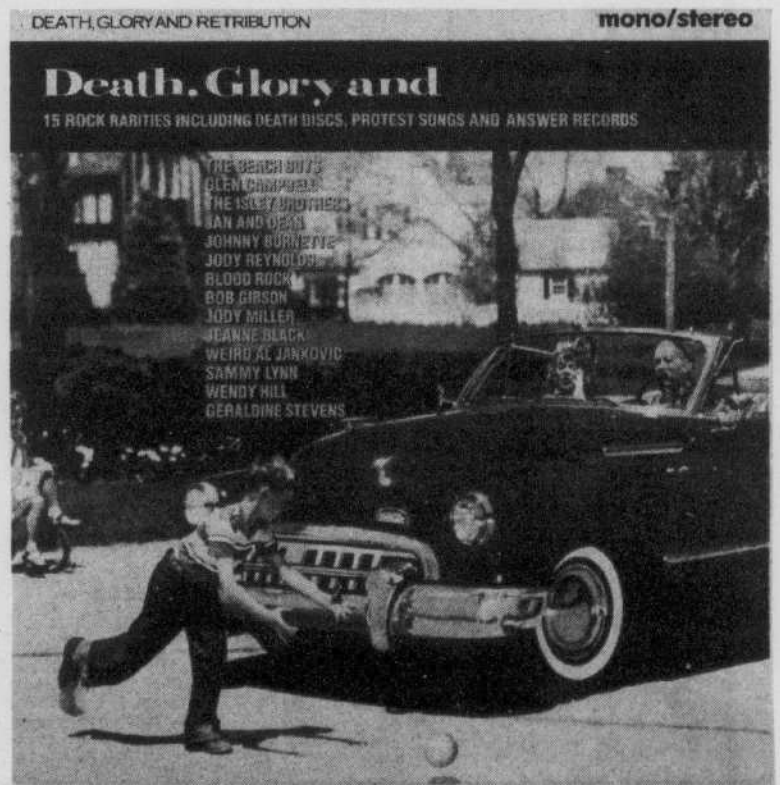
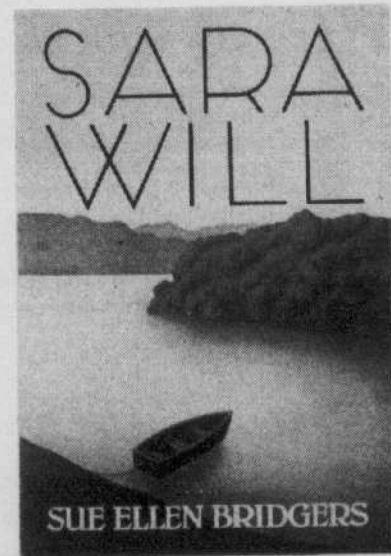
out one named Roger Spottiswoode) takes one of the comic geniuses of our time, Robin Williams, wraps him in an inane and genuinely unfunny train of circumstances and we get to watch him flounder amid a comic film that would not even have the laughs to fuel a one-half hour American sit-com — and that's pretty bleak!

Taking a trite plot line — the "way it was" in the good old high school days — and adding a slight wrinkle to it — maybe we could change the outcome of the big game we blew, if only we had one more chance to replay it — this film makes two better than average actors, Williams and Kurt Russell, and makes them look amateurish.

The town of Taft, California has been taking it in the ear because of a collegiate football loss to the powerful, hated Bakersfield a couple of decades ago. Robin Williams plays the poor klutz who dropped the winning touchdown pass away back then, and his quarterback, Russell and the rest of the town, have never forgotten. Williams gets a chance to replay the big game and the result is so obvious that scarcely a single public school kid would miss predicting the plot's outcome.

Unfortunately the comic situations are as tedious as the plot in this one, and all of the football footage was done more interestingly in the mid-Seventies in Burt Reynolds' "The Longest Yard". If a director like Woody Allen would take Robin Williams and put him into one of his ad-lib, make-it-up-as-we-go-along film experiments perhaps the potential of this incredible comedy talent would be realized. **THE BEST OF TIMES** is merely a frustrating experience of waiting for something funny to happen.

Compton County museum tells stories inside and out

This is the fourth in a series of articles on Townships museums to be featured in the Record over the summer months.

EATON CORNER — The town is small. Home to 75 residents — perhaps. There is one tiny convenience store cluttered high with knick-knacks and debris. Yet Eaton Corner is on the map.

Why? One of the most unique historical museums in the Eastern Townships is housed in this town not much bigger than a football field.

The Compton County Historical Society Museum is unique, not just because of its contents, but because of its buildings. Yes, buildings, with an 's'. The museum's local historical pieces sit, recounting history like an old sea captain, in a renovated Congregational

church (built in 1841) and across the street in a refurbished school house (built in 1821).

The pair of white, green-trimmed buildings are part of the appeal of the museum. Their wooden planks, hand-cut beams, and inclined roofs might be the museum's strongest (or certainly largest) historical statement.

OPENED 1959

The main museum, housed in the church, has been welcoming visitors since 1959 (when the Compton County Women's Institute started collecting and displaying). Open hours are Wednesday to Sunday, from 9 a.m. to noon, and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., from May to October (after September though, the museum will likely only be open on weekends). Between 4,500 and 5,000 people ranging from historians to the just-plain-curious stroll through the museum every summer.

Not bad for a town with a hand-full of families.

Inside, visitors are greeted with scores of intriguing historical items — be they beautiful or humorous. Everything from satin dresses to old sticks of Wrigley's Gum enriches the old-time aura of the building. The set-up of the single open-room church illustrates its ability to convey the image of times gone-by.

The area is partitioned on the right-hand side into a couple of small rooms with large viewing windows. In these rooms and on the red-carpeted altar at the front — decorated with furniture, clothes, and ornaments from the 19th and early 20th century — are mannequins dressed in old garb, almost still-life photographs from the past.

RATES 9½

The museum is fun. And on a scale from one to 10, the Compton County museum rates a nine-and-

a-half, according to Diana Gillam, the museum curator who has been working at the museum for the last six years.

Gillam is a firm believer in the importance of historical museums... especially Compton County's.

She says "the greatest function of the museum is to preserve our heritage. It's a monument to our ancestors."

What does Gillam feel are some of the museum's prized possessions?

Well, of course, the museum's oldest piece is its *pièce de résistance*: an antique fold-down, wooden writing desk, with spiral legs and numerous drawers, including two hidden ones. It's dated around 1790, even before the township of Eaton got its name Dec. 4, 1800.

Also topping the interesting list is a three-tier Habitat iron stove, made in Toronto in 1864, and a large collection of charmingly obsolete medical equipment, such as cat gut stitching.

Included in the glass cabinet with the medical supplies is a worn book entitled *Reminiscences of Student Life and Practice*, by E.D. Worthington, printed in Sherbrooke in 1897 by Walton and Co. The book tells of how the first operation on a patient under the effects of sulphuric acid and later chloroform (what the baby boomer generation so naturally refers to as 'getting put under'), was performed

in the Eastern Townships in the 1800s.

SAWYER

The museum also boasts memorabilia from the Sawyer family — a pioneering foundation stone for the Eastern Townships. Local historians know Josiah Sawyer immigrated from Britain in the late 1700s and built the first log cabin at the site of what is now Sawyerville. Included in the collection is a large Sawyer family bible, a wooden walking-stick with a white-gold knob etched with a dedication to Julia Sawyer, and a set of hand-painted porcelain supper pieces brought from New England in the late 1700s.

And there is oodles more. In fact there are over 2000 items exhibited.

An extremely fragmentary list includes antiques such as hand-made beaded capes, top hats, ceramic dolls, a wooden wheelchair, a collection of spectacles, a bouquet enclosed in glass made entirely from human hair, stuffed animals, and World War I memorabilia from gas masks to pistols confiscated by soldiers from the Eastern Townships.

How did the Compton County Museum procure this scintillating collection? Well, says Gillam, it's a case of the objects coming to the museum rather than vice-versa. Everything has been donated by locals within a 70-mile radius. This has been the case since the 50s when the stately buildings were declared a provincial site by the Commission of Historical Monuments of Quebec and the Ministry of Cultural Affairs.

STILL COMING IN

And Gillam says contributions are still steam-rolling in despite skepticism from some antique dealers who feel the Eastern Townships antique well has long since dried up. As a matter of fact, there is a loft in the church building which is home to dozens of less important artifacts because space doesn't permit them being displayed on the main floor.

Across the street in the school building, renovations are under way, so temporarily these museum pieces are closer to being stored than on view. But anyone can see the pieces simply by asking.

The museum's school building contains mostly old tools and the like. Truly interesting are the "pump logs," pipes made of logs with tunnels drilled through the centre to transport water from the pump to the house.

Also fascinating is the winning mill, circa 1820, which cleaned grain; the coffee mill from Tom Riglor's store in Scotstown; the school benches from about 1850 and an old map of the St. Francis

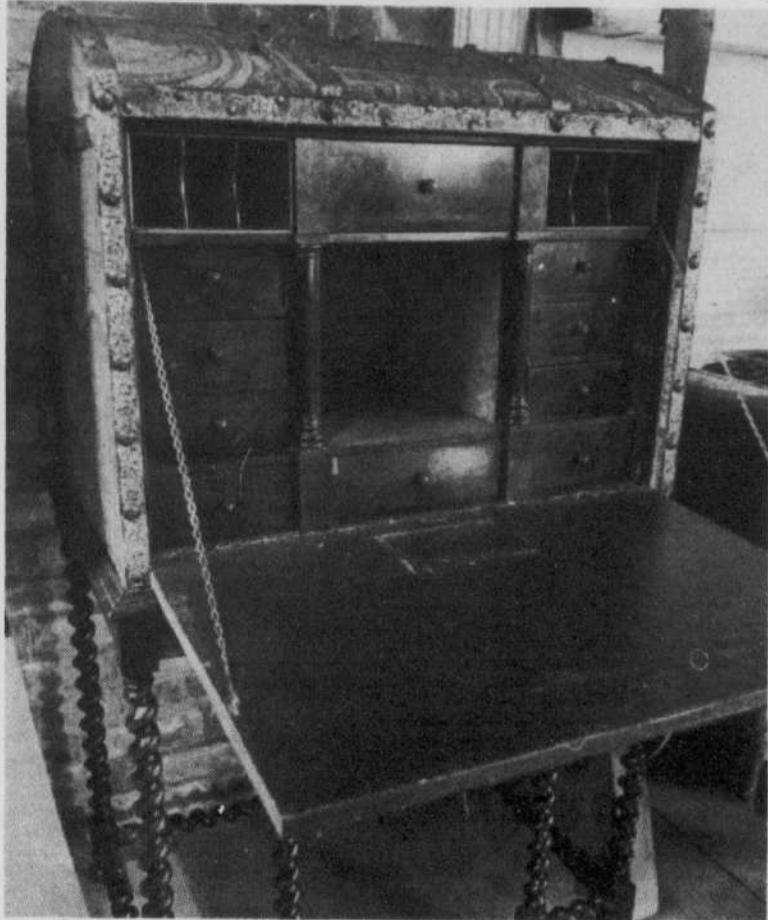

district of the Eastern Townships. This map was made in 1863 when Eaton had a larger population than either Lennoxville or Sherbrooke, says Gillam. Everybody who lived in the area has their name on the map where their house was.

Incidentally, the reason Sherbrooke and Lennoxville grew and Eaton did not was because the

railway (the now defunct East Harford) was built near the river away from the hustle-and-bustle of Eaton, says Gillam.

BOTH SEE AND HEAR

But sometimes, if you're really lucky, you can do more than just see history at this museum — you can hear it. That is, only if an older local is willing to recount a personal tale.

For instance, a colorful gentleman, Carole Lindsey (who proudly boasts of being a descendant of Josiah Sawyer), spoke of an interesting museum artifact: a piece of glass speared by three rusty nails.

Apparently, this was the work of Bill McCallum whose talent entered him in Ripley's *Believe It or Not*. It's as true as the world is round according to Lindsey who says he saw the feat with his own eyes.

Said he, "Well, I was hanging around his (McCallum's) shop and he was busy working on some sort of cabinet.

"We were sitting on the porch and he came out with a small piece of glass and a couple of nails and put the glass up to a post, took a few taps, then spun the piece of glass around the nail a couple of times and said, 'Can you do that?'" Then he sauntered back into his store. Unfortunately said Lindsey, McCallum "took his secret to his grave."

READY TO ANSWER

But even without the verbal folklore, the Compton County Museum is as great a history lesson as one could hope to find. And whenever the museum is open, there is Gillam or a part-time employee on hand to answer any queries.

Besides historical pieces, the museum offers genealogy services. In other words, it traces family roots. Gillam says hundreds of families have been helped including one from Switzerland. And the museum is currently helping a family from California. There is no charge even for non-members, but families who use the service are asked to give a donation. Memberships cost \$3 per person or \$5 per family. The museum gets a yearly provincial government grant. This

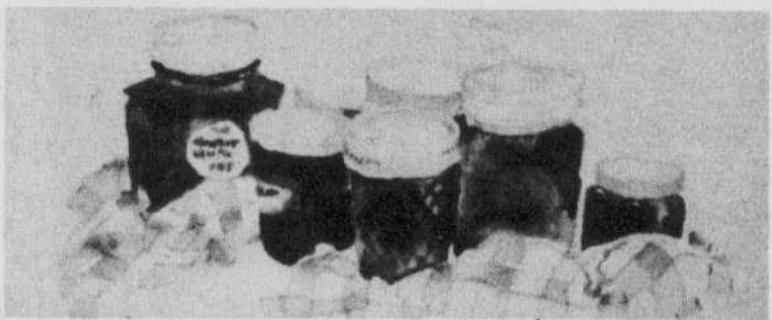
year's was \$11,100 which goes largely towards salaries.

But why wait to use the services before dishing out, asks Gillam? The museum is always willing to accept a donation or volunteer work.

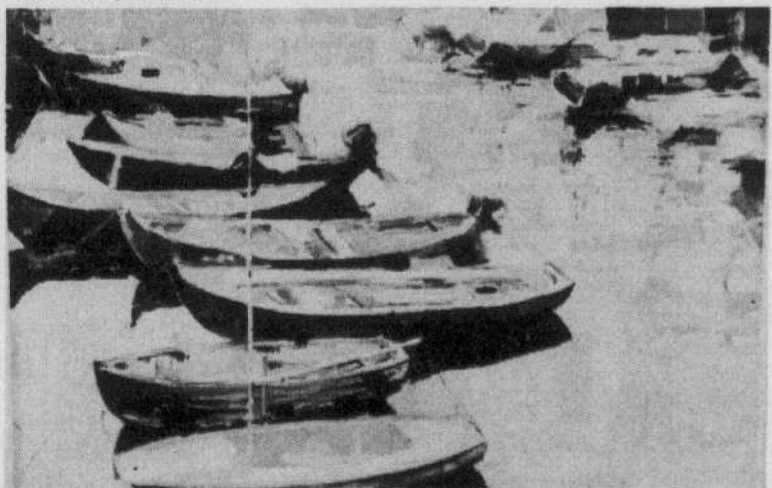
Also in the history vein is a future project planned by the museum. Gillam says workers will soon be cataloging grave stones for possible historical clues, and interviewing local senior citizens.

So if your looking for an alternative to those going-to-the-movies-is-all-I-ever-do blahs, the Compton County Museum awaits, in the heart of Eaton Corner, to inform, intrigue and entertain.

Worthwhile, low-key exhibits in Knowlton, Dunham

If you're looking for art in Brome-Missisquoi this weekend, check out both the Brome Country Historical Society Museum in Knowlton and the Blue Armoire gallery in Dunham. Both offer worthwhile, low-key exhibits.

But if you can only get to one — or if you want to buy a painting — make it the Blue Armoire.

The Sara Colby show concluding in Knowlton this Sunday disappears on two counts. First, there's not enough of it. Colby's 14 pen-and-ink and watercolor sketches don't nearly fill the space of her surroundings. She draws very well, with a light hand, adding pastel washes for highlights. At close range, she's effective. From five feet away, her best lines get lost.

Second, Colby's asking an average price of around \$300 per drawing, or three times the going local rate for similar work. In the U.S., similar work gets \$50-\$75.

All round, the Colby show is a pleasant few minutes' viewing, but cries for counterpoint, for other artists to help fill the gallery, and help show her off in best light.

Down the road at Dunham, current Blue Armoire artists Mary

Martin, Sunshine Taylor, Madeleine Lemire, and Gordon Ladd all ask comparable prices — in the \$300 range — for excellent oil and watercolor landscapes.

Fact is, the gallery offers some striking bargains to the end of the month, left over from major individual shows by all four artists. As often happens, the leftovers are among the best of each artists' work; for instance, Lemire's 'Stop Sign' and some of Martin's more recent, impressionistic views of local scenery. Such paintings go unsold simply because they're different, which is also why the astute collector seeks them.

The Blue Armoire offers many new paintings as well. Ladd borrows a trick from Rembrandt in 'Bountiful', using deep shadow to set off a cluster of blueberries in the foreground. Martin presents new views of several Brome-Missisquoi landmarks. Lemire demonstrates exceptional humor and energy in 'Cazenac II.'

Both galleries are open all day Saturday and Sunday. The Blue Armoire is also open during normal business hours Tuesday through Friday.

There's plenty happening this weekend on the popular music scene as well.

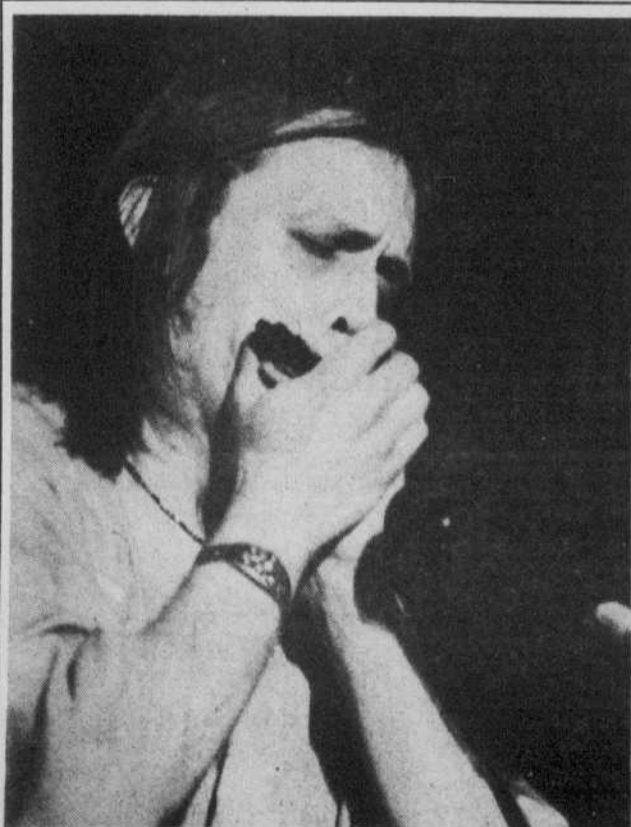

You'll find the **Good Ole Boys** playing country music at the **Bretagne Bar Salon** in Waterville again tonight and Saturday after 9 p.m. and Sunday after 4. In Sawyerville, **Country Fever** with **Steve Aulis** plays every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 9:30 to 2:30 at the **Motel des Cantons**.

Mike Goodsell plays dance music, accompanied by a sophisticated electronic system, at the **Bar Salon Burrough's Falls** tonight and tomorrow night. Mike will be there for the rest of the month.

In Ayer's Cliff, the **Shady Crest** has **Moonshine**, playing country-rock music Thursdays through Saturdays starting around 9:30 and after 3:30 Sundays, until the end of August.

The **Maples** in Stanstead has the **Backroad Band** Fridays and Saturdays throughout July. The country music sounds start there around 9:30.

Down in Derby Line, Vt., **Jimmy's** features **The Rick Pinette Show** this Saturday night. They're calling this their biggest weekend of the year, so it sounds like something out of the ordinary. **Rick Pinette**, I am told, has recorded 10 albums of his rock music. In Mansonville's **Bar Salon Chez Ralph**, **Just Us** continues on for the rest of the month, playing rock music Fridays and Saturdays starting at 9:30. Finally, in the western reaches of the Townships, Stanbridge East's **Old Mill** has 50s, 60s and Top-40 music by **Mac'n'Tosh** Thursdays through Saturdays throughout July, while **Wayne Durrell and Co.** play country western Sundays after 8.

Exhibitions/Events

You could tell by the rate the wine and cheese disappeared that organizers hadn't expected such a turnout. Around 300 people showed up for the opening of an art exhibition at the **Hovey Manor** Tuesday. This is an exhibition of arts and crafts featuring work by some 30 artists of the region, organized as part of the **Festival Lake Massawippi**. Located in the conference room connected to the Tap Room, the exhibition features a tasteful balance of strictly art objects such as paintings and photographs on one hand, and cute and functional crafts on the other.

Among the more impressive artwork represented is **Sara Colby's** watercolors, delicate and wistful in pale colors, often close-up views of rather ordinary domestic sights (clothes hanging out to dry, for example). **Christa Kotieson's** silkscreens are both attractive and intriguing. They comment on conformity and rebellion with Escher-like interlocked human figures. **Denis Godbout's** engravings are sometimes puzzling, but always compelling. Potter **Lucy Doheny** has a good collection of mugs, dishes, soup tureens and such — all very functional, but also visually pleasing in their earthy daintiness. **Barbara Verity** has caught local

people doing whatever they do best in evocative black-and-white photos, while **David McCammon's** color photos make you want to reach out and touch the flowers, grasses, or water he brings up under your nose.

There's a lot more, including hooked rugs, stuffed animals and cushions, enamel work, stationery, apple-head dolls and such that have you exploring every corner of the exhibit hall. The exhibition is open from 1 to 4 p.m. every day except Saturday until Aug. 15.

In the Brome-Missisquoi area, **Sara Colby** has work on display at the **Brome County Historical Museum** in Knowlton, while **Mary Martin**, **Gordon Ladd**, **Madeleine Lemire** and **Sunshine Taylor** are featured at the **Blue Armoire** in Dunham. Take a look at **Merritt Clifton's** review of these two exhibits on page 7.

The **Laurier Museum** in Arthabaska just opened an exhibit of work by ceramist-potter **Richard Fulham** and **Daniel Hamelin**, who is described as a *sculpteur-concepteur*, a term I haven't been able to find an English translation for. Fulham's work consists of decorative pieces such as murals and panels in porcelain and sandstone. Hamelin uses scraps of wood to create animals, toys and innovative pieces of furniture. The exhibition continues until Sept. 2 and you can see it during business hours Tuesday through Friday, or between 1:30 and 5 p.m. weekends. The museum's at 16 Laurier West in Arthabaska.

Townships artists **Claude Lafleur**, **Jacques Barbeau**, **Gordon Pearson** and **Monique Voyer** are among those whose work is currently on display at the **Denise Gallant Art Gallery** in Orford (Cherry River). The gallery is located in the **Auberge Estrimont** and is open from noon to 8 p.m. Friday to Sunday.

I haven't mentioned this for a few weeks, but it's something you should see before the end of the summer. The **Léon Marcotte Exhibition Centre** at 222 Frontenac in Sherbrooke has a display called **SOS: Save Our Species** on until Sept. 7. It's an educational display about endangered species — boring, right? Wrong. A group of local researchers and designers have put a lot of work into this, making it a triumph of organization and impact, far beyond what you would expect from this kind of exhibition. Granted, there's a lot of reading involved if you want to get the full benefit, but

it's all presented attractively, clearly and simply, and the information is really quite startling. You can see SOS daily between 12:30 and 5 p.m.

A parade is planned for 9:30 a.m., featuring pipe bands, and this will be followed by Highland dancing and piping and drumming demonstrations. Athletic events begin at 12:30, including the caber toss, shot-put throw, hammer throw and tug-of-war. The gates open at the park at 9 a.m. tomorrow and the admission price is \$3 for adults and \$1.50 children.

If you miss this event, or if it wets your appetite for more of the same, you can book a place on a bus from Richmond to the Glengarry Highland Games in Maxville Aug. 2. The St. Andrew's Society of Richmond, Melbourne and District is organizing this trip, and you can call the society's president, Rev. James C. MacLan Jack, to book a seat. Richard Corliss of *Time Magazine* says, "It took seven writers to devise plot complications a high school dropout could doodle on a lunch bag." If you drop your defenses and your standards, he says, some of the jokes will force a smile from you. Well, that isn't necessarily a bad thing, is it? It plays at 7:15 and 9 nightly at the Capitol.

Club Paradise, playing over at the Carrefour Cinemas, is being called a waste of Robin Williams' talents. Williams plays a burned out Chicago firefighter who decides to undertake managing a hotel on a tropical island. According to the *Christian Science Monitor's* critic, David Sterritt, this comedy is directed by Harold Ramis "with more enthusiasm than taste or coherence." But then, as you know, critics can get caught up in their own self-importance and all that, and become somewhat out of tune with what the average movie-goer appreciates. *Club Paradise* plays at the Carrefour at 6:45 and 8:45 nightly, and Sundays at 12:45, 2:45, 4:45, 6:45 and 8:45.

Also playing at the Carrefour this week is *Aliens*, sequel to the 1979 horror movie, *Alien*. (You've got to give them credit for not calling it *Alien II*.) I didn't see the original, so have no gems of wisdom to pass on about it. It shows at 7 and 9:30 every night and Sunday at 1:30, 4:15, 7 and 9:30.

The Cinema Princess in Cowansville has *Wise Guys* sho-

wing nightly at 7:15. All I know about this is that it's a comedy. This is followed at 9:05 by *Running Scared*. This one stars Gregory Hines and Billy Crystal as policemen trying to decide whether to continue cleaning up the streets of Chicago, or retire to Florida. The reviews of this are mixed. *Time Magazine's* review says it's as funny as *Beverly Hills Cop*, that Crystal is "one of the few stand-up comics who is fall-down funny as an actor" and that the plot is peppered with well-staged surprises and smart remarks. The *Christian Science Monitor*, on the other hand, finds racist overtones and "bursts of nasty violence", and that the plot doesn't always make sense. Take your pick.

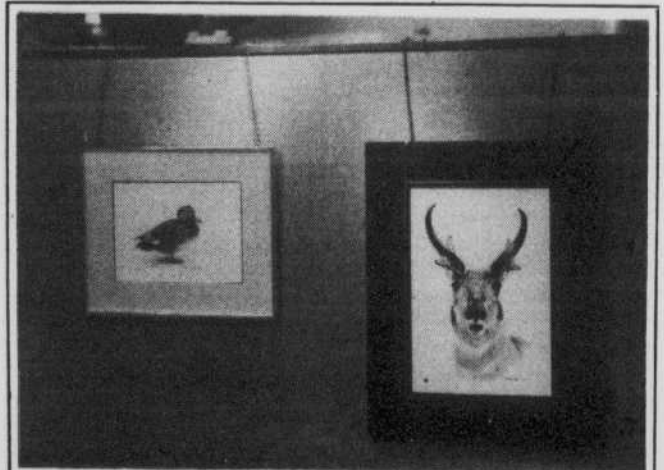
The Merrill's Showplace Cinemas in Newport, Vt. *Back to School* is showing tonight through Tuesday at 7:25 with bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 2:10. Also playing at Merrill's is *Karate Kid II*. Ralph Macchio is Daniel, the endearing underdog who in the first movie learned karate the traditional way from the peace-loving, sage-like Miyuki (Pat Morita), and ends up triumphing over the big bullies who use karate as a weapon, rather than a defense and an art form. It was billed as a "feel-good" movie, and it was. In the sequel, Miyuki returns to his homeland, taking Daniel with him. Miyuki has to fight for his first love, who has waited 40 years for him to return, and Daniel finds a love of his own. The *Karate Kid II* shows tonight through Tuesday at 7 and 9:20 with bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 1:50.

About Last Night also plays at Merrill's this week, at 9:30 tonight through Tuesday night. This is an R-rated movie, which you might expect, considering that originally the movie's title was to be *Sexual Perversity in Chicago*. Some broadcast media in the U.S. apparently thought this was too suggestive and wouldn't accept advertising for it under this name. This is supposed to be a comedy about the yuppies' singles scene, starring Rob Lowe, Elizabeth Perkins and James Belushi.

Ferris Bueller's Day Off is the fourth movie playing at Merrill's this week, tonight through Tuesday at 7:10 and 9:25 with bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m. Matthew Broderick plays 17-year-old Ferris Bueller, who gives in to an overwhelming urge to cut school one fine spring day and head for downtown Chicago with his girlfriend and best friend. Critic Dave Sterritt comes down hard on this, saying it falls in with most of director John Hughes teen-age movies, "a minor summertime diversion", which hovers "between the pretentiousness of 'The Breakfast Club' and the stupidity of 'Weird Science'". Again, you've got to know how to take the critics.

I've heard nothing but good reports of *Three Men and a Cradle*, of which the French version, *Trois Hommes et un Couffin* is playing every night at 7 at La Maison du Cinéma. I said I've heard all good reports; the critiques I've read have been mixed. It tells of three swinging Parisian bachelors who have a baby girl dropped on their doorstep with a note saying one of them is the father. Naturally, she changes their lives, bringing out the nurturing side of them. *Newsweek's* David Ansen calls it "a slight, moralistic and extremely predictable tale", but David Sterritt of the *Christian Science Monitor* says parts of it are amusing and the performances are convincing. Word of mouth reports, however, are that it's very funny.

The more astute readers among you may be just a little indignant at this point, realizing that I haven't seen a movie in weeks. My apologies—I'm not trying to fool anyone—but I ask you, who has the time?

Attention to basics brings guests back to Sutton inn

SUTTON — The Schweitzer Road heads off into the hills southeast of Sutton as a decent-sized paved road. As you climb, the blacktop gives way to gravel, and the road narrows and starts winding.

Just when you think the road is going to run up a tree and into a knothole, you come upon a small farm with a sign reading *Auberge*

Schweitzer at the gate.

Schweitzer Lodge, as it's more commonly known in the area, has been a thriving family-style inn for over 30 years. It's a small establishment, accomodating 25 to 30 guests at a time, but business is steady enough throughout the year to support three families.

In the world of the 50s, 60s and 70s, where the credo of business was that bigger is better, the Schweitzer family were both old-fashioned and ahead of their time in keeping their inn small and manageable — and all in the family.

HOMEY ATMOSPHERE

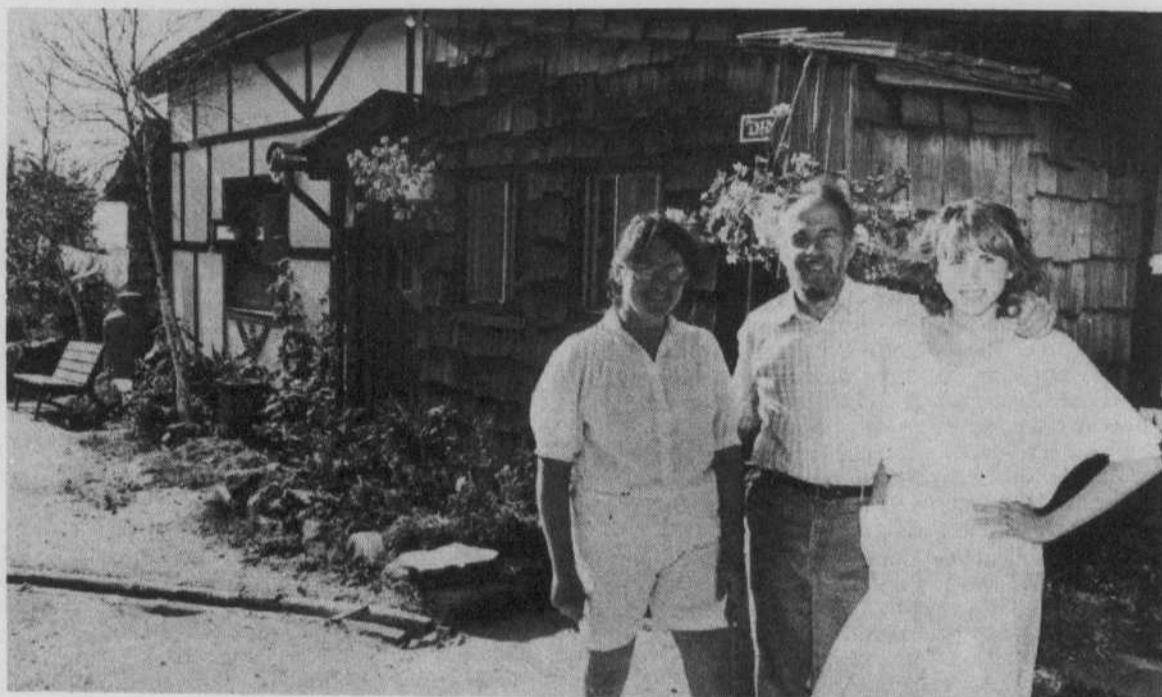
The present owners, Walter and Pauline Canzani, son-in-law and daughter of the founders, attribute the inn's success to the homey atmosphere, the peace and quiet and the attention paid to the basics, like good food and clean rooms.

"The place is simple, but we try to make up for it by having good food," says Pauline. It's late Monday afternoon, there are 21 guests to feed, but she takes the time to show a reporter what's cooking: roast beef, roast goat, baked potatoes, filet of sole, snow peas ("which we picked this morning," Walter adds) and string beans. For dessert there's strawberry pie.

"We always try to have a choice," says Pauline, although she never follows a menu. "As a rule I like to cook what I feel like cooking and then I can cook with a lot of love."

Pauline is at the helm in the kitchen and has one employee. But she also gets a lot of help from her brother Peter, who is a trained chef; daughter Christine and son-in-law Hans-Peter; husband Walter, and at particularly busy times, just about any other family member who's around.

Guests come from Montreal and the nearby United States mostly, say the Canzani, and generally stay about four days. They pay \$32

for one day and night and two meals, \$36 for three meals. And they come from every walk of life.

ALL KINDS

"This place is really different from other places," says Walter. "We have doctors and lawyers coming here, but we also have common workers and they all get along."

The serenity of the spot is carefully guarded by the family. "When people call we tell them it's a quiet place," says Walter.

The family's pride in their lifestyle and the down-to-earth hospitality they offer is evident. They are quick to point out how much of what they serve is homegrown — as much as possible within the government health regulations —

and the variety of simple diversions available to their guests.

"There are a lot of places like ski lodges that are basically just for skiing, but we do lots of other things," says Christine. The family organizes outings such as hiking trips to the Pinnacle mountain nearby for those who want more than just the peace and quiet of the inn, and the surrounding fields and ponds. On holidays and other special occasions the musically talented family invites the guests to an evening of music with Walter at the piano and at least a couple of his four children on various instruments.

There are benefits to being your own boss, says Walter.

FEEL RICH

"In some ways we are rich," he says. "We have a nice view, you can go for a dip in the swimming

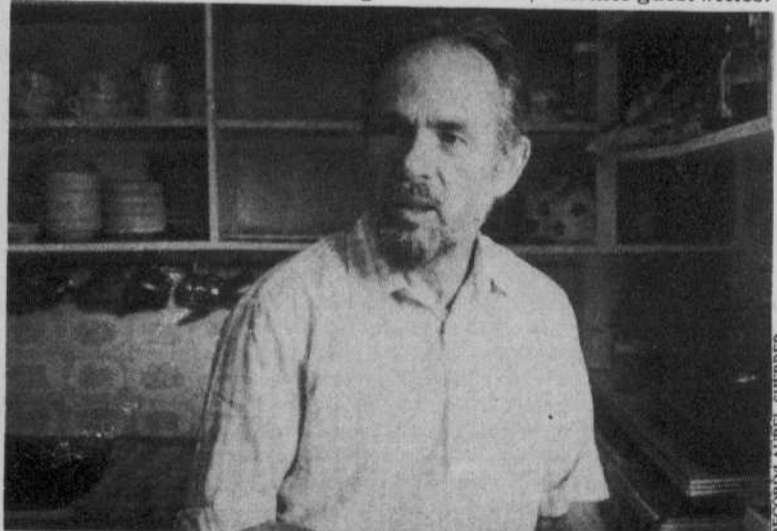
pool during working hours, which you can't do in other jobs."

There are also disadvantages of having a business that is so intertwined with one's life. "Your private life suffers sometimes," Pauline admits. But satisfied guests who often return and become friends make up for the inconveniences.

A hefty guest book contains notes of thanks and mini-essays on the virtues of Schweitzer Lodge, rather than the customary names and addresses of guests.

"Schweitzer Lodge is addictive," one reads. "When you experience their gracious hospitality, comfortable accomodations and wonderful meals, you will always come back."

"The pleasure of being in a warm family setting was the best experience of all," another guest writes.

Fire convinced farming family to open Schweizer Lodge

SUTTON — When Paul Schweizer immigrated from Switzerland in the 30s he followed his heart and bought a beautiful hillside property near Sutton.

He soon found the very things that attracted him made it almost impossible to live off the land. It proved to be all uphill work. You removed the stones one year, and they seemed to grow back by the next.

"My husband, when he came, he bought the scenery," says Margaret Schweizer, now 71. "He didn't see the stones."

But by the early 50s the Schweizers had turned the situation around to their advantage. They had transformed their humble farmhouse into a quiet family-style inn that capitalized on the scenery, the tranquility and hospitality that is as warm as ever, over 30 years later.

Schweizer Lodge came about as the family's way of making the best of a bad situation. Living off a small farm for 10 years had been hard, but the last straw was a fire that took almost everything they owned.

STILL FOREIGNER

As hard as that was for the couple and their young children, it proved one of the best things for their integration into the community.

"I think at the time I was still a foreigner," says Schweizer. "I minded my own business. After the fire, seeing how people helped us, that was so touching. They were thinking of everything, things we didn't even know we lost. Something happened in me, something changed."

It brought out a fundamental love of people that her shyness had kept hidden for a time. She now attributes the success of the lodge to that love.

"I think I always loved people

and I tried to make them happy with their favorite meals," she says. "I think it reached success that way."

But it wasn't instant success. Not being accustomed to guests, they had to learn as they went along.

"I remember one time I had 15 guests and I was shaking because just working on the farm for 10 years I had an inferiority complex," says Schweizer. Later she and her family would serve over 100 guests at times and organize dances and games for them, and they just seemed like part of the family.

The first guests were mainly of German, Swiss and Austrian origin, who in many cases heard of the inn by word of mouth. They found the Sutton area reminded them of their homelands. Many came back again and again, and some bought land and moved to the area.

It was natural for the six Schweizer children to take part in running the lodge as soon as they were able. "I started waiting on tables when I was eight or nine," says daughter Heidi. Holidays were more work than ever, with extra guests coming just for meals. But Heidi doesn't have any regrets. "It was a nice childhood," she says.

Paul Schweizer died in 1973 and Margaret retired a few years later, leaving the lodge under the care of her daughter Pauline and son-in-law Walter Canzani. Finding she had a lot of spare time, Schweizer began to write a book, in German, about her experiences adapting to life in Canada.

She called it *Love is the Way* because, no matter what difficulties you have to face, "if you have love in you, you can deal with them." She described life on the farm, the fire, her mother's visit to Canada, and lots of funny incidents that happen when you're running a farm and raising children.

PUBLISHED BOOK

Her book was published in *Die*

Hausfrau, a monthly German magazine that caters to housewives. It ran in installments over a two-year period. The publishers changed the name of the book to *Brothers Over Land and Sea*.

Schweizer says she might have it translated into English sometime, but it isn't her top priority. Publishing it the first time made her feel like she'd emptied her soul, and she's not sure she wants to do it again.

She's proud of how the lodge has done, not making a great amount of money, but always managing to pay the bills. Some of the changes that the family has had to make are rather sad, but she understands why they have to be.

"We served our own bread, butter, fresh vegetables and piles of cottage cheese," says Schweizer. "Everybody loved our cheese; you can't buy a better cheese." They used their own cheese to make cheesecake that everyone raved about. Now government regulations don't allow them to serve their own dairy products.

SO HEALTHY

"A lot of people came because of the farm products," she says. "I made butter and we had butter milk, and that's so healthy."

One thing that doesn't change is the way the family members support each other, she says.

She remembers being kind of depressed on day as she prepared a meal for about 100 guests. "Heidi asked me will you sing this or that. I sure didn't feel like singing, but I sang and she and the others joined in. After, the work went very easy."

Now that she's retired she's a "travelling grandmother", spending a lot of time visiting children in other parts of Canada. When she's home in her small house overlooking the lodge, she still often goes down to the inn, and helps out when it's busy. "I'm not used to living in a house alone," she says.
