PREFACE.

AFTER an interval of two Years, the Editor has much pleasure in presenting the supporters of the City Directory with a new, and he believes, much improved edition of the work. In collecting the material for the present volume, great care was taken to render it as full and complete as possible, and to secure the obtaining of the French names with greater accuracy than heretofore, two active and intelligent French Canadian gentlemen were employed, who doubtless performed their part of the work ably and faithfully. The rest of the material was collected by himself and two other competent assistants, and he thinks, that altogether, the present volume will be found the most complete of its kind yet issued in Canada. The number of names in the ALPHABETICAL DIRECTORY is about *nine thousand five hundred*, being upwards of ONE THOUSAND MORE than ever appeared in any former edition, and of these MORE THAN SIX THOUSAND have changed their places of business or residence during the last two years. The recent destructive fire having caused the removal of many business people after the work had gone to press, every effort was used to procure their subsequent places of business, and in nearly all cases with success, and any names which do not appear in the body of the work at their new addresses, will be found so in the CLASSIFIED BUSINESS DIRECTORY, and in the Addenda at page 9, which see.

Many enquiries having been made of the Editor regarding the reliability of the Census returns of the City as lately published, he has to say in reply, that he believes the gross population to be *considerably underrated*, as several

families reported having Schedules still in their possession which had not been called for, and as far as it relates to the Religious sub-divisions (excepting the Roman Catholic) it is of no practical value, as the people engaged on it did not seem to understand that the Church of Scotland was Presbyterian, nor the Church of England Protestant Episcopal.

The City has undoubtedly continued to advance steadily during two years past, unmistakeable signs of improvement being now visible in every quarter, and from the great natural advantages which her geographical position confers, there can be no reasonable doubt that she will ultimately become one of the greatest commercial emporiums in North America. Hoping that this period may speedily arrive, and that the friends and supporters of the City Directory may live long to enjoy it,
