## THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty **ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri Rani Victoria, Kaiser-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, DUKE OF SAXONY, PRINCE OF COBOURG AND GOTHA, who was born 26th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:—

POLICE ALARM.

Art. 1.—25 strokes on the alarm gongs in each station, and on the alarm bells, will be the sig-

nal for all officers and sub-constables on duty in the stations to proceed at once to the central station.

Art. 2.—30 strokes will be the signal for all officers and men at stations, and on beat to proceed at once to the central station.

Art. 3.—In day-time, after 12 strokes are given, all officers and men, not on duty, will report immediately at the central station. This rule will apply to men off duty during the night.

For every gig, buggy or other vehicle mounted on springs and drawn by one horse..... 6 00

For every waggon or other vehicle not above specified, adapted for draught by two or more horses..... 8 00

For every two wheeled vehicle or carriage kept for hire by livery-stable keepers.... 3 00

For every 4 wheeled vehicle or carriage kept for hire by livery-stable keepers.... 4 00

Dogs.—to be licensed annually at the office of the Chief of Police: amount of license,—\$2 for a male, and \$3 for a female dog.

*Tariff of Rates.*—To be collected annually by the Chief of Police for licenses issued to carters and others using hackney-carriages or vehicles for the conveyance of passengers, or the transport of goods, wares, merchandise, building materials, produce or other articles in the city of Montreal.

For every cab, calèche or other two-wheeled vehicle..... \$ 5 00

For every four-wheeled carriage, drawn by one horse..... 7 00

For every coach or four-wheeled carriage, drawn by two horses..... 9 00

For every omnibus or stage coach..... 16 00

**CARTS, TRUCKS, WAGGONS AND OTHER VEHICLES.**

The licenses for carts, trucks, and other vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, &c., shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

The first class shall include all carts, trucks, waggons, and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward, not otherwise expressly provided for, and shall pay:—

For every cart, truck, or other two-wheeled vehicle—*Two Dollars*..... \$2.00

For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse—*Six Dollars*..... 6.00

For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses, and made to carry a load under 4,000 lbs. weight—*Seven Dollars*..... 7.00

For every heavy waggon, float or other four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, and made to carry heavy articles or materials weighing 4,000 lbs., or upwards—*Nine Dollars*..... 9.00  
 For every diable—*Four Dollars*..... 4.00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Two Dollars and fifty cents*..... 2.50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Five Dollars*..... 5.00

Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses, employed in drawing the above-mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of *two dollars and fifty cents* (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

**TARIFF OF CARTAGE.**

From any place to any other in the First Division or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile.

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts. Ashes, pot or pearl, 20 barrels, 15 cts. Beef, pork or fish, five barrels or tierces, 15 cts. Coals or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts. Crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts. Flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts. Grain not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts. Lumber sawn from yard or boat, 500 feet broad measure, 15 cts. Salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts. Firewood, dry from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts. Firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts. Furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts. Lumber, green or hard from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts. Molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts. Pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts. Bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile, for all above description of goods, 10 cts. And from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile.—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35, and 40 cts.

From any place in the Western section of the First Division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine Canal, 20 cts. The stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of

Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents. The stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street, from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 35 cts. And vice versa for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first Division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 30, 20, 25 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

**DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.**

*First Division.*—The First Division shall comprise the East, Centre, and West Wards, (including the south-west side of McGill street, and the north-west side of Craig street) and shall be sub-divided into two sections, Eastern and Western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste streets.

*Second Division.*—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence Wards, (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets.)

*Third Division.*—The Third Division shall comprise the St. Louis Ward (exclusive of Craig street) the St. James and St. Mary Wards.

Fractions of hours to be charged at *pro rata* hour rates— but not less than one quarter of an hour shall be charged when the time exceeds the hour.

Fifty per cent. to be added to the tariff rates for rides from twelve midnight to four a.m.

The tariff by the hour shall apply to all rides extending beyond the city limits where the engagement is made in the city.

## BAGGAGE.

For each trunk or box carried in any vehicle.....10 cents.

But no charge shall be made for travelling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry in the hand.

## CHIMNEY SWEEPING.

*Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates of sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, &c.*

Sec. 93.—Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, namely:—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

Sec. 94.—The said inspector may grant licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whensoever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

Sec. 95.—The inspector may for the purposes aforesaid divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary, to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time, as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Sec. 96.—Such sweepers will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

Sec. 97.—The following shall be the fees to be demanded and received by each licensed sweep for cleansing and sweeping chimneys:

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a two story house, ten cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents.

When any sweeper is specially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

Sec. 98.—Such fees shall be payable by the occupant of the house or building wherein such chimneys have been swept, so soon after, and as often as such chimneys are swept; and any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay such fees, or shall prevent any such sweeper from entering into any house or building, or shall in any way obstruct or molest him in the execution of his duties shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 99.—Whenever any chimney shall take fire, and it shall appear that the occupant of the house or building where such chimney may be, had refused or neglected to have the same swept at any of the periods hereinbefore specified, every such occupant shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 100.—The word "Chimney" as applied to the next preceding sections shall mean the interior or flue of such chimney.

The course of studies, in which religious instruction holds the first rank, is divided into two sections—the classical and the commercial.

The classical course, principally taught in French, is designed to impart a thorough knowledge of the Greek, Latin, French and English languages and literature, pure and mixed mathematics, history and geography, philosophy and natural sciences, and whatever is necessary as a preparation for a professional career.

It comprises eight classes—Latin Elements, Syntax, Method, Versification, Belle-lettres, Rhetoric, 1st and 2nd year of Philosophy.

The commercial course, principally taught in English, embraces the English and French languages and literature, mathematics and the other branches named above, moreover book-keeping, and whatever else may fit a young man for commercial and industrial pursuits.

It comprises four classes: Grammar, Literature, Rhetoric and Philosophy.

There are, moreover, elementary and preparatory classes for younger students.

The system of education is paternal. The teachers endeavour to unite kindness with firmness, and make use of the means of persuasion in preference to those of severity.

To be admitted into the college, applicants must present a certificate of good character.

Monthly reports of behaviour, application and progress are sent to parents or guardians.

None but relatives, or those who represent them, are allowed to visit the boarders.

Half-boarders and day scholars must not absent themselves without previous leave from the College authorities.

The collegiate year is of ten months, beginning in the first week of September, and ending in the first week of July.

Terms per year.—Board and tuition, \$150.00; washing, \$20.00; bed and bedding, \$10.00; music lessons, \$25.00; use of the piano, \$5.00; drawing lessons, \$20.00. Half boarders, \$80; day scholars, \$30.00.

Payments, which are required in gold or its equivalent, and strictly in advance, are made in two instalments, 1st in the beginning of September, 2nd on the 1st of February.

The college will not take charge of providing a student with clothing or other necessaries, unless a sufficient sum be deposited in the hands of the treasurer.

No reduction in the above mentioned terms will be granted for absence of less than one month.
