in the Province of Quebec. The weather was not as propitious as it might have been, a bitter north wind greatly inconveniencing contestants and spectators alike. The Meet was a success, however, and was marked by several functions of a social character, such as a public reception by the Mayor and Council in the Armories. 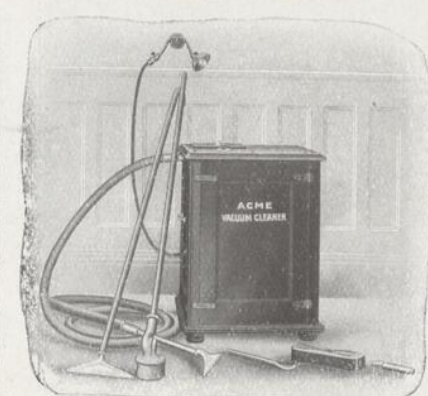

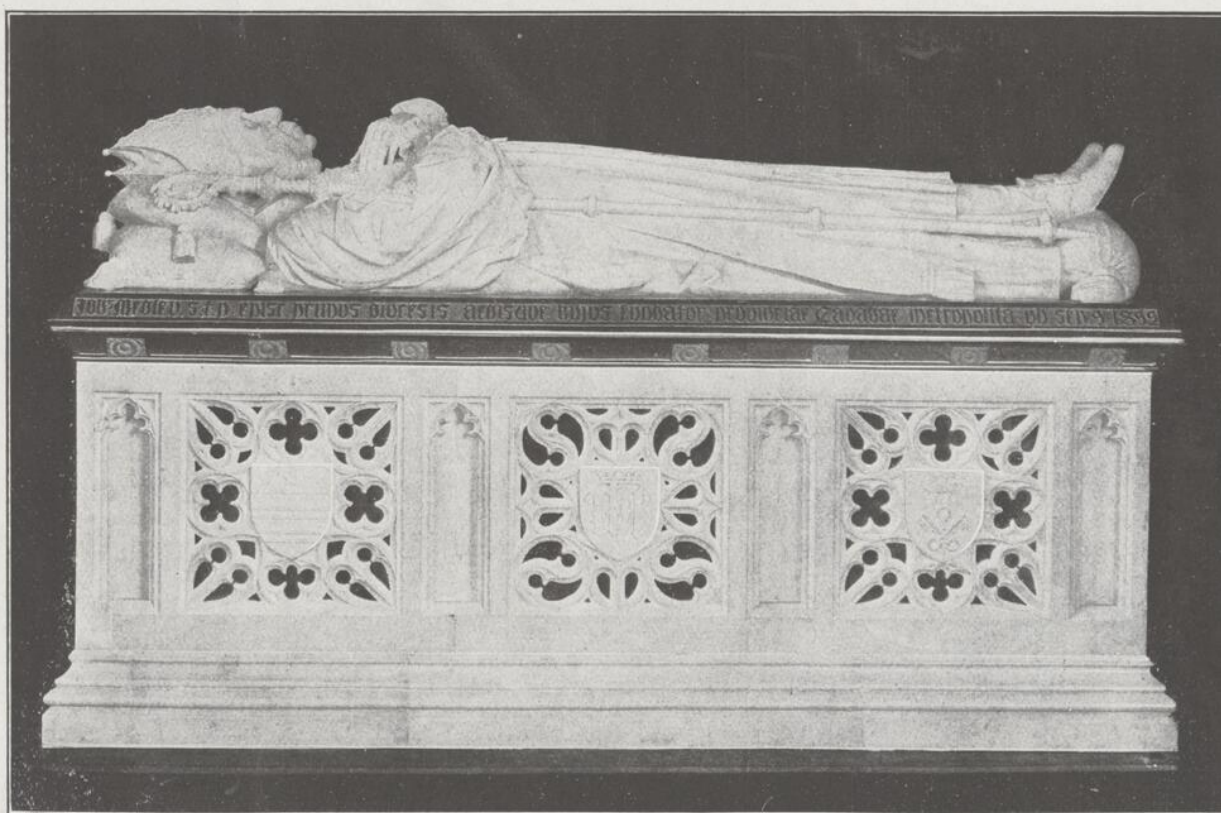

The "Edmund Wood Memorial."

One of the pictures on this page (that illustrative of the Bishop Medley Memorial) will give readers of The Standard an excellent idea of what the Memorial to the late Rev. Edmund Wood in the Church of St. John the Evangelist may look like. At a recent meeting of the Select Vestry of the church it was decided that, at the next annual Easter meeting of the General Vestry, the question of erecting a suitable Memorial to the founder and first rector of St. John's should be considered and discussed, and it is quite probable that this meeting will definitely determine the form the Memorial is to assume.

Shortly after the decease of Mr. Wood an excellent and extremely natural death-mask was taken, and, in view of this fact, it has been suggested by many of his friends that the Memorial should be of such a character as would preserve for and perpetuate to all time the well-known features of the deceased. It is known that the Medley Memorial greatly appealed to the artistic temperament of Mr. Wood on account of its beauty and purity. It has

been said, too, that it was his wish that any Memorial which the congregation of St. John's might see fit to place in the church, after his death, in his honor, should follow the lines of that in the Fredericton Cathedral. It is probable, therefore, that the General Vestry will carry out his wishes, in which event St. John's will put itself in line with many churches in the Motherland which have erected similar Memorials to their founders and first rectors. In the Wood Memorial the figure of Mr. Wood will show the late priest robed in the characteristic vestments of a priest of the Church of England.

It is probable that it may form the model or archetype for the Memorial which is to be placed (in the not distant future) in the Church of St. John the Evangelist in this city in honor of the Rev. Edmund Wood, founder and first rector of the church. 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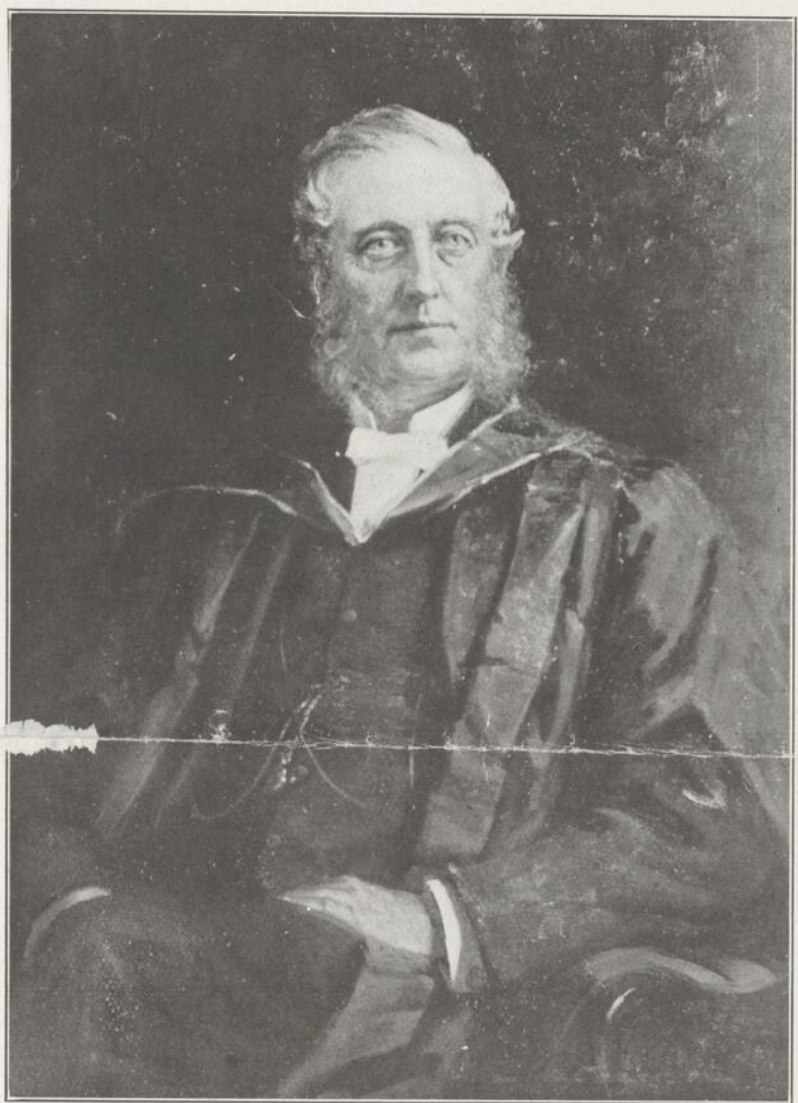

THE LATE WILLIAM TASSIE, M.A., LL.D., who was for many years connected with the educational life of Galt, Ont.

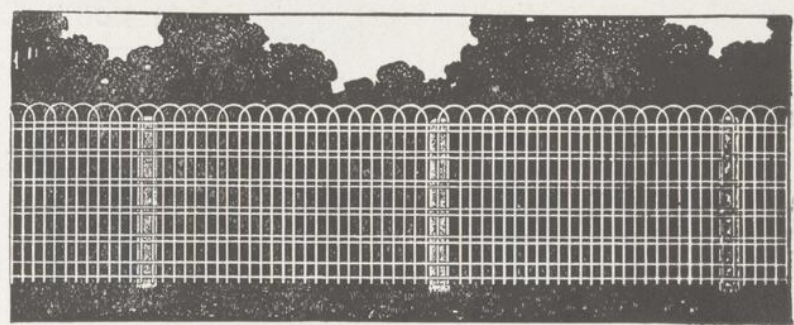
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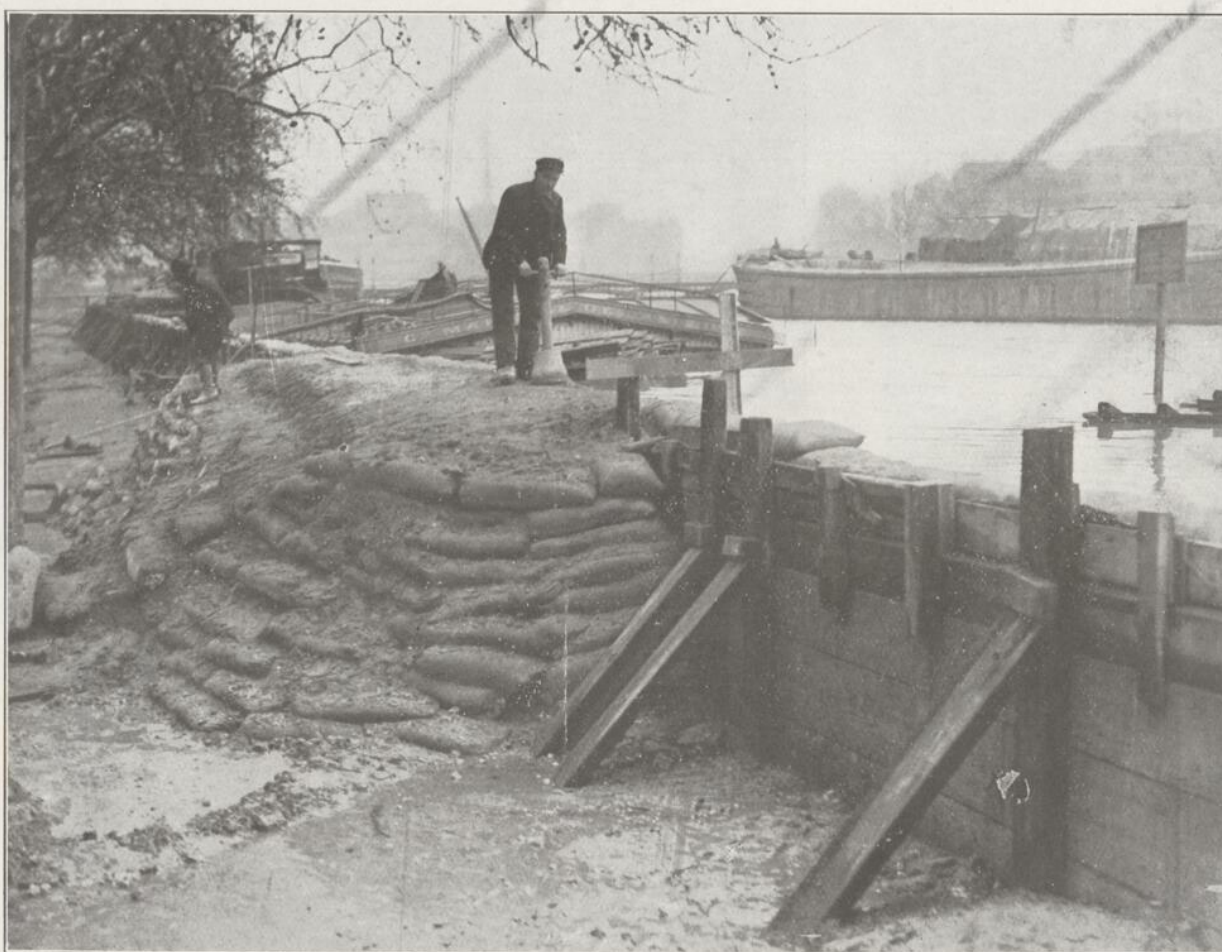

THE LATE WILLIAM TASSIE.

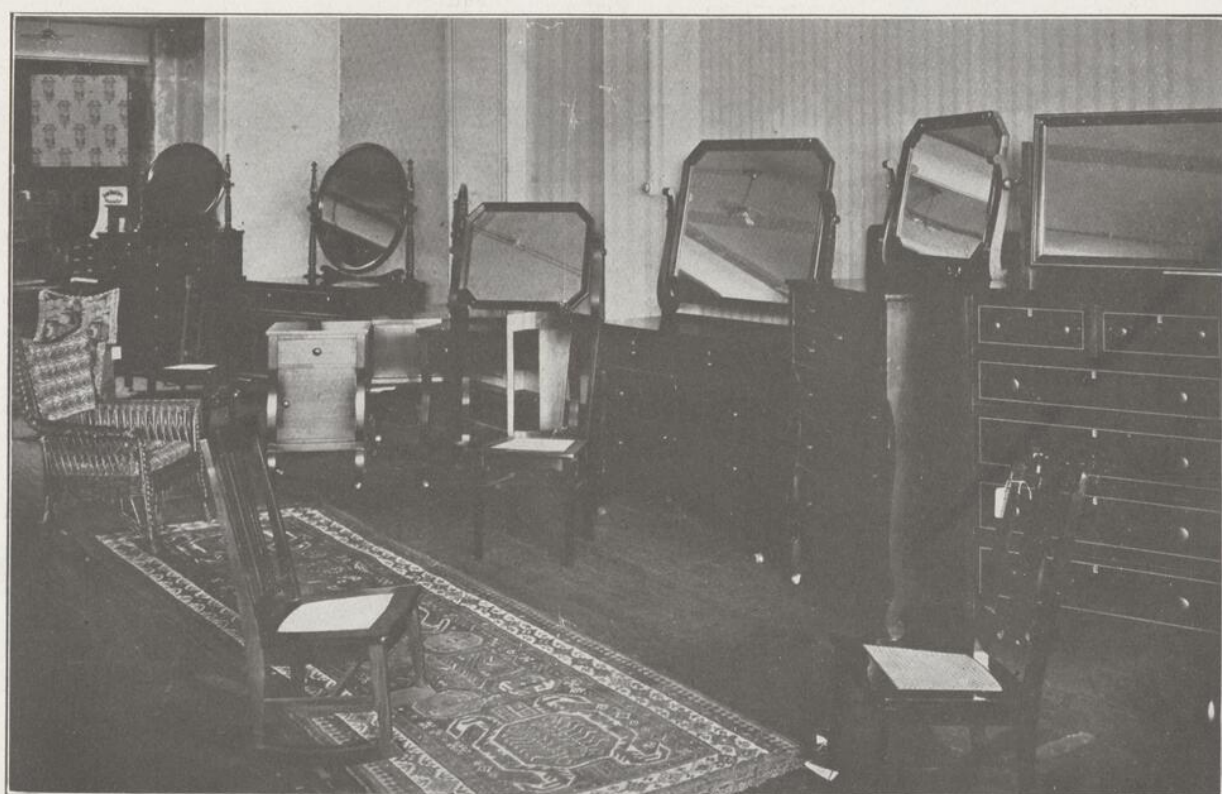
Some few days before the Christmas holidays, the Board of Trustees of the Galt Collegiate Institute, successor to the famous old school known as Dr. Tassie's Grammar School, of Galt—in days of long ago—was presented with

a valuable and magnificent oil portrait of the late master, William Tassie, M.A., LL.D. The work of art is from the brush of the well-known artist, J. W. L. Forster, of Toronto, and is an excellent likeness of the doctor. The presentation was made by Mr. John N. Mackendrick, B.A., and Mr. Thomas Peck, of Galt, on behalf of the many old Tassie boys who were unable to be

at the ceremony of presenting the portrait, which now hangs in the old school at Galt. The portrait forms a historical link with the past. Many of his old pupils, holding high positions in Canada, some in the United States, and others as far as the Island of Porto Rico, owe their success in life and their stand of to-day to the careful training of the venerable Dr. Tassie.

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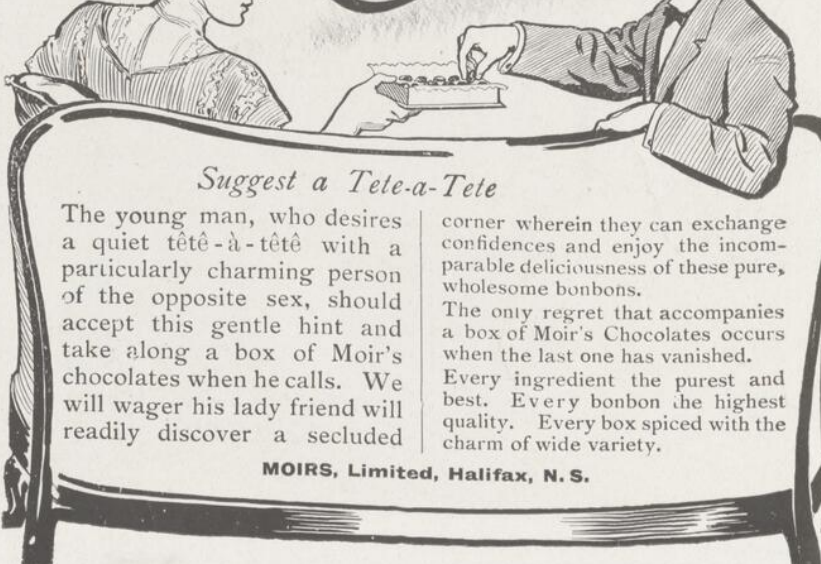
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
