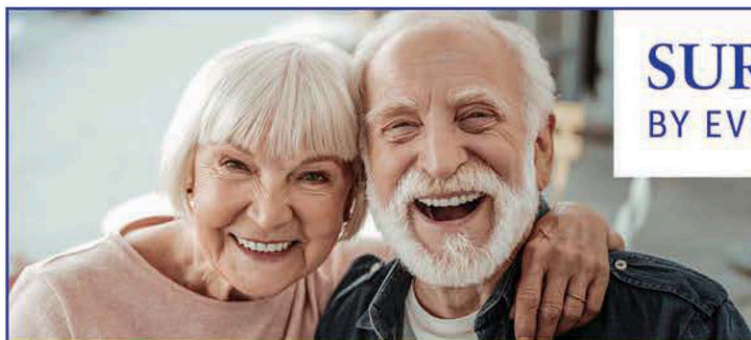

because of the Covid-19 pandemic. "It was unfortunate because we couldn't do anything about this situation and we intend to bounce back this year by finally presenting our

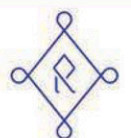

# Fast-moving twists and turns marinated in sharp human insight

How does a novelist create an aura of romance and mystery from the setting of the Canadian National Archives? Before reading Amy Tector's second novel, *The Foulest Things*, such a question would have stumped me cold. But Amy has pulled off the highly unlikely prospect of creating a spellbinding thriller unfolding, of all places, in a federal bureaucra-cy.

*The Foulest Things* is the first volume of Tector's Dominion Archives series. It sparkles from the get-go, holding readers on the edge of their seats, as they turn page after page toward the astonishing dénouement.

The plot zigs and zags as it runs into dead ends and down blind alleys, while fledgling archivist Jessica (Jess) Novak pursues the truth behind a murder triggered by the greed of shadowy figures racing to find a hidden, priceless painting by a renowned 17th century Dutch master.

From a chilling jolt in her opening chapter, Tector establishes the framework of a mystery that drives her adventure on a high-speed chase through the streets of Ottawa and Mon-treal and points in-between. The narrative punch is quickened by the author's short, spare sentences and copious use of the active voice.

The story zooms along in an informal style, written in the first person, engaging the reader almost as a confidential pal. Characters are sharply defined, notably Jess's archival col-leagues Louise (mentor), Ginette (antagonist), Oliver (cipher-boss), and Mike (confi-dante).

A fulsome cast of other players include Jess's steadfast pal Adela (leader-advocate), law enforcement officers, thuggish assassins, star-crossed lovers from a bygone era, and a dead man — distinctly not walking anymore. The police captain assigned to Jess's case, for example, presents as "Daniel Lemieux ... a short man with a large chin and a head of care-fully gelled black curls. A few tenacious chest hairs crawled up over his tie, promising that he was a hairy man indeed." Although Tector's story situates itself in the 21st century, it probes back into the early 20th century for essential narrative antecedents. Historical insights are portrayed through Jess's surreptitiously

discovered correspondence of an aspiring lovesick Canadian painter (Jeremy) in WW I Paris, to his sweetheart, Victoria, pining away on a rural Albertan farm.

Tector's dialogue crackles and pops like a bowl of cereal overdosing on steroids. Her argot clearly places the protagonist as a rising young professional employed in an intellectually acute setting in the nation's capital city. Her piquant splashes of humour propel readers to anticipate each subsequent quip, which they soon discover will lie reliably just around the next corner.

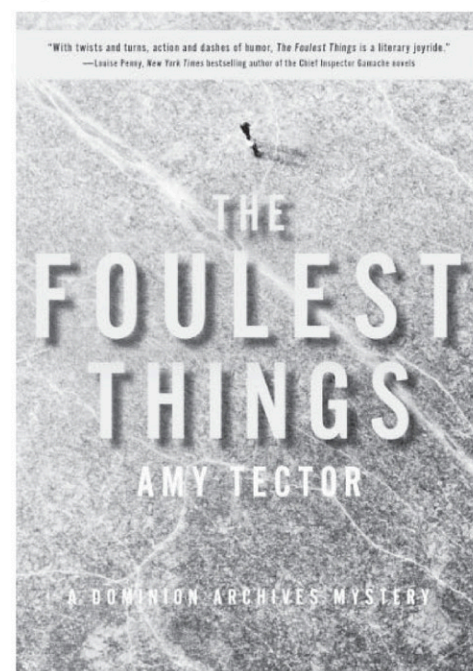
Literary dialogue can be spoken or thought-based. For example, following Jess's first kiss with fresh romantic interest Mike, he blurts, "I couldn't resist. ... You looked so gorgeous standing in the sun." So Jess thinks, "Gorgeous! An old boyfriend regularly called me 'Sweet Tits' and another had told me my hair was pretty, but I'd never been called 'gor-geous'."

Later in the volume, Tector offers a brilliant exposition of Victoria, a bygone figure fixed in an alternative time and place who co-spawned this cliff-hanger in the first place. "She [Victoria] was much shorter than her aunt ... and wore a dark wide-brimmed hat and a light-colored blouse tucked into a long dark skirt. I peered at her face. She was unsmiling, but I could see her high cheekbones and wide eyes. She was beautiful."

Through portrayals such as this one, Amy Tector offers a keen glimpse into the humani-ty—or lack thereof—of her colorful cast of characters. Her human insight is incisive: she reveals much through a richly imaginative literary escapade that brings her figures to life.

A comparable novel to *The Foulest Things* is *Straight Man* by American author Richard Russo, about the absurdity of life in a small, second-tier liberal arts university. Like the university experience, the Dominion Archives doubtless cradles life in a bureaucratic bubble where high-stakes drama crashes occasionally into ecologies more achingly low-stakes in their daily routines. Both volumes exhibit a sharpness of wit that commands reader attention and prompts mirth throughout.

Amy Tector is an Eastern Townships talent, having grown up with four siblings in Cow-anville, Québec. Supplementing her novel-writing, she



serves as a government archivist living in Ottawa. Full disclosure here: Amy wrote a lovely Foreword for my book, *It Was Only a Movie*, and she is the daughter of my beloved friend, the late Dr. David Tector.

Does this connection bias me in Amy's favour? You bet it does, but don't take my word for it. Believe the globally-celebrated Louise Penny, author of nearly twenty mysteries in her "Inspector Gamache" series. Penny's endorsement of *The Foulest Things* proudly blares across the front cover that Tector's volume is nothing less than a "literary joyride."

As for the startling outcome of Amy's white-knuckle escapade, who would ever have thought? Find out for yourselves. The book is on order at the Lennoxville Library, or you can buy it through one of the links below, or better still, from your local bookseller!

## Federal government tables bill to help supply chain and ease inflation

As supply chain disruptions continue to add to the rising cost of living, Federal Transport Minister Omar Alghabra hopes to help fix the problem with new legislation, but said improvements will take time.

The minister tabled a bill in the House of Commons on Thursday to improve Canada’s supply chain and to make the transportation system safer, more efficient and more reliable.

The legislation will help address a root cause of inflation by strengthening the country’s supply chain through port competitiveness and rail safety, said Alghabra in a briefing on Thursday.

The bill will create the power to establish a regulatory framework to require ports to collect more information and share it with railways, trucking companies and shippers to enhance accountability and transparency, said Alghabra.

“What we’re bringing here is a broader view of the industry instead

of what has been the pattern of each organization managing its own operations independently from everything else,” said Alghabra in a phone interview.

Supply chain disruptions have been cited as one of the factors contributing to decades-high inflation this year.

In 2021, freight prices peaked up to 10 times over 2019 rates, as high consumer demand and port congestion contributed to an extreme hike, said Judah Levine, head of research at Freightos.

In October, the National Supply

Chain Task Force released a final report with 21 recommendations to improve Canada’s supply chain, including port modernization and digitization.

The bill still needs to go through the parliamentary stages and the senate.

“We need to be honest with Canadians to let them know that some of the work that is being done will also take some time,” said Alghabra.

He said that there are structural and systemic issues that will take some time to be addressed.

# Open to the Spirit

Today's word: ADVENT

**1**) With the advent of winter weather, I hope you have all got your winter tires on. At the beginning of every season there are usually ways to prepare that make our lives easier.

During the Advent season before Christmas, it often seems that merchants of the world have united to persuade us to buy, buy, buy. As if buying more will bring us to December 25th as well-prepared as possible. Moreover, they'd have us believe that happiness, harmony and serenity will reign because we've found the perfect gifts for our loved ones. I suppose it was inevitable that Christmas would devolve in this manner. It's so tempting to think all our troubles would be resolved if only we had the proper gadget or winter tires, etc.

Yet it has been my experience that no exterior object, no matter how well treaded, can fix whatever ails us at Christmas time. The work of preparing for this time of year begins with an examination of ourselves, values, goals, hurting places. The journey inward is fraught with past experiences and future expectations for Christmas. Expectations that are rarely met. Trying to pretend that life

is perfect, that our families, our jobs, and our circumstances are perfect can be exhausting.

Instead, here's my recipe for the season of Advent. Start by counting. Every day count at least one thing about your life for which you are grateful. Find the blessings. No matter how poor in spirit or pocket book I may be, I can usually find at least one thing for which I am grateful. Recognizing our poverty yet not letting it define us allows us to enter the season of Advent with humility and sensitivity. What better way to welcome the Prince of Peace into our hearts?

**2**) "Advent" signifies the coming arrival of a notable person or event. A person might ponder the advent of television, or of space travel or of the Internet. Something new is beginning, and it is a time of celebration. For many in church life, Advent is the season of preparation before Christmas. We celebrate the coming of God into our world in a dramatic new way. We use candles, or calendars filled with chocolate treats, and we change colours in our church decorations. This year Advent begins on November 27th, and Christmas lands on the fourth Sunday of December.\*

One of my favourite words, adventure, begins with the same letters. I like to think that life can be a series of adventures filled with excitement and

passion. Each new experience brings wisdom and joy.

This year my life has gone through many wonderful, dramatic changes. I look forward to more. Our church, both locally and nationally has also undergone many changes. There are those who see change as something to be afraid of. The familiar is disappearing and we don't know the future. Many long for the past.

The word advent for me means the arrival of a new world, very different as the divine mystery unfolds. My hope is that we can rejoice together and find hope. I know that we are not alone, God is with us as we journey.

**3**) "Prepare ye the way..." the chorus reminds us in Handel's Messiah. Before the joy and jubilation, comes the long season of waiting in hope and anticipation. The oratorio's first section leading up to the Nativity sings about the longing for justice, the cry of the messenger heralding the coming of light, the birth of love and goodness into a world of power and greed gone madly awry.

Growing up, Advent was more than opening doors in a cardboard calendar for daily chocolate treats or shopping countdowns toward the gift-giving bonanza. I learned to look forward in the darkening time of year to the haunting plainsong of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". The wreath invited me into contemplative mystery. We'd light its purple, rose and white candles each Sunday at church and later, our smaller version at home. Around the dinner table we children were encouraged to prepare for Advent by choosing acts of self-restraint, kindness and generosity.

Advent is our turn to wait on God. Can we learn to live in the space of not-yet without being impatient, anxious, or demanding? Not just standing in endless check-out queues waiting to pay for armloads of gifts. Can we live in the dark of the year without losing hope for the light to come? Can we make peace with each other, bringing joy to those whose lives are filled with suffering? Can we love and welcome the lonely and forgotten?

Advent's weeks are named for gifts only we can give: hope, peace, love and joy. And acts of justice that can tip the balance in a world which still, centuries after the birth of the one we celebrate, is never quite ready to recognize or welcome infinite goodness. My favourite closing words for our annual

Carols and Candlelight service are from Howard Thurman, reminding us that the work of Christmas begins as we put away the decorations. Or does it begin even before that - in Advent, with the realization that goodness depends on us, we are the ones we're waiting for.

**4**) Advent is my favourite church season. I know it should be Easter, but I don't always feel like that much joy, and the trumpets and lilies can be a bit much.

Give me Advent: a small light, a quiet hymn, the waiting, the blue. This season wraps us like a blanket. We aren't joyful, but we also aren't alone. We simply wait in hope. The church is like a cocoon of peace in the midst of a world that is bustling around, getting broke and exhausted in attempts to make people happy. Advent doesn't worry about happy. Advent just is.

Give me the quiet prayers and the waiting at the edge of mystery. Let me be surprised, again, when the sacred child is born, but only after the needed journey. Most of life is like the trip to Bethlehem. We plod along, one foot after another, thinking about the things that need to be done. We need food. We need to find a home. We need to pay our taxes. Only sometimes, when we rest, we can remember our sacred task. We remember that God waits, always, to be born.

The Inn is full of guests, drinking and eating, completely unaware of what is about to happen. We can go to the mall, on any given day, and be distracted. But, somewhere outside, somewhere at its very edge, the world is pregnant with God. Let us remember and make our hearts ready.

One word, four voices ~ now it's your turn to reflect: Do you celebrate the season of Advent - and if so, in what ways?

The northwest corner of King West and Wellington was the location of the former Continental Hotel. The original, four-storey building (pictured here circa 1920) was built in 1872 by Henri Camirand. # Phoenix continue to stumble in loss to Remparts

The month of November hasn't been kind to the Sherbrooke Phoenix, as the team has sputtered along through the past few weeks with only two wins in six games, including a close 5-4 loss to the first-place Québec Remparts on Wednesday.

The Phoenix fell behind 4-1 early in the second period, as the offensively gifted Remparts seemed to be on cruise control for most of the game. But after a slow start, Sherbrooke, another offensive juggernaut in the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL), came alive.

Phoenix head coach Stéphane Julien was pleased to see his team claw back into the game with Justin Gill finding the back of the net midway through the second period for his 17th goal this season, and Anthony Munroe-Boucher adding a brace to level the playing field in the third.

However, a bad turnover, and a subsequent two-on-one, resulted in a go-ahead goal for the Remparts. The Phoenix were buzzing in the final frame, but this time Québec goaltender William Rousseau shut the door to a comeback. Julien said another slow start sunk them.

"When you play a team like that it makes you realize, first, your goalie has to make the save at the right time, but also, if you give up an odd-man rush, if you make mistakes in the offensive zone, turnovers, it will cost you, so that's what we learned yesterday," he told The Record.

According to Julien, the biggest difference for Sherbrooke since the start of the season has been the way to come out of the gates in the first period. The Phoenix sit in the second place behind the Remparts, but they have been off lately, and Julien is hoping to turn things around.

It starts with goaltending, though, and the head coach is aware that his starting goaltender, veteran QMJHLer Jakob Robillard, is the backbone of

the squad. But he was pulled against the Remparts, and he has been lacklustre this month. He wants to see more from his goaltender.

"He has to be better. I'll be honest and he knows that. When you make a decision to take an overage goalie, you want those guys to win games for you and right now I think he lost his last three or four, so it's not enough for us, obviously," Julien said in a phone interview on Thursday.

Asked about Gill's hot start to the season — he currently leads the league in goals — Julien told The Record it has been a pleasant surprise and the forward is beginning to receive phone calls from the National Hockey League. But like every star, teams start to make adjustments.

Gill plays alongside Joshua Roy and Ethan Gauthier. Roy led the QMJHL in points last season. It took about 15 games, but most teams are starting to match Sherbrooke's top line against their best defenseman and responsible forwards, Julien explained, it was bound to happen.

Québec was a bit of a wake up call for the Phoenix. The forward group is deep, skilled, and strong, according to Julien, and Sherbrooke simply didn't put in the effort to keep up with them for an entire game. He has spoken to his team, though, hoping to inspire them for next game.

"The message right now is about consistency and our team identity. We've always been very good in the first period, we set the momentum early, and that's what we have to do. Right now we're chasing the score, which is tough for any team," he said, noting it's a tough road ahead.

The Phoenix have a top-heavy schedule for the rest of November. They play the Remparts again, this time in Sherbrooke, Drummondville, and Gatineau. He is optimistic that his squad will recapture some of the magic earlier in the season, like scoring first and setting the tone.

There aren't in panic mode, Julien

added, but he has expressed to his team that there needs to be more effort on the ice. If players look like they aren't trying out there, he told The Record, then they might not be around for much longer, as the trade deadline is just around the corner.

"We're going to make some trades at Christmas to get better. We can only keep 22 or 23 guys, so we'll make our decision there, but obviously some guys have an opportunity here to stay with a winning team, which is good for their career, I hope they understand that, too," he said.

## SAAQ to suspend services for the holiday season

Québec has announced that SAAQ services will be interrupted throughout the province from Dec. 16, starting at 5 p.m., until Jan. 3, 2023 to allow for the deployment of a new transactional component, according to a press release from the Brome-Missisquoi Chamber of Commerce.

The non-profit organization also urges Quebecers to plan their visits to the SAAQ, since a number

of services will not be available as of Dec. 16, including the release of driver's records, response to requests for attestation of driving record, and replacing a lost or stolen license.

Folks will also not be able to receive a response to requests from the Québec Police Information Centre, validation of the right to drive and right to trade, and the release of a seized vehicle. More information on the transition period will reportedly follow in the coming weeks.

While the government might *say* that we should return to masking, might *suggest* we get our boosters, and *remind* us to wash our hands, how many will do so in any meaningful amount compared to when it was mandatory? Have

you or your Facebook friends ever resolved that “maybe”? Medical experts operate like everyone has the same skills to determine personal risk. They assume that people will understand the facts in the same way that they do, but I can say that from experience, most people ignore suggestions they weren’t already considering. One doesn’t have to be a skeptic of the dangers of COVID-19 to shrug it off.

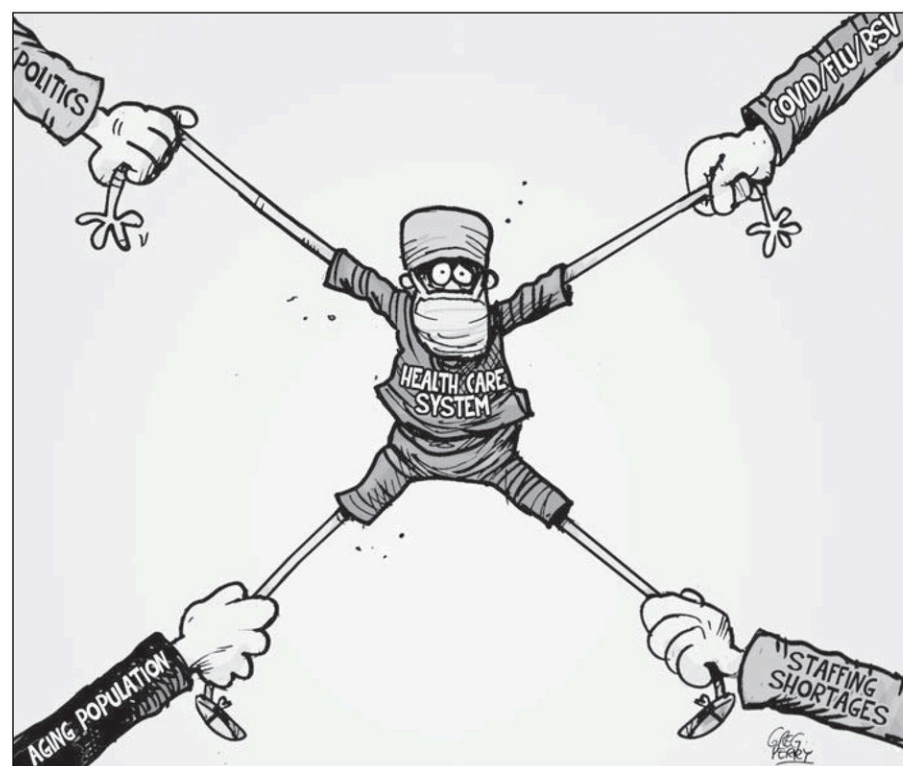
The government has once again vocalized recommendations for COVID-19 vaccine boosters, and wearing masks in public spaces, but are people even listening anymore?

At the end of the day, folks will do what they’re comfortable with. Quebec has chosen to go down the recommendation route for the holiday season because they know forcing people to mask up, for example, will inevitably cause pushback.

But avoiding the word

‘mandatory’ isn’t bad. I think the more folks are exposed to signage offering suggestions like wash and disinfect your hands, get your booster, get a flu shot, and even wear a mask, eventually it will seep into everyone’s day-to-day life.

Quebecers followed these recommendations for the most part throughout the pandemic. And I don’t think we’re ever going to revert back to our pre-pandemic habits. These things take time and running awareness campaigns is another part of it.

### Lack of information and public health

As during the worst of the pandemic, doctors and scientific experts are alerting the population. The lack of information from the government and public health in Quebec is still to be deplored.

It is necessary to inform the population so that the mandatory or strongly recommended measures are followed because they are understood, and not because of obedience or fear of penalties! However, the information on the evolution of COVID is given less and less, to say that they had even removed the subsidies for the analyses of wastewater, hidden behind a vale. PCRs are only for certain categories, hospitalizations are no longer counted on weekends, outbreak reports are no longer required, the INSPQ only publishes statistics once a week, and weekly averages. And best of all, flu vaccination is not free if you are not at risk, as if you can’t transmit the virus.

The problems are major in the emergency rooms and many in children’s hospitals, a doctor speaks of a March 20 for these hospitals. No reaction from the government, acting as master of public health. Dr. Cecile Tremblay is right to recommend free flu vaccination for all, as in Ontario, our neighbor. A pandemic that continues (yesterday at 9.9% with the data that the government wants to compile!), almost 2 epidemics in progress.

It is the elderly who have suffered in 2020, due to a lack of foresight (for the CHSLDs) of the under-funded Public Health at the time. Will it now be the children who will suffer?

On Oct 3, 2022 Quebecers elected a new government. Included in the new cabinet was a minister responsible for relations with the English-speaking community. Eric Girard, who is also the finance minister, said he wants to hear from Anglophones so he can better understand their issues and concerns. Let's help him with that. Simply put, Quebec's Law 96 making French the only language of business in Quebec, included federal government institutions such as Canada Post and other government offices that provide services to Quebecers. The federal government's response appears to be: appease Quebec and abandon the basic tenets of the Official Languages Act, which guarantees federal government services to French and

English-speaking minorities where numbers warrant, wherever they live.

## Music publicist Eric Alper hits the high notes in career and health



A RUNNER'S MIND

Eric Alper is regarded by movers and shakers in the music industry as being well-connected to the point where some say that he knows...everyone. With 27 years in the entertainment field as a successful music publicist, commentator, radio host and owner of his PR company, music was always a big part of his life. In our Q&A, Eric talks about his background, some career highlights and how he balances his health. Read on.

**Q:** What events shaped your life to where you knew that music and everyone involved, from performers to producers and executives, would regard you as a solid industry professional? And when was that pivotal moment you wanted to pursue a career as music publicist and kept going to become a host for top-rated SiriusXM radio program, "ThatEricAlper"?

**A:** I always knew I wanted to do something in music. When I was eight years old, I saw the movie American Hot Wax that told the story of Cleveland DJ Alan Freed, who coined the term 'rock'n'roll' and who had one of the very first rock concerts in America. It was a docudrama, but at the end of the

movie was the real-life Chuck Berry and Jerry Lee Lewis absolutely tearing it on the stage. I was mesmerized. It was like now when I hear about artists from the 1970s saying they wanted to become a Rockstar when they saw The Beatles on the Ed Sullivan Show. I knew right then and there I wanted to do something that had to do with that, but I had no idea what THAT was.

I had no idea how to even become part of that world, but I asked for, and got a subscription to Billboard Magazine when I was 12, I started reading about what a record label does, what a manager does, who handles distribution, what went into getting onto the charts, and for me those stories were magical, they were my sci-fi. They were about real people talking about real things but in a world that I still didn't know how to get involved. When I was in university, I wrote for the campus newspaper and worked at the campus radio station and met other publicists from various record labels inviting me to come out to go see concerts and to review albums for free, and all I would have to do was write and talk about the music and show. Meeting the other Publicists, that's what really got me into this industry, and when I graduated university, I started a record label then a booking agency and then a PR company. Quickly, I eliminated the first two and have done public relations and music ever since and it's been coming up on 27 years now.

A number of years ago, I got asked to do segments on television and radio for music box set gift guides because I guess the producers knew I'd be honest with not being negative whatsoever, but also not just talk about the artists I was working on the record label at the time.

From there, I just kept kept saying yes to everything - yes to doing a wrap-up on this artist that had recently passed away, yes to talking about this new album, yes to talking about this new tour and I loved it because it was really my opportunity to continue to share. About eight years ago, the president of talk radio at SiriusXM Canada asked me if I wanted to have my own show and I quickly said no. I didn't want to expand on my views at all, wasn't comfortable with that, and he said no, silly, go talk to the people that you love. From the beginning of the 1-hour talk show on SiriusXM, I just get to talk to the artists I love, book authors, producers and the industry and really dig deep - never inside baseball, per se, but I'm always fascinated with how things happen the way they do, and really, this is just my excuse to continue to promote the music that I love.

Q: Who was your first client and describe the experience of how you evolved into PR?

A: I honestly can't remember who the first client was, but I do remember finding out about how much the other publicists were charging end went waaaaay below that. I just had three rules starting out: Do it better, do it faster, and do it cheaper than anyone else out there. I was charging

\$100 a month when other publicists were charging \$500 or even \$1000 a month for doing what I was doing. Granted, they had a lot more contacts than I did, of course, but this was the way that I made mistakes and learned this industry, working with other bands that were just starting out (where) we're both just so happy to have somebody work with them. As time went on, the bands got better and bigger and I got slightly better at my job. I DO remember one time doing the PR for Toronto's Free Times Cafe, El Mocambo, Shanghai and several shows a week at the Horseshoe Tavern and I was out every single night after working all day talking to the media and industry. I didn't make a lot of money and I wasn't eating great, either (turns out the Coke and smoking cigarettes are a wonderful meal anytime!) but I loved it and it's still the best job in the world.

Q: Can you share some of your past clients and talk about your career highlights that come to mind?

A: I've had the honor of working with some of the greatest artists of our time, and all of them I love and I admire deeply. I still can't believe that long after I bought Sinead O'Connor's albums, Ringo Starr from The Beatles, Smashing Pumpkins, Duran Duran, Ray Charles, Bruce Cockburn, Buffy Sainte-Marie and literally thousands more, I get to work with them on their

latest releases. Almost all of the artists are as nice, kind, determined and funny as you hoped they would be. But really, it's so many artists - Colin James, Sue Foley, Murray McLauchlin, Liona Boyd, Spoons, Honeymoon Suite, Andy Kim, Micah Barnes - all of them. Perfect.

Q: How do you balance your career, family and health?

A: I don't. There are many, many books that will detail whatever happiness they would consider a person to have, but my happiness is based on having my family blended into my career where I get to bring them to shows and concerts and go and do the things my wife and daughter are interested in, too. It's not a balance, it's a blend. As for the health, I stopped with the Coke and chips for breakfast, but now it's just in the afternoon.

Q: Do you have a favorite activity?

A: I'm a lifelong baseball fan so although I don't get to play it anymore, I love watching it and of course listening to music and finding out about new artists all day and night long.

Q: Do you have a favorite dish?

A: My wife makes the best tomato sauce for spaghetti, so anything pasta works for me!

Q: Describe a typical day and what do you love most about what you do?

A: I'm sure that this is gonna come

across wrong but I love the idea of working 15 hour days, seven days a week. My family are all pretty big and busy on social media as well, so that certainly makes it a lot easier. In a day, it's answering 1000-1400 emails a day, setting up press releases and sending them out, doing edits on the next batch, following up with the media in TV radio, print, blogs, and Spotify playlists to ensure that they have the artist's latest music and video, follow up on tour dates in Canada. And then hang out, and get to do it all over again the next day.

Q: What is next for you? A memoir?

A: Oh, not at all (crowd applauds). I still firmly believe that my memoir is really all over social media through the posts and videos that I create online to help bands come up with ideas for social media. Those are really the closest things that I wanna reveal about myself. And those stories about the artists aren't mine to tell, it's theirs.

Q: Thank you, Eric, for your time on this. Anything else you'd like to add?

A: It's people like you, Christine, in absolute honesty, that make my job so amazing, so fulfilling. I'm so glad that we got a chance to meet and work together. I'm not sure how long that we'll be both doing what we love to do, but I know that one day, we'll both be dragged and kicking and screaming our way out.

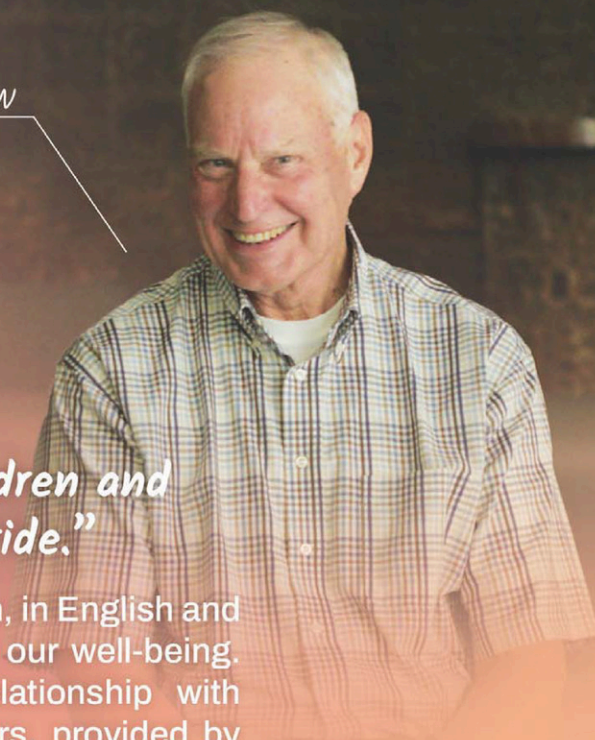

## Did you know?

(MC) Socialization in midlife can have a profound impact on individuals as they approach their golden years. A 2019 study led by researchers at University College London found that being more socially active in your 50s and 60s predicts a lower risk of developing dementia later in life. The study used data from a previous study that tracked more than 10,000 participants between 1985 and 2013. Participants in the study completed cognitive testing from 1997 onwards. Researchers found that someone who saw friends almost daily at age 60 was 12 percent less likely to develop dementia than someone who only saw one or two friends every month. Strong associations between social contact at age 50 and subsequent dementia were also uncovered. The study supports the idea that remaining socially active in one's 50s and 60s can benefit long-term cognitive health.

Traders use various tactics to

analyze markets. Candlesticks are a chart that help traders predict market movements. Depending on the price chart, a candlestick can show an asset's price movement over a set amount of time, whether that's a minute or a day. According to Investopedia, the candlestick originated from 18th century Japanese rice merchants and traders before becoming popular in the United States and elsewhere. The candlestick will display the high, low, opening, and closing prices of the security. It resembles a rectangle or square "body" with lines above and below the body called "shadows." The top or bottom of the body refers to the opening and closing prices. The upper shadow reflects the high price, and the lower shadow the low price. If the stock closed lower, the body of the candlestick will be red or black. If the stock closed higher, it will be green or white. Analysts use various candlestick indicators and patterns to predict pricing actions. According to

Wall Street Mojo, there are around 35 to 45 candlestick patterns. However, only 25 are actively used by traders.

No matter the culture or the cuisine, the heart of many delicious dishes is a solid flavor base. This flavor base goes by many names. "Mirepoix" is crucial in France and French-speaking nations, while "soffritto" is the name for a version relied on in Italy, Spain and Latin America. In Germany, chefs may say "suppengruen." These flavor bases essentially are a combination of vegetables that are minced and sauteed in butter or oil to add a unique flavor profile to a dish. Flavor bases often include celery, carrots, leeks, peppers, and onions. They may give tomato sauce added depth or gumbo a little extra zest. Flavor bases are the building blocks of many dishes that simmer or braise over long periods of time, such as soups, stews, sauces, and gumbos.

The most valuable rare stamp in the world is the British Guiana 1c Magenta. The stamp was auctioned in 2014 and sold for \$9.48 million, though that price tag dipped considerably when it was auctioned again for a price of roughly \$8.3 million in 2021. According to Invaluable.com, the stamp was included in an 1856 emergency run that was produced after the initial shipment of 1c magenta stamps went missing. That emergency run included a small boat on the stamp, which can be seen in the lone remaining stamp from that run that is now so valuable. That lone stamp was discovered by a young boy in 1873. Nearly 150 years later, the world's most valuable stamp can be purchased via fractional ownership, a method through which unrelated parties can share in the ownership of a high-value tangible asset.

I ordered Lynn to leave. I told her she really needed to quit drinking and I don't ever want to be around her if she

is drinking.

What happened in the following weeks really surprised me. Not only did Kim decide to forgive and forget; she joined Lynn in berating and guilted me. Both women have texted me that I am a judgmental hypocrite and ruining the family. I do like a beer on a hot day or a margarita at a Mexican restaurant. ## Two into one will not go

Lawrence Welk said, "I knew nothing of the real life of a musician, but I seemed to see myself standing in front of great crowds of people, playing my accordion."

Against four hearts, West led the diamond jack. Things looked like smooth sailing to South. He won trick one in hand with the diamond king and cashed his heart ace. However, West's discard was a rude shock. Suddenly there appeared to be four inescapable losers: one spade, two hearts and one diamond.

Hearing the strains of an accordion in the street outside, South had a clever idea. He led his spade. East won and returned a trump (a diamond is no better). Declarer won with his king, crossed to dummy with a club to the jack, ruffed a spade, played a club to dummy's queen and ruffed another spade. Now came the diamond ace and the club ace.

South had won nine tricks: two spade ruffs in hand, the heart ace-king, the diamond ace-king and three top clubs. Left in his hand were the heart eight-seven and the diamond four. East had the heart jack-10 and the diamond queen.

Declarer called for dummy's spade

jack. How could East defend? If he discarded, South would ruff for his 10th trick. However, when East ruffed, declarer discarded his diamond loser. He had a trump trick to come.

South had squeezed two losers into one with a loser-on-loser play. The accordion or its close cousin the concertina are good analogies.
