

Mount Royal Park, which officially opened in 1876, was designed by the acclaimed landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted, who also designed New York's Central Park. Olmsted wanted all Montrealers to be able to enjoy the charms of the mountain's natural landscapes and its benefits for the human soul. Today, Mount Royal Park is a symbolic beacon in the heart of the city, a destination offering year-round fun and discoveries.

Mount Royal relief and natural habitats

Although people affectionately call it “the Mountain”, it is actually the best-known of Québec's Monteregian Hills. Mount Royal, with its three summits, is home to a rich variety of plant and wildlife. Its lush vegetation creates many different habitats for local wildlife. Set in the heart of the city, the Mountain is a very popular site with nature lovers.

SUGGESTED WALKING PATHS:

PATH ACCESS

CHEMIN OLMSTED: Climb the mountain slowly as you follow this trail dotted with stunning landscapes. This is how the park's designer, Frederick Law Olmsted, imagined the experience. Starts at Sir George-Étienne Cartier monument. **Easy to intermediate trail • 90 minutes**
4.4 km to the Boucle du Sommet

BOUCLE DU SOMMET: Chemin Olmsted loops around behind the Mount Royal Chalet, offering views of the three summits and taking you to the Mount Royal Cross. Birdfeeder trail (November to April). **Easy trail • 40 minutes • 2.2 km**

LE SERPENTIN AND THE STAIRCASE: From the very top of Rue Peel, take Chemin le Serpentin to Chemin Olmsted. Head to your right and climb the 339 stairs up the escarpment, taking you directly to the Kondiaronk lookout. **Athletic trail, not appropriate for baby strollers**
20 minutes • 1.4 km

SENTIER DE L'ESCARPEMENT: Outside the Mount Royal Chalet, turn left onto the Sentier de l'Escarpelement along the side of the mountain and enjoy the fabulous views of the city. **Intermediate trail, not appropriate for baby strollers**
40 minutes • 0.9 km

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SITE PATRIMONIAL DU MONT-ROYAL

Mount Royal has always been a visual landmark and a historic symbol of Montréal itself. It is home to many important sites and monuments, including leading religious, educational and health care institutions that stand out because of not only their vital missions and long history but also their striking architecture. Then there are the prestigious homes and villas, and four cemeteries with the graves of many illustrious figures from Québec's past. And, of course, there are the parks in the heart of this green oasis. Mount Royal Park alone is huge, measuring nearly 200 hectares.

Recognizing the tremendous importance of the landscapes, natural spaces, buildings and other structures on Mount Royal, the Ville de Montréal and the Québec government have granted it increased protection. In 2005, the Québec government adopted a decree creating the Arrondissement historique et patrimonial du Mont-Royal – the only place in Québec awarded this twofold status. The designation has been replaced by that of "site patrimonial du Mont-Royal" with the entry into force of the Cultural Heritage Act.

Exploring the Site patrimonial du Mont-Royal is a way to learn about its rich heritage, and a chance to appreciate nature's charms, escape your everyday cares and enjoy the magnificent views of the city spread out at its feet.
