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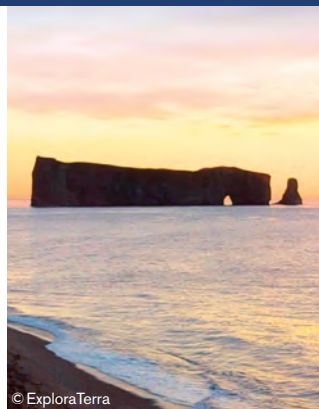

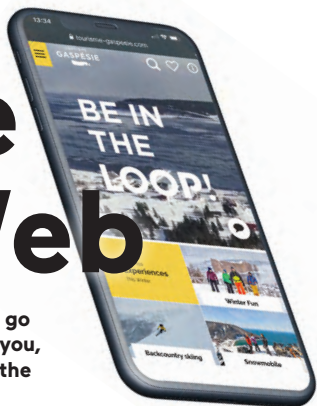

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Profile of the Region



A Sea, Mountain and River Destination

Gaspésie Overview

Enjoy a complete change of pace and scenery in Gaspésie, which offers spectacular sea and mountain landscapes as well as crystal-clear rivers. This vibrant region bustles with activities of all kinds, charms visitors with warm hospitality and delights the palate with tasty dishes featuring local ingredients from the land, sea and forest. Bordered by the salty waters of the St. Lawrence Estuary and Gulf, this immense panoramic peninsula has been recognized multiple times by prestigious publications as one of the world's must-see destinations.

Explore the backcountry, where the majestic Chic-Choc Mountains rise, then discover the splendours of the coast, where the sea, beaches and cliffs will take turns wowing you!

Colourful accents

As you travel from one community to the next, listen carefully to the many accents and expressions that originate from the different peoples who have marked this region's history. First Nations, Vikings, Italian navigators, Basque and Breton fishermen, the French, Acadians, Loyalists, English, Jersey Islanders, Irish and Scots... All have left their

mark on this region's cultural heritage. Learn more about the history of local Indigenous people and pioneers in various museums, interpretation centres and historic sites throughout Gaspésie.

Gaspesian culture is also expressed in other ways in the region's many art galleries, studios, workshops, boutiques, shows, festivals and other cultural activities.

Surrounded by the sea

An epic 885-km drive around the peninsula, the Gaspésie Tour is an unforgettable road trip in either direction. All along the shoreline, strikingly beautiful coastal landscapes will leave you breathless. The St. Lawrence as it widens into the sea in the Coast sector is a must-see as are the steep cliffs of Haute-Gaspésie and Land's End as they plunge into the immense gulf. Various preservation sites have been created throughout Gaspésie to better protect and showcase the natural wonders of this region.

At the tip of the peninsula, Forillon National Park, which marks the end of the Appalachian Mountains, offers a variety of experiences between sea, cliffs and forest. The park features rich geological phenomena, fascinating history and diverse flora and fauna.

Off Percé, you will be awed by the sight of Bonaventure Island and legendary Percé Rock, a massive limestone monolith that is Québec's most iconic natural landmark. These major attractions dominate the landscape of Parc national de l'île-Bonaventure-et-du-Rocher-Percé, which offers a rich natural, historical and geological heritage. Bonaventure Island features magnificent cliffs and unique flora and fauna, including an impressive northern gannet colony, as well as numerous heritage buildings that bear witness to the lives of the local inhabitants in the 19th and 20th centuries. Nearby, the Percé UNESCO Global Geopark gives visitors the opportunity to discover 24 geosites, areas of great geological importance that also meet one or more exceptional criteria.

Further south, Chaleur Bay enjoys a microclimate that warms its waters, making this the perfect place to enjoy a wide variety of water sports. Along the bay you will also find the beach and cliffs of Parc national de Miguasha, a fossil-rich site on the UNESCO World Heritage List that protects treasures dating back 380 million years.

In the Matapédia Valley, which features a rich built heritage, a meandering road winds through the heart of a landscape of mountains and crystal-clear, salmon-filled rivers.

In the winter, the thick blanket of snow covering the Gaspé Peninsula is a sight to behold! A popular destination for backcountry skiing east of the Rockies, this region is also a true paradise for snowmobilers and other winter sports enthusiasts.

Mountains worth climbing

The Chic-Choc Mountains, a huge natural playground, offer breathtaking landscapes and many opportunities to observe and learn about local plants and wildlife. Located at the heart of these mountains, Parc national de la Gaspésie is a popular hiking destination in Québec with more than 25 peaks over 1 000 metres high, including Mount Albert and Mount Jacques-Cartier. Woodland caribou are the emblem of this park, which is home to the only herd found south of the St. Lawrence.

The International Appalachian Trail runs through the Chic-Chocs for over 650 km, from Matapédia all the way to Forillon. You will also find two wildlife reserves in these mountains: the Réserve faunique de Matane, which has a high moose density (over 4 000 moose in a territory of 1 275 km²), and the Réserve faunique des Chic-Chocs, which features dramatic bare peaks, including Blanche-Lamontagne and Hog's Back.

Plants to admire and savour

In Grand-Métis, magnificent English-style floral displays extend over nearly 100 hectares at the world-renowned Reford Gardens. Some 3 000 species and varieties of plants are found at this site, which also offers a cuisine based on edible plants from the gardens' horticultural collection.

Gaspésie is a paradise for foodies: the region is renowned for its culinary offerings from the land, sea and forest. Numerous small-scale food companies are open to the public and allow visitors to meet local artisans. In addition, many businesses and restaurants sell or serve expertly prepared regional products and dishes.

Rivers and covered bridges

Known for their waters that are among the clearest in the world, the 22 salmon rivers in Gaspésie meander across a rich and varied wilderness environment with

a diversity of microclimates. The rivers in this region also offer the opportunity to enjoy a wide variety of water sports (including canoeing, kayaking, canyoning and rafting). Some of them are crossed by beautifully preserved covered wooden bridges that are worth a visit!

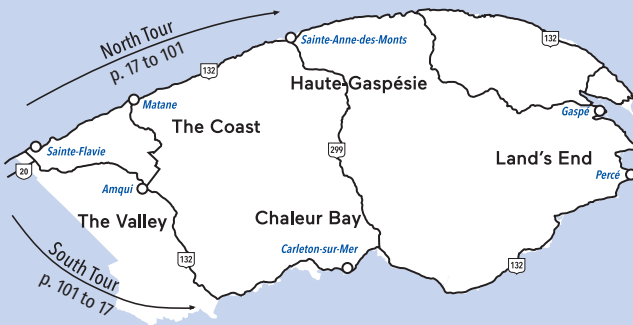
Maritime symbols

Lighthouses and wharves are two strong symbols of the maritime culture of Gaspésie. The Lighthouse Trail will give you the opportunity to discover proud witnesses to the region's history, and you can also visit wharves to fish with the locals or watch commercial fishing boats unload their catches.

Québec by the Sea

Gaspésie is one of the four tourist regions that make up the maritime regions of Québec, also known as Québec by the Sea. Located in Eastern Québec, Bas-Saint-Laurent, Gaspésie, Côte-Nord and the Îles de la Madeleine are united by the sea and a common maritime tradition. Enjoy exploring these regions via scenic routes and ferries, which increase your travel options and add a unique maritime flavour to your trip.

Want to experience something extraordinary? Then set off on an epic 885-km road trip! Soak up spectacular scenery throughout Gaspésie featuring the sea, beaches, cliffs, mountains and rivers. Chat with the locals, who will welcome you with warm smiles and open arms. Stop in the region's many restaurants and shops, and feast on delights from the sea, land and forest. Dance, sing or relax until the wee hours under an infinitely starry sky. Are you ready for this grand adventure?

Percé Rock: An Iconic Landmark

Come and see for yourself this imposing rock that everyone talks about! Located in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, famous Percé Rock was once connected to the continent and had three arches: it now proudly displays its single remaining arch. Admire it from various angles, from the village of Percé or in a boat. Be sure to also visit its neighbour, Bonaventure Island, in the same national park, which shelters thousands of nesting northern gannets every year.

The Chic-Chocs: An Outdoor Paradise

Hiking enthusiasts and fans of winter mountain sports will love the Chic-Chocs! Let yourself be surprised by these singularly shaped mountains, with flat peaks and steep slopes, which run parallel to the St. Lawrence.

Climb or descend the trails in Parc national de la Gaspésie, which is home to more than 25 peaks over 1000 metres high, or explore the International Appalachian Trail. Enjoy fishing and watching game in wildlife reserves (Chic-Chocs and Matane)... and be prepared for the unexpected!

Forillon: Wild Beauty

Open all your senses as you explore the wild beauty of the Forillon Peninsula, which is now protected by a national park. Take in magnificent views from the park's lookouts and observe local geological phenomena and formations that have witnessed 450 million years of history. Admire the cliffs of the easternmost part of the Appalachian mountain range. Watch thousands of seabirds and the rich wildlife found in Forillon's boreal forest... and befriend curious seals along the shore.

Sea and Rivers: Relaxation... or Adventure!

Are you looking forward to exploring the waters of Gaspésie? Whether fresh or salty, they offer many opportunities for relaxation and adventure. Experience the sea through activities such as swimming in the temperate waters of Chaleur Bay, sailing, kitesurfing, whale watching, scuba diving or fishing from a wharf or at sea. You can also explore many crystal-clear rivers, some of which are salmon-spawning areas. Canoeing, kayaking, canyoning, rafting, snorkelling... you are spoiled for choice in Gaspésie!



Wildlife: Incredible and Unforgettable Encounters!

Keep your camera ready, because you will want proof when you tell stories of your wildlife encounters in Gaspésie! Out at sea, play hide and seek with seals, watch gigantic whales appear over the horizon or dive underwater to see fish and crustaceans up close. Visit the largest and most accessible northern gannet colony in the world. Spot river salmon, moose, black bears and white-tailed deer, not to mention the only caribou herd south of the St. Lawrence!



History and Heritage: Gaspesian Identity

Come and visit beautifully preserved heritage sites. Their walls have many stories to tell... including incredible fishing tales! Plunge into the heart of what has forged Gaspesian identity to better understand and appreciate it in all its authenticity. Discover important witnesses to the past, including the Reford Gardens; Gaspé, the Birthplace of Canada; Parc national de Miguasha, a paleontological site; various interpretation sites and museums; and picturesque lighthouses, fishing harbours and coastal villages.

Gastronomy: Distinctive Flavours

Satisfy your appetite as you savour delicious and carefully crafted dishes featuring ingredients from the sea, land and forests of Gaspésie. Local restaurants prepare the region's most popular products (lobster, crab and shrimp) with a unique know-how and innovate with marine delicacies such as seaweed. Microbreweries, which are a must-stop for hops lovers, will delight you with their high-quality products and friendly atmosphere. To be sure not to miss anything, follow the Gaspésie Gourmande and the Saveurs du Bas-Saint-Laurent gourmet tours!



Festivals and Events: Bringing People Together

There is always something to do and a good reason to gather on the Gaspé Peninsula! Surrender to the festive spirit that reigns around bonfires, on patios as well as in bars, show venues and even people's homes!

Let yourself be enchanted by the enthusiasm of the locals, who organize a wide variety of distinctive events throughout the year. Once you have attended some of these festivals and sporting events, you will want to tell everybody about them!



Winter Fun: Lots of Powder Snow

Seven metres of annual snowfall, an enchanting winter wonderland and tons of powder snow... this is what awaits you in Gaspésie! Both extreme sports enthusiasts and winter lovers will be thrilled by the exceptional conditions for cross-country skiing, downhill skiing, backcountry skiing, snowboarding, telemarking, snowshoeing or snowkiting on the frozen sea. Snowmobilers, experience pure joy as you explore over 3 000 km of marked and groomed trails. To cap off a perfect day, enjoy a hot and comforting typical Gaspesian meal...

Are you concerned about not being served in English in Gaspésie?

Enjoy a picnic of famous northern shrimp with your family in nature or savour your feast in a romantic setting at the beautiful Reford Gardens, before marvelling at the sun setting over the sea. Admire crystal-clear salmon rivers and keep an eye out for wildlife—you never know what animals you will spot during your visit to this area!

Sainte-Flavie, at the gateway to Gaspésie, marks the beginning of the loop around the Gaspé Peninsula on Route 132. Observe birds at the Gros Ruisseau rest area, where the banks have been stabilized, and visit the International Garden Festival's extramural garden nearby. Via the Place Clément-Chouinard boardwalk, access the beach and admire beautiful sunsets. On the wharf, meet fishermen or take in the shows performed by regional artists on Thursday evenings throughout the summer (*Jeudis soirs Ô Quai*). At Place Flavie-Drapeau, enjoy the picnic area and beach access. In the village, visit the art gallery in the former presbytery (now a cultural centre), the library and the local historical interpretation centre.

Discover the seaside rest area on Rue Principale, picnic tables, benches, public restrooms, wireless Internet access, café, inns, restaurants, art gallery, grocery store, gas station, wind farm (in the backcountry), flax fields (4e Rang), covered bridge (Route MacNider), various trails (snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, ATVing) and stairs leading to a sand and pebble beach (swimming, hiking, access to the water).

Village with a rich built and historical heritage: the neoclassical church (1878) is one of the most architecturally interesting in Eastern Québec. At the confluence of the Blanche and St. Lawrence rivers, two rest areas offer access to the shoreline (picnic tables, public restrooms, playground, tourist information). A boat launch is located behind the municipal office. An intergenerational park with ballpark near Route 132 makes a great stop (picnic tables, playground, community garden, playhouses). The Vignoble Carpinteri vineyard is nearby (Chemin du Pont-Couvert). Credit union, post office, market, accommodations, chocolate shop.

Cap-des-Rosiers (“Rosebush Cape”) was named after the many wild roses that once grew here. For sailors, the cape marks the point where the St. Lawrence becomes a gulf. From here, an officer sighted Wolfe's fleet in 1759 and immediately sent a messenger to Québec City. This area has witnessed numerous shipwrecks, which led to the construction of a lighthouse in 1858. Designated as a historic monument in 1977, it is the tallest lighthouse in Canada. Cap-des-Rosiers is also the gateway to Forillon National Park. Also, Du Banc trail; harbour; observation tower; picnic area; and site commemorating the wreck of the *Carricks*, an Irish sailing vessel carrying 187 passengers.

Enjoy the view of Gaspé Bay and the Penouille Peninsula, the Boom Defence dunes and Plate de Pointe-Saint-Pierre Island. Follow a nature trail that clings to the mountainside, winding along the village for over 7 km. Here, horseback riders, cyclists and hikers can admire various species of regional forest flora. West of the village, discover Fort Peninsula, a vestige of World War II.

In the Mi'gmaq language, Gespeg means "land's end." Gaspé is associated with the origins of the country and the beginning of Western history in North America: the cross erected by Jacques Cartier in 1534 earned Gaspé the title of "Birthplace of Canada." Protected by mountains, Gaspé Bay shelters recreational boats and cruise ships from all over the world. Gaspé has three internationally renowned salmon rivers, the York, Dartmouth and Saint-Jean, which are frequented by over 1 500 anglers every year. Plan to spend some time here: you can enjoy the warm welcome at the hostel in the middle of the village. Built in 1936 and now a tourist attraction with a golf course overlooking the sea, Fort-Prével was a military outpost during World War II that aimed its heavy artillery towards the Atlantic.

Salmon Rivers

In Québec, the anadromous Atlantic salmon sport fishing season generally extends from June 1 to September 30. To fish for salmon, you must purchase a salmon sport fishing licence and obtain a right of access. There are two types of access to salmon-fishing sectors on rivers: open access (no limit on the number of anglers) and limited access. To obtain a right of access, contact the river operator.

Every year, the MFFP publishes a guide to the main salmon fishing regulations. Visit their website (mffp.gouv.qc.ca) to consult this guide and find out more about fishing zones, catch and size limits as well as mandatory or voluntary catch-and-release.

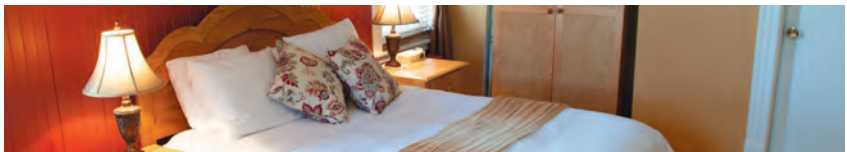

Travelling in Québec

Bars, Casinos and Purchasing Alcohol

You must be at least 18 years old to enter bars, pubs, nightclubs and casinos, as well as to purchase or consume alcohol (be prepared to produce ID if asked). Wines and spirits are sold through the Société des alcools du Québec (SAQ), the provincial liquor board. Beer is available at grocery and convenience stores, which also stock a limited selection of wines.

Currency Exchange

There are numerous exchange offices in Québec's main urban centres. Airports also offer exchange services. Some businesses accept American money, but tend to offer a less competitive rate than the exchange offices.

Driving in Québec

Since Canada uses the metric system, speed limits and distances are posted in kilometres per hour (km/h) and gasoline is sold by the litre (l).

It is illegal to transport or use radar detectors in Québec.

Cell Phones

Use of a cell phone is prohibited while driving.

Drugs and Driving

This Act introduces a zero-tolerance principle when it comes to drugs and driving by prohibiting anyone from driving a vehicle if there is a detectable presence of cannabis or any other drug in that person's saliva.

According to the law, you must be at least 21 years old to purchase or consume cannabis (be prepared to produce ID if asked). The legislation also includes other measures, such as the prohibition from consuming drugs (cannabis or any other drug) in a road vehicle, on an off-road vehicle or on a bicycle.

Winter Tires

From December 1 to March 15, all taxis and passenger vehicles registered in Québec must be equipped with winter tires. This requirement also applies to rental passenger vehicles in Québec.

Tourist Routes

The official tourist routes are clearly marked with blue signs. They are designed to highlight the attractions of the regions through which they pass, and to enable visitors to discover the extent of Québec's natural and cultural treasures. quebecoriginal.com/tourist-routes.

Tourist Signage

In Québec, tourist regions and directions to services, attractions and activities are indicated by blue road signs.

Voltage

In Québec, the standard voltage is 110 volts/60 cycles, as it is throughout North America. Since the outlets cannot accommodate European plugs, you will need to bring or buy an adaptor.

Canadian Currency

The legal currency in Québec is the Canadian dollar (CAD), which is divided into 100 cents. Bank notes are available in denominations of 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 dollars, and coins in denominations of 5, 10 and 25 cents as well as 1 and 2 dollars. Bank cards and major credit cards are also accepted almost everywhere.

Tippling

Tippling is customary in restaurants, bars and taxis. The amount, which is not included in the bill, is generally equivalent to 15% of the total bill before taxes. For quick tip calculations, Québécois normally add up both taxes. Tippling bellhops or porters is at your discretion (generally, \$1 per bag).

Taxes

Québec has two taxes: the 5% federal goods and services tax (GST), and the 9.975% Québec sales tax (QST). An accommodation tax of 3.5% of the room price per night also applies in our region.

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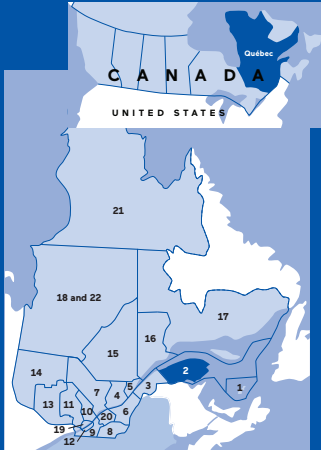
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Map of Québec Tourist Regions



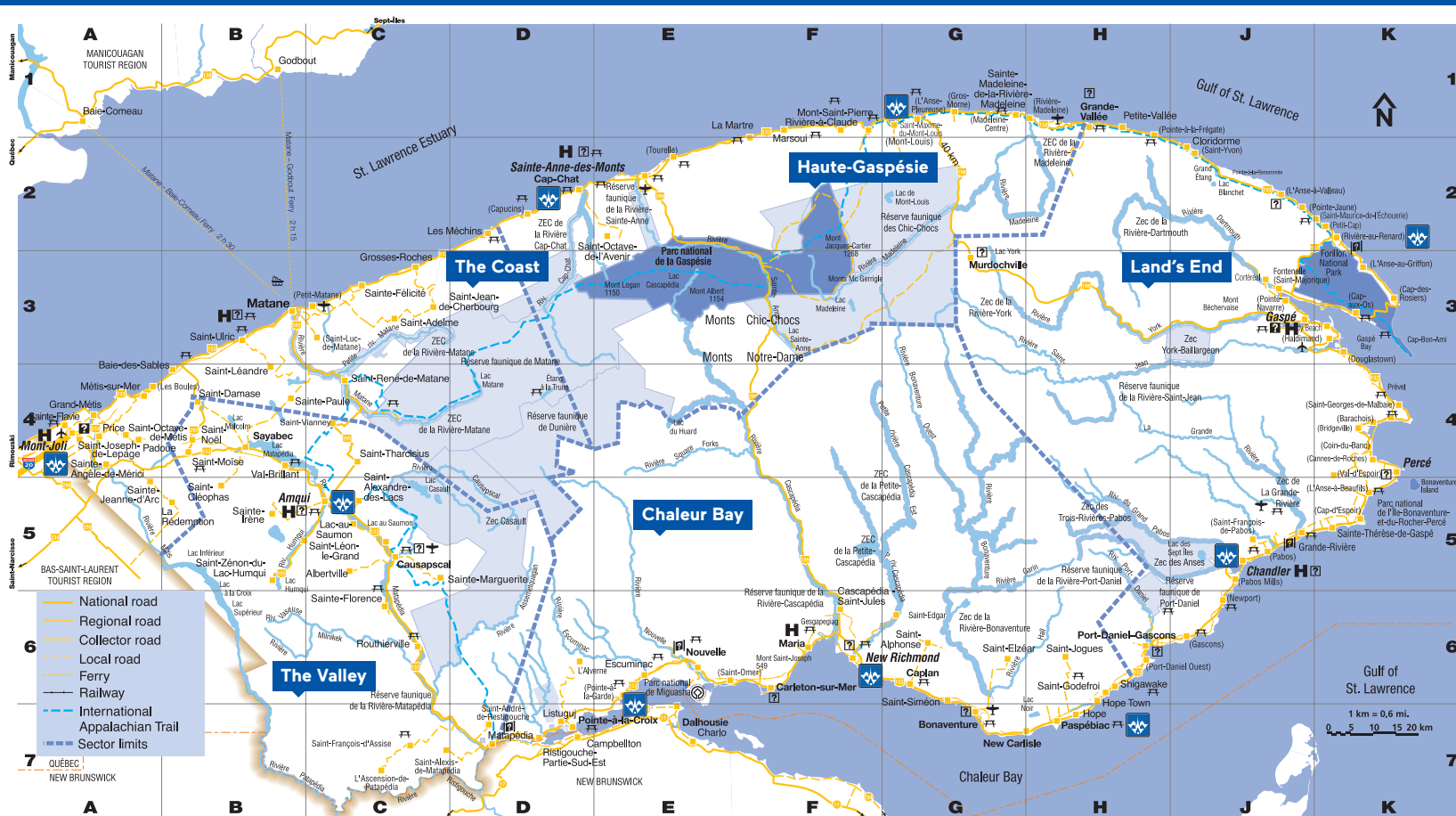

A *village-relais* is a municipality that offers, with the help of local merchants, services at least comparable to those found in service areas, including restaurants and lodging establishments as well as gas and service stations.
