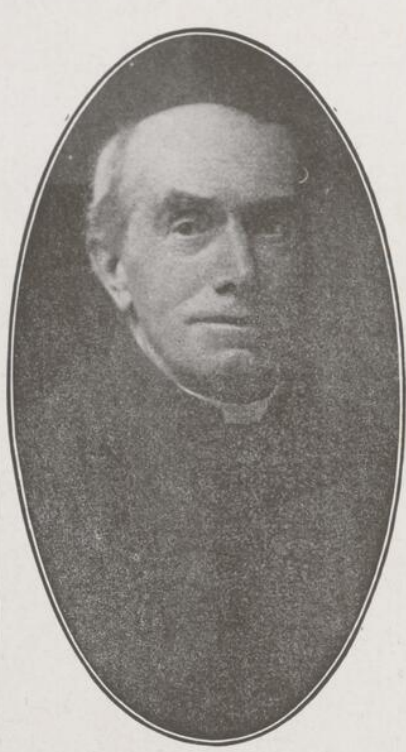

Congregation of Grace Church Will To-Morrow Honor Memory of Their Late Pastor, Ven. Archdeacon Ker



FUNERAL OF A BELOVED ANGLICAN PRIEST—Scene in the chancel of Grace Church, Point St. Charles, during the lying-in-state of the late Venerable Archdeacon Ker, who for many years was rector of the church, and who was laid to rest in Mount Royal cemetery, beside the late Bishop Carmichael, last week. On the left is the pulpit from which the deceased used to instruct his flock in the verities of the Christian faith, and in rear of the casket are the handsome altar and retables erected during his incumbency. 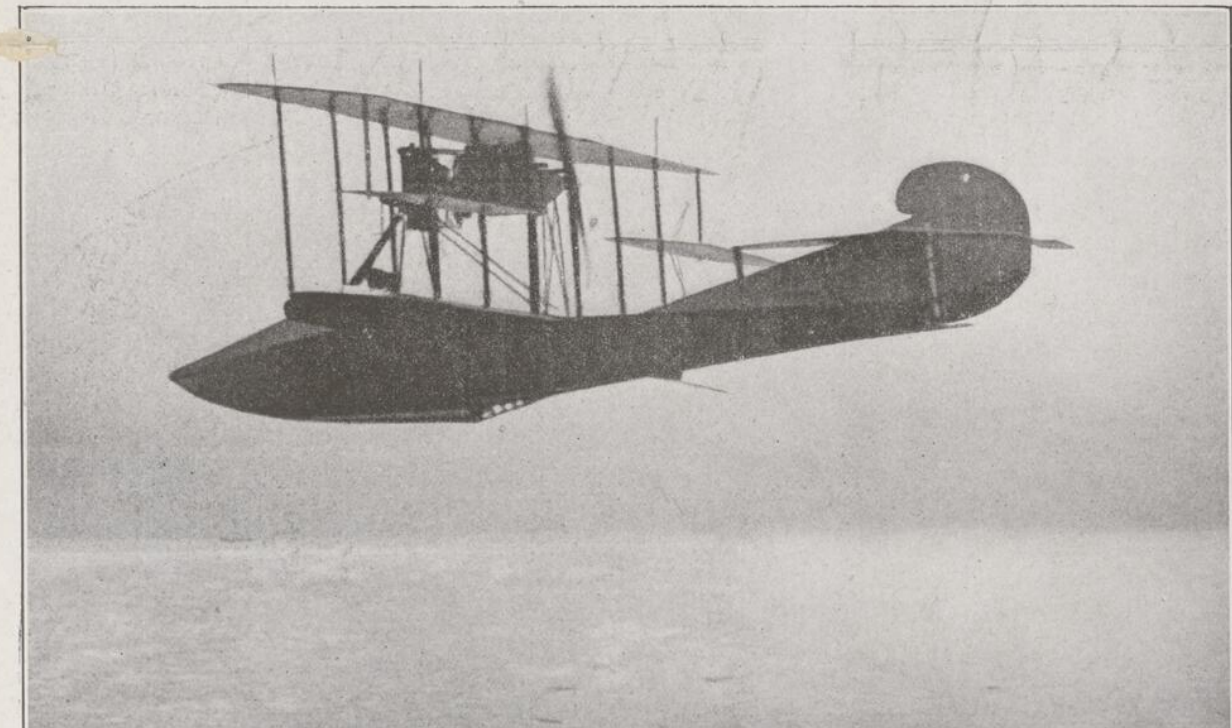

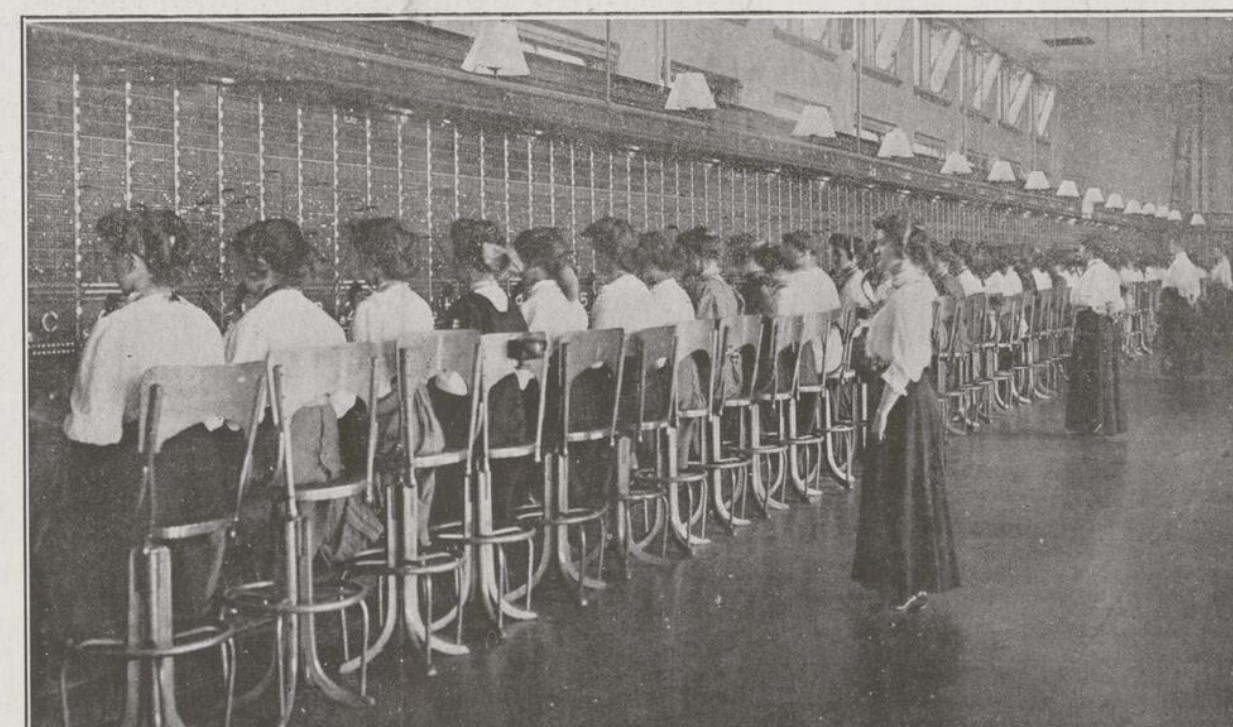

FIRE SILENCES THE 'PHONES OF MONTREAL.—At the Main Exchange of the Bell Telephone Company in Canada's commercial metropolis, three shifts of men have been at work for nearly two weeks repairing the damage wrought by a recent fire. This fire had the effect of silencing all the 'phones on this Exchange and temporarily cutting off communication over the long distance wires. To repair the damage, 50,000 wires will have to be spliced and 190,000 solderings will have to be made. It will be two weeks yet before the service is in running order again. SOMETHING NEW IN THE REALM OF AVIATION—The flying boat invented by Mr. Glen H. Curtis, the well-known motor racing expert, who recently won the first Gordon Bennett Cup at Rheims. It is particularly adapted for naval purposes, as it can be launched from battleships with comparative ease. In this respect it is superior to the modern biplane and monoplane, which are too cumbersome for naval purposes. 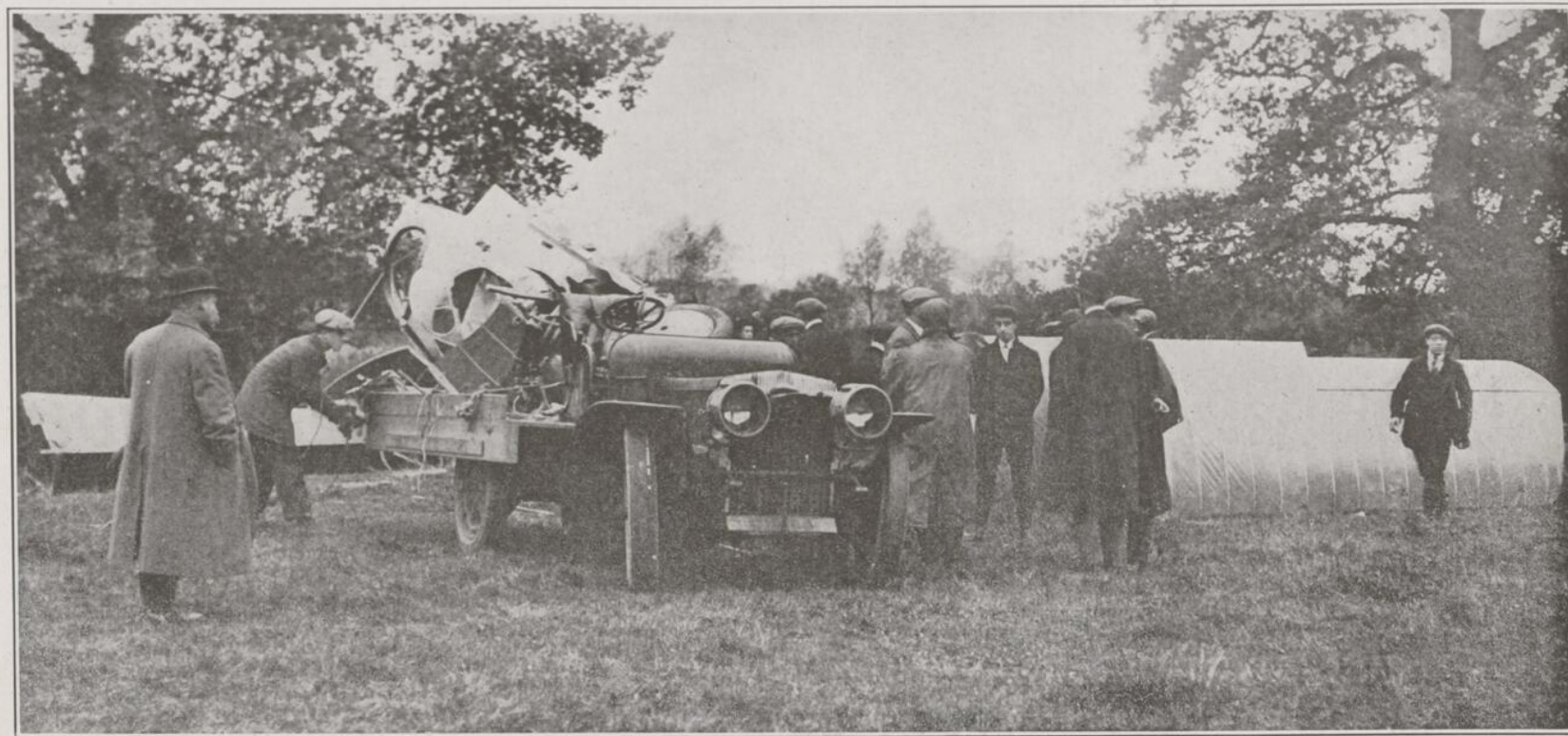
# Splendid Site in London on Which Lord Grey Would Erect Big Imperial Building for Over-Seas Dominions

**LORD GREY'S GREAT IMPERIAL SCHEME: NEW BIRD'S EYE VIEW OF THE ALDWYCH SITE, LONDON, ON WHICH IT IS PROPOSED TO BUILD A GREAT IMPERIAL BUILDING FOR THE OVERSEAS DOMINIONS OF THE KING.**—The above picture, taken from Westminster Bridge, shows the magnificent and unique site, the option for which Lord Grey has secured for the Dominion Overseas, should the idea appeal to them to erect thereon a great Imperial building which will be as visible, suggestive and inspiring as St. Paul's. The site is in the very centre of the Metropolis, half-way between St. Paul's Cathedral and Trafalgar Square, and is flanked by the Courts of Justice, Somerset House, and the other great institutions of the city. With the exception perhaps of the Mansion House, probably more people pass this point during the day than any other in London, while north of this great island site is a splendid new street, Kingsway, which in ten or twenty years' time (a very short span in the life of a nation) will be one of the finest streets in Great Britain. The money expended would be by no means all outgoing for after securing what would be undoubtedly the most impressive headquarters in London, a considerable return would accrue from the large amount of remaining space which would be rapidly filled by institutions and business concerns connected with Canada, many of which have expressed a keen desire to become tenants the moment the scheme matures. The Aldwych site is considered by experienced business men to be greatly superior to Westminster, the alternative site suggested for the Imperial Building, and an active campaign for its acquisition is at present being waged in England and the Overseas Dominions.

## EARL GREY'S GREAT IMPERIAL SCHEME.

One of the illustrations on this page shows the splendid site—right in the heart of London—on which it is proposed to build a Dominion House capable of accommodating all the offices of the various Provinces of Canada. Earl Grey, a former Governor-General of Canada, is working hard to achieve success for the scheme. His Lordship has secured an option of £3,000 per annum on the site, which contains about 125,000 square feet, or more than two acres.

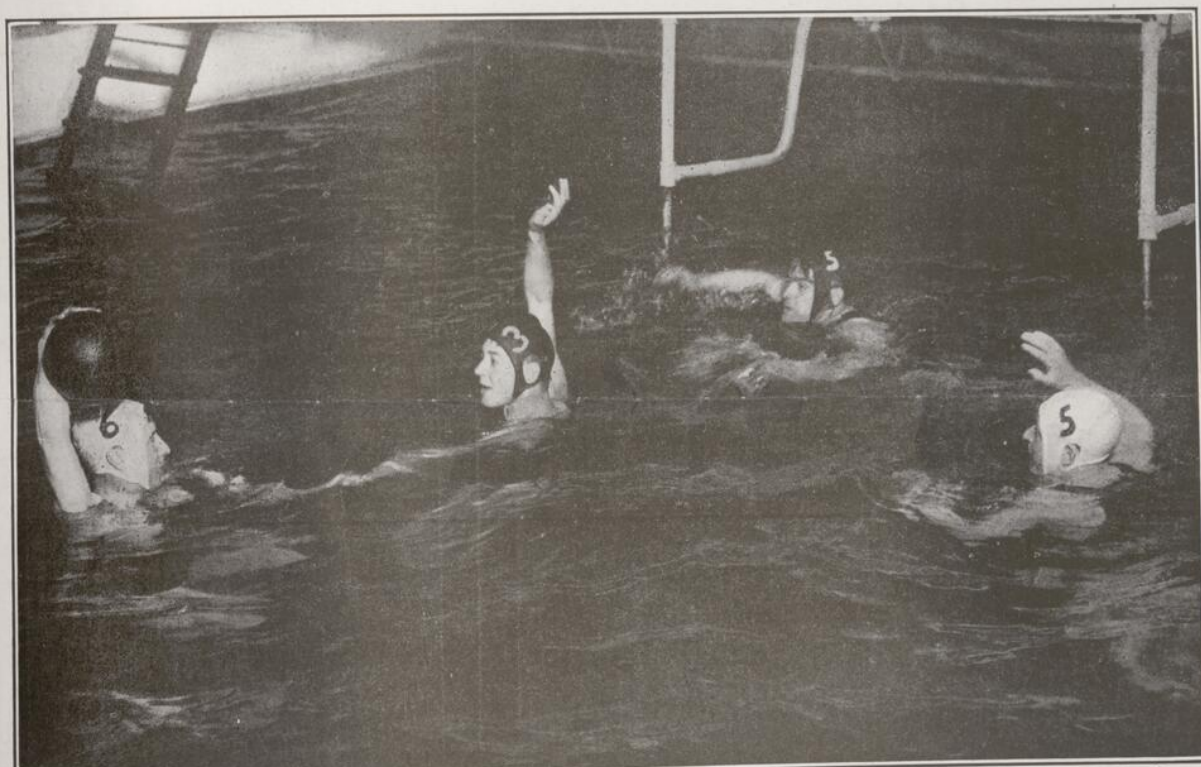
The erection of Dominion House would enable the Government of Canada and the Governments of the Canadian Provinces to concentrate on one

single site their several London offices, which are now widely distributed in different parts of the world's metropolis. Australia has already secured a portion of the property and is erecting a building thereon which will be commensurate with the dignity and importance of the Commonwealth in the sisterhood of British Dominions. New Zealand and South Africa will, it is expected, follow Australia's lead.

It has been suggested that the Canadian building might contain a permanent exhibition of products of the various Provinces, in which event, it would be a splendid advertisement for this Dominion. The establishment of this Canadian centre close to the heart of the world's metropolis would also remind the thousands which daily pass this point of the great lands which many consider the brightest jewel in the Imperial crown.

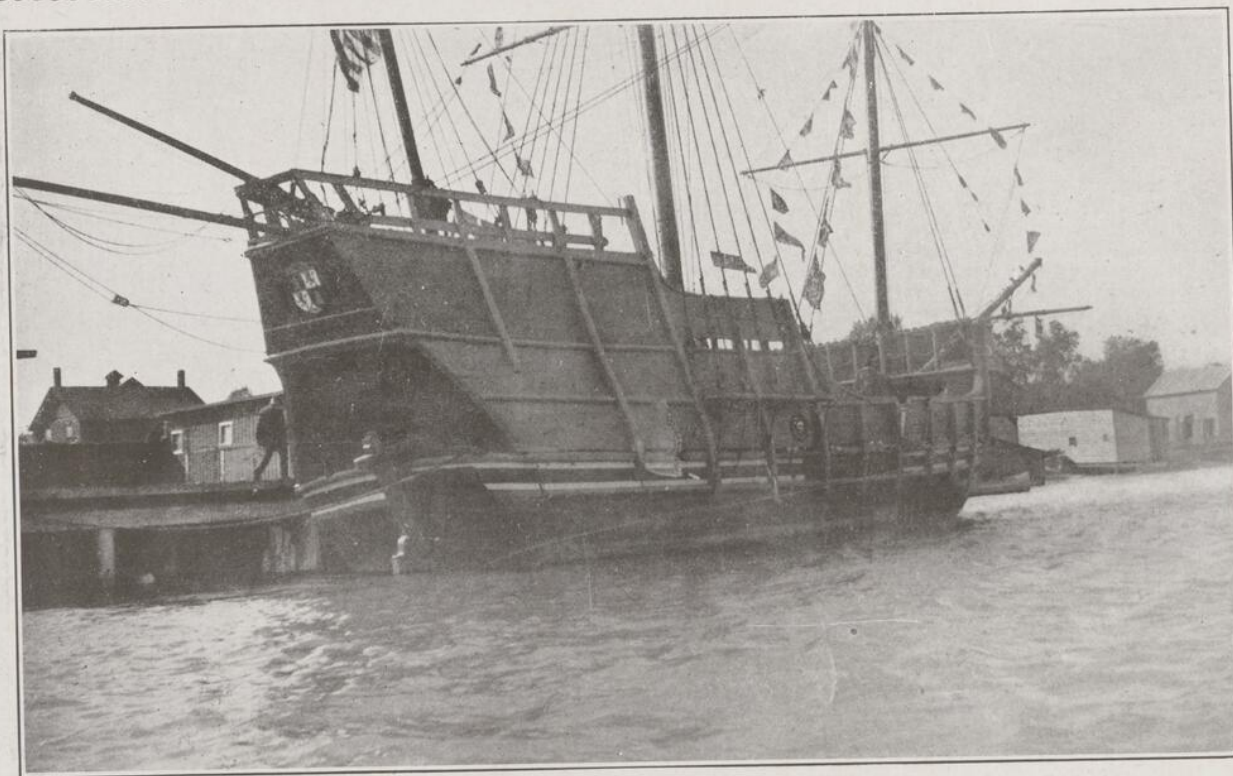
