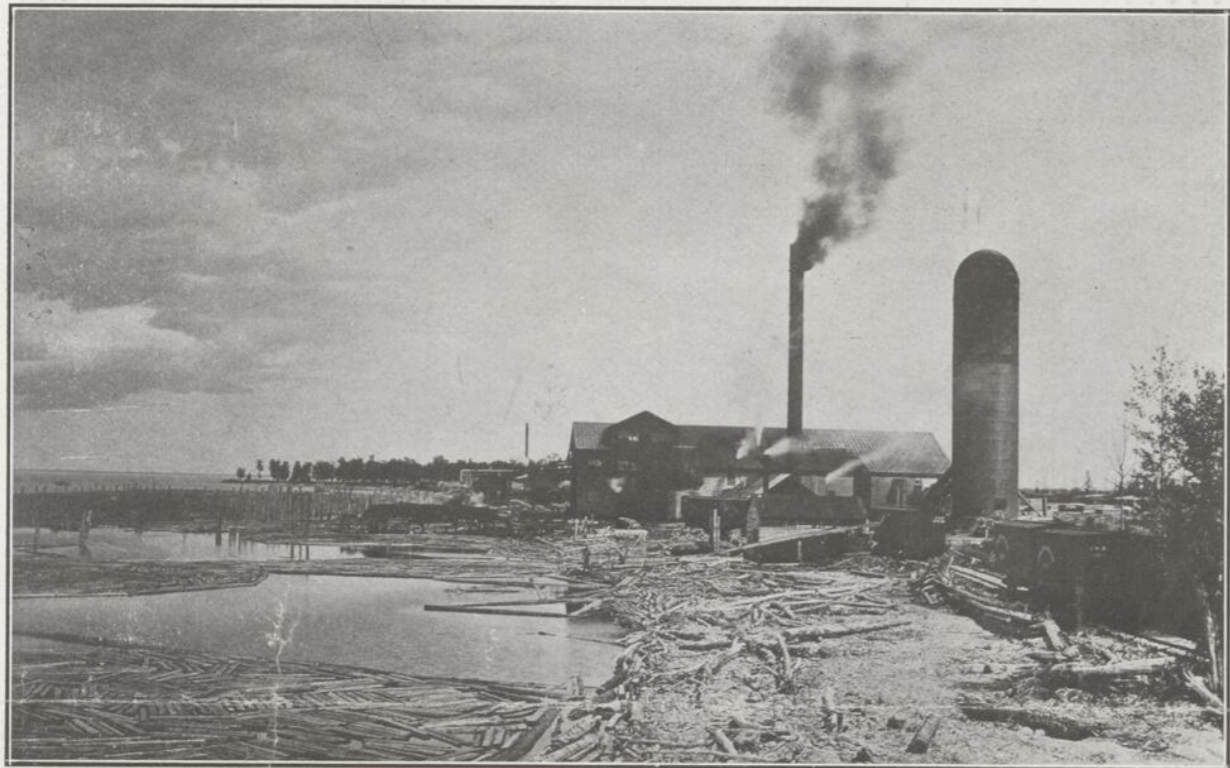

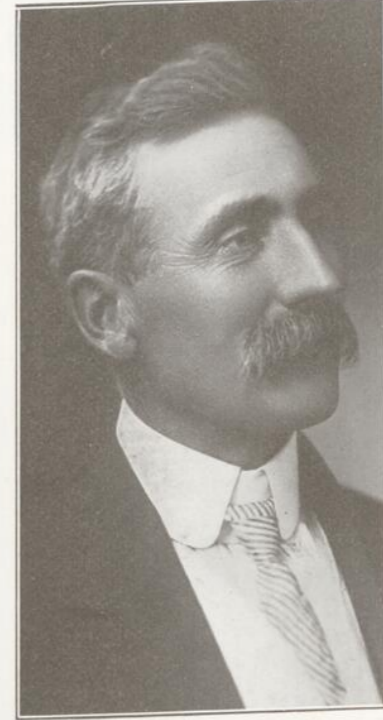

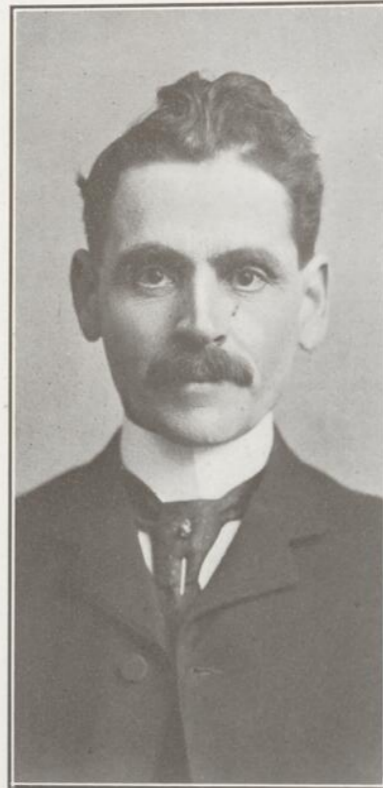

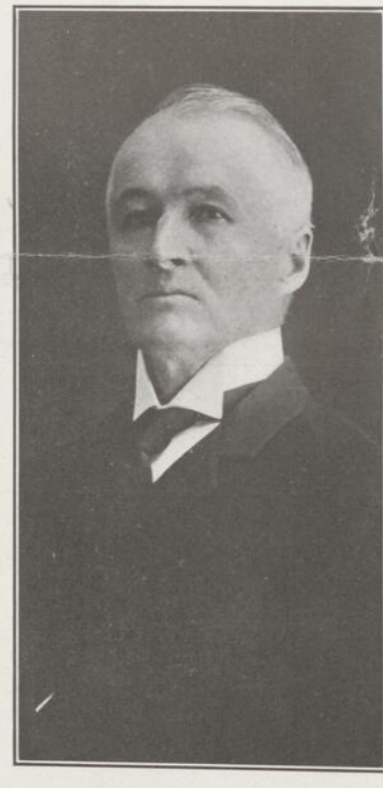

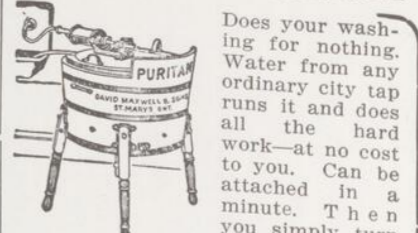

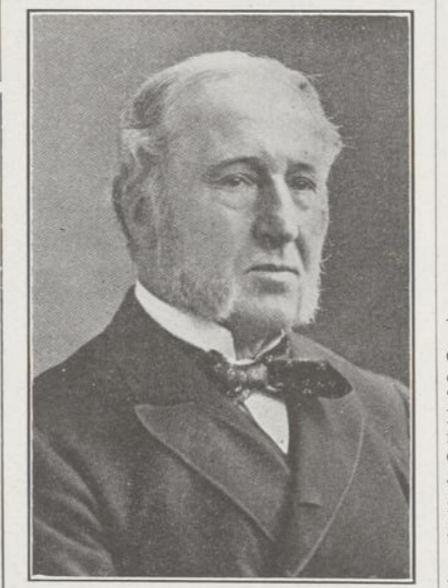

THE LATE MR. FREDERICK GREENWOOD.

Frederick Greenwood, author, journalist and publicist, who passed away recently at Sydenham, England, was born in 1830. In addition to the poems and stories, which were his first efforts in literature, he wrote two books on Napoleon III. When Thackeray resigned the editorship of *The Cornhill Magazine*, he became co-editor with George Henry Lewes, and in 1864 he became editor—a post he held for four years. In 1865, in conjunction with

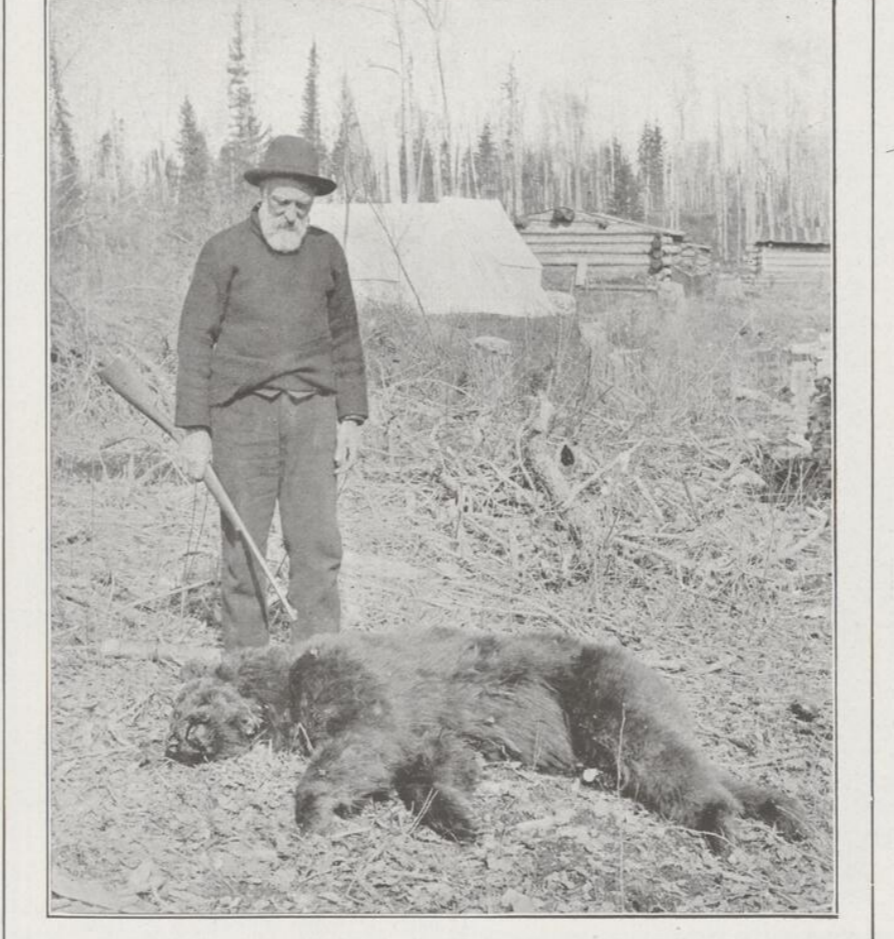

George Smith, the publisher, he produced *The Pall Mall Gazette*, a paper "written by gentlemen for gentlemen." In 1880 *The Pall Mall Gazette* became for a time a Liberal paper, when Mr. Greenwood retired, and founded *The St. James's Gazette*. At a later period he founded the short-lived *Anti-Jacobin*. His last book was entitled "Imagination in Dreams."

To Mr. Greenwood was given a superb literary instinct which enabled him on two occasions to complete the masterpieces that great writers had left unfinished at their death—in the one case with Thackeray in "Denis Duval" and in the other with Mrs. Gaskell in "Wives and Daughters."

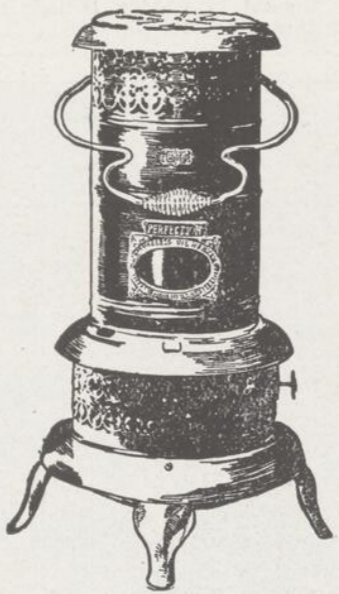

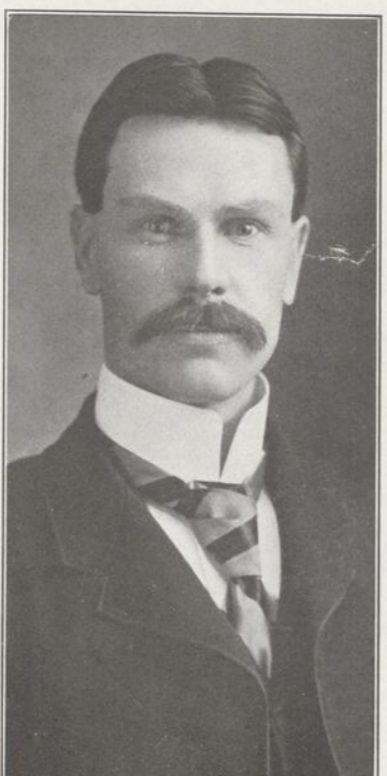
