At Amora, in Russia, there has been a panic in consequence of placards announcing that the town would be burned on the 15th May. The St. Petersburg police have been reinforced by 150 soldiers.

An important dispatch reaches us from London which says that heretofore all foreign cattle will be slaughtered within fourteen days after being landed instead of ten as heretofore.

The sublime Porte has informed its representatives abroad that Greek brigades recently disbanded 46 Turkish soldiers in the forest district of Trilika, and killed 14 soldiers, and their bodies in pieces and hung the pieces on the trees.

PRINCE BISMARCK's proposals for the regulation of the railway matter have been referred to a special committee by the Bundesrath. The Reichstag, after four hours debate, has adopted the Government's proposals relative to grain duties.

It is said in the West that the recent conference between the Toledo and Grand Trunk delegations has resulted in no exchange of pledges or definite assurances of any kind. Sir Henry Tyler said there was a contract outstanding with the Washab to construct a road, but the nature of the contract could not be divulged at present.

The arguments advanced by the Toledo delegation would, he said, receive thoughtful consideration.

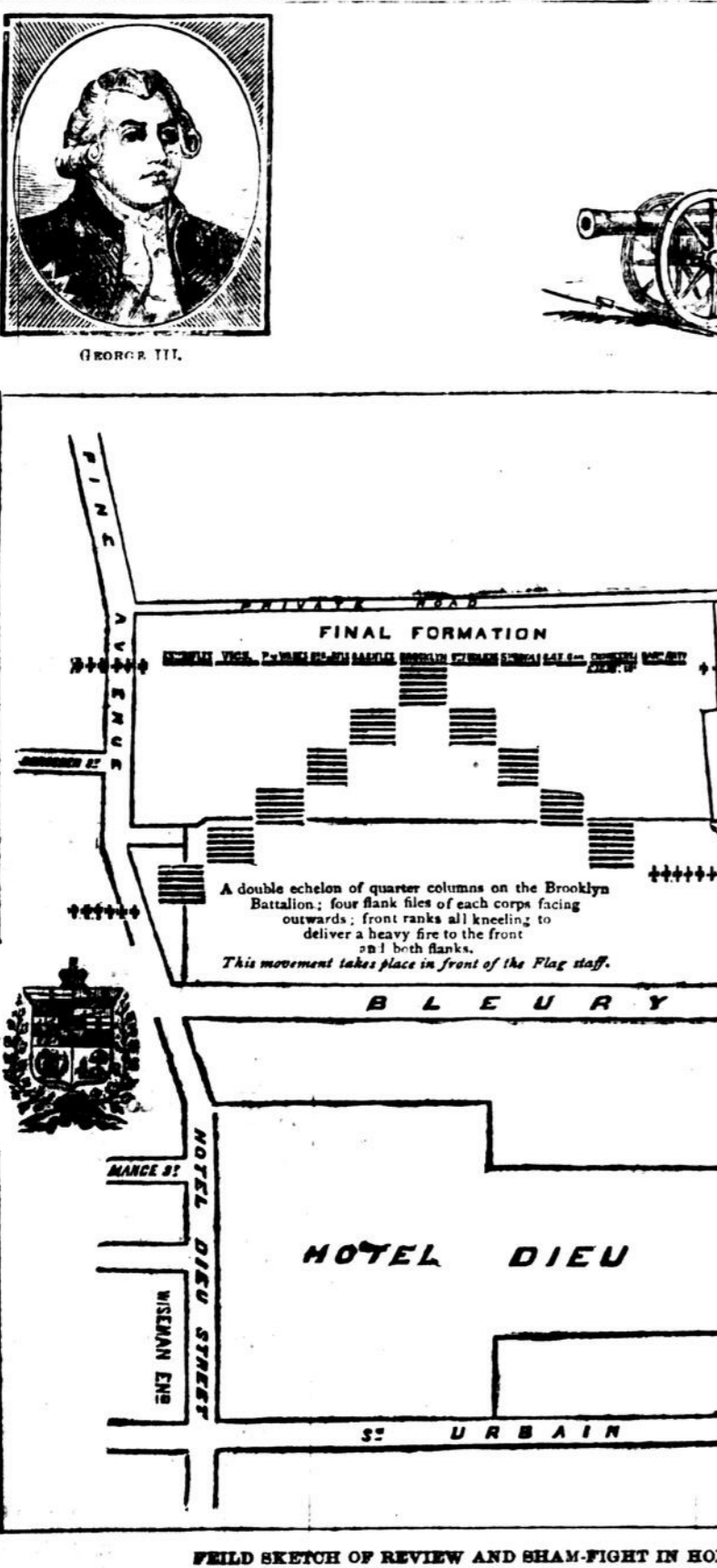

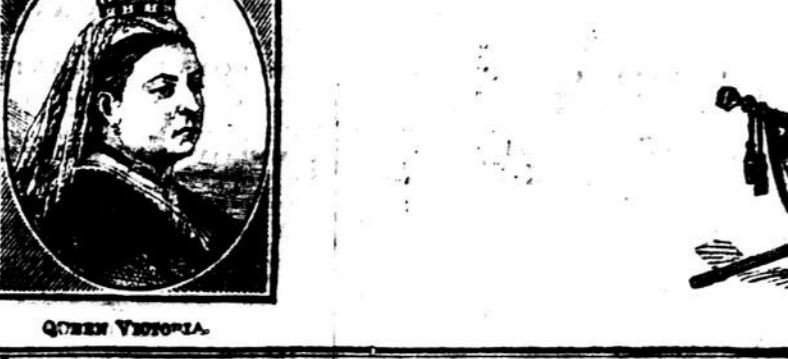
