GENERAL ASSEMBLY ADJOURNED FOR ANOTHER YEAR

Queen's Will Remain as at Present—Dr. Pringle Praised.

Western Associated Press. Winnipeg, Man., June 12.—The Presbyterian Assembly adjourned shortly before midnight with the Moderator's blessing. The Moral Reform committee's report regarding the Yukon was adopted without discussion and esteem for the best was shown, thus rendering noble service to our church and our country in their fearless denunciation of vice, and in their fight for righteousness.

Further, the Assembly rejoices in the improved conditions in the Yukon, as revealed by the report of the committee.

Rev. Dr. Candier introduced amended rules for systematic giving, and Rev. J. J. Carter amended rules for Ministers' widows and orphans.

The afternoon session was by no means largely attended, probably owing to the fact that the great burning questions were disposed of. The report on Queen's University additional endowment fund was presented by Professor Laird, who expressed the opinion that the completion of the work of raising the four hundred thousand dollar endowment could be brought about by the end of the year. The report was adopted.

On the temperance question the report of the connection of the Assembly committee, regarding local veto and abolition of bars were promptly accepted, but much opposition was expressed toward the elimination of the element of private gain, which was described as not sane.

Discussion occupied about two hours and resulted in the adoption of the report by large majority.

Rev. W. M. Rochester then raised the question of the connection of the Assembly's committee with the Canadian Social and Moral Reform Council without the Assembly having clear knowledge of its nature and aims.

QUEBEC BRIDGE INQUIRY.

Evidence Taken by Royal Commission Will Be Admitted. Special to The Montreal Star. Ottawa, June 12.—The Quebec bridge inquiry will be materially shortened by an agreement to consider as evidence all the relevant facts of the present inquiry taken before the royal commission which reported on the Quebec disaster. This was practically decided on at a meeting of the committee on Thursday afternoon, at which the Hon. Mr. Mackenzie Bowden and financial statements were the principal thing done.

Towards the close of the sitting some interesting evidence was given by Mr. Ulrich Barthe, secretary of the bridge company, in regard to the condition of affairs when the new company was organized in 1897. The old company had a capitalization of \$1,000,000, but the shareholders were only called upon to pay four per cent. of their subscribed stock.

Mr. Barthe said that when the new company was securing legislation at Ottawa in 1897, Senator Landry, unknown to the company, secured the insertion of a clause in the bill providing that the shareholders of the old company should be reimbursed for their stock on the liquidation. Senator Landry, the witness said, had never been friendly to the new company.

Mr. A. K. MacLean, the chairman of the committee, asked if it were true that the Hon. Mr. Mackenzie Bowden started a rumor to the effect that the pier of the bridge rested on an insecure foundation. Mr. Barthe said that he was in which he was interested had made some such statement to such questions, and later on renewed his objections when Mr. Barthe asked if the Hon. Mr. MacLean, another of the shareholders of the old company, had withdrawn his money. Mr. Barthe objected to the making of dirty linen.
