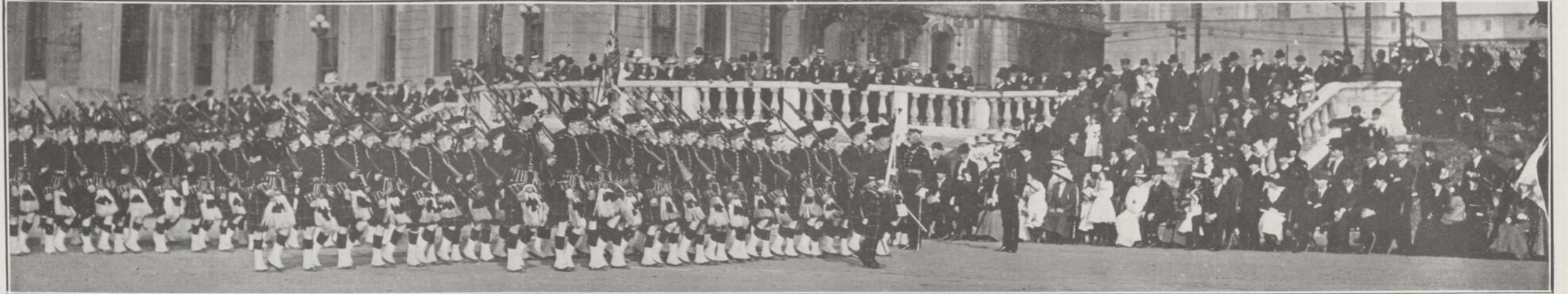


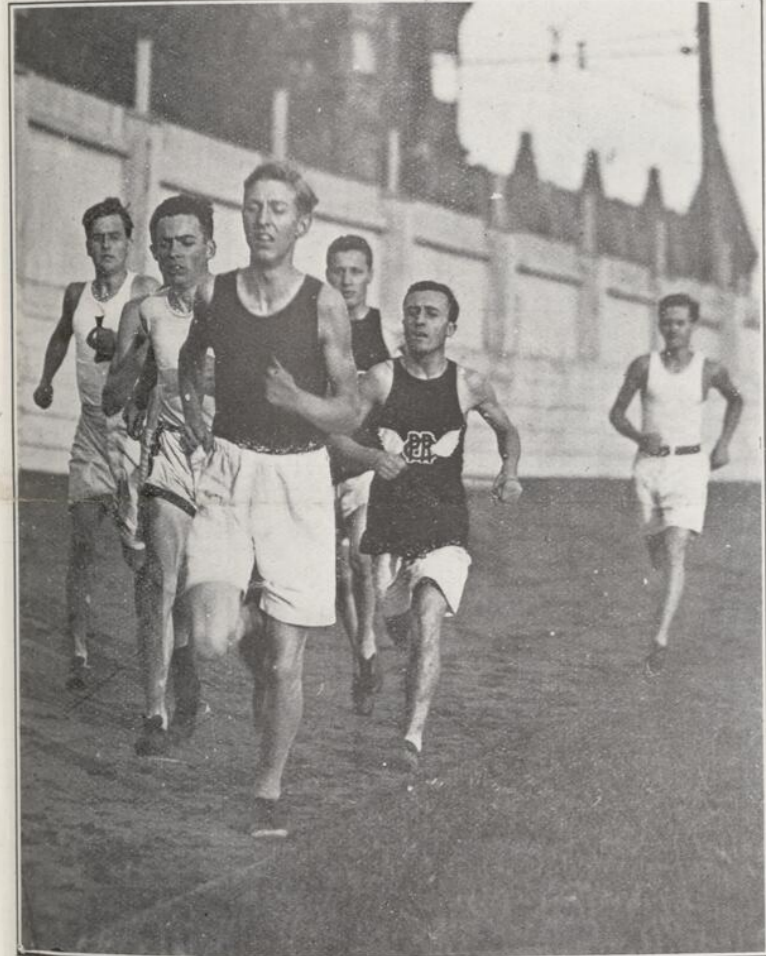
Scenes Connected with Provincial Championships Meet on M.A.A.A. Grounds, Montreal--New Aerial Monsters

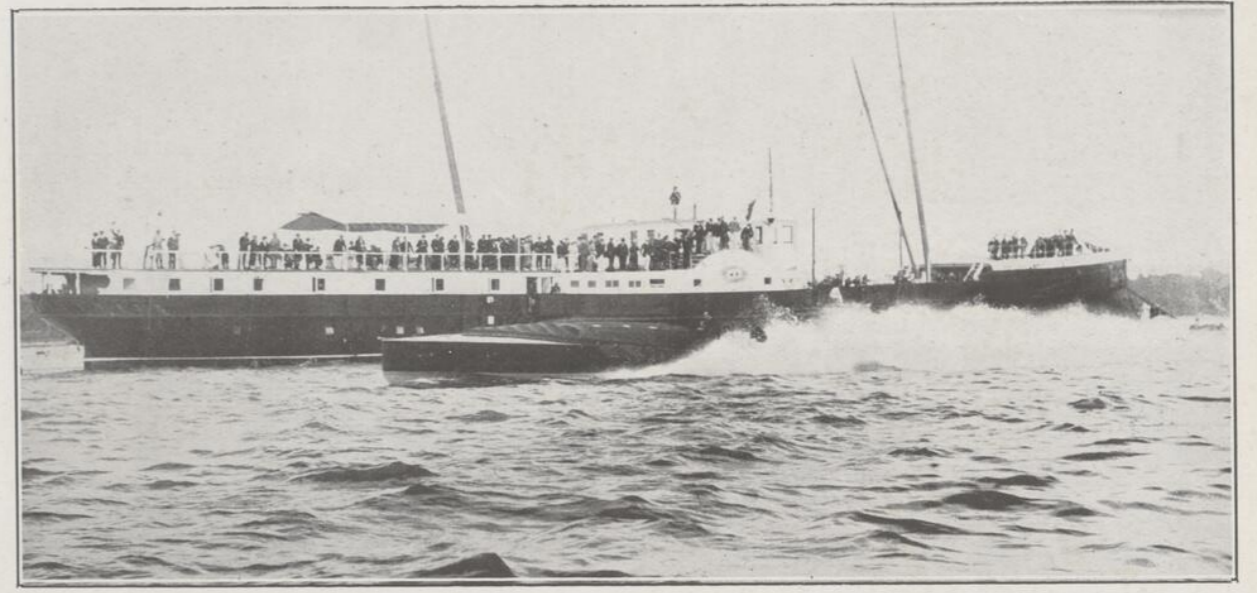

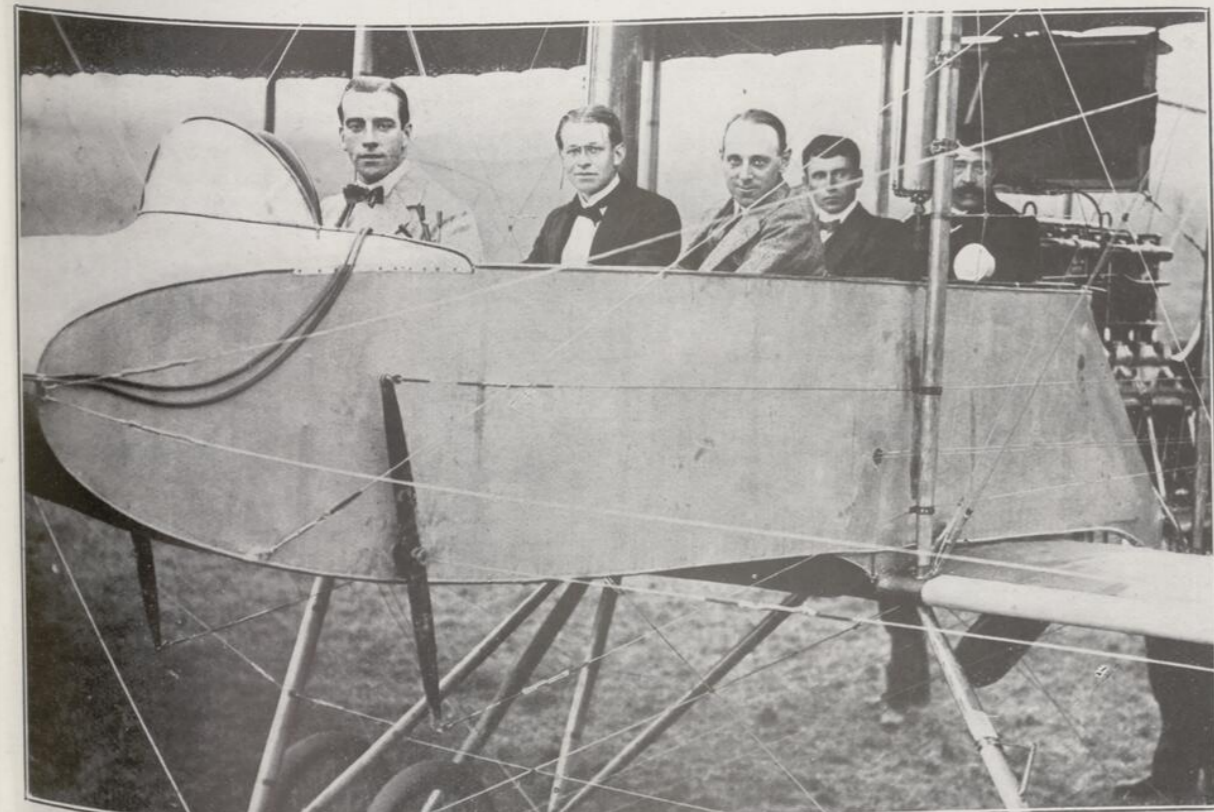

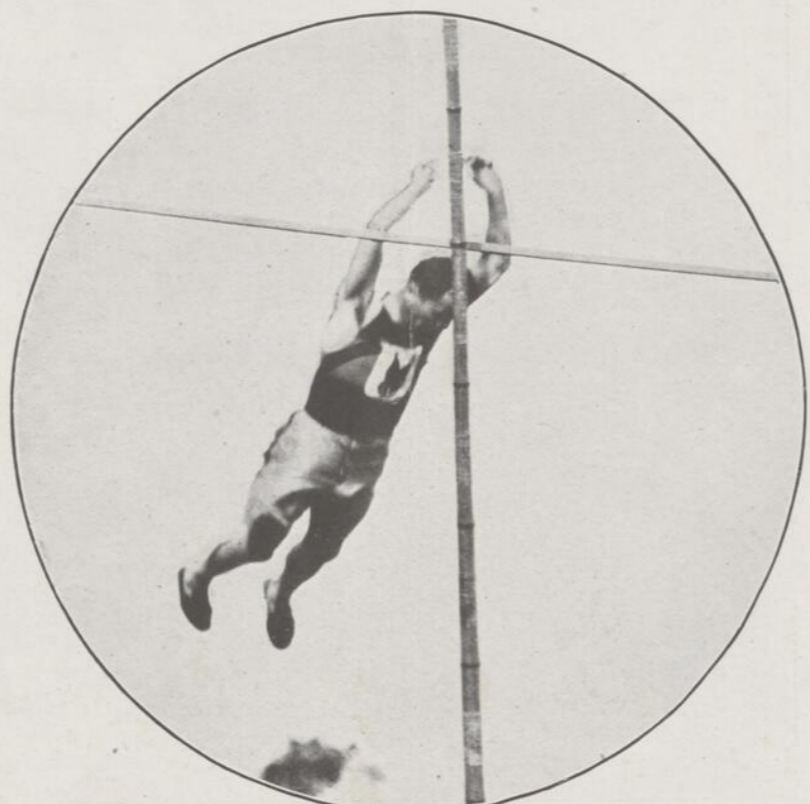

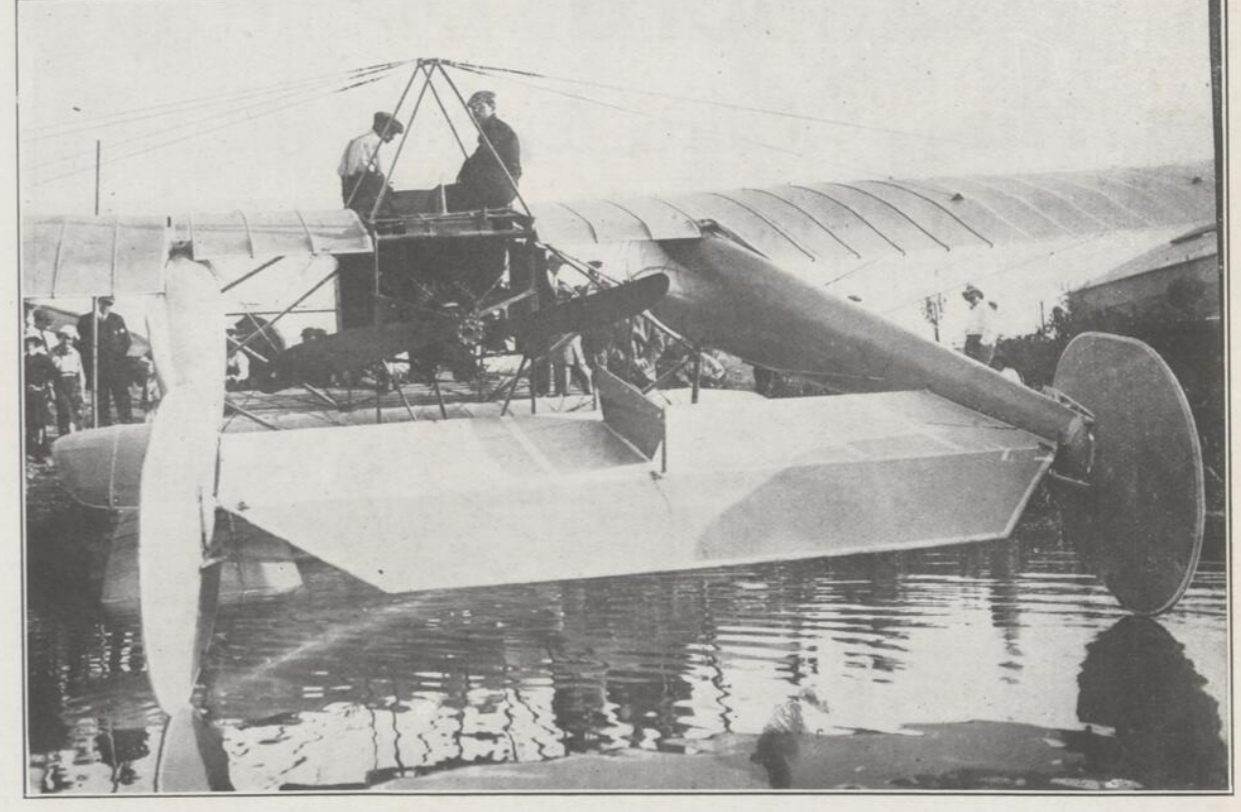

Scenes Associated with Recent Brilliant Wedding of Manoel, Deposed King of Portugal, to German Princes



THE MARRIAGE OF KING MANOEL TO THE PRINCESS AUGUSTA VICTORIA OF HOHENZOLLERN—Brilliant scenes attended this important event in the annals of the Portuguese and German royal houses. The above is a charming picture of the bride and bridegroom, and shows the former in the act of receiving a bouquet from a peasant girl, who is gowned in the native Hohenzollern costume. The groom, it will be noticed, wears a portion of the insignia (the star, ribbon, jewel and garter) of the Most Noble Order of the Garter—the most illustrious and exalted of all English Orders of Chivalry. The bride's gown is worthy of the closest study, inasmuch as it embodies all the latest ideas in bridal costumes. The accordion-pleated underskirt, and the arrangement of coronet, wreath and veil, are especially interesting.

THE MARRIAGE OF KING MANOEL.

Several of the pictures on this page deal with the recent wedding of King Manoel of Portugal to the Princess Augusta Victoria of Hohenzollern. This function was celebrated at the parish church, which was connected with the castle of Sigmaringen, the residence of

the bride's father, by a covered way bedecked with flowers and occupied by lines of white-clad maidens of various classes, including a bevy of peasant girls in so-called Hohenzollern costumes. The ceremony was performed by Cardinal Neto, formerly Patriarch of Lisbon, and was of a most imposing character. The bride's train was borne by three ladies of the Court. A group of Benedictine monks, carrying huge lighted candles, received the

wedding party at the entrance to the church. Cardinal Neto, formerly Patriarch of Lisbon, and all the clergy received the procession at the gates of the plainly decorated church, and preceded it up the aisle. The bridal pair took their places before the altar, with the princely personages to the right and left of them. The Cardinal having performed the religious ceremony, the Prince Abbot

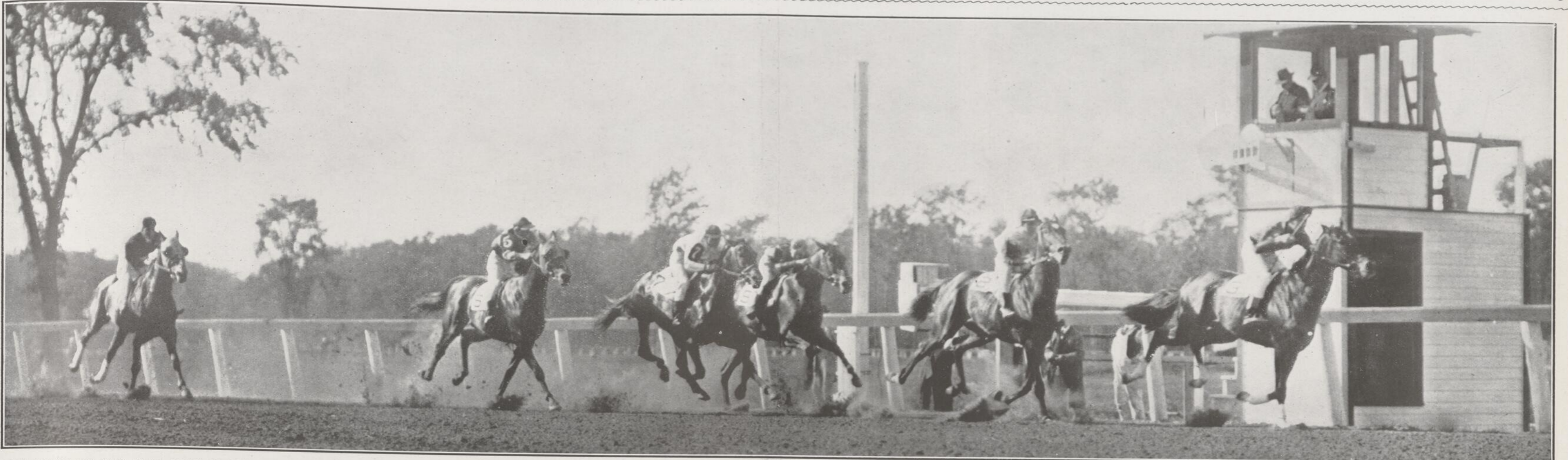

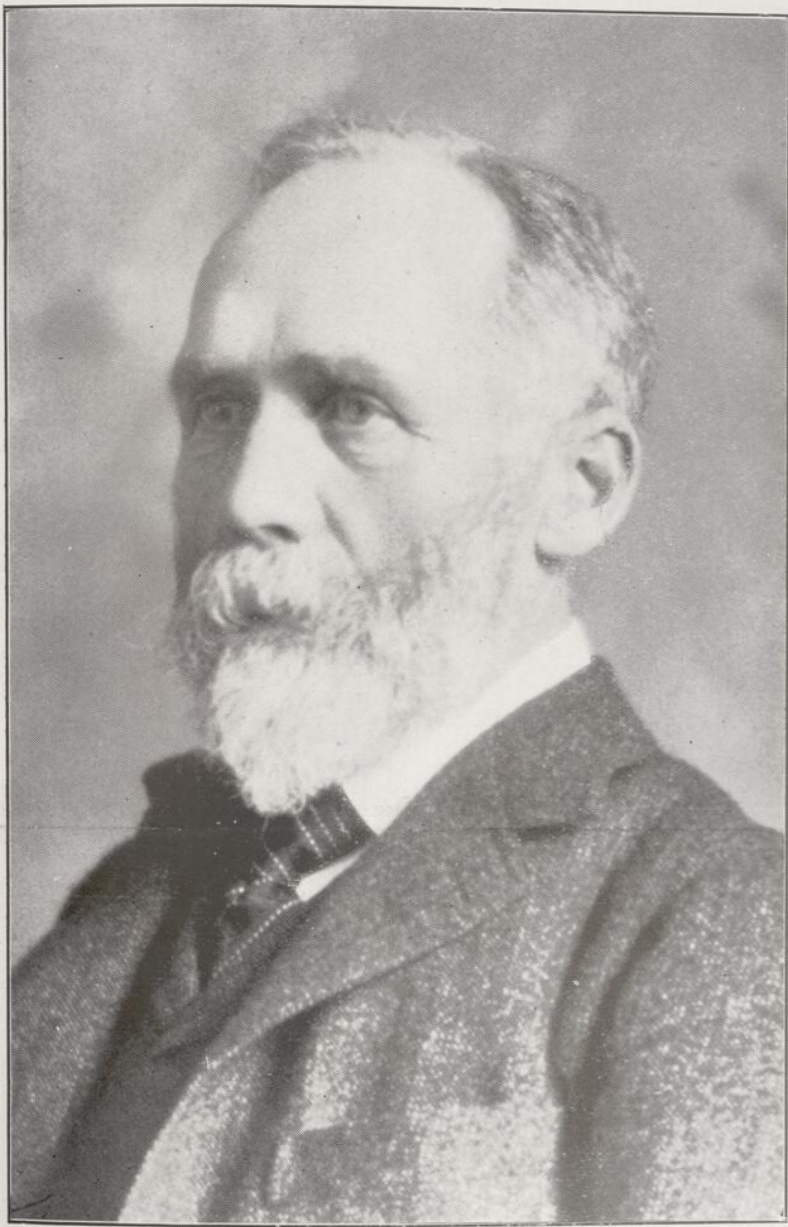

First Race on New Dorval Track Witnessed Disqualification of Leading Horse and Suspension of Jockey



THE FINISH OF THE FIRST RACE ON THE NEW DORVAL RACE TRACK—This race (for two-year-olds and upward, that had not won more than two races, purse \$500, five furlongs), proved disastrous to Jockey Lounsbury, whose rough riding caused his suspension from the Meeting. The race was won by Czar Michael (Jockey Scharf up), with The Spirit (Jockey Smyth) second, and Montreal (Jockey Gould), third, Harbard, The Idol, Old Jordan, Netmaker, and Suwane also ran. Fathom was disqualified for fouling. This horse, to the amazement of all, cut across the track to hauling Fathom at almost every stride. He lost by less than half a length, but was awarded the race after the disqualification of Fathom. In the above picture Fathom leads, with Czar Michael close at his heels.

... speak concerning Christ and the Church," spoke of the greatness and blessings of the mystery of the Christian marriage.

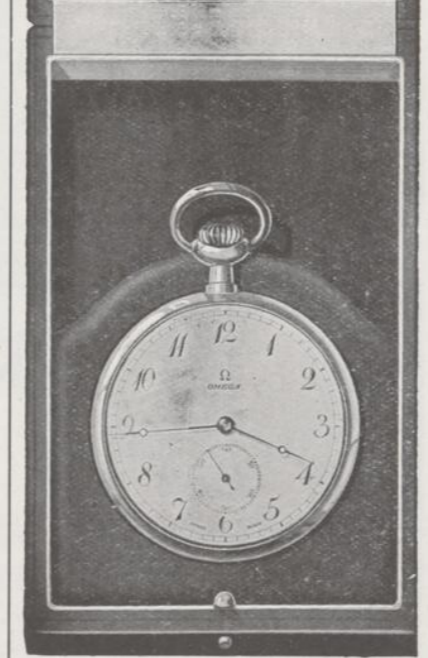

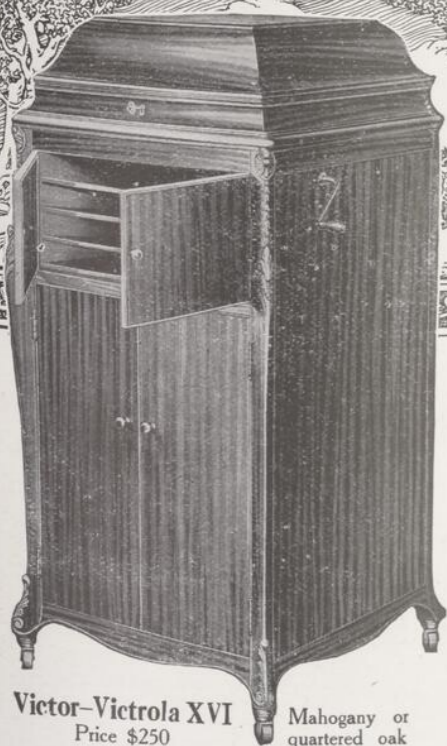

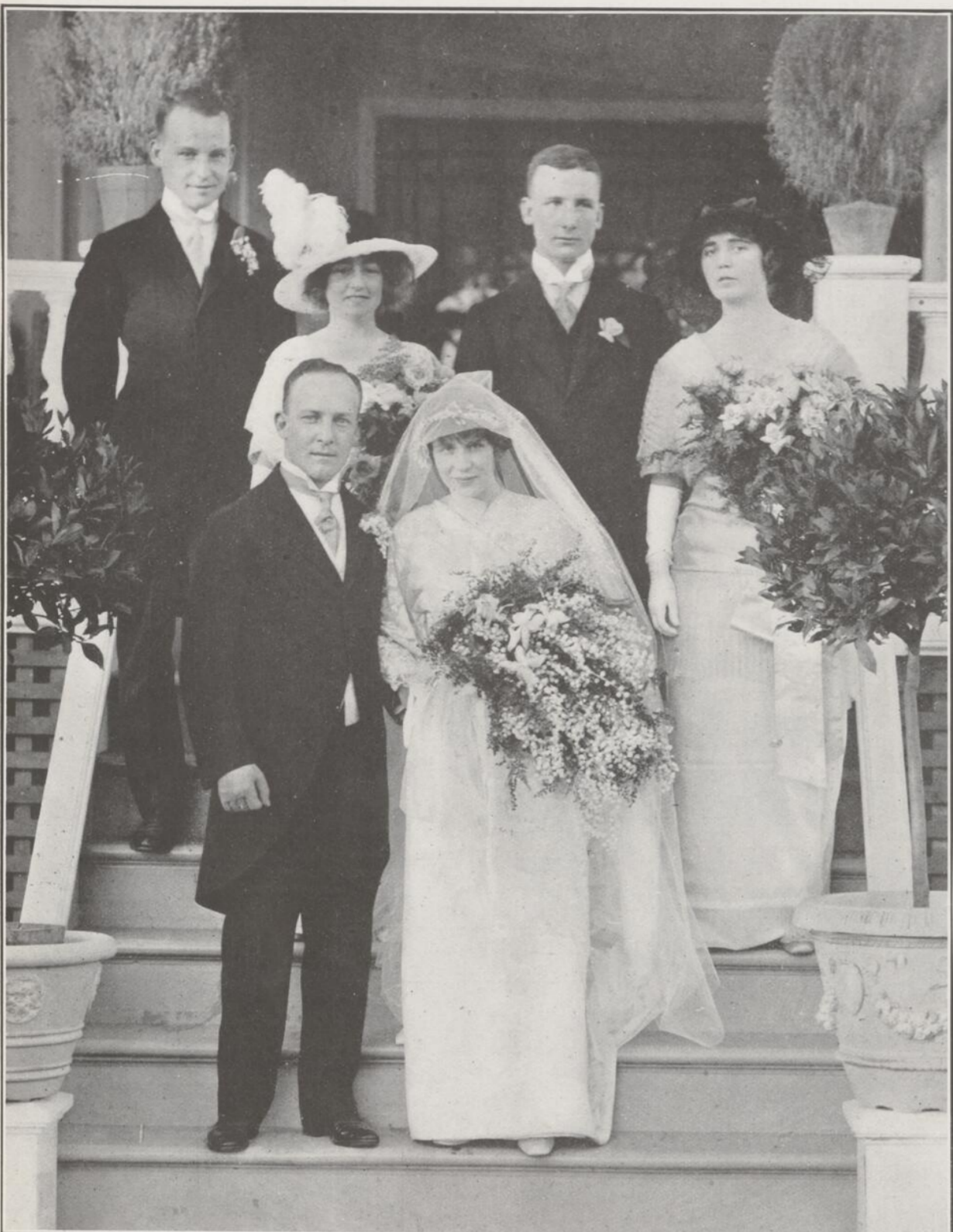
