Former Record reporter's 1948 book on Morrison now in paperback Price reissues Kidd's tale of Megantic Outlaw

With a little television exposure, the Queen vs. Donald Morrison could have been the trial of the century.

It had it all - drama, romance, tragedy, loyalty, celebrity lawyers, a packed courthouse and daily media coverage.

Morrison's trial was one of Canada's biggest of the 19th-century - second only to Louis Riel's epic court case.

It received worldwide media coverage after the 'Megantic Outlaw' managed to elude a massive manhunt for months, but most Canadians are unfamiliar with the story that gripped so many Townshippers in 1889.

One version of Morrison's tale, *The Megantic Outlaw*, has recently been reissued in paperback by Montreal-based publishing house Price-Patterson Ltd. The 150-page pocket book, written by Henry G. Kidd, was originally privately published in 1948.

"I admired the story," publisher Michael Price said from his Montreal office. "Basically it's about a tight community that stands behind one of their own who thinks he's being screwed by the establishment."

"They all were poor, but they didn't break in front of a \$3000 reward, which in today's money is about \$250,000," he added. "There has to be some tremendous principle and loyalty packed into that community."

Morrison was wanted by authorities for allegedly terrorizing the French-Canadian family that bought his father's farm. But his story grew after he killed Lucian Warren, an American bootlegger-turned-constable in Megantic on June 22, 1888.

The authorities called Morrison a murderer, increased the reward and stepped up the manhunt. The Gaelic-speaking Scots of Megantic County harbored Morrison for months, causing endless embarrassment to the Quebec establishment.

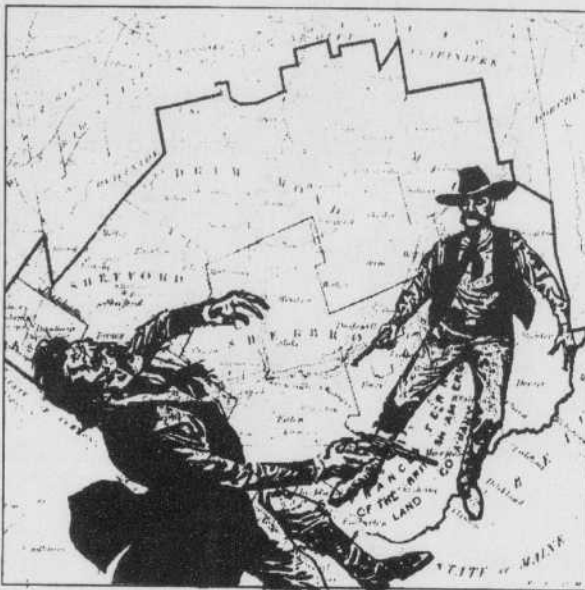
"There was in effect a rebellion in Megantic, because the people would not tell them where Morrison was and they actually taunted the authorities," Price said. "They hid him and actively covered up for him."

Morrison was finally captured and brought to trial with much fanfare. His friends raised money for his defence and hired some of the country's top lawyers. J.N. Greenshields of Winnipeg was Morrison's chief counsel for the defence. He was assisted by François Lemieux, a future chief justice of the Supreme Court of Quebec.

Charles Fitzpatrick, the deputy attorney

general of Quebec, led the prosecution team. Fitzpatrick would eventually become the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Canada.

Greenshields, Lemieux and Fitzpatrick had all been a part of the 'Dream Team' that had defended Louis Riel five years earlier.

"You had some celebrity lawyers which shows you how important the case was at the time," Price said.

More than a century later, Price felt it was a good time to bring the story back.

"I think it's important for the Townships to have something that's positive about the community," Price said. "And I think it's a great story about how they all hung together."

Price had hoped to publish a Morrison book last year in conjunction with the first production of the Megantic Outlaw musical at Theatre Lac Brome in Knowlton. He tried to buy the rights to *Wanted: Donald Morrison*, written by Clarke Wallace in 1977, but when that failed he went after the rights to Kidd's

book. The reissue has arrived in time for the current remount of the musical in Knowlton.

Kidd, who at one time had been a *Sherbrooke Daily Record* reporter, died in 1957. Price had to chase down Webb's grandson, David McKennitt, in Markham, Ont. to secure the publishing rights.

"I was happy to do it because it was by a Townships' guy, who I gather was quite a character himself," said Price.

Price is a bit of a character too. He spends his weekends in Knowlton and has taken an interest in publishing Townships-related books and other stories about English Quebec,

even though he said "the market stinks." Last year, Price published Phyllis Hamilton's *With Heart and Hands and Voices*, a 320-page history of Protestant churches in the Brome, Missisquoi and Shefford regions. He also published *Once A Lion*, a novel written by Townshippier Brian Robinson.

Price was so taken by Morrison's story that he decided to visit his grave in Guisla Cemetery on June 19, 1994 - 100 years to the day of Morrison's death at Montreal's Royal Victoria Hospital.

"I'll never forget it because at the point when I was planting the flowers in the earth I was digging away and my back gave out," he said. "I had to be carried to the car. It was like the outlaw was saying, 'Hey, enough is enough - go away'."

Thanks to the efforts of Price and Theatre Lac Brome artistic director Nicholas K. Pynes, the legend of the Megantic Outlaw won't fade away any time soon.

The Megantic Outlaw by Henry G. Kidd is available at places throughout the Townships, including at the Auberge Ayer's Cliff, Foster's chamber of commerce, the Brome County Historical Museum in Knowlton, the Knowlton Pub and the General Store in Frelighsburg. Theatre Lac Brome reworks Donald Morrison tale *Megantic Outlaw* musical returns to Knowlton

Donald Morrison became the stuff of legend when he shot Lucian (Jack) Warren on June 22, 1888, when the latter attempted to arrest him. Self-defence or simply murder? Morrison claimed the first, authorities believed the second and the hunt was on. Signs like these were everywhere - 'Wanted: Donald Morrison. \$3,000 Reward For His Capture'. In 1888, \$3,000 was not a paltry sum.

This tale does not come from Tombstone, but the Townships. Morrison was a Megantic boy from a Scottish family who had worked from Texas to Alberta before returning home just in time to see the family farm auctioned off to pay for debts. Morrison viewed the whole affair as unjust and the result of corruption, so he protested. When the new owners lost a barn in a suspicious fire and had a rifle shot fired into the house, Morrison was suspect No. 1. Although he maintained his innocence, an arrest warrant was made out for him. When Warren, an American bootlegger deputized specifically to arrest Morrison, met the outlaw on the streets of Megantic, Morrison killed him with one shot. Morrison's fate was sealed.

Director and co-writer Nicholas Pynes brings the tale of Donald Morrison back to Theatre Lac Brome this week after an immensely popular run at the end of last season. Last year's production was a rushed event, with the actors rehearsing for little more than a week, with rewrites going on daily. This year they've had more rehearsal time and writers Pynes and Edward S. Herkes

have reworked the show. Mrs. Morrison, the character played by Kathleen McAuliffe last year, has been eliminated.

The other actors are reprising their roles, including Al Goulem, who stars as Donald Morrison and plays the guitar in the American House Hotel Band.

He said the changes are real improvements to the play.

"It makes a world of difference. The character is easier to play and the changes in the music are good. The music is more difficult, but it's also

more suited to the play. Last year the song choices were rushed and more arbitrary," he said.

Pynes and Marc Desormeaux have chosen new songs for the musical - only one song remains the same.

Goulem, who also starred in *Gunmetal Blues* at the theatre last season, has a bit of an attachment to Morrison.

"I think he was railroaded. He was a victim of greed - people with money exerting all the power they can to keep it," he said. "It's not a naturalistic play though. We're presenting a folk tale, presenting a lot of aspects of the story, but not really giving a flesh and blood accounting. The play takes place over seven to 10 years. We can only include so many pieces of info."

Eric Goulem, Al's brother, co-stars as Murdo Beaton, Morrison's best friend. "I'm the fiddle player, and the comic character," said Eric, who is also pleased with the improvements to the play. "We've made big changes. The script is immensely changed."

"It was a good play before, but now it's been polished, edited and trimmed down. We had about nine days to rehearse last year. Now we've had three weeks, although we still keep cutting, adding, changing lines," he added. "The songs are more complex and we have two Gaelic songs now."

Musician and composer Marc Desormeaux plays the guitar, piano and trumpet, as well as a variety of characters, in the play. He said the new choices

of music suit the play better.

"We chose contemporary music as well as some traditional music or at least more recent adaptations of traditional songs," said Desormeaux, who recently had a musical produced at Ottawa's National Arts Centre.

He said he is impressed with the talent in *The Megantic Outlaw*.

"All of the actors play an instrument in the show. Everyone is really playing and acting. They are not just pretending to play," he said.

A native of Timmins, Ont., Desormeaux had not been familiar with

the Morrison tale. "I was enthralled with the script. And I am French, and the same traditions exist in French and Gaelic folk music."

Glenn Roy is a man of many costumes. He plays Donald's father, Jack Warren and a couple of other characters. His take on the Morrison tale is a little more cynical than Al Goulem's.

"I think we're painting Donald in a heroic light, but in reality he was probably more guilty than some like to admit. He probably did harass the farm residents," he said. "But I do think he was railroaded. I think shooting Warren was a case of self-defence. It is slightly difficult to believe that he could have been accused of so much and really been innocent. I think it's an exaggerated story, but it initiated in reality."

Roy points out the play is "dramatically correct rather than strictly historically correct."

"It's more interesting as a piece of theatre," he said. "Let's face it, history is often not dramatic or exciting. When the facts were not all that clear, we've opted for the more dramatic options."

Stained glass comes in all shapes, sizes

Page turns hobby into full-time profession

The largest work of stained glass Shelley-Lynn Page of West Bolton ever created was commissioned by God, through an intermediary.

"A woman called me and said she'd had a vision from God, and she wanted me to make it," Page says. "I was thinking 'Oh my God, will I be able to match this?'"

Based on a description of the vision, Page created a 15 by four and a half foot tableau depicting a valley with a mountain rising majestically in the middle and a river flowing from its base. Deer and antelope repose in the lush valley beneath a bright blue sky. When the sun shines through it, Page says, it glows.

The piece took six and a half months to build, working seven days a week, 10 hours a day. It has more than 4,000 pieces of colored glass.

Page's client said it matched her vision perfectly. The work now serves as a window of a solarium in a Vancouver care home for seniors.

Residents of the home used to shun the room because they feared its large glass windows. Since the stained glass window was installed, they've started to take tea there in the afternoons. Page says she still wants to cry when she re-

counts the story.

She may also be weeping because of the low price she charged. Thinking publicity from the work would bring in several orders, Page charged only \$8,000, working out to about \$1.75 an hour for her labor. But soon after the work was finished, Page moved from Vancouver with her husband, Wayne, to live on his parents' farm in West Bolton. The free publicity was for nought.

Fortunately, the move to the Eastern Townships three years ago has proved fruitful and profitable for the 38-year-old artist. Working out of a converted garage on the expansive Page family property, she is often hard-pressed to keep up with orders. Nearly 90 per cent of her work is done on commission, most of it through word of mouth.

The majority of her commissions are for windows and doors, for which she charges anywhere from \$200 and up. Prices are based on size, complexity and the price of glass used in the piece. Stained glass can run from \$4 a square foot to \$115 for antique, textured pieces. Windows can take anywhere from three days to six months to build. Page charges an average of around \$75 per square foot for windows and doors. Less than her contemporaries in big cities.

"People who come out to the country generally expect to get a good deal, or at least a better deal than they would in the city," she says. "And since I pay less rent than I would in the city, I can afford to charge less."

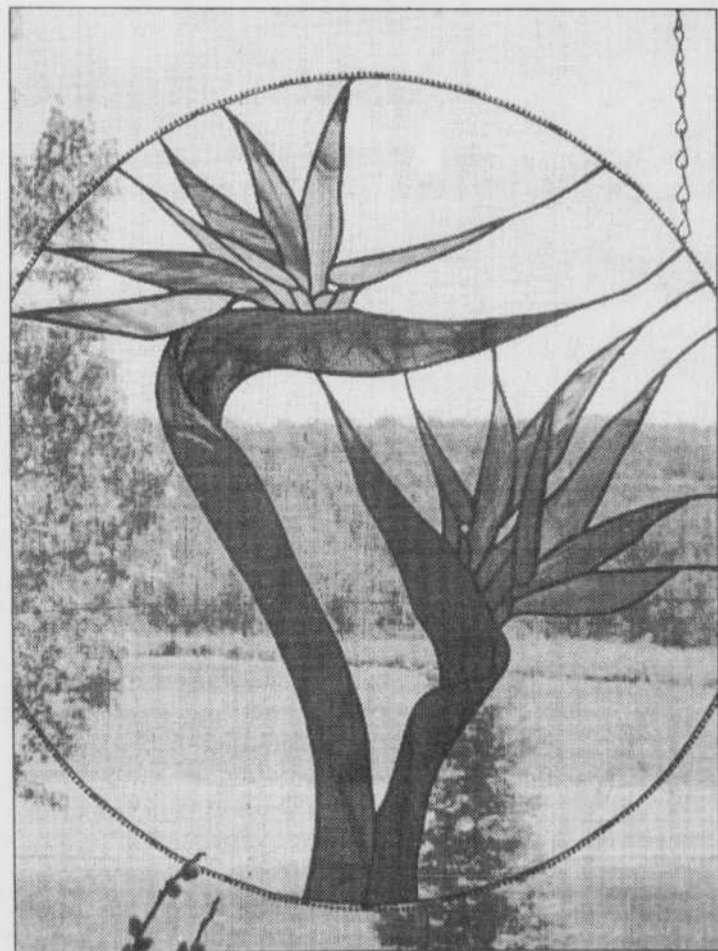
The Tour des Arts, an annual open-house for artists in the area, is another valuable source of revenue for Page. The tour is in its ninth year and 37 artists in the Bromé Lake-Sutton-Mansonville region have opened their workshops to customers and tourists the last two weeks. The Tour ends Sunday.

Last year, Page had over 700 visitors during the tour. The subsequent orders kept

her busy until the end of October. This year's tour has been equally busy.

For an artist's studio, Page's garage is a clean haven, especially considering the large assortment of pieces on display. She sells anything from \$6 dollar pendants to an \$1,800 courtesy screen. Butterflies, hummingbirds and dragonflies in a multitude of colors protrude from potted plants. Lighthouses, fruits, stars and wind chimes dangle from the ceiling. Finished pieces can take anywhere from two to three hours for a small lighthouse to two to three days for a larger animal.

She starts by drawing a pattern on a piece of paper. Different colored pieces of glass are traced from the pattern and cut out. The edges of the glass are smoothed to shape with a grinder, which is basically a high-speed rotating sander. The edges of each piece are wrapped in copper foil, to give the solder an adhesive surface - solder won't stick to glass. This is called the Tiffany style, which Page prefers over the less intricate lead came style of stain glass

work, more often seen in large church windows. Then the separate pieces are soldered together.

Anything possible that can be made from stained glass is on display, much of it functional as well as decorative. Card holders and vases, picture and mirror frames decorate shelves. Brooches, berets, pianos and pendants in reds, yellows and blues festoon the walls. Killer whales, horses, mountain goats and birds two feet across stand posed in frames on windows.

What started as a hobby 17 years ago became a full-time profession around 1991 when Page discovered it was too expensive to pursue as just a hobby. Page doesn't make it look like work, however.

"I love it," she says. "I love working with the materials, and creating the images. It doesn't feel like a job to me."

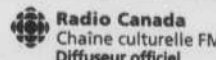
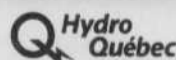

Festival is great theatre and good business

The Shakespeare industry at Stratford

STRATFORD, ONT.

Surely this is some kind of record in niche retailing: Poor Yorick, opened just a few weeks, specializes in videos of movies based on Shakespeare's plays.

There are funky CDs, too, but that's insurance.

"I use the CD store as an opportunity to do the Shakespeare, which is my own personal passion," said proprietrix (as she calls herself) Tanya Gough, 30.

She figures once people have seen the Stratford Festival play, they'll want to buy the movie. "I came here because the festival was here."

If Sudbury, Ont., has its nickel, and Hamilton its steel, Stratford has its

Shakespeare.

The ultimate dead white male has become an Ontario industry, the economic engine of a city of 29,000. The festival sustains one of the most vibrant downtowns in Canada, block after fashionable block of boutiques, galleries, clothing stores and so many restaurants they've opened a cooking school to help supply chefs.

Without the festival, "it would all wither up and die," said Charles Dingman, publisher and editor of the Stratford Beacon Herald. With it, Stratford is riding a wave.

Last year, 502,105 tickets were sold to plays at the Stratford Festival, 40,000 more than the year before. Revenues exceeded \$20 million for the first time.

The theatre, ranked by many critics

as the third finest in the English-speaking world (after England's Royal Shakespeare and National theatres) now relies on government subsidies for only six per cent of its \$27-million budget, and the figure is dropping.

"We're officially a not-for-profit organization," said Mary Hofstetter, the festival's general manager. "I prefer to call it not-for-loss." Stratford posted its third straight surplus last year.

Various governments did kick in just over half the cost of the \$13-million refurbishment of the festival theatre, which was officially unveiled at the end of June by Queen Elizabeth. The city of Stratford donated \$1 million.

The municipality was simply protecting an investment. City officials estimate the festival, the largest repertory company in North America, added \$97 million to the local economy last year, generated up to 4,000 local jobs (including the 600 at the theatre), and put 100,000 visitors in local hotel rooms.

They bought more than t-shirts. Stratford's patrons are Rockport-heeled, preferring to eat and shop well when not contemplating the eternal verities of the Bard. In turn, the up-market stores they support have become a regional draw, bringing in shoppers from Kitchener-Waterloo to London to Owen Sound who appear to prefer Stratford's chic boutiques to their own pock-marked main streets and bland suburban malls.

"People come to shop here because Stratford has a beautiful downtown," said Allan Watts, who co-owns a trendy gardening-supply store. And the downtown exists, he is convinced, because of the theatre.

This virtuous circle was the product of luck and astonishing hustle. Stratford was in deep trouble in the early 1950s. The railway machine shops that were its only industry were shutting down, thanks to the advent of diesel engines.

Tom Patterson, a young local dreamer, figured the town already had the right name and a river with swans. In 1962, in one of the great sales jobs of the

century, he telephoned the legendary director Tyrone Guthrie, showed up in the West End dressing rooms of actors Alec Guinness and Irene Worth, and convinced them all to come to the colonies and mount a season of Shakespeare in a Stratford tent. The rest is prosperity.

But there are always discontents. The city also has a solid manufacturing sector and the blue-collar locals sometimes chafe at the town's tony image.

"There are people here who've never set foot inside the festival," conceded tourism director Barbara Quarry. They are wont to complain, she acknowledged, of "visitors who signal left and turn right."

Merchants who want to have the downtown declared a heritage conservation district have clashed with property owners who, as Dingman puts it, "feel they're looking after the downtown very well, thank you."

Some theatre critics lament that the festival has abandoned its original mandate. Only three of 1997's 12 productions are of Shakespeare - the theatre increasingly relies on such upholstered musicals as this year's Camelot.

But Stratford is more than a theatre festival, Hofstetter rebutted: "It is also a business." And a growing one, she believes. In future years, Hofstetter hopes to see the festival develop a theatre apprenticeship program in co-operation with provincial schools and colleges.

And she's convinced Stratford is ready to sell its product overseas, especially in Asia. The festival might even participate in future Team Canada trade missions.

"I really do believe the possibilities are breathtaking," she said.

Gough, with her videos, doesn't know how far the Shakespeare industry can expand.

"It has to max out sooner or later," she pondered.

Her money's on later.

The good life, according to the way Detective Inspector Jack Frost lives it, is a well-balanced mix of good food, willing women and police work.

When a 10-year-old murder case appears to be connected to the current investigation, Frost is implicated in evidence tampering in the earlier case and suspended while the charges are looked into.

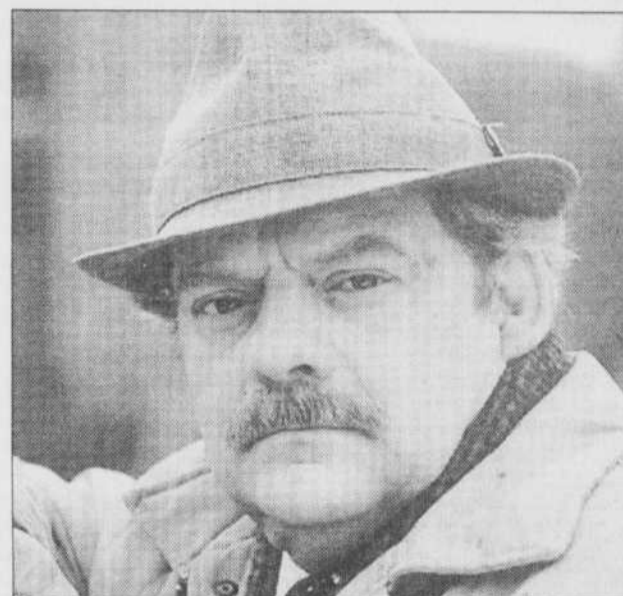
"He has nothing outside the police at all," writer Michael Russell said. "If you put him in a situation where he cannot work, you then realize just what it means to him."

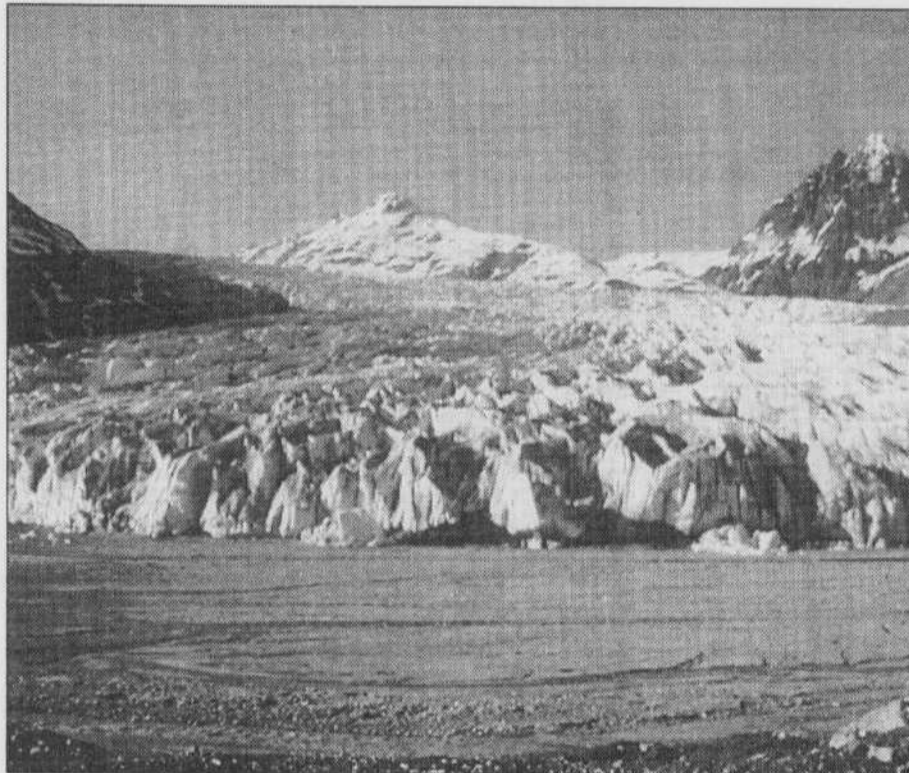

George Page's narration is thoughtful and informative, avoiding the gratuitous cuteness that accompanies many nature specials. If you can't be one of the 1.2 million tourists who visit Alaska this year, you can beat the heat of summer just watching and listening to the thundering ice and rushing waters in this special. — Roberta C.
