RICHMOND.

AN incorporated village and station of the Grand Trunk Railway, pleasantly situated on the St. Francis river, township of Cleveland, County of Richmond. The Montreal, Quebec, Portland and Western branches of the Grand Trunk Railway centre here, and an extension to the Maine Boundary is contemplated. The Missisquoi and Black Rivers Valley Railway, when completed, will also have a chief depot here, thus giving the village first-class advantages, and materially augmenting its general interests. The Grand Trunk has extensive works here, and, as the water privileges afforded by the river are numerous and excellent, there are good inducements for the establishment of all kinds of manufactures. Large deposits of copper and slate are found in the neighborhood. The St. Francis College, located here, has attained a high character among the educational institutions of the country. Richmond, as well as all other commercial and industrial centres, feels

the effect of the present depression of trade, but it is to be hoped that speedily matters will change, and that it will rise Phœnix-like from the vortex, and become again alive with the busy hives of industry, which it is so well calculated to maintain, and that all the facilities which it possesses may be fully utilized. It contains, besides the county buildings, a college, mechanics' institute, telegraph office, newspaper office, and several stores and hotels. Population 1,272. Assessed value \$387,000.
