On the 1st of July, 1841, the Company, at their General Meeting, declared an addition of one-half to the sums paid by the Stockholders, and appropriated to those holding Assurances at the participating rate of £2 per cent per annum, from the dates of their policies, so that the addition to a policy for £1000, in force for the previous 5 years, has been £100, making it in all £1,100. A
