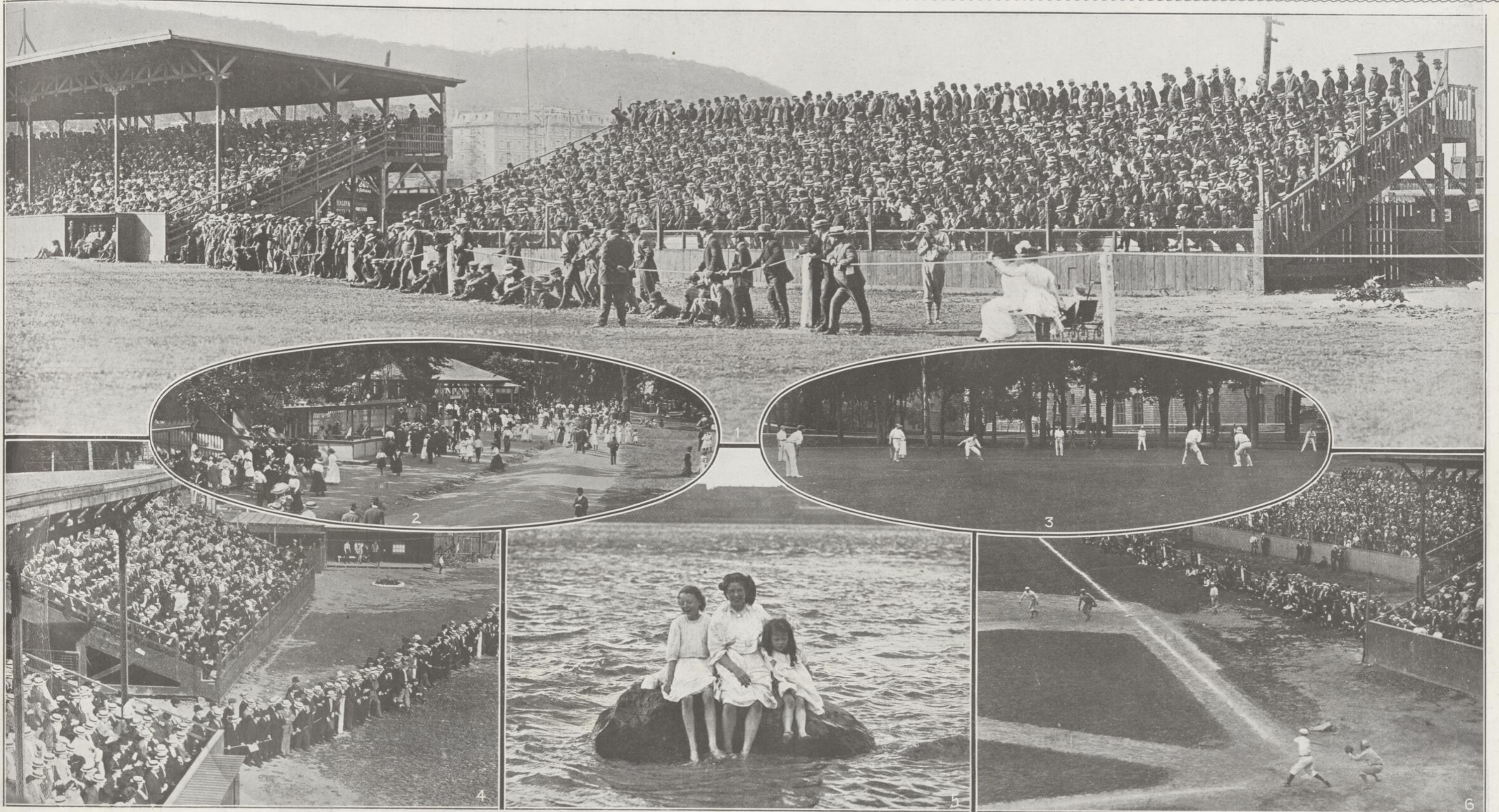

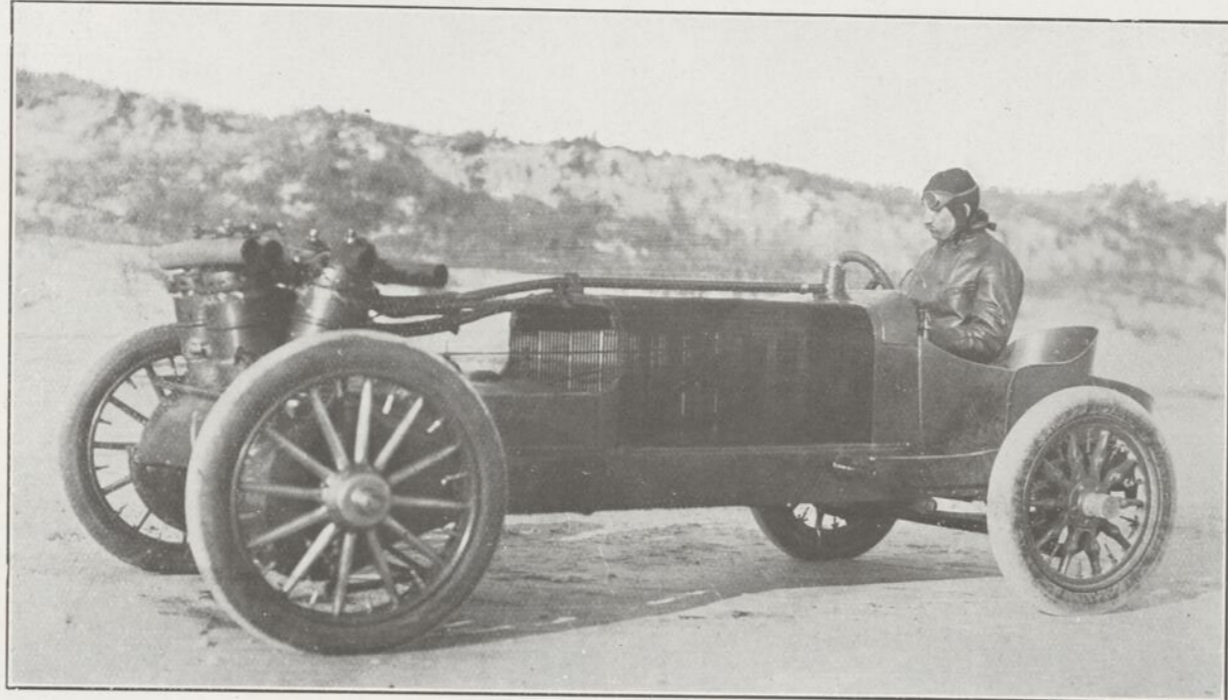

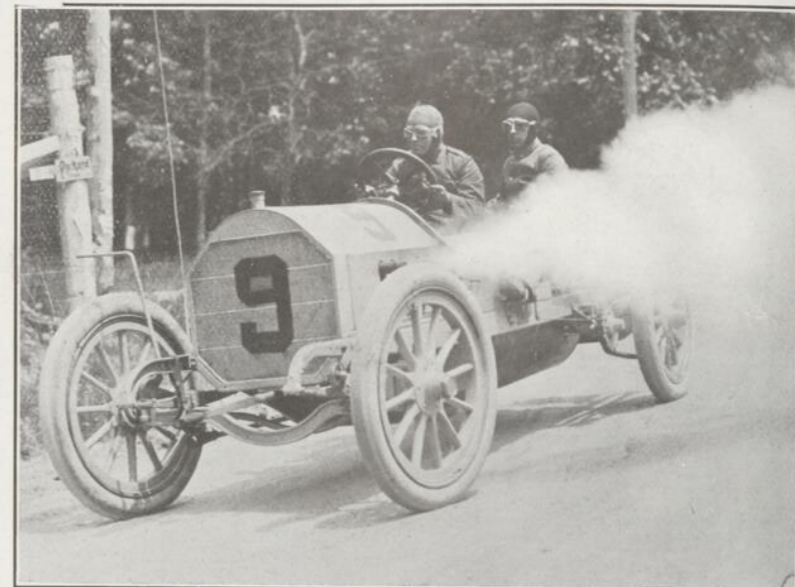

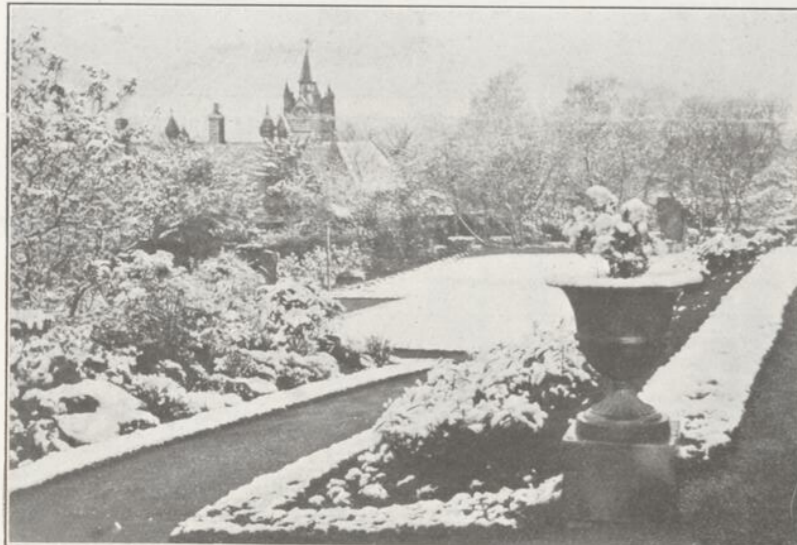

ST. JEAN BAPTISTE CELEBRATION

THE illustrations of St. Jean Baptiste Day Celebration published in last week's issue of The Standard attracted much attention. At no place was the celebration more hearty than at Coaticook, Que. The exercises of the final day of the St. Jean Baptiste Society celebration were carried out in fine weather. The influx of visitors was one of the largest ever known, coming from all parts of the Province of Quebec, as well as large numbers from the surrounding districts. The day's proceedings commenced with the Zouaves marching to meet the members of the St. Jean Baptiste Society at their hall, and forming a procession and marching to the church. The order of the procession was as follows: The battalion of Zouaves, Coaticook Band, members of the Alliance Nationale Society, Union St. Joseph, Catholic Order of Foresters, St. Jean Baptiste Society, Little St. Jean Baptiste guarded by the company of Junior Zouaves of Coaticook, firemen of Coaticook, Old Zouaves, Chevalier de St. Gregoire and other invited guests.

Bishop Roy, Coadjutor to the Archbishop of Quebec, one of Canada's greatest ecclesiastical orators, very eloquently addressed the congregation that had assembled at the Roman Catholic church, praising the initiative of the Coaticook community in the organization of so elaborate a feast to celebrate the Na-

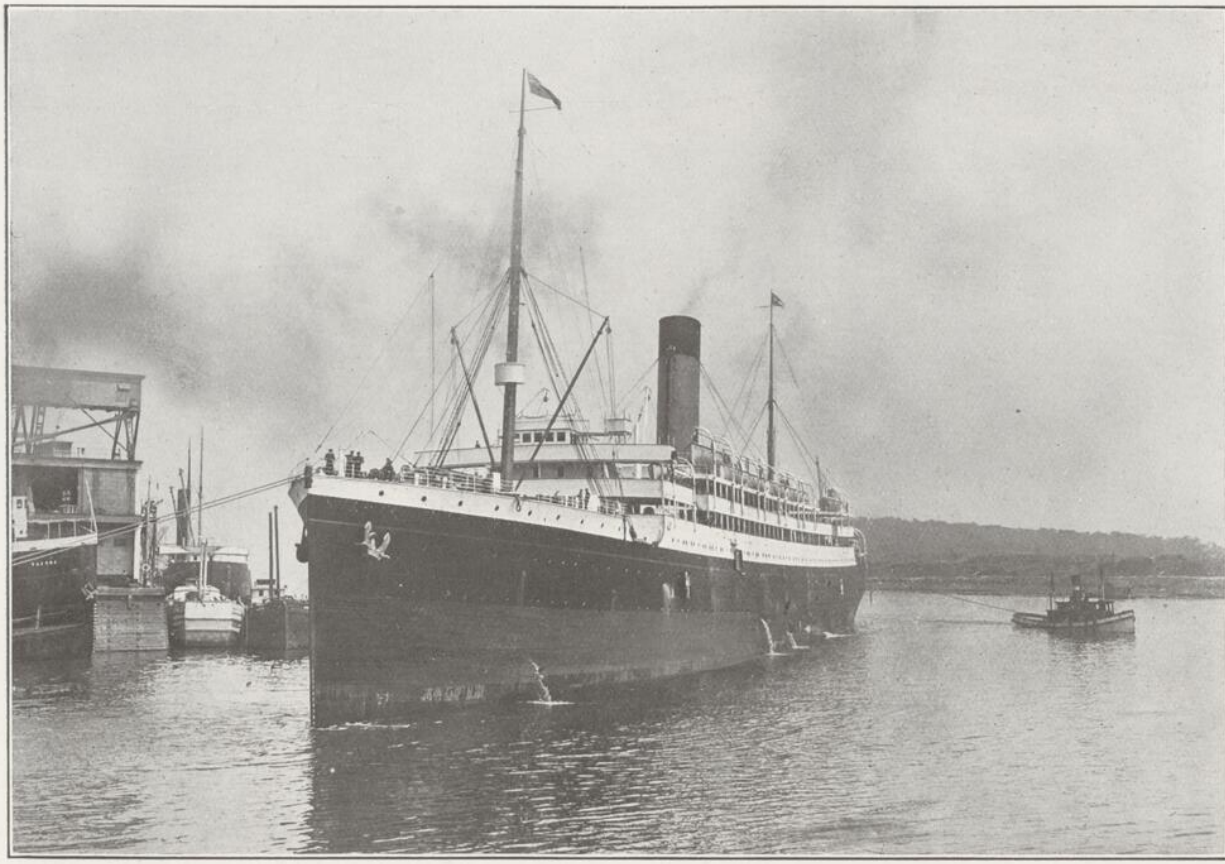

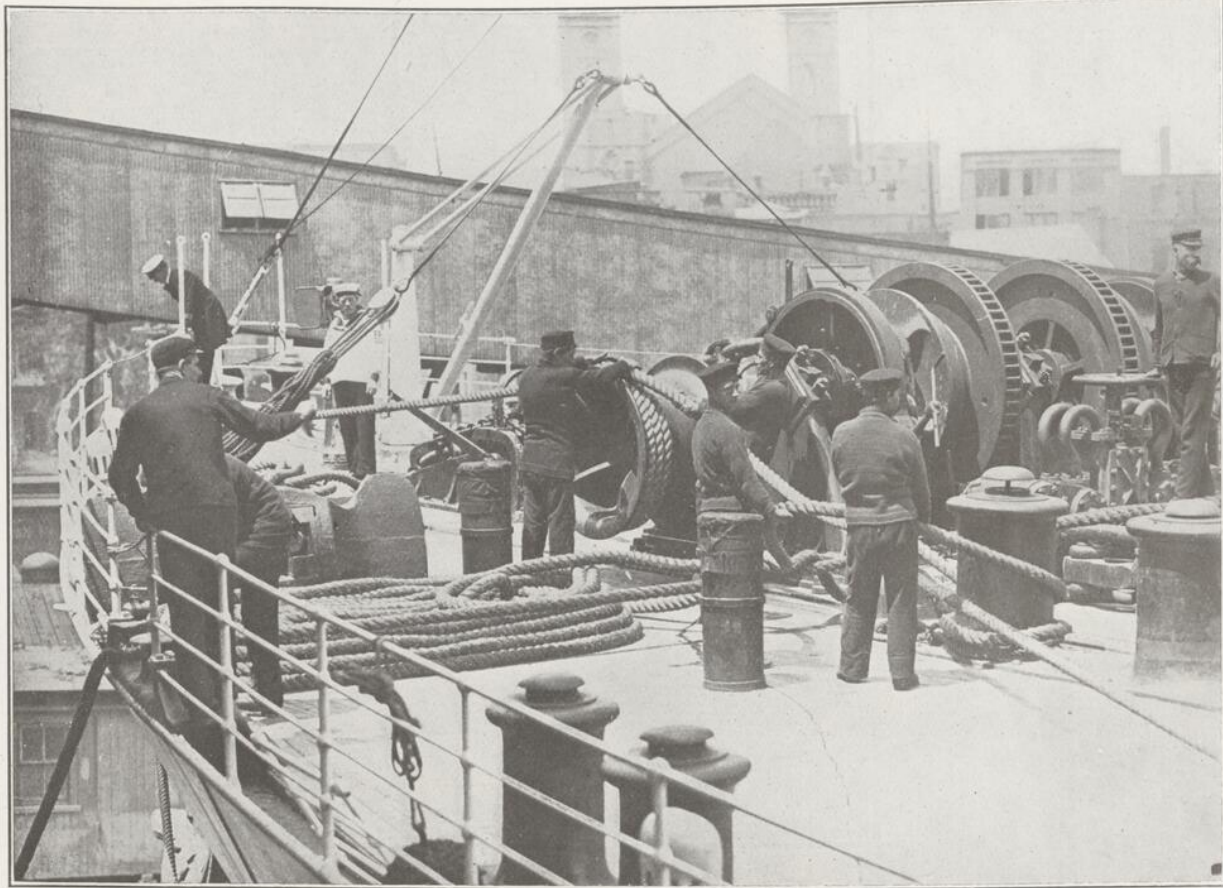

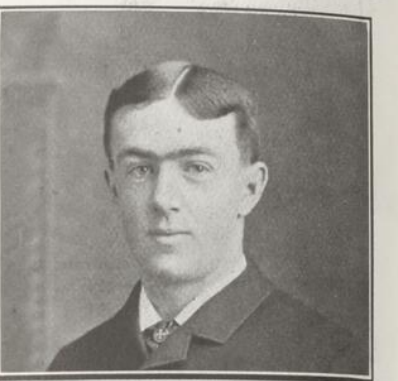

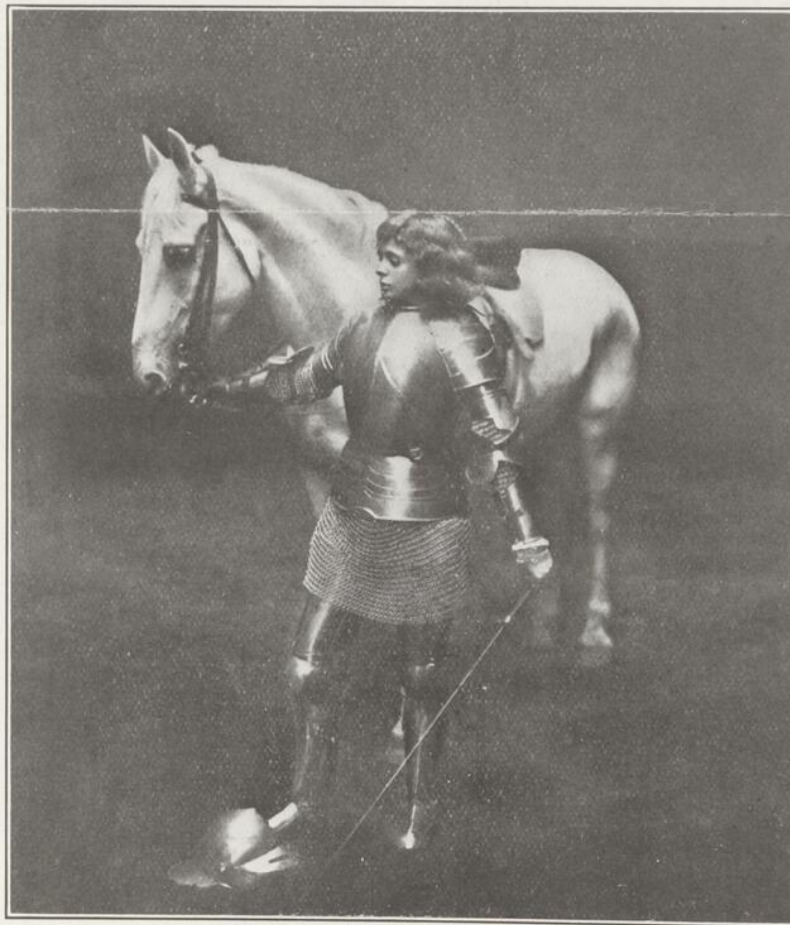

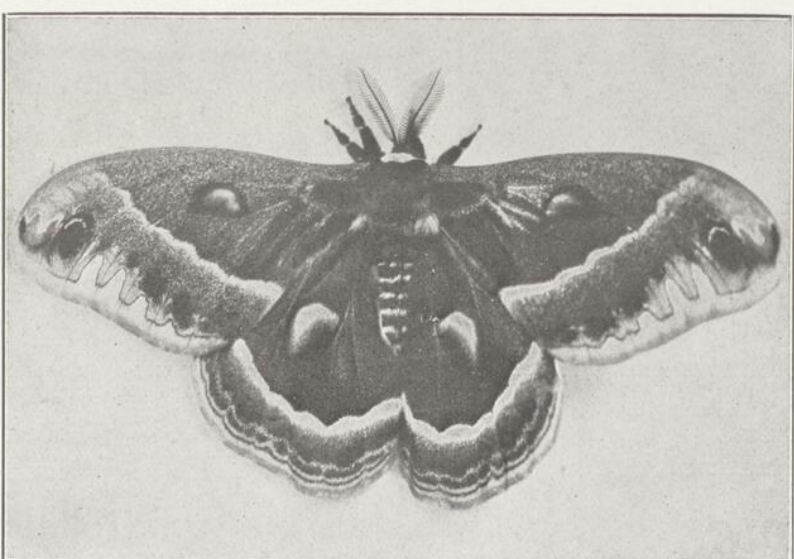
