### CHARGES FOR STORAGE IN THE CUSTOM HOUSE STORES, QUEBEC.

*Act 10 and 11 Victoria, Cap. 31.*

*Section 30.*—All charges incurred on goods for landing, cartage, storage, unpacking, repacking, weighing or gauging, paid, in order to carry this Act into effect, shall be at the expense of the Importer of such Goods.

One package at least in each Invoice to be opened, or more if necessary, and in case of suspicion of fraud the whole to be opened.

The dues according to the annexed Tariff, are to be charged and collected for goods, &c., stowed or taken into the Examination Warehouse at the Port of Quebec. All unclaimed goods are to be sent to the Examination Warehouse, and Goods will be received on storage from the parties who may wish it.

Parties can either insure their own Goods against loss by Fire, or can have the value of the same covered, by duly notifying the Officer of Customs of their wishes in that respect, and paying the cost thereof.

It will be seen that it is unnecessary to extend this table further, because any sum in dollars and cents may be multiplied or divided by 10, 100, 1000, &c., by merely shifting the places of the figures.

RULE.—*To convert Dollars at 5. 1d. into Dollars at 5s. :* Multiply by 61 and divide by 60;—*and to convert Dollars at 5s. into Dollars at 5s. 1d. :* Multiply by 60 and divide by 61.

\*When the figure cut off is five or more, it may be counted a cent and added to those taken in.

## VALUE OF COINS.

The values assigned to the several coins by the Currency Act are not arbitrary, but are proportioned, (except in the case of British silver) to the quantity of pure gold or silver in each. The £ currency was and is equal to 4 dollars of account; and a note for 100 dollars, either in Upper or Lower Canada, is now, as it has always been, payable by £25 currency, in any coins equivalent by law to that sum. By the Currency Act the Provincial dollar of account is made equal in value to that of the United States.

The coins current by the Act are:—

British gold coins at the rate of £1 4s. 4d. cy. to £1 sterling. American Eagles, coined before 1st July, 1834, at £2 13s. 4d cy.—Do. coined between 1st July, 1834, and 1st January, 1841, at £2 10s.—and at the same rates for Half Eagles, &c.

The above are a legal tender *by tale* if within 2 grains of full weight, deducting one half-penny currency for each half of a grain wanting.

British gold and American gold coined before 1834, at 94s. 10d. cy. per oz. Troy,—

American gold coined between 1834 and 1841 at 93s. cy. per oz. Troy,—

British silver coins, *while lawfully current in Great Britain*, pass for sums proportionate to their nominal value there, at the rate of £1 4s. 4d. cy. for £1 stg. in sums not exceeding £2 10s. cy. in any one payment.

The Dollars of Spain, United States, Peru, Chili, Central America, States of South America, and of Mexico, coined before 1841, 5s. 1d. cy., and half dollars at 2s. 6½d. cy.; Quarters at 1s. 0d.; Eighths at 6d. and Sixteenths at 3d. if legal weight,—the parts less than halves being a tender at the said rates *by tale* to the amount of £2 10s. in one payment, until they have lost one twenty-fifth of their weight, and not afterwards.

French 5 franc silver pieces, coined before 26th April, 1842, at 4s. 8d. each.

Copper Coins of the United Kingdom, (or any to be coined by Her Majesty, of not less than five sixths the weight of such coin) at their nominal rates.

The least legal weight of a sovereign is 5 dwts. 2½ grains—of an Eagle, coined before 1834, 11 dwts. 6 grains—after 1834, 10 dwts. 18 grains—of a Dollar, 17 dwts. 4 grains,—of a 5 franc piece, 16 dwts.

N. B.—The United States quarter dollars still pass by law for 1s. 3d. currency.
