Perce is supplied with water by means of an aqueduct. The far-famed Perce Rock with its abundance of sea-birds is situated in close proximity to the shore. The scenery from this portion of the coast is highly picturesque and romantic and hardly to be exceeded in grandeur. The largest cod fishing industry in Quebec is located here, and several important fishing establishments export to the West Indies, Brazil, the Mediterranean and other foreign ports. The best fishing grounds for salmon, trout, cod, mackerel and other salt and fresh water fish are in this portion of the Gaspé coast. Mount St. Ann, situated in rear of the village, is about 1,400 feet high, and, from its altitude, on a clear day, commands a view towards the Gulf of St. Lawrence of over 50 miles in circuit. On its summit is a shrine to St. Anne. A break-water has been constructed in the south cove of the village and is of great advantage to the fishermen. Bonaventure Island lies 3 miles southeast from the village. It is a port of entry and warehousing port. A fine wharf 700 feet long has been constructed in the north cove—an extension of 150 feet to said wharf has just been constructed. Perce is a calling place for several lines of steamers plying between Montreal and Maritime Province Ports, notably the Canada Steamships Lines and the Gaspé and Baie des Chaleurs Lines, Limited. It is also within six miles of Railway

and has excellent stage connection. Since last year two large and splendidly equipped hotels have been constructed and are largely patronized by tourists. Pop. 300.
