## THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty **ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Sri Sri Rini Victoria, Kaisar-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, who was born 26th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:—

**POLICE ALARM.**

Art. 1.—12 strokes repeated twice on the alarm gongs in each station, and on the alarm bells, will be the signal for all officers and sub-constables on duty in the stations to proceed at once to the central station.

Art. 2.—12 strokes repeated three times will be the signal for all officers and men at stations, and on bells to proceed at once to the central station.

The licenses for carts, trucks, and other vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, &c., shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

The first class shall include all carts, trucks, waggons, and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward, not otherwise expressly provided for, and shall pay:—

For every cart, truck, or other two-wheeled vehicle— <i>Two Dollars</i> .....	\$2.00
For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse— <i>Six Dollars</i> .....	6.00
For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses, and made to carry a load under 4,000 lbs. weight— <i>Seven Dollars</i> .....	7.00
For every heavy waggon, float or other four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, and made to carry heavy articles or materials weighing 4,000 lbs., or upwards— <i>Nine Dollars</i> .....	9.00
For every diable— <i>Four Dollars</i> .....	4.00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Two Dollars and fifty cents*..... 2.50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Five Dollars*..... 5.00

Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses, employed in drawing the above-mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

**TARIFF OF CARTAGE.**

From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile.

Firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts. Furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts. Lumber, green or hard from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts. Molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hogshead or load, 20 cts. Pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts. Bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. Forevery additional half mile, for all above description of goods, 19 cts. And from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cts.

From any place in the Western section of the first Division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine Canal, 20 cts. The stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cts. For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

**CHIMNEY SWEEPING.**

*Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates of sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, &c.*

Sec. 93.—Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, namely:—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

Sec. 94.—The said inspector may grant licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whenever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

Sec. 95.—The inspector may for the purposes aforesaid divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Sec. 96.—Such sweepers will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

Sec. 97.—The following shall be the fees to be demanded and received by each licensed sweep for cleansing and sweeping chimneys:

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a two story house, ten cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents.

When any sweeper is specially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

Sec. 98.—Such fees shall be payable by the occupant of the house or building wherein such chimneys have been swept, so soon after, and as often as such chimneys are swept; and any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay such fees, or shall prevent any such sweeper from entering into any house or building, or shall in any way obstruct or molest him in the execution of his duties, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 99.—Whenever any chimney shall take fire, and it shall appear that the occupant of

the house or building where such chimney may be had refused or neglected to have the same swept at any of the periods hereinafter specified, every such occupant shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 100.—The word "Chimney" as applied to the next preceding sections shall mean the interior or flue of such chimney.

**TARIFF OF PILOTAGE.**

Approved of by the Governor General in Council, 5th March, 1877.

From the Harbor of Quebec to Portneuf and the opposite side of the River St. Lawrence, or below Portneuf and above the Harbor of Quebec:

For the Pilotage of any Vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water upwards, 50c; downwards, 50c.

For the Pilotage of any Seagoing Vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, 62½c.; downwards, 62½c.

For the Pilotage of any Vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.35; downwards, 70c.

From the Harbor of Quebec to Three Rivers and the opposite side of the River St. Lawrence, or any place above Portneuf and below Three Rivers:

For the Pilotage of any Vessel in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water upwards, \$1.50; downwards, \$1.50.

For the Pilotage of any Seagoing Vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.75; downwards, \$ 75.

The classical course, principally taught in French, is designed to impart a thorough knowledge of the Greek, Latin, French and English languages and literature, pure and mixed mathematics, history and geography, philosophy and natural sciences, and whatever is necessary as a preparation for a professional career.

It comprises eight classes—Latin Elements, Syntax, Method, Versification, Belles-lettres, Rhetoric, 1st and 2nd year of Philosophy.

The commercial course, principally taught in English, embraces the English and French languages and literature, mathematics and the other branches named above, moreover book-keeping, and whatever else may fit a young man for commercial and industrial pursuits.

There are, moreover, elementary and preparatory classes for younger students.

The system of education is paternal. The teachers endeavor to unite kindness with firmness, and make use of the means of persuasion in preference to those of severity.

To be admitted into the college, applicants must present a certificate of good character.

Monthly reports of behavior, application and progress are sent to parents or guardians.

None but relatives, or those who represent them, are allowed to visit the boards.

Half-boarders and day scholars must not

absent themselves without previous leave from the College authorities.

The collegiate year is of ten months, beginning in the first week of September, and ending in the first week of July.

*Terms per year.*—Board and tuition, \$150.00; washing, \$20.00; bed and bedding, \$10.00; music lessons, \$25.00; use of the piano, \$5.00; drawing lesson \$20.00. Half boarders, \$80; day scholars, \$30.00.

Payments, which are required in gold or its equivalent, and strictly in advance, are made in two instalments, 1st in the beginning of September, 2nd on the 1st of February.

The college will not take charge of providing a student with clothing or other necessaries unless a sufficient sum be deposited in the hands of the treasurer.

No reduction in the above-mentioned terms will be granted for absence of less than one month.
