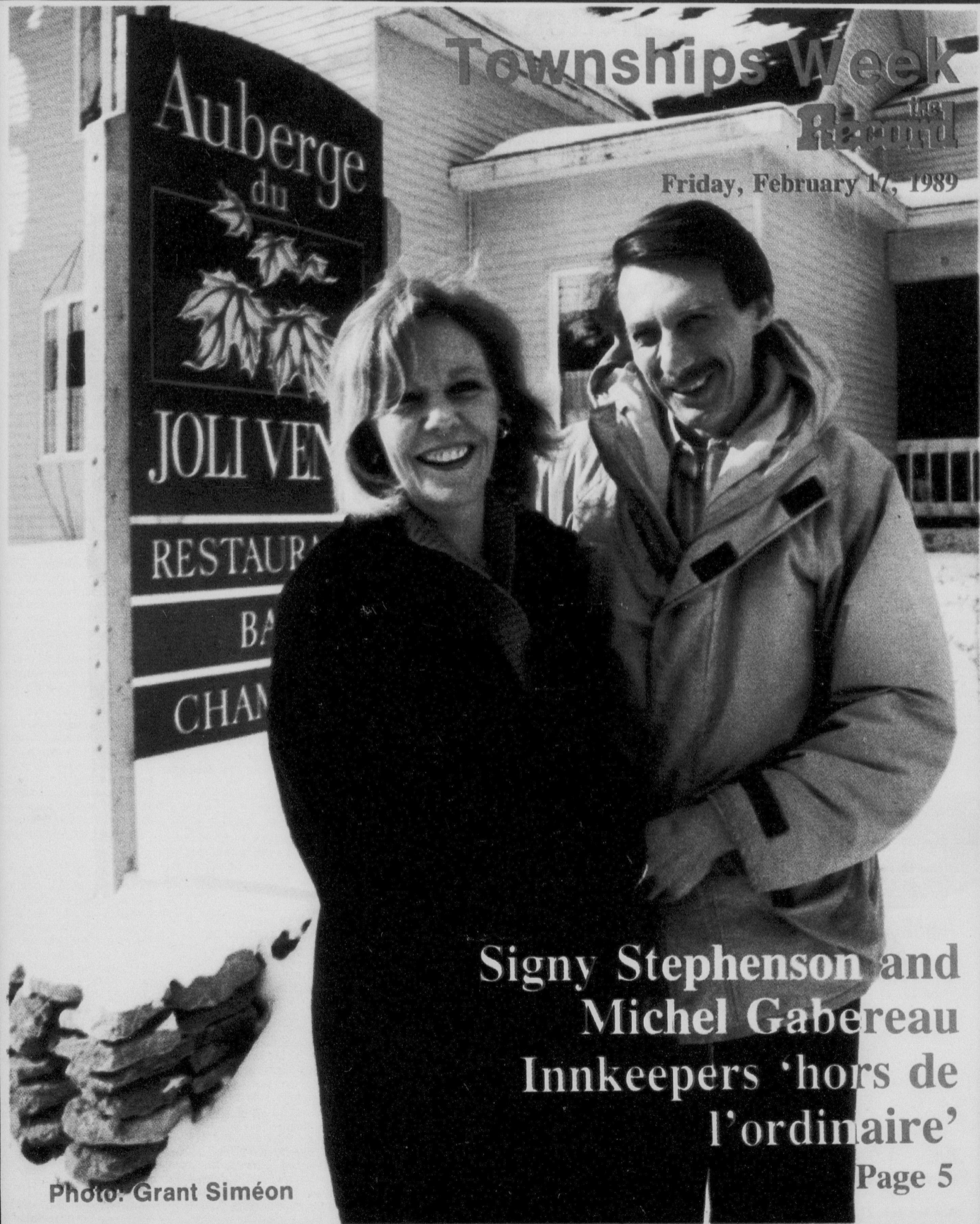

Canada's first addiction treatment centre for teens

YORKTON, Sask. (CP) — A decade of boozing, dropping acid and smoking dope has left Ken with pale skin and a kidney that regularly bleeds inside him.

The longtime addict is in his third treatment centre.

Ken is 18.

Only a hint of an adolescent moustache dusts his upper lip. His brown eyes stare at the table in front of him. His long, straight hair falls forward off his shoulders.

"When I was eight years old I could see drugs around," he says quietly.

"I got drunk with my sister. I did drugs with some of her friends.... They gave me drugs because they wanted to see a little kid high, I guess."

By high school, Ken was borrowing money wherever he could and committing break-ins to support a taste for LSD, marijuana, hashish and other drugs.

He says his last chance may be the barren former military base in Yorkton that houses the first addiction treatment centre in Canada specifically geared to teenagers.

OPEN A YEAR

The Whitespruce Youth Treatment Centre, about 180 kilometres northeast of Regina, opened its doors a year ago to addicted youths who previously had to go to expensive U.S. clinics or Canadian centres designed for adults.

At an adult centre, a teenage girl worried about school, struggling with her sexuality and contemplating suicide might end up beside a middle-aged man worried about losing his job and rebuilding a crumbling marriage.

"Our youngest kid here has been 11," says Marilyn Legebokoff, coordinator of treatment services at Whitespruce.

"You put that person with a 35-year-old and their issues are totally different. An 11-year-old and a 35-year-old cannot go to group therapy together and relate to each other."

"I came through adult centres two times before here and I felt

that I couldn't relate to them just because of the age difference," says Ken. Like other youths in this story, he asked that his last name not be used.

"I was 15 and I was in there with people who were 25, 30 years old. I didn't feel comfortable. I felt out of place...."

"Here we're all in the same boat. We all have the same problems that we can help each other get out of because we know exactly what each other is going through."

EXPANSION PLAN

The \$7.5-million centre, built by the Saskatchewan government, handles 20 teenagers at a time but plans call for a slow expansion to 60 beds. It has had patients from Calgary, Winnipeg and the Northwest Territories as well as Saskatchewan.

Most are from broken homes. Eugene, a 16-year-old native who was adopted and spent time in foster homes, started drinking at age 13 and eventually became a violent alcoholic, sometimes slashing his arms with a knife while drunk.

"My life was just getting right to the point where I wanted to die," says Eugene, who gave up life on Regina streets late last year for the stark surroundings of Whitespruce.

The military's abandoned fences, concrete radar towers, long low barracks and even a guardhouse set the tone for the tough-minded treatment centre. "The day I came through the gate I thought I was going to a work camp or something," says Eugene.

Residents live by strict rules that forbid cigarettes and sexual contact. They give up their ripped jeans, wild ear-rings, acid rock music and even shirts with negative moral messages or slogans about drugs and alcohol.

"You couldn't wear your favorite Molson Canadian T-shirt," says John Scholten, the centre's executive director. "It reminds you of the lifestyle that you used to live and you come here to acquire a lifestyle that will support sobriety, not usage, so anything that relates

to your usage is discouraged in here."

BUSY PROGRAM

An initial assessment includes a look at what drugs and alcohol the youth has used.

"When I looked and I saw all the drugs I had done it really scared me because I thought, 'Holy, I should be dead,'" says Marilyn, a soft-spoken 18-year-old who used to sleep with men who would give her cocaine.

The teenager and an addiction counsellor work out a program of individual counselling, group therapy, school work and physical fitness that takes between two and three months to complete. Residents are busy from the 6:15 a.m. wakeup time to lights out at 10:15 each night.

Their mornings start with a jog to a gymnasium and weight-lifting room run by Rick Traualia, a former physical education instructor in the Canadian army.

"The whole thing is to get these kids to do things when they don't feel like it," says Traualia. "A lot of these kids have come from doing absolutely nothing."

EACH HAS ROLE

Nurses, residential counsellors and teachers play a major role in what Legebokoff calls the "holistic" treatment approach.

"I see us working surrounding kids who are in a little trouble in all areas of their lives, not just one. They have school problems, they have family problems, they have self-esteem problems, they have whatever."

Marilyn, for instance, suffered from the eating disorder bulimia, was "addicted" to men who sometimes physically abused her, had been pregnant twice and had left her Saskatoon family to go to Ontario.

"I had dug myself a little hole and I felt like I was watching the world," she says. "I didn't want to

be any part of it. I wanted to die.

"I hated myself. I hated everybody. I hated society. I didn't think I was going to be anybody."

MARBLE A SYMBOL

If residents complete treatment they "marble out" of Whitespruce, receiving a marble as a symbol of what they have regained since "losing their marbles" as an addict.

After leaving they follow specific plans — monitored by Whitespruce staff — to keep from falling back into drug or alcohol use as many addicts do. Legebokoff says it's too early to tell how successful Whitespruce will be, since the first graduates have been out only a few months.

Ken is going to a halfway house in Saskatoon.

"It's really hard, really emotional," he says. "But there's a big payoff being free from myself, not having to live in a world of depression, a world of suicide thoughts."

"I'm feeling happy and waking up and saying life isn't that bad."

Canada's National Film Board will receive Honorary Oscar

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — Canada's National Film Board has won an honorary Oscar, the motion-picture academy said Tuesday.

The NFB's Oscar, to be presented at the 61st annual Academy Awards show March 29, recognizes the board's 50th anniversary and cites a commitment to artistic, creative and technological excellence.

The board has been nominated for Oscars 52 times and won eight. Its first award was in 1941 for Churchill's Island.

The award was voted by the Board of Governors of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Science.

The awards show is to be broadcast by ABC from the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles.

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Box office revenues hit a record \$4.46 billion US last year although movie attendance in the United States dropped slightly, the president of the Motion Picture Association of America told theatre owners Tuesday.

"In spite of competition for the eye and ear of the American consumer, in spite of an avalanche of visual options, the movie theatre has not only refused to die, it has held firm," Jack Valenti told the opening session of SHOWEST.

Americans attended an average of 4.4 movies last year, compared to Canada with 2.8, France and West Germany 1.9, Italy 1.6 and Great Britain 1.4.

Theatre admissions totalled 1.085 billion in 1988, Valenti said, the 12th straight year attendance topped one billion. The attendance figure was down 0.03 per cent from 1987, Valenti said, while revenues rose five per cent.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Melanie Griffith, star of the movie Working Girl, and her fiance, Miami Vice television star Don Johnson are expecting a child later this year, Johnson's publicist said Tuesday.

"Last week, Don called me and told me he had some wonderful news and he told me Melanie was pregnant," publicist Elliott Mintz said from Miami, Fla. Mintz didn't know when the baby was due.

Johnson, 39, and Griffith, 31, who were married previously and divorced, announced Dec. 26 they planned to remarry. No date has been announced.

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (AP) — Singer-songwriter Smokey Robinson said he became addicted to cocaine after the 1985 break-up of his marriage and the death of his father, but is now drug-free and will release an autobiography and an album this year.

Smokey: Inside My Lif' is to be out March 1. In a recent interview with The Associated Press, the singer said he wanted to discuss his 16-month addiction.

"At the time I didn't know I was escaping the pain of leaving home after 27 years. I didn't know I was escaping the death of my dad ... But the Lord had me go through this to let young people know, and everybody know, what it could do to you and that there is a way out," said the singer, who is to appear at Bally's Grand Hotel and Casino this weekend.

Smokey Robinson and the Miracles' hits included Shop Around and Tears of a Clown. Robinson, who is also a vice-president of Motown, won a Grammy for Best RB Male Vocalist in 1987.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Angela Lansbury, who plays an author-

detective on Murder, She Wrote, says CBS president Laurence Tisch was instrumental in getting her to remain with the network.

She said Tisch visited her two weeks ago at her trailer on the set.

"He was so dear. He came in and ... said, 'We really want to work with you and your company, and we very much want you to stay with CBS.'"

An agreement announced Monday gives Lansbury's family-run production company commitments to produce both a comedy series starring the actress and two TV movr said she cannot be certain her series will be back for another season, but said she has agreed to come back for another year.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC-TV's Moonlighting, which has run into hard times, is going off the air temporarily and the hit comedy Roseanne is taking over half of its Tuesday night time slot at the end of the month, the network announced Tuesday.

Moonlighting, the tongue-in-cheek detective show starring Bruce Willis and Cybill Shepherd, will return in the spring with all new episodes, said Brandon Stoddard, president of ABC Entertainment.

The show is going off the air to make way for two new half-hour comedy series, Anything But Love, starring Jamie Lee Curtis and Richard Lewis, and Coach, starring Craig T. Nelson, Jerry Van Dyke and Shelley Fabares.

Anything But Love will premiere in its regular time slot at 9:30 p.m., Tuesday, March 7, in the second half hour of the Moonlighting spot.

Ophra Benazon works power with lines & angles

SHERBROOKE — Ophra Benazon has astounded her fans. This well-known Lennoxville artist has evolved from pure form to tangible, recognisable shapes in her work, adding a multitude of dimension to her former art.

For the month of February, Le Gallerie Horace is hosting an exhibition of Benazon's latest, a collection of silkscreen monoprints on plexiglass, featuring pastel backgrounds that, from a distance, give a pebbled effect to identifiable forms of electric power lines and hydro poles and towers.

The result is a series of box-frame works which seem to

contain sizzling motion, the angular drawings seeming to draw the eye of the observer forward while one's mind absorbs the power each piece represents. She is especially adept with color contrast and shading so that the shifting angles the viewers get as they pass by constantly change the aspect of the work.

But Benazon is no stranger to lines, angles and squares. A previous exhibition at Horace featured a series of 25 squares. At that time Benazon said there were no particular messages in her work but rather it was an exploration of shape, pattern and form. This time

she has gone many steps further in that expression.

This Israeli artist, born in Haifa, came to Canada in 1953. Her work has turned up in such places as CKOC Annual Hamilton Arts Exhibition, Royal Canadian Academy of Arts 90th Annual Exhibition, and the Society of Canadian Artists 4th Annual Exhibition where she won first prize, just to mention a few.

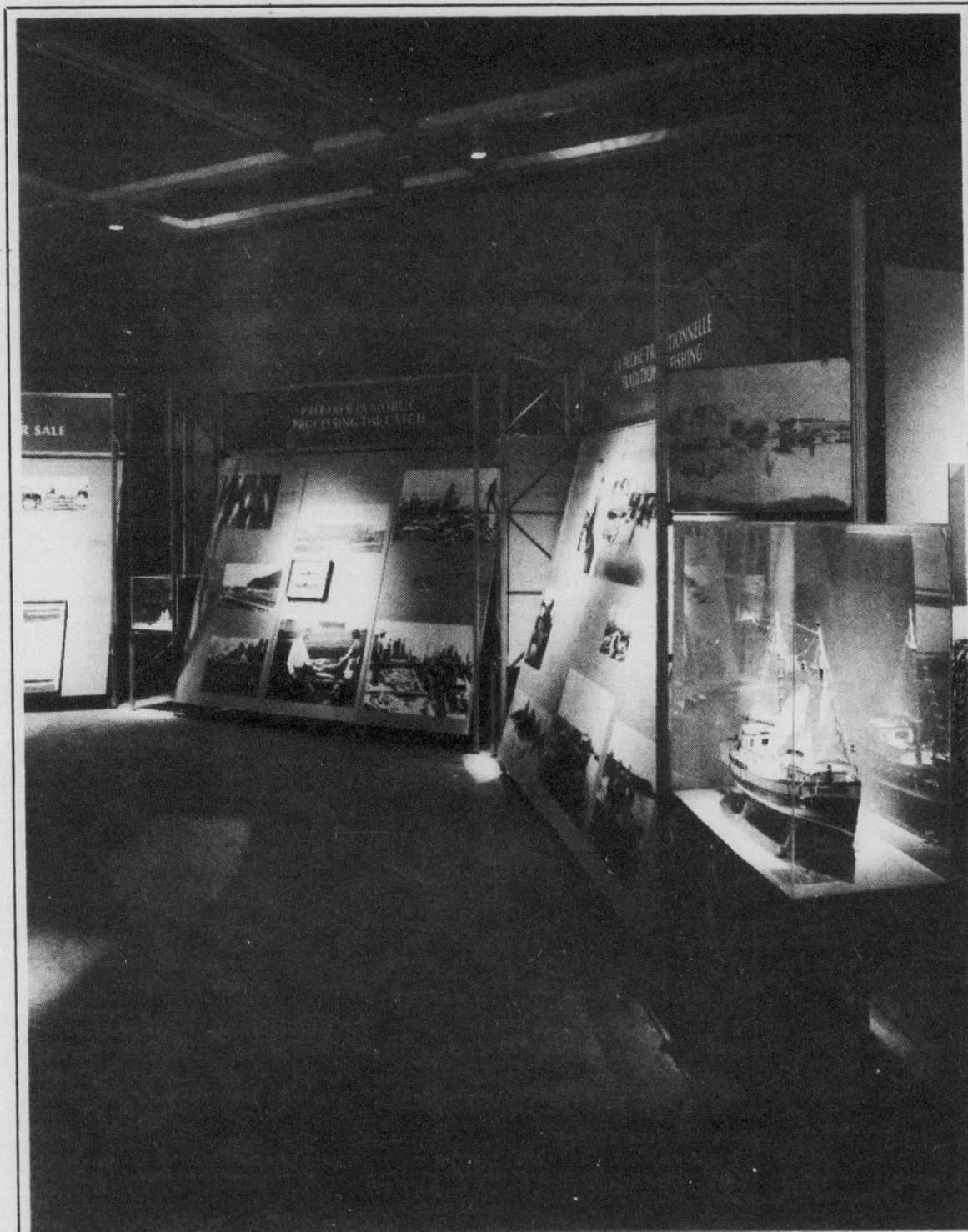
At present she lives in Lennoxville and teaches at Champlain Regional College; the Ateliers d'Animation Culturel, Université de Sherbrooke; Printmaking, Department of Fine Arts, Bishop's Uni-

versity. She is Co-ordinator of the Bishop's-Champlain Art Gallery and past president and treasurer of the Regroupement des Artistes des Cantons de l'Est.

The exhibition continues at the Horace, 106 King Street West, until February 26. Gallery hours 12 to 5 Tuesday to Friday, 1 to 5 on weekends.

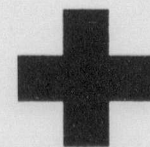

Who's who

"The brute!" WHAT'S HAPPENING TO EANUTS?

Now to graver and far more dreadful matters — the severe and unexplained deterioration of **Peanuts**.

The strip we have known and loved for more than thirty years still carries the signature of **Charles Schulz** but it is now painfully obvious that it is drawn by some indifferent hack — just like the **Disney** and **Bugs Bunny** strips.

That deterioration began as a nagging suspicion some months ago — something was ailing **Snoopy**. There was a subtle change in the drawings, a line less certain, a difference in the treatment of shadows — but the round-headed kid and all his friends were still there and everybody is entitled to an off day.

Then came a change in the humour, something not quite right but nothing you could really put your finger on. Now the difference in all the characters we have loved so long cannot be denied and instead of the daily warm smile or the sudden delight in recognizing some human foible, we are left disappointed, puzzled, empty.

THE BAG-DOG IS GONE

For heinous example — a recent sequence concerned an ugly dog contest and introduced us to **Snoopy's** brother, **Olaf**. When we first meet this unfortunate **Olaf** he is wearing a paper bag over his head exactly like that character in **Winthrop**. But then the bag is removed and we find a creature that is less ugly than he is fat and un-



happy. He wins the contest, is deprived of his trophy by **Lucy** and decides to hurt himself by diving off **Snoopy's** doghouse onto his head.

Had the old **Charles Schulz** handled that story, he might have left the paper bag in place and that championship ugliness up to our imagination — as with the fantastic ferocity of that unseen cat who sometimes slashes **Snoopy's** house. Had the old **Schulz** been in control, he would have celebrated human frailty but he would never have made fun of someone fat and ugly.

SO IS THE INSIGHT

Gone, now, are all those gentle insights into the human predicament that have decorated refrigerator doors and office bulletin boards all over the world. Instead we are left with cheap gags.

Snoopy is standing at the back door and **Charlie Brown** says; "No, I think you misunderstood. The invitation says 'Black Tie'."

As **Snoopy** walks away, he says to himself; "I thought it said 'Black Ears'."

That is not only witless (why would the round-headed kid be giving a black-tie affair?) but

completely out of character because if anybody wanted a black-tie-and-tails, **Snoopy** could be relied on to provide it from his bottomless doghouse.

(Before you know it, adults will be allowed into this pristine world.)
NO ONE CAN REPLACE HIM

Every good character writer knows that humor rises most naturally from character — and **Schulz** wasn't just a good writer, he was great. Somebody once defined genius as the ability to do with ease what others can only do (or fail to do) with utmost difficulty. **Schulz** managed to astonish us with his immortal characters day after day, week after week, year after year.

For more than thirty years, **Charles Schulz** has contributed to that 'kinder and gentler society' **George Whatsisname** only dreams about. Tens of thousands of small people all over the world now get to hang onto their security blankets because of the understanding **Linus** gave us. We've learned a fond tolerance of crabby fussbudgets from **Lucy** and an appreciation of **Sally's** unrequited crush on her 'Sweet Baboo'. **Peppermint Patti** might fall asleep in class and

consistently bring home D-minus but we know better than to call her stupid.

Comic strips belong right up there with **Abstract Expressionism** and **Jazz** as America's enduring contributions to the history of art and deserve respect. Instead, although ignorance and poverty isn't nearly as funny as we once thought, forty-year-old strips of **L'il Abner** are resurrected so new generations can learn to laugh at people dressed in rags and living in hovels. Anything for a buck.

When **Gary Trudeau** burned out on **Doonesbury**, he was allowed a sabbatical and came back stronger than ever. When **Walt Kelly** passed away, **Pogo** and **Albert**, **Churchy**, **Howland Owl**, **Porkypine** and all the creatures of the **Okefenokee Swamp** were allowed to pass on too as a tribute to his creative genius.

But **Snoopy**, it appears — the most famous and best loved dog in all the world — is to be battered beyond recognition until the last drop of profit is squeezed from his plump little body.

Then we'll go dogless all the rest of our days.

Exotic flower garden flourishes

Frank Schaefer has taken his gardening hobby one step further than most retirees.

He has cultivated a botanical show-piece around his home at **Port Dover**, on the north shore of **Lake Erie**.

Schaefer, 62, has spent the past eight years of retirement — and 20 years before that — tirelessly planting, transplanting and lovingly nurturing his garden.

What's so unusual about **Schaefer's** garden is that it contains more than 250 exotic trees and shrubs, which some skeptics would say couldn't possibly be grown in the harsh eastern Canadian climate.

"But it's 10 degrees milder (at **Port Dover**) because of the **Lake Erie** influence," **Schaefer** explained in an interview at his home. "This gives me a more moderate temperature than you'll find in other parts of southern Ontario."

The fact that the property is heavily hedged and wind-sheltered with a variety of evergreen trees hasn't hurt either, he added. But it's still a mystery how **Schaefer** can successfully cultivate less-

than-hardy shrubs and trees such as dogwood, holly, hibiscus, azaleas and rhododendrons.

After emigrating from England in 1957, **Schaefer** and his wife, **Sylvia**, built a modest summer cottage in 1961 on the property, a totally barren site about a fifth of a hectare (or one-half acre) in size.

"I bought one of those cottage kits for \$1,100 and then kept adding to the structure as we needed space," he said.

Meanwhile, **Schaefer** was also planting evergreen trees around the edge of the site, along with shrubs, bulbs and other perennials.

PLANTS IN TIERS

"In a restricted space like this I had to plant in tiers," he explained. "Most important was to group the trees, shrubs and ground cover at intervals."

So dense is the growth of the miniature arboretum, the cottage is barely visible from the street outside.

At the front, **Schaefer** has planted **Manitoba maple**, **Himalayan pines**, weeping willows, **Japanese umbrella trees** — even a monkey tree, which he is patiently and gradually exposing to the cold cli-

mate.

Schaefer became so engrossed in his garden that he, his wife and two children moved to the cottage permanently in 1969. He retired in 1981 from a **Hamilton dairy** where he was delivering milk.

Schaefer scours nurseries in Canada and the United States looking for unusual species of trees, shrubs and plants.

He's particularly fond of trees and often trains low-growing shrubs to climb along steel pipes to conserve space. One corner of the property has a collection of tulip trees, a **Kentucky coffee tree** and several varieties of **magnolia**.

Perennial flowers such as tulips, daffodils, hyacinth and iris grow in abundance in the beds beneath the trees and shrubs.

He's even cultivated tropical and exotic foliage such as lizard trees, sweet gum trees, a hardy banana tree and a handkerchief tree from **Holland**.

Scattered between the lush greenery are garden ornaments, little benches and feeders for the hundreds of birds that congregate in the oasis.

"Frank has built or made almost everything on the property," **Sylvia** said with pride.

The hostess of Lac Brome's newly renovated *Auberge du Joli Vent* offered a warm handshake and a welcoming smile.

Dressed in blue jeans, a plaid shirt and loafers, with a small child cuddled up on her shoulder, one could be forgiven for not recognizing Signy Stephenson, one of the leading names in the Canadian fashion industry.

Stephenson is the former editor of *Style* magazine, and until recently, owner of a successful public relations firm in Toronto.

She is married to Michel Gabereau, a Parisian who worked for the Minister of Education in France setting up language labs before coming to Toronto in 1964. He spent much of his time between 1970 and 1980 at the forefront of world events, often dodging bullets around the world as the sound track man for the popular TV News program, W5. Until recently, he owned a thriving computer software company in Toronto.

OLD COUNTRY INN

Last June, friends told the Toronto couple about an 80 year old country inn for sale in the Eastern Townships, close to the community where Stephenson grew up.

"Two weeks later we bought it," Stephenson said.

"It was a spur of the moment thing," adds husband Michel. "We were working so hard in Toronto that we never had time to spend with the kids. The couple has two children Georges 7, and Aileen, 2.

"It was beginning to be a question of whether it's all worth it," Gabereau said. "I spent 200 days a year for the last ten years in a hotel room. It was time for a change."

The Gabereau's are not the only benefactors of their energy transfer. Guests at the *Auberge du Joli Vent* are already marvelling at the newly renovated country retreat.

In the space of a few months, ceilings were raised, "miles and miles" of wide baseboard were laid, passages were opened, and a special room for children was added.

YUPPIES LIKE US

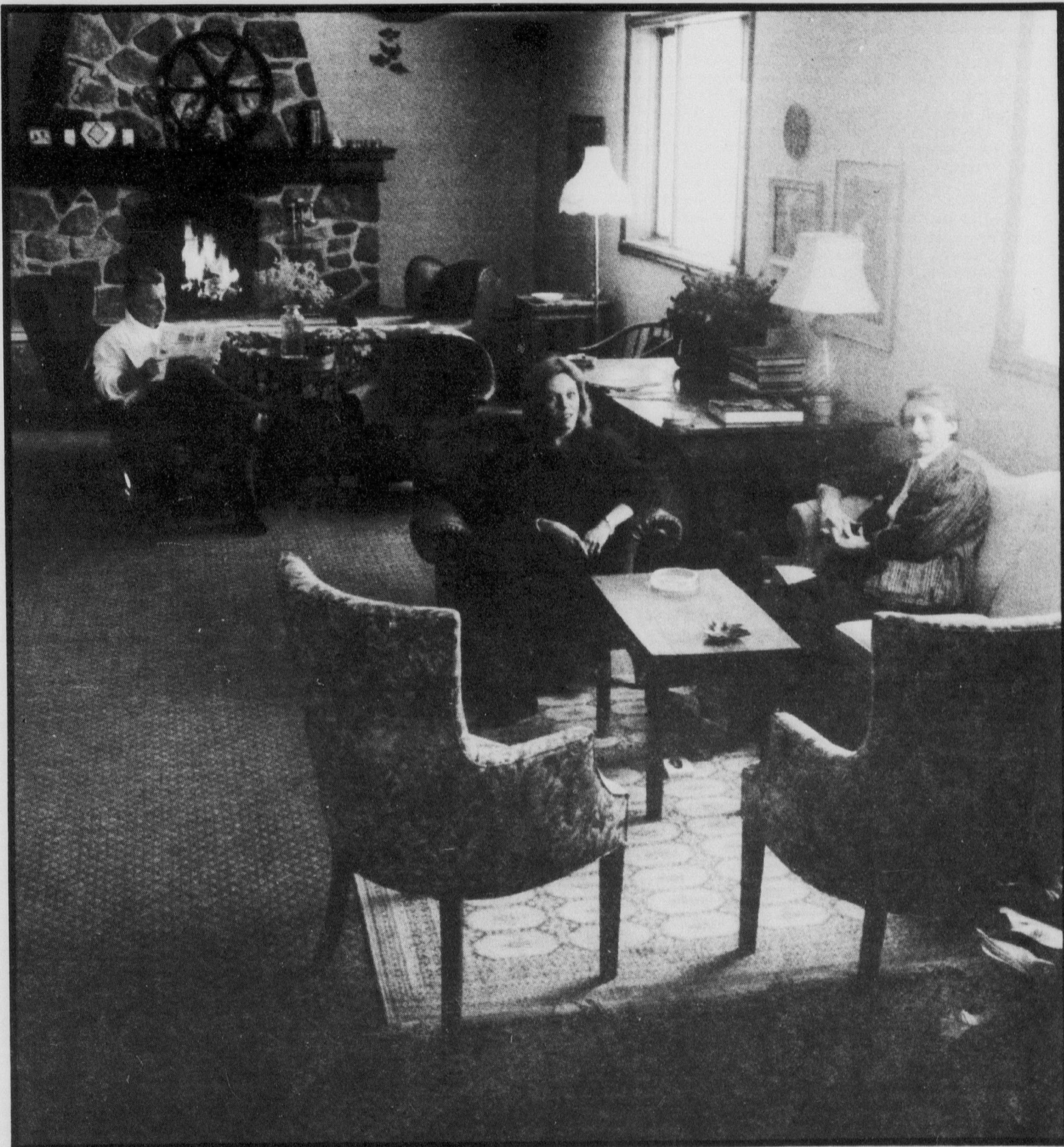
"We wanted to have a room just for children," explains Signy, "for yuppies like us who like to travel with the kids."

The room, off the main living room, is filled with wall to wall books, a T.V. and VCR, games, puzzles, and cozy furniture. French doors of bevelled glass can be closed to contain sounds while still affording parents an occasional glance.

Signy and Michel have brought to the turn of the century farmhouse a flair and panache which translates into quiet elegance.

The brightly covered chintz sofa and high back chairs in front of the fire give a distinct European flavor to the room, while the potpourri of "objets d'art" bear testimony to the couple's globetrotting.

Two weeks ago, Signy and Michel welcomed their new neighbours, friends, and family to the *Joli Vent*, to celebrate their new venture.

The original 65-70 cast is back in Get Smart Again!

LOS ANGELES (AP) — After nine years of white socks and a charming bunkside manner as the cruise ship doctor on *The Love Boat*, Bernie Kopell is up to no good in the ABC movie *Get Smart, Again!*

Kopell is back as Conrad Siegfried, still with KAOS, still plugging evil and terror, still trying to take over the world, still being thwarted by Agent 86 from CONTROL.

Agent 86 was better known as Maxwell Smart, Siegfried's American nemesis. The truth is they were both a couple of dim bulbs, but Smart, aided by his brainy and beautiful colleague, Agent 99, always managed to muddle through.

Nearly the entire original cast from the *Get Smart* series, which ran from 1965 to 1970, first on NBC and then on CBS, is back for the two-hour movie on Sunday — Don Adams as Maxwell Smart, Barbara Feldon as Agent 99, Dick Gautier as Hymie, Dave Ketchum as Agent 13, Robert Karvelas as Larabee, and King Moody as Shtarker. Kenneth Mars takes over as chief of CONTROL in place of Edward Platt, who died in 1974.

In *Get Smart, Again!* — also on CTV — KAOS kidnaps a scientist to obtain his secret formula for creating a weather machine. Siegfried and his henchman Shtarker demand a ransom of \$250 billion.

NO ACRONYM

Neither KAOS nor CONTROL stood for anything, the way

U.N.C.L.E., for instance, stood for United Network Command for Law and Enforcement on *The Man From U.N.C.L.E.*

KAOS ought to stand for Kopell's Acts of (Comic) Subversion.

"Siegfried is more fun than anything I've done in my life," said Kopell. "I could let loose. Is there a comedy of anger? Siegfried always appears to be angry.

"In the movie, KAOS has been taken over by a corporate raider, which only adds to Siegfried's anger and frustration."

Get Smart was a spoof of James Bond and it gave no quarter as it milked its laughs from sendups of secret agents, disguises, codes, technological gadgets and monolithic intelligence organizations. The series was created by Mel Brooks and Buck Henry.

"It was biting, incisive and stepped on a few toes," said Kopell. "We got a couple of good shots at the government."

Kopell has been a regular or a recurring character on eight series. At the same time he was on *Get Smart*, he was on *That Girl*, starring Marlo Thomas.

"I never had a contract for either show," he said. "I got to know the assistant directors over at *That Girl*, and I'd call over and say, 'Look, I'm not working Tuesday and Wednesday.' And they'd set up all my scenes for those days."

He was also on *The Steve Allen Show*, *The Danny Kaye Show*, *The Doris Day Show*, *Bewitched*, *The Love Boat* and *When Things Were Rotten*. The latter, in which he played Alan-a-Dale in a Robin Hood spoof, was also created by Mel Brooks. Things were really rotten because it lasted only a few weeks.

Kopell also supplied some of the voices for the Saturday morning series *Lancelot Link, Secret Chimp*, a cartoon spoof of James Bond. The good chimps belonged to

A.P.E. and the bad chimps, led by the Baron (Kopell), belonged to C.H.U.M.P.

JUST A KID

His longest-running series was *The Love Boat*, and it was the only time he was ever cast in a romantic role. He played the ship's doctor, Adam Bricker.

"I was always a character actor," he said. "I couldn't believe it when I got the role. I was cast when Dick Van Patten pulled out after doing the pilots to do *Eight Is Enough*."

Kopell credits producer Leonard Stern with casting him as Siegfried in *Get Smart*.

"There was no reason why a 33-year-old kid would get the part," he said. "Makeup made me look very old."

"They put a fencing scar on my left cheek. I was a baby-faced kid. I remember being unhappy when the makeup came off. I was me again."

Rain Man hits the top with eight nominations

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP-CP) — *Rain Man*, the Dustin Hoffman-Tom Cruise drama of a self-absorbed car dealer learning to love his autistic brother, won eight Oscar nominations Wednesday, including best picture.

Canada's animation expertise in *The Cat Came Back* and *Who Framed Roger Rabbit* reaped two Oscar nominations.

In collecting the most nominations for the 61st Academy Awards, *Rain Man* also garnered a best-actor nomination for Hoffman and a directing honor for Barry Levinson.

"I'm happy for Barry Levinson, the film and everybody connected with it," said Hoffman, whose depiction of an autistic savant brought the actor his sixth Oscar nomination. He won best actor in 1979 for *Kramer vs. Kramer*.

Earning seven nominations each were *Dangerous Liaisons*, a drama set in the bedrooms of the elite in pre-revolutionary France, and *Mississippi Burning*, a controversial exploration of the FBI's handling of the 1964 murder of three civil-rights activists.

Both were nominated for best picture, as were *The Accidental Tourist*, an adaptation of Anne Tyler's novel about the heartbreaks and romances of a travel writer, and *Working Girl*, a corporate Cinderella story about a secretary on Wall Street.

Sigourney Weaver claimed a rare double nomination for best actress for *Gorillas in the Mist: The Adventure of Dian Fossey* and best supporting actress as a shrewish executive in *Working Girl*.

The Cat Came Back, a seven-minute film by Cordell Barker, a freelance film-maker with the National Film Board's Winnipeg studio, was nominated in the animated short film category.

Toronto-born animator Richard Williams was also nominated in the visual effects category for his work as art director on Walt Disney's box-office hit, *Who Framed Roger Rabbit*.

In addition, the National Film Board of Canada will get an honorary Oscar in recognition of its 50th anniversary and artistic, creative and technological excellence.

The awards will be presented March 29.

Joining Weaver in the best actress competition were Glenn Close, *Dangerous Liaisons*; Jodie Foster, *The Accused*; Meryl Streep, *A Cry in the Dark*, and Melanie Griffith, *Working Girl*. Streep, who won in 1979 for *Kramer vs. Kramer* and in 1982 for *Sophie's Choice*, now has eight Oscar nominations in 15 roles. Griffith's nomination was her first.

Facing Hoffman in the best actor race will be Gene Hackman for *Mississippi Burning*, Tom Hanks for *Big*, Edward James Olmos for *Stand And Deliver*, and Max Von Sydow for the Danish film, *Pelle the Conqueror*.

Best director nominees included Charles Crichton for *A Fish Called Wanda*, Alan Parker for *Mississippi Burning*, Mike Nichols for *Working Girl* and Martin Scorsese for *The Last Temptation of Christ*, a film criticized by religious groups as blasphemous.

Nominated for best supporting actress were Joan Cusack for *Working Girl*, Geena Davis for *The Accidental Tourist*, Frances McDormand for *Mississippi Burning*, Michelle Pfeiffer for *Dangerous Liaisons* and *Working Girl*'s Weaver.

Veteran actor Alec Guinness, co-star of *Little Dorrit*, received a nomination for best supporting actor, as did Kevin Kline for *A Fish Called Wanda*, River Phoenix for *Running on Empty*, Dean Stockwell for *Married to the Mob* and Martin Landau for *Tucker: The Man and His Dream*.

Nominated for best foreign-language film were Hungary's *Hannus*, Belgium's *The Music Teacher*, India's *Salaam Bombay!*, Spain's *Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown*, and Denmark's *Pelle the Conqueror*.

Yoopers - old music - new twist

ISHPEMING, Mich. (AP) — The telephone lines have been jammed for weeks in this tiny town on Michigan's northern coast, as Americans elsewhere discover Yoopers.

They're calling up to talk to a certain Yooper, Jimmy DeCaire, or to order tapes from his band, Da Yoopers. There were so many calls to DeCaire's house deep in the snowy woods by Lake Superior last month that the circuits gave up and phones rang willy-nilly around town.

"Dentists were getting called. Little old ladies were getting called at 2 in the morning. They're ready to burn me in effigy. It's the biggest thing in Ishpeming since the high school burned down," DeCaire said.

Welcome, Ishpeming — tiny town among the pines and swamps of Michigan's Upper Peninsula — to the world of novelty music.

The songs that jammed Ishpeming's phone lines won't show up on Billboard charts or in record store bins, but they and others like them are flourishing on radio shows across the United States.

Novelty music is a do-it-yourself business. Da Yoopers recorded in DeCaire's basement and distribute their comic songs,

four mailbags a day, from DeCaire's dining room.

DR. DEMENTO

"They exist in a kind of underground way," said Barry Hansen, who regularly sheds his quiet demeanor to become the king of kooky music, Dr. Demento, in Los Angeles.

Hansen relied on old standbys such as Spike Jones when he started broadcasting his Dr. Demento radio show in the early 1970s.

Now, he receives up to 150 new tapes a week from would-be wackos who want air time on the 185 stations that broadcast the doctor's nationally syndicated show.

Underground music is flourishing.

Not-so-underground has been the appeal of Da Yoopers, named after the people of Michigan's Upper Peninsula, a.k.a. the U.P.

One Da Yoopers' tune reached the cult-coveted *Funny Five* status, topping out at No. 1 on Dr. Demento. It has had similar rankings on more conventional radio shows.

The song is called *Second Week of Deer Camp*, and the flannel-shirted Da Yoopers sing it to a polka beat in the Finnish accent of ice fishermen and lumbermen

from their native North:

"It's da second week of deer camp, and all da guys are here. We drink, play cards and shoot da bull, but never shoot no deer. De only time we leave da camp is when we go for beer."

The sound is local. The appeal is universal.

'VERY GOOD'

"They're very, very, very good. That's about 16 verys," said Dan Christopherson, who spins the discs for KXRB in Sioux Falls, S.D.

Da Yoopers' other hit, *Rusty Chevrolet*, has evoked a similar grass-roots response. To the tune of *Jingle Bells*, *Rusty Chevrolet* is a diatribe about one man's decrepit automobile:

"Oh, rust and smoke, the heater's broke, the door just blew away. I light a match to see the dash, and then I start to pray. The frame is bent, the muffler went, the radio, it's OK. Oh what fun it is to drive this rusty Chevrolet."

A good novelty song will bring more request line phones than something off the charts, Dr. Demento said.

"Songs like these reach out to something special for individual people, whereas Michael Jackson tries to reach the whole world."

Lived-in look is in for '89 jeans

NEW YORK (AP) — It's no longer that jeans just fit — and last.

Manufacturers now promote jeans that have been acid-washed, white-washed, stone-washed, rinsed, bleached or over-dyed.

Last spring's favored look was acid-washed. This spring, says Roy Schiefner, manager of product development for jeans manufacturer Levi Strauss, "light-colored, lived-in denim" will be popular.

He says the style may also turn

to narrower, slimmed-down styles, which translates as tighter-fitting.

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — A University of Rochester professor believes he has found evidence that a meteorite struck the Earth 66 million years ago, causing the extinction of the dinosaurs and other species.

Scientists have long debated the cause that wiped out the mighty

beasts. Some speculate a meteorite hit the Earth, while others say volcanic activity or climatic changes led to the demise of the dinosaurs.

Geologist Asish Basu believes a meteorite hit what now is India, causing extensive volcanic activity. He bases his conclusion on rocks from central India which have features suggesting they withstood a large impact.

Richard Ford is great storyteller in Rock Spring

Kaleidoscope

Rock Springs by Richard Ford (RANDOM HOUSE): \$9.95, 235 pp.

Richard Ford's three novels — the best known of which is **The Sportswriter** — have not won him the effusive praise that his collection of short fiction, **Rock Springs**, has brought him from the major literary journals. **Esquire** and **The New Yorker** have been publishing Ford's stories over the past decade, and the best of them are gathered in this slender but powerful volume from this literary descendant of Raymond Carver and Thomas McGuane.

Many of these tales are set in the great American west, such as the title story with its Rock Springs, Wyoming locale, or "Great Falls", which features the hunting and fishing territory of Montana in its plot.

The latter story is typical of Ford's method; it begins with a nostalgic reverie by Jackie Russell, who recalls how his father, a discharged Air Force sergeant, would take him hunting and fishing in the Montana wilds. Jackie would accompany his dad to the local hotels where he would sell the fish and game for barely enough money to support his family. Suddenly the story takes a twist into the surreal dimensions that Ford stories love to probe: the father and son come upon a strange vehicle in their driveway, and the discovery that his mother is having a tryst with a young man named Woody is narrated through the wide-eyed boy's eyes. The controlled violence of the story gives way to the aching feeling of things lost which develops as the boy meets his mother, now long-estranged from the boy's father, in a sleazy Great Falls motel.

The epiphany in the story comes when the boy finds himself on the edge of something, not knowing how the events that have sundered his family's life have special meaning for him: "it is just low-life, some coldness in us all, some helplessness that causes us to misunderstand life when it is pure and plain, makes us more or less than animals who meet on the road — watchful, unforgiving, without patience or desire."

Ford's stories, the obvious pro-

duct of a born storyteller, often feature stories within the story, in which characters reflect on the way their lives have turned out, or how a loved one was lost, or even how love faded away.

His characterizations are imbued with a realism that is powerful and convincing. Yet the people we meet in these stark litanyes of divorce, lost-love, and family anguish, or the destitute women in lonely bars, or lonely army sergeants on passenger trains, have a sorrow in their lives that Ford drives home with depressing regularity. These Montana vignettes seem to have been written by Ford with some perverse delight in showing that the American west is as much a landscape of lost souls, heartache, and blighted lives as can be found in any urban setting.

These stories do indeed "elevate Richard Ford to the small group of great living American storytellers", as one Denver writer declared.

RECORD REVIEWS

Lou Reed New York (SIRE-WEA) Springsteen has attempted a vision of New York with his song "Jungleland", Randy Newman tore a strip or two off Los Angeles with his satirical "I Love L.A.", but there has never been a no-holds-barred diatribe against a city like Lou Reed's **New York** album. Reed went into Media Sound Studio B in the Big Apple with two guitars, a bass and drums and laid down fourteen straight tracks that he advises listeners are "meant to be listened to in one 58 minute sitting as though it were a book or a movie".

Mike Rathke played guitar, backing up Lou, while Rob Wasserman handled Clevinger Electric upright bass on most tracks, with Fred Maher (co-producer with Reed) handling the bulk of the drum work.

The result is one of the grittiest, brutal albums that ever addressed the contemporary scene and went out on the streets of that major American metropolis that is a barometer predicting everything right or wrong about urban life. Reed's purview here is anything currently topical on the American scene: want pollution probe?, then Lou's got it on "Last Great American Whale" — "Americans don't care too much for beauty/ They'll shit in a river, dump battery acid in a stream/ They'll watch dead rats wash up on the beach/ And complain if they can't swim...It's a lot like what my painter friend Donald said to me 'Stick a fork in their ass and turn them over, they're done'".

Reed's memorable rock'n'roll figures are Romeo Rodriguez, who courts his Juliette Bell while Manhattan's sinking like a rock; or Pedro, who lives out of the Wilshire Hotel, "No one here dreams of

being a doctor or a lawyer or anything / They dream of dealing on the dirty boulevard"; or the smooth, euphonic litany of characters in "Halloween Parade": "There's a downtown fairy singing out 'Proud Mary' / As she cruises Christopher Street / And some Southern Queen is acting loud and mean / Where the docks and the Badlands meet"; he even takes on Waldheim and the Pope in "Good Evening Mr. Waldheim"; and in "Hold On" the vitriol about New York's sad state really spews forth: "There's blacks with knives and whites with guns / Fighting in Howard Beach / There's no such thing as human rights / When you walk the N.Y. streets / A cop was shot in the head by a 10 year old kid named Buddah in Central Park last week".

The bed tracks that underplay Lou Reed's relentless indictment of New York are simplistic, raw, unadulterated rock, offering the perfect complement to Reed's deadpan, talkin' blues style of delivery. Just when the parade of crazies, junkies, and perverts becomes an overpowering onslaught, Reed can punctuate the mood with some witty, comical observations, as in "Sick of You". "I was up in the morning with the TV blarin' / Brush my teeth sittin' watchin' the news / All the beaches were closed the ocean was a Red Sea / But there was no one there to part it in two / There was no fresh salad because / There's hypos in the cabbage / Staten Island disappeared at noon / And they say the midwest is in great distress / And NASA blew up the moon".

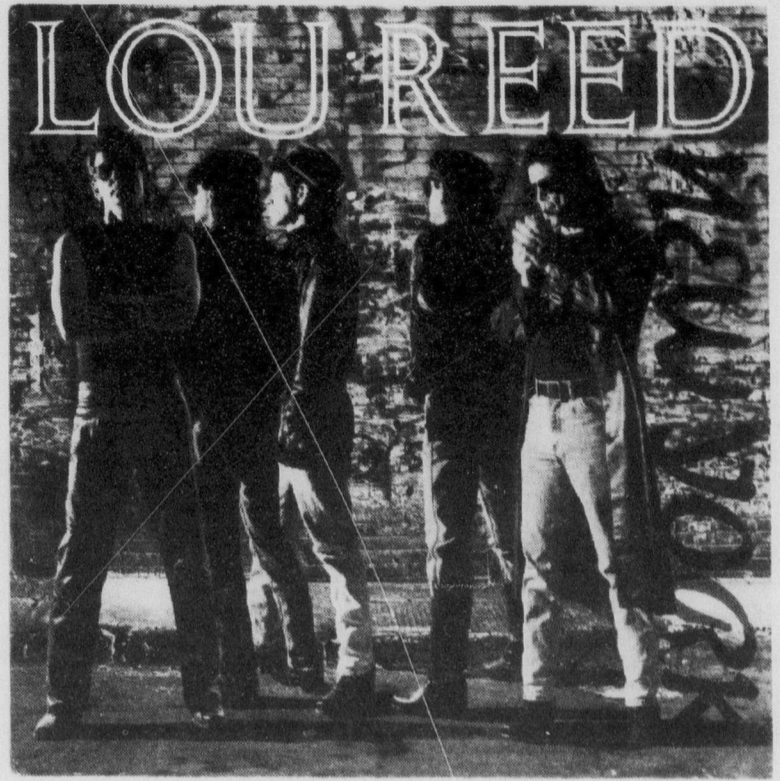
From his days in the Velvet Underground, through his pretentiously ambitious rock experiments, on to his nihilistic primers that were picked up as holy writ by punkers, Lou Reed has been controverial and always unpredictable.

Like the greatest of the rockers, Elvis, Jerry Lee or Lennon and the primitive madcap Beatles, Lou Reed always appears to be on the edge of respectability, able to plunge into bad taste, outrageous behaviour or wretched excess on the next back-beat or on the next guitar break. **New York** is a topical, timely album that will put its author back into the rock spotlight.

VIDEO SCREENINGS

Die Hard (CBS/FOX VIDEO)

As an example of exploitative violence flicks, **Die Hard** might be written off as a lesser-Rambo, were it not for the fact that the relentless, gut-wrenching action shots follow one another with a sustained impact that has nothing to do with a Stallone-style characterization. Bruce Willis may be limited to an array of grunts, grimaces and James Bond-like asides of black humour, but he is light years ahead of Stallone in most aspects



of film-acting.

Willis plays a New York City cop whose rendezvous with his estranged wife atop a glitter-dome of corporate excess leads to an unexpected encounter with terrorist-like thieves. The thieves, led by Hans Gruber, (Alan Rickman) descend upon a Christmas party being held atop the Fox Plaza, located in Century City, L.A.

Willis' character is John McClane, whose wife Holly (Bonnie Bedelia) has pursued a career with a Japanese conglomerate much to McClane's chagrin and in spite of the rupture that results in their marriage. On a holiday visit, McClane gets caught in the middle of the big heist and holds his own against a superior force of the most dastardly, deadly criminals to sneer and smirk their way across a video screen.

Wreckless chases through the elevator shafts of the building, violent explosions, head-shots with

hand-guns, hand-to-hand combat, and all manner of mayhem develops, as McClane becomes the archetypal American frontier hero fighting off the invading foreign hordes — he even adopts the name "Roy" because of his affection for Roy Rogers as a childhood hero.

The symbolism of good and evil, several sub-texts involving the black cop who maintains radio contact with McClane as he battles the terrorists, and even a swipe or two at the devious tactics of the television newsmen for whom the story is the only thing that matters, conspire to give added dimensions to what is basically a terrifically exciting action flick. John McTiernan's direction in this successful venture should ensure that his name will be seen on the credits again soon. 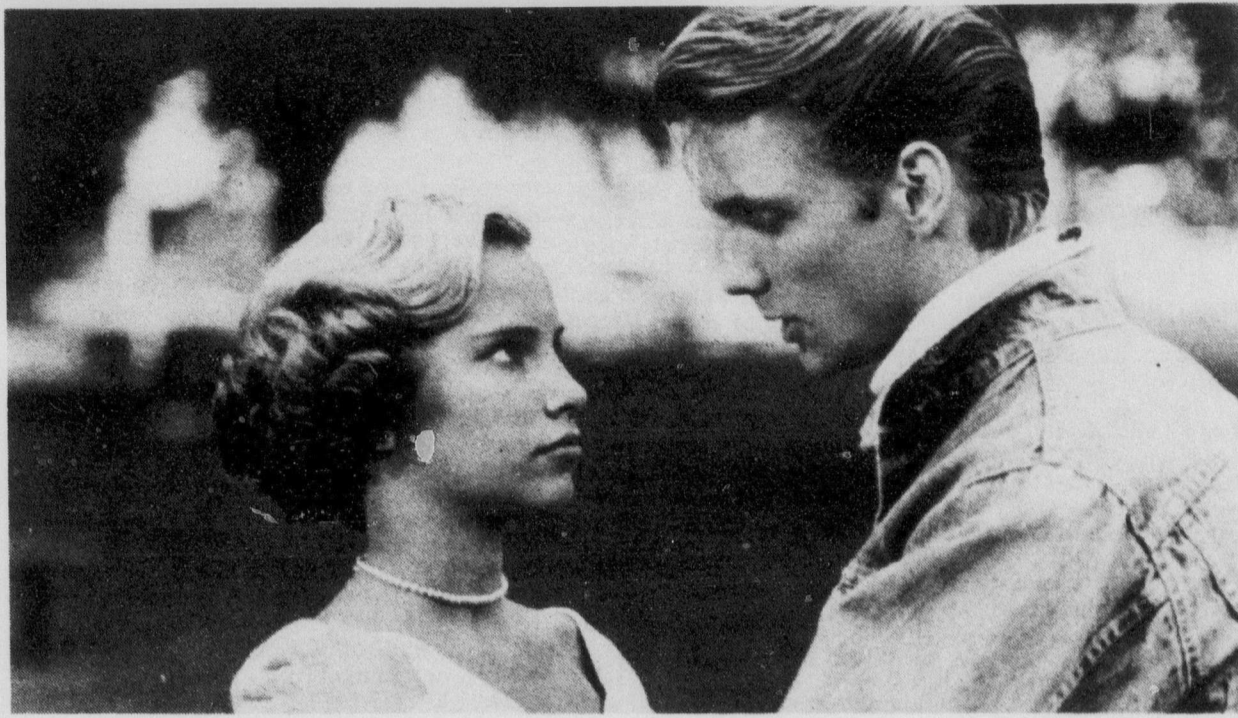

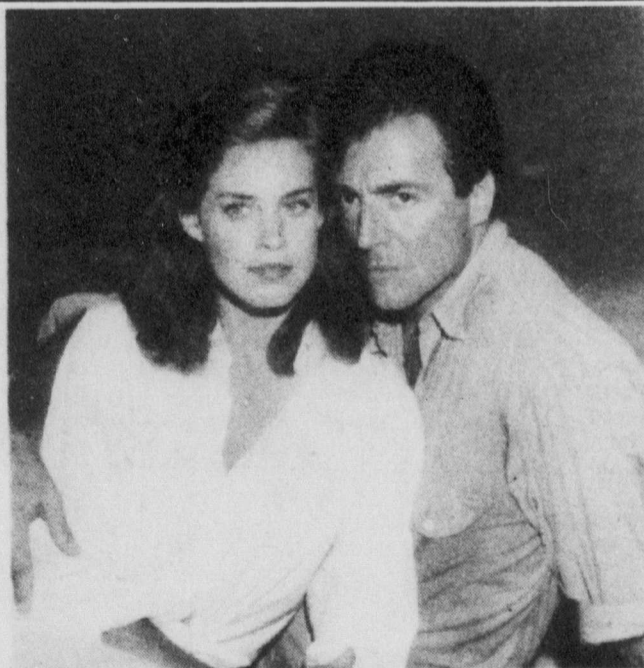
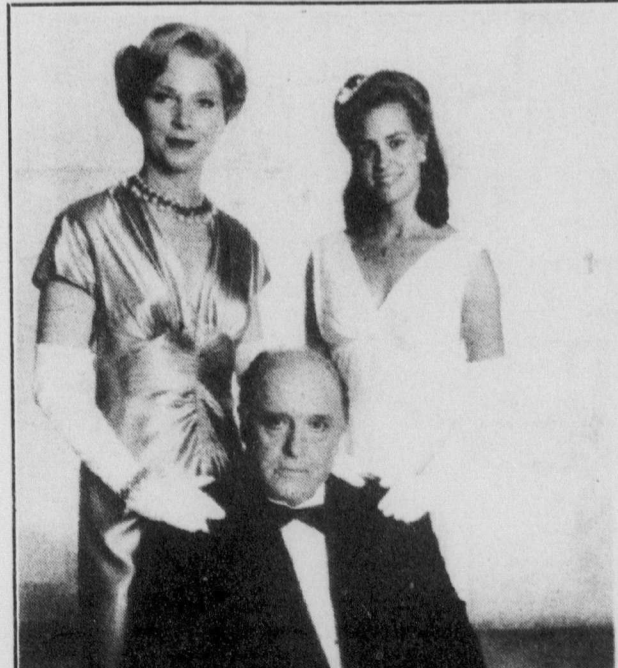

Isle of Antigua offers irresistible deals for any budget

ST. JOHN'S, Antigua — If high employment is the measure of prosperity, this eastern Caribbean island, once the capital of the British Leewards, is enjoying the most prosperous period of its history.

There are not enough Antiguans to fill the jobs available and people from other islands — notably Dominica and St. Vincent — and from Guyana in northern South America are flocking in to take the jobs Antiguans can't fill or don't want.

The booming tourist hotel industry isn't all that happy about the situation. As one hotelier put it to me, "We have difficulty obtaining and holding onto experienced help. We have to put more effort into obtaining and training new staff, and keeping them means increasing our wage bill."

That, of course, is good for the average Antiguan.

The changes on the island over the past years, particularly as they relate to tourism, have been pronounced. Many older hotels have been refurbished or expanded, or both, and new ones have been built or are being planned.

It wasn't long ago that the area around Deep Bay, a 15-minute cab ride due west of St. John's, the island capital, was undeveloped as far as tourism is concerned. Now it is the site of the island's largest hotel and casino, the Royal Antiguan, a posh establishment built for the Antigua Government with Italian aid at a cost of EC\$70 million (about CAN.\$31.5 million at current exchange rates). It can accommodate up to 282 guests in its nine-story main building (the island's only high rise) and its nearby one-bedroom cottages and one- and two-bedroom suites. Moreover, it has enough space (604 square meters of it) in five public rooms to accommodate up to 1,000 people meeting in conventions.

Across from the hotel at the other side of what is designed to be a large marina, now being built, are new holiday apartment-type complexes facing onto quiet beaches that are designed to cater to those seeking escape from the fast life.

At the opposite end of the island, on the extreme eastern point, the Pineapple Beach Club, expanded and completely refurbished since it was known as the Antigua Horizons Hotel, offers all-inclusive holiday packages at, this winter, from \$1,299 to \$1,569 per person for 7 nights and from \$2,099 to \$2,599 for 14 nights. These prices, in Canadian funds, include everything — from transfers between airport and hotel, various categories of accommodation, and all meals to drinks, wines with lunch and dinner, and a variety of sports activities. "Once here," the manager says, "a visitor doesn't have to go anywhere else. There are always

guests who want to shop, of course, and for them we even arrange a shopping tour to St. John's once a week."

Dickenson Bay, which arguably has the finest of Antigua's 365 white sand beaches (one for each day of the year, as the tourist board never tires of pointing out), is still home to the first of the island's luxury hotels, the Anchorage, and to Halcyon Cove and the Runaway Beach hotels. It has seen several others sprout in recent years. One notable one is the Siboney Beach Club where we stopped for a leisurely lunch one day. It's named after the first-unknown Antiguans, the Siboney Indians of 4,000 years ago, and set amid palms and tropical flowers that reach down to the beach's edge.

And speaking of lunch — or dinner — it wasn't so long ago that a visitor had a choice of only three or four restaurants to patronize, apart, that is, from those operated by the tourist hotels. Today, you can choose from more than 20. At a few, prices can be as high as you would pay at some top-class restaurants in Canada, but the food and wine selections are excellent.

St. John's has always been a good town for shopping, but now, with the opening recently of two new shopping complexes, it has become significantly better than ever. The shops of Heritage Quay, new and modern, specialize in duty-free sales, while those of Redcliffe Quay, housed in restored old buildings that date back to the days of slavery on the island, tend more toward boutique-type merchandise. One or two days can profitably be spent shopping in St. John's, coupled with lunch at one of the town's many restaurants. The visitor should also set aside an hour to take in the Antigua and Barbuda Museum in the city's old court house. It's well worth seeing.

For the active vacationer and sports-minded, Antigua has always had appeal, but now it offers more than ever before — tennis (tournaments of up to three weeks draw professionals from around the world), golf at 18-hole and 9-hole courses, horseback riding, deep-sea fishing, scuba-diving, snorkelling, wind-surfing, and sailing, including the now internationally recognized sailing week each spring (the dates this year are April 30 to May 8).

For most tourists, the big spectacle of the year is Carnival, which in Antigua is annually centered around the last weekend of July. Dates this year are July 24 to August 1.

For the sightseer, Nelson's Dockyard at English Harbor remains the number one attraction, not only in Antigua, but in the entire eastern Caribbean. High up on one of the big hills overlooking the Dockyard is Shirley Heights where you can photograph goats grazing amid the ruins of old British Army

barracks dating back to Nelson's day, and lunch at the Lookout, a relatively new restaurant, while taking in the activities in English Harbor far below.

Two other sightseeing attractions are the sailings aboard the "pirate" ship, Jolly Roger and the helicopter flights to as far away as Antigua's sister island of Barbuda, home of a large frigate bird colony.

For U.S.\$40, the Jolly Roger will take you on a five-hour, fun-filled outing along part of the island's west coast. The price includes all the drinks you want, a steak or lobster lunch, island music and dancing, rope-swinging or walking the plank into the Caribbean Sea, and wreck-snorkelling. Hotel desks will make reservations, or call the ship's office on the island at

462-2604.

If you would rather fly than sail, AB Helicopter Services offer three sightseeing flights at from U.S.\$150 to \$450 for up to four people. You can get details and make reservations by calling them on the island at 463-1343.

When I suggested to my taxi driver that Antigua had come a long way in the past five years or so, his reply was, "It sure has, mahn; it sure has. And long may it continue."

To which there is only one response: amen.

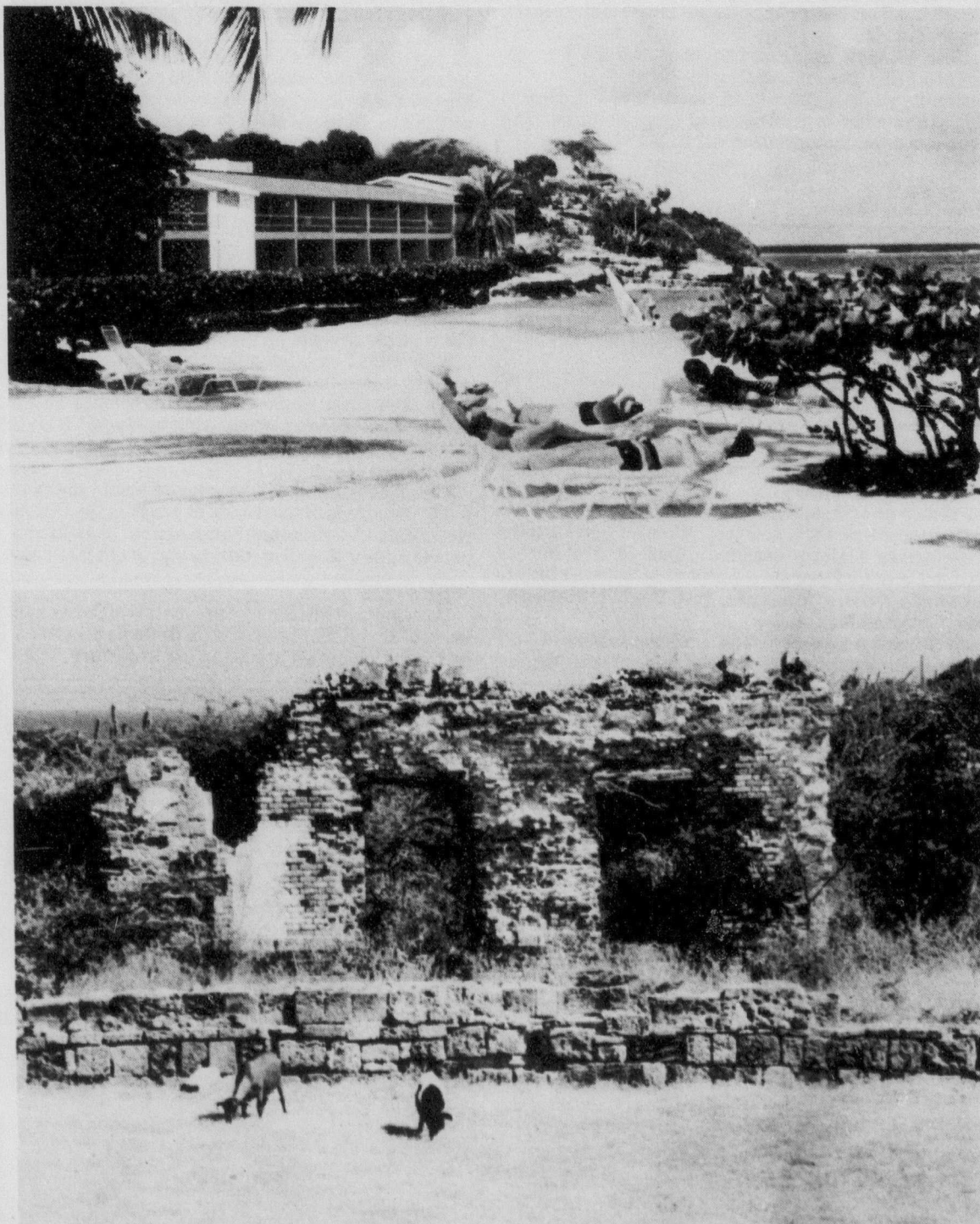

Sandy Wilson, director stars Langrick again

VANCOUVER (CP) — When Vancouver director Sandy Wilson saw Margaret Langrick at a Halloween party in 1987, one thought raced through her mind.

"My goodness, she's growing up awfully quickly," Wilson recalled.

The young actress, Wilson realized, was outgrowing her next role.

Langrick, now 17, won a Genie Award in 1985 for her portrayal of a precocious pre-teen named Sandy Wilcox in *My American Cousin*. Wilson's first feature film grabbed five other Genies that year, including best picture.

"If I ever wanted to make a sequel I (knew) I'd better get to work on it right away quick," said Wilson, who originally planned *My American Cousin* as the first in a series of three movies.

The 41-year-old director began sketching out the script.

She raised a \$3-million budget within a year and finished shooting in December. The sequel, as yet untitled, is scheduled for release in July.

STORY UNFOLDS

Wilson, who started out as a documentary filmmaker, based *My American Cousin* on her experiences growing up in the 1950s in the orchards of the Okanagan Valley in British Columbia.

"Dear Diary," writes 12-year-old Sandy as the film opens. "Nothing ever happens."

Her cousin Butch from California soon rolls on the scene in a red convertible and things do start happening.

Ultimately, however, Butch returns to California and Sandy is left in the slow lane.

The sequel picks up a few years later, says Wilson.

"It's set in 1965, and Sandy is a student at Simon Fraser Universi-

ty. She . . . gets an invitation to Butch's wedding, and that starts her on a little bit of an adventure down south of the border."

In the years since *My American Cousin*, Wilson wrote a pair of scripts and directed two television shows — *Moving Day*, starring Candice Bergen, Bruno Gerussi and Jackson Davies, and *Mama's Gonna Buy You a Mockingbird*.

Wilson also travelled extensively with *My American Cousin*. Stops included Moscow, Havana, Sydney and Washington, D.C.

Wilson's attire is a mishmash of different styles — her short blonde hair brushes a fringed scarf that looks like it survived the 1960s. Below her black jean jacket she wears a black and blue chequered kilt.

Her office is equally eclectic.

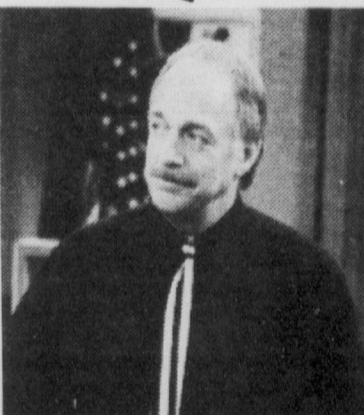

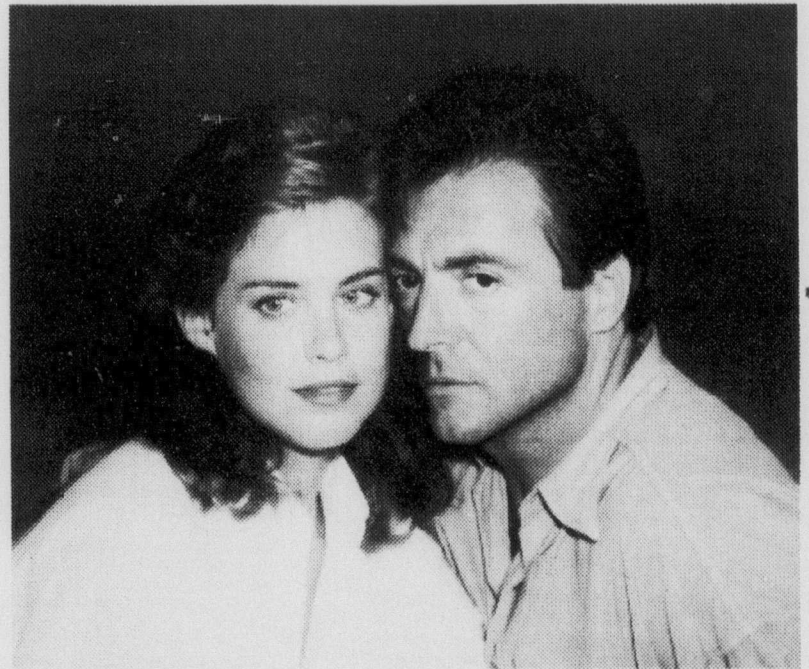

'Passion and Paradise' recreates bizarre murder

Drama presents stunning, fact-based conclusion

The bizarre 1943 killing of an incredibly wealthy American in his lavish Bahamas home—after his unsuccessful attempt to prevent his teenage daughter's marriage to a notorious gigolo—prompted both international speculation and outrage.

Passion and Paradise, based on the true story of the murder of Sir Harry Oakes—probably the richest man in the world at the time—airs Sunday and Tuesday, Feb. 19 and 21, on ABC.

The cast of characters involved in this infamous crime includes Sir Harry's bankrupt son-in-law, the Duke and Duchess of Windsor, a mysterious gangster, a firebrand revolutionary leader with voodoo connections, and an anxious wartime government more interested in a quick trial than justice.

Rod Steiger is Sir Harry, whose fortune is estimated at \$100 million. Armand Assante is Alfred De Marigny, a former gigolo who is making a new life for himself as a farmer on the

island. When De Marigny falls in love with and marries Sir Harry's very beautiful—and very young—daughter, Nancy (Catherine Mary Stewart), the millionaire and his wife (Marianne Hartley) are enraged.

When Sir Harry is murdered, De Marigny immediately becomes the leading suspect, because he is desperately in need of money. However, the Mafia—and even the Duke and Duchess of Windsor—will also profit from Sir Harry's removal.

In spite of other suspects, the native government leader is determined to lead a lynch mob against De Marigny, which provokes Nancy to call in Raymond Schindler (Wayne Rogers). Schindler, a deceptively mild-mannered American private detective, doggedly pursues the truth to provide a stunning climax to the trial.

Although in actuality the murder was never definitively solved, the drama presents a conclusion which reflects not only the producers' judgment of what happened, but also the consensus of the public at the time.

Music stars take spotlight for Grammy Awards show

Tracy Chapman leads with six nominations

Nominations have been made and votes cast for the cream of the crop in the field of music, and awards will be presented on *The 31st Annual Grammy Awards*, Wednesday, Feb. 22, on CBS.

Selected by music industry peers in the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS), the nominees include artists in a variety of genres of music.

"The awards are like sports' MVP (Most Valuable Player), voted by the players themselves," said Mike Greene, permanent president of NARAS.

Billy Crystal, who has hosted the awards show for the past two years, winning Emmy nominations each time, will once again be the master of ceremonies.

Crystal, a star of films, television, recordings and the concert stage, was selected in 1987 as the first comedy recording star to host the Grammy Awards. He himself earned a Grammy Award nomination in 1986 for his comedy recording, "You Look Mahvelous." In addition to his two Emmy nominations for the Grammy ceremonies, he was nominated for an Emmy last year for the variety special *All-Star Toast to the Improv*, and in 1985 for *Saturday Night Live*.

This year, first-time nominee Tracy Chapman received the most nominations of any recording artist with six. The singer-songwriter was nominated for her version of "Fast Car" in the categories of Record of the Year and Best Pop Female Vocal Performance (as singer) and Song of the Year (as writer). She was also nominated as Best New Artist, and her album, *Tracy Chapman*, is an Album of the Year and Best Contemporary Folk nominee.

Bobby McFerrin, winner of five previous Grammy Awards, runs a close second with five nominations. He received nominations in the categories Record of the Year, Song of the Year and Best Pop Male Vocal Performance for his well-played recording, "Don't Worry, Be Happy." His album, *Simple Pleasures*, is an Album of the Year nominee, while his rendition of "Brothers" has earned him a nomination for Best Male Jazz Vocal Performance.

Nominations were made through the secret balloting of the nearly 7,000 members of NARAS. This year, nominations were made in an all-time high of 76 categories. Additionally, three new categories have been established this year.

Along with Chapman and McFerrin's nominations for Best Record of the Year are "Giving You the Best That I Got," by Anita Baker; "Man in the Mirror," by Michael Jackson; and "Roll with It," by Steve Winwood.

Album of the Year nominees include George Michael's *Faith*, Sting's *Nothing Like the Sun*, Winwood's *Roll with It*, and, of course, McFerrin and Chapman's albums.

Besides McFerrin and Chapman's Song of the Year nominations are Sting's "Be Still My Beating Heart," Baker's "Giving You the Best That I've Got" and Brenda Russell's "Piano in the Dark."

In fight against substance abuse, knowledge is power

Networks can reach a vast number of people while delivering a message with impact.

With this in mind, NBC has started a new campaign aimed at fighting teenage alcohol and drug abuse through a new public awareness program.

The *More You Know About Substance Abuse* is an outgrowth of NBC's 10-year partnership with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in on-going awareness campaigns, including the "Just Say No" movement.

In undertaking the project, NBC will combine efforts with its local affiliates to draw attention to the serious substance abuse problem threatening the educational system.

As part of the campaign effort, NBC and its affiliates will telecast a new series of public-service announcements featuring some of the network's best-known personalities.

Stephanie Kramer of *Hunter*, Rhea Perlman of *Cheers*, Sandra Santiago of *Miami Vice* and Jimmy Smits of *L.A. Law* are involved in on-air spots. To further help viewers learn about the impact of substance abuse on their communities, many NBC stations will offer special news reports.

The network recently distributed a poster/study guide to secondary schools across the nation. The guide, which provides suggestions for activities for both the individual and the classroom, features helpful prevention programs, a directory of agencies and organizations that can provide more information on the subject and useful guidelines for implementing local drug-abuse awareness campaigns.
