

title of May 15, or remain another month, as her great draft would prevent her getting out except at the highest stage of the tide. The experiments with the new paying-out machinery were giving general satisfaction.

The citizens of Manchester have given a banquet to Sir James Brooke, the Rajah of Sarawak, the incentive being the development of a trade with China, by way of Borneo. Sir James, in a lengthy speech, called upon the Government to assume the sovereignty he has obtained over the North Western Coast of Borneo, and the London Times endorses his views.

A serious riot had occurred between the English and Irish laborers in the iron district, near Newcastle on Tyne. The military had to be called out to restore order.

Queen Victoria had been reviewing 15,000 troops at the camp at Aldershot, and General Buller was expected to visit her majesty at the camp.

The Dundee Herald states a rumour that Queen Victoria is again in an interesting situation.

INDIA. The Calcutta mail of March 23rd reached Alexandria on the 23rd April.

There is intelligence from Lucknow to the 23rd March. On the 20th, Bregadier Campbell's force returned from the pursuit of the enemy.

On the 21st, the Malva, Nena's retreat, was stormed. He escaped, and a reward of 50,000 rupees was offered for his head.

Gen. Outram's force had discovered and destroyed a number of the Lucknow rebels, and the Prime Minister is among those reported as killed.

Peace prevailed in Oude. The enemy were flying towards Secundra.

Jung Bahadur was to go to Allahabad. No civil officers had yet been sent to Lucknow by the Government. Some of the inhabitants were returning to the city.

The heat of the weather was increasing daily. Sir Hope Grant had dispatched a body of the insurgents under Rajah Jalla Singh, of Kuree, taking 12 of their guns.

The desamring Act was being enforced in the North Western Provinces.

The recent proclamation issued by the Governor General calling on the Zemindars to submit to British authority, had produced no effect.

CHINA. Hong Kong dates to 15th March. Canton continued tranquil. An Imperial edict was read on the 6th March. Yeh's conduct is commended, and he is degraded, and successor appointed.

Lord Elgin and his colleagues had left for the north.

FRANCE. The sensation excited by Bernart's acquittal was subsiding. It was reported that the Constitutionnel was to receive a warning for its inflammatory article on the subject.

An Imperial return states that next year, France will have 15 iron saddles and screw steamers, independent of sailing vessels and fitted with the screw, and gun-boats, steam transports and floating batteries.

The election was to take place in Paris the day after the Europe sailed. General Perrot, who was nominated by the Opposition, had avowed himself the Government candidate.

M. Louis Fould, brother of the Minister of Finance, is dead.

It is stated that the director of the Constitutionnel has been dismissed for the article on England. He receives an indemnity of 50,000 francs, which every director is entitled to in case of a sudden removal. The paper will now print a complimentary article on the subject.

Another ship of the line had been added to the Toulon fleet, which is to consist of 15 ships-of-war.

ITALY. A despatch from Turin, of April 22nd, says the reply of Naples to Sardinia was officially communicated to Count Cavot to-day. It is couched in moderate terms, but contains a flat refusal of the Sardinian demands.

The report that Sardinian officers on leave of absence had been ordered home is unfounded.

RUSSIA. A despatch from St. Petersburg announces that after the 30th May foreign vessels will be admitted to Anapat, Soulim, Kaleb, and other ports in the Black Sea.

TURKEY. Trieste advises say that the Porte has ensured the Viceroy of Egypt for giving his assent to the canal across the Isthmus of Suez, and commands him not to support the scheme.

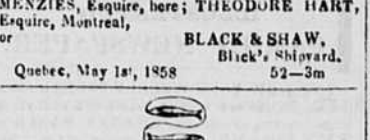
