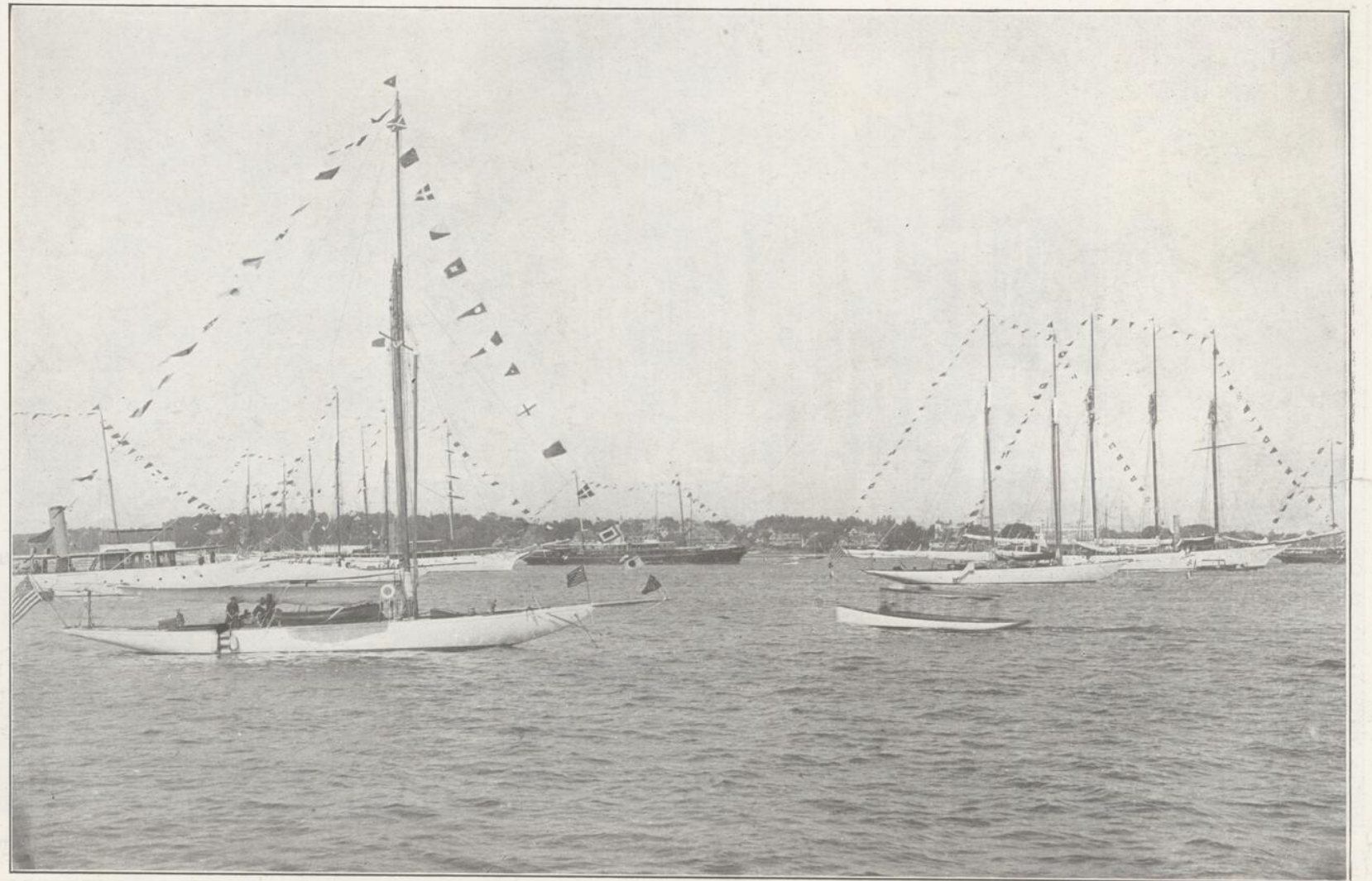

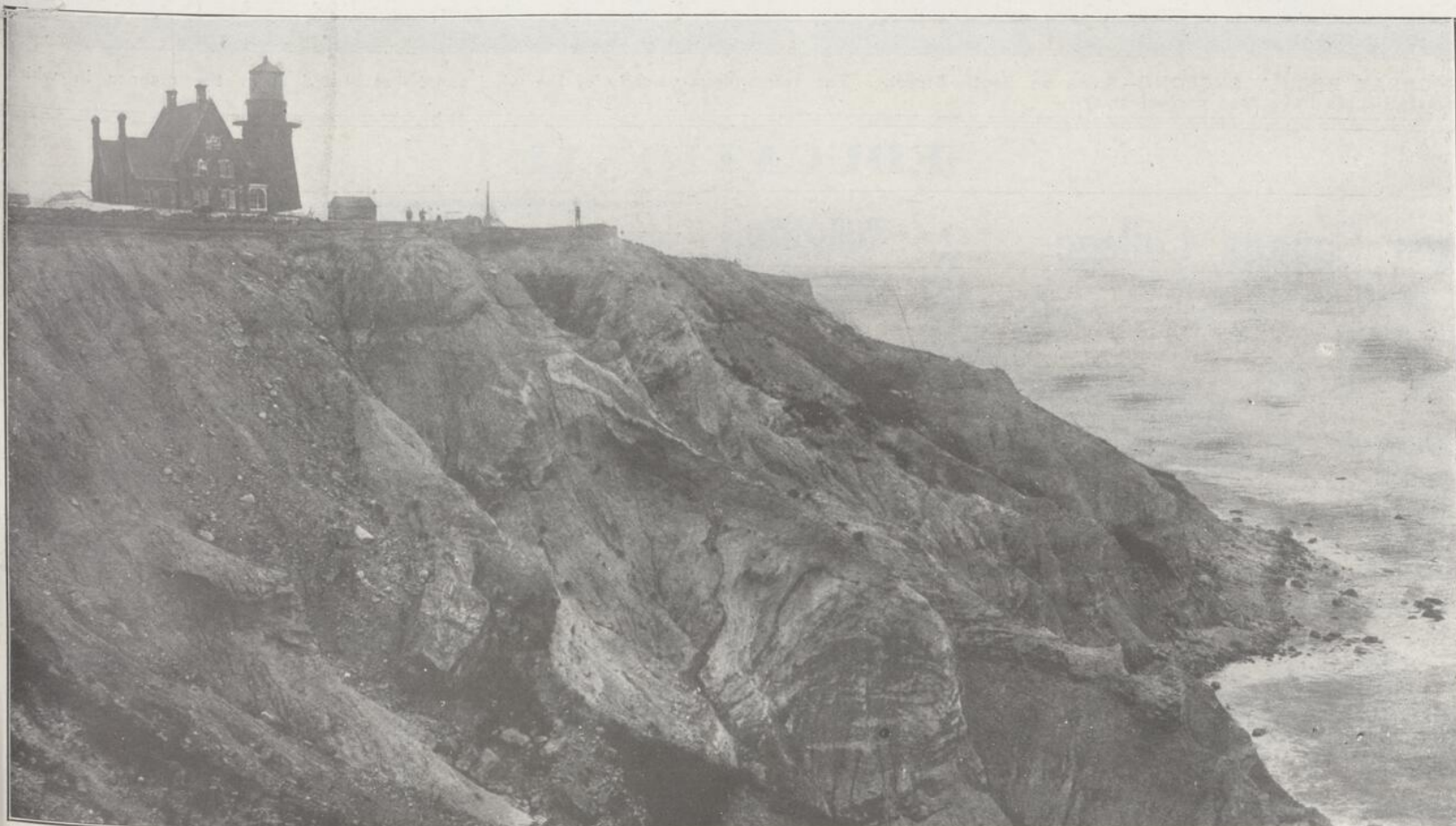

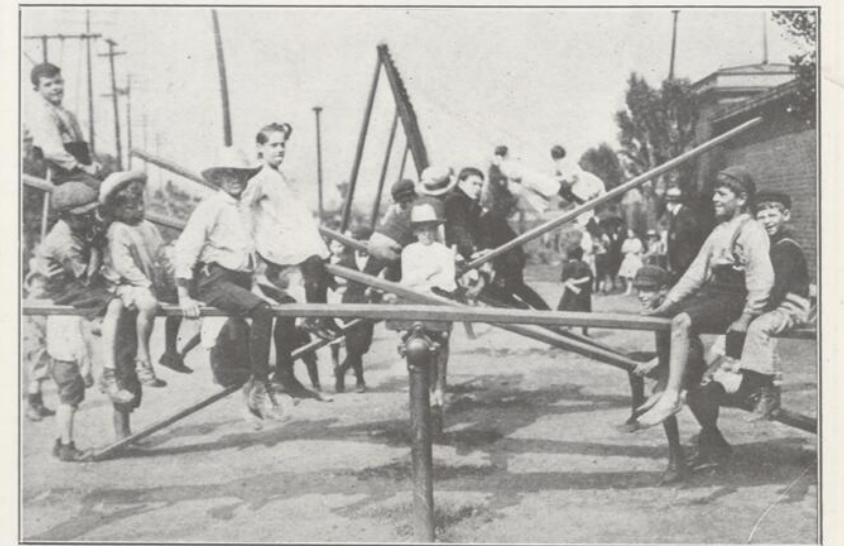
# Children's Playground Movement in Canada Made a Good Start This Week in the Commercial Metropolis

the use of the children this year. These are situated at Hibernia Road; at the Dyke at the foot of Ash Avenue, Point St. Charles; at the Berthelet Street School; and at the Sheltering Home on Dufferin Square.

Each of these playgrounds is doing a great work in aiding in the keeping healthy of the thousands of poor children who, through poverty or other causes, are unable to leave the city during the sweltering days of summer and secure that relief so necessary to the mental, moral and physical development of every growing child. At the Hibernia Road Playground there is a wading pool, where the little ones may wade, up to their waists, during the hot hours of the day, and at each of the playgrounds there is a proper amount of swings, chutes, ladders, maypoles and all the other equipment so dear to the heart of all children.

It is at the Dyke, at the foot of Ash Avenue, however, that the idea has been carried to its fullest extent, for here the beautiful St. Lawrence adapts itself to the needs of the boys and

## MONTREAL PLAYGROUNDS

Of all the plans in operation in the great city of Montreal looking towards the proper care and treatment of children in the summer months, there are few which have met with the amount of approval from the general public that has been accorded the open-air and free playground idea.

During the summer of 1900 the idea took shape among a number of ladies in Montreal, who keenly felt the terrible amount of suffering existing among the poorer children of this city, for the lack of proper facilities for enjoyment during the hot summer days and nights, and these ladies, after much thought, to say nothing of trouble and disappointment, finally put in operation the scheme whereby certain places were opened up, under the supervision of a number of school teachers engaged in the schools of Montreal, and where all children over three

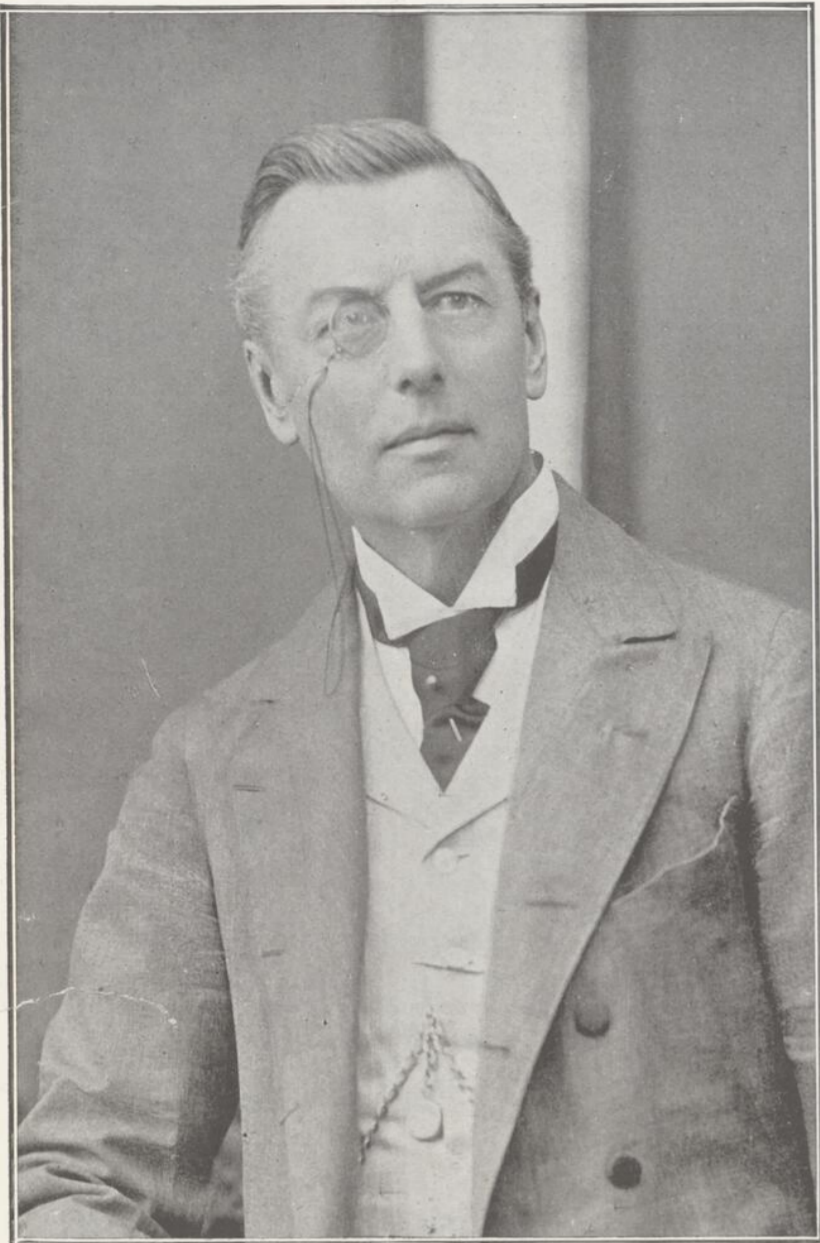

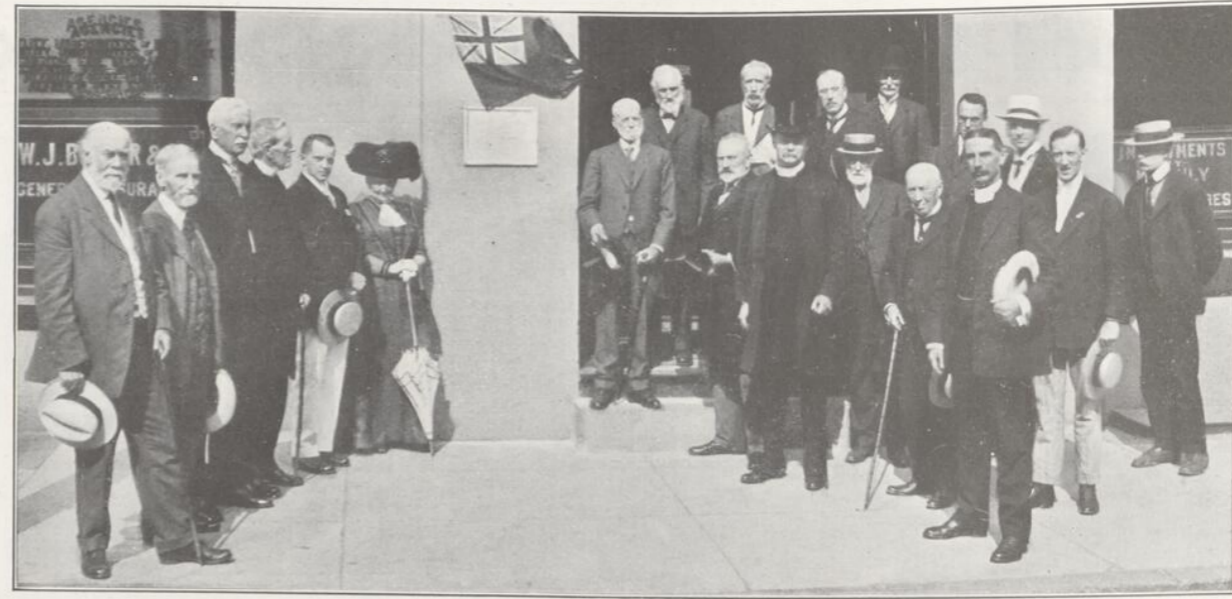

A St. Andrew's College Boy (Campbellton, N.B.) salmon fishing in the waters of the Jaquet River, N.B.



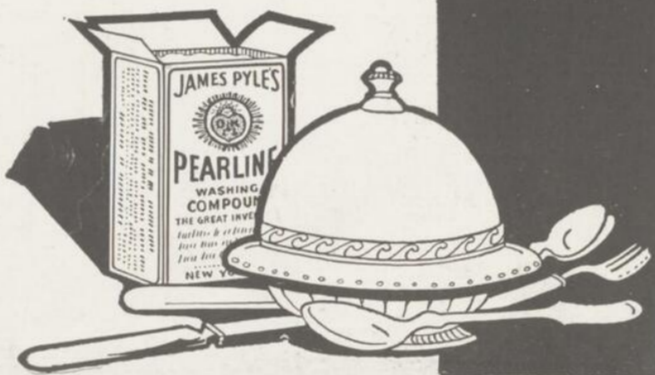

This year, for the first time, the city of Montreal contributed towards the work, while the playground plan was also remembered by the committee handling the funds of Tag Day, so that, with the exception of the great difficulty in obtaining the proper places to be used as playgrounds, the work of those interested has met with a considerable amount of success this year.
