



FROM LATE ENGLISH PAPERS.

LIVERPOOL, Aug. 14.—IRELAND.—In the Irish elections, the returns will not differ much from those of the last parliament.

Mr. O'Connell's obsequies were performed with great pomp in Dublin, and the moral sovereign of millions has now rested from his labors.

The patriotic Poles, Wisniewski and Kanczinski were executed on the 31st July on the scaffold.

MEMBERS OF THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT.—There will be, in the new Parliament, some nine gentlemen who have resided in, and who are well acquainted with, the United States.

OPORTO AND OTHER STRONGHOLDS were being dismantled, and the guns conveyed to Lisbon.

PORTUGAL.—Letters from Lisbon bring the intelligence that the liberty of the press and of the subject had been restored by an ordinance.

THE KING OF BELGIUM, accompanied by the Queen, has returned to Brussels, from Paris, in a very debilitated state.

THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF EXPENSES for 1848, amount to 71,530,835 florins, and for 1849 to 71,135,067 florins.

SWITZERLAND.—The last accounts from Switzerland represent the danger of a collision between the rival parties as most imminent.

GRECE.—Accounts from Athens to the 30th ult. state that not a single member of the Opposition has returned to the new Chambers.

INCREASE OF FEVER.—In Glasgow and its vicinity fever appears to be on the increase, as several more cases have been reported over the previous week.

CHOLERA IN RUSSIA.—The Paris Constitutionnel states that the cholera is raging with intense severity among the Russian army of the Caucasus.

FIFTY-SECOND REGIMENT.—The Apollo troop ship arrived at Spithead on the 9th inst., at one o'clock, with the whole of the 52nd Regiment, and the women and children of the regiment, amounting to above 500 persons.

MORTALITY OF LIVERPOOL.—The mortality returns for Liverpool, for the quarter ending 30th June, have just been issued.

OBITUARY.—The news of the demise of the heir apparent to the throne of Brazil, Don Alfonso, only son of Don Pedro II., has just reached England.

THE OFFICIAL NOTICE of the Bank of England, raising the minimum rate of discount to 5 1/4 per cent., has revived all those discussions which in April last were so warmly agitated respecting the power of that establishment, and the prudence with which that power is exercised.

IN SPITE of the general gloom, we confidently anticipate that the resources of the country will be found adequate to meet the great demands which will be pressed upon us.

THE NAVIGATION LAWS are defective in many points; but they are now interwoven with the commercial policy of every trading nation on the globe.

THE GENERAL CONVULSION which has taken place in the money market, together with the decline in the price of grain, have produced already many serious failures in England, Ireland, and on the continent.

HER MAJESTY and Royal Consort, with the Prince of Wales and Princess Royal, and suite, left Osborne Creek, Isle of Wight, on the 11th inst., for their tour through Scotland, which is expected to occupy about five weeks.

ON Monday evening the Royal squadron anchored in Scottish waters, and passed the night in Loch Ryan. From thence the Royal squadron will proceed, on Tuesday morning, to the Clyde, where an assemblage of upwards of fifty steamers, many of the largest class, in the river, will welcome the arrival of her Majesty; and the sight of this great fleet alone will be one that has rarely, probably never, been equalled.

REFINED SUGAR.—A vessel has arrived in the Port of London from Amsterdam, with an entire cargo, comprising 15,400 loaves of refined sugar, the manufacture of Holland.

RICHMOND, August 30.—We have no New Orleans papers of the morning of the 23rd inst., except the Commercial Times.

THE POTATO ROT.—We hear from various parts of the State alarming reports of the ravages of the potato disease. They come as well from the interior of the State as from the sea coast.

THE POSITION and prospects of Ireland are, we rejoice to say, beginning to bear a more encouraging and brighter aspect.

FRANCE.—The royal family, with the exceptions of the Princess de Joinville, and the Duchess d'Angoulême, have returned to Eu.

The English 19th August mail which arrived at Boston in the Caledonia on the morning of the 23rd inst., was received here yesterday morning the 25th inst.

We have not received our correspondent's letter, On looking over the Liverpool papers of the 19th, London papers of the 18th, Dublin of the 17th, we see that they all agree in the existence of a severe pressure in the money market, and its injurious effects on the trade and industry of the three Kingdoms.

A few items from Willmer & Smith's European Times of the 19th will give a notion of the general state of affairs in Europe, which offers little consolation, excepting the prospects of an abundant harvest.

The General Election was nearly over at the latest dates, and all seem to agree that, upon the whole, there will be little variation in the state of parties in the House of Commons.

The United States papers of the 2nd inst., contain no later accounts from the United States army under Gen. Scott. The most horrible state of things prevails between the population and the United States forces in the Provinces on the left bank of the Rio Grande; robberies, murders, the burning of entire villages and massacres, are represented as very generally prevailing, and the Indians appear to be joining in the work of destruction.

THE WEATHER AND THE CROPS.—The four fine days of last week ended on the evening of the 3rd, by heavy rain and thunder. Next morning the thermometer had fallen from 75° to 56°, with a strong easterly wind.
