He makes his own guitars and writes country songs

Earlwin "East Angus Slim" Tincarre never gives up

Meet Earlwin Tincarre of East Angus. As a kid he wanted nothing else but to be a cowboy. Today he plays country and western music. Though you may not have heard him sing yet, if he keeps it going, you just might.

Earlwin, at 28, composes his own songs and makes his own music instruments. With titles like "Little Rosa", "The Memories of the Cowboys", and "The Bluebird is Flying Over the Water", his songs have a tinge of sadness. His vocal style is naturally influenced by the country legends he so admires — people like Hank Williams, Buck Owens, Charley Pride, Hank Snow and, his personal favorite, Wilf Carter.

HE MAKES HIS OWN

Professional guitars can be very expensive but, thanks to another talent, Earlwin has been able to provide himself with all the good guitars he needs. "I make my own guitars," he said. "I made my first one when I was seven years old. Mr. Smith, my teacher at Cookshire Elementary, is the one who got me started. We had a school guitar club. Then, around 1974, Mr. Losier at Alexander Galt taught me my first chords. He introduced me to country music."

When Earlwin makes a new guitar it's actually a father-son project. "My Dad helps me," he said, flashing an easy smile. "I learned what I know from him."

QUALITY INSTRUMENTS

The Tincarres' homemade gui-

tars are good quality instruments — and totally unique. "Our guitars are different," he explained. "For the center-hole we can use the star, clover leaf or banana design as well as the traditional round shape. It's pretty tricky, let me tell you. I'm making my new one with diamonds around a star-shaped hole. People are gonna wonder 'how the heck did he get those in there?'"

By making his guitars at home, Earlwin has brought himself even closer to the music he loves. He has also proven the old saying, "where there's a will there's a way."

PERSISTENCE IS THE KEY

Overcoming obstacles has become a way of life for Earlwin Tincarre. Now enrolled as a student at the Eastern Townships School Board's Adult Education Center in Sherbrooke, he is aiming at another goal.

"By going to night school," he said, "I'm trying my best to get my high school leaving certificate. I'm also in school to improve my pronunciation of words." Earlwin knows full well that improving his language skills will make his music sound better.

MUSIC WAS THE ANSWER

The sudden and tragic death of his older brother in a Lennoxville car accident a few years ago had a terrible effect on Earlwin's life. He's still reluctant to talk about it. A deep faith in God's will has brought him this far. Faith has also moved him toward music.

"One day when I put my hand on the Bible," he said, "the Lord told me to play music and to keep it going and to do the best I can. It's the Lord who told me to take the name East Angus Slim."

Two years ago Earlwin met country singer Tommy Hunter in

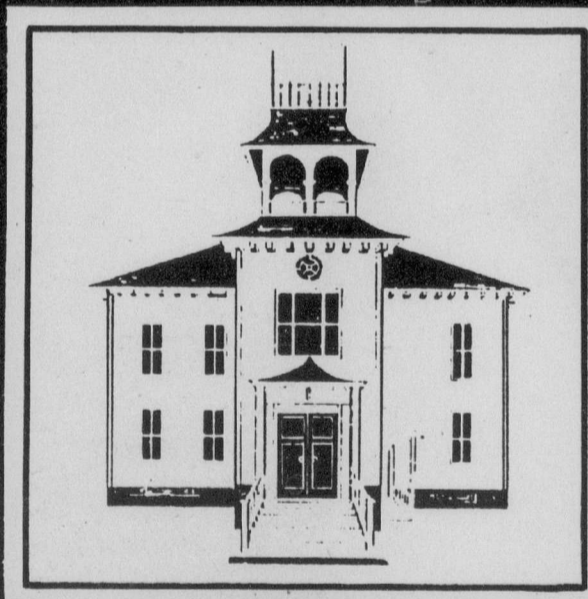
Toronto. Hunter listened to him sing and later spoke to him by phone, encouraging him to keep going.

"East Angus Slim" is a hometown boy. He has lived in East An-

gus all his life. That's where he sings. And that's where he is slowly building his dream of playing music and being heard.

"I just want people to give me a chance," he said, "to get me going." Meanwhile, you can bet on one thing. Earlwin just won't quit. Not today. Not tomorrow. The kid who dreamed of being a cowboy is really going for it.

The latest advice from Hite on mating, matters

WHAT GOOD GUYS ARE MADE OF

Good guys, according to Sheer Hate and her followers, are those most like women. They are more sensitive, more "in touch with their feelings" and talk much more. They are tender, loving, gentle and considerate, help with the housework, wash the dishes, change the baby's diapers and never ever smoke cigars.

Shere Hite, in short, has turned Professor Henry Higgins' beffuddled wail on its head and crooned; "Why can't a man be more like a woman?"

A TITILLATING STORY

She was once a fashion model in New York, Paris and Milan, and her statuesque beauty had much to

do with turning *The Hite Report* into an international best seller - although fashion models pose for other women, not for men. Her Report, compiled from less than 2,000 of 3,019 responses to questionnaires in women's magazines and feminist newsletters, was snapped up not for its scholarly research but for its titillation. It read like an extensive hen-party from which men were excluded, sex the only topic and no detail too intimate.

It has long been fashionable among feminists to deride the masculine virtues. The strong silent type - the Gary Cooper image is condemned it's alright to cry. "Macho" is a filthy word. Anyone taking pride in his masculinity is a male chauvinist pig.

Shere Hite wrote; "It is very clear by now that the pattern of sexual relations predominant in our culture exploits and oppresses

women... It has institutionalized out any expression of women's sexual feelings except for those that support male sexual needs."

HERE IT COMES

The thrust - if you'll excuse the expression - of her research was that most women achieve more sexual gratification from masturbation and cunnilingus than from penetration. (The rest prefer Bingo.)

She concludes; "Trends toward male passivity and androgyny are healthy."

Boutiques now feature unisex shirts, unisex pants and unisex hairdos - all of them leaning more towards the female than the male and undoubtedly designed by people with serious doubts about their own sexual orientation. Nevertheless, one can't avoid the nagging feeling that even these perfumed, blow-dried, hermaphroditic creatures, these sensitive, tender, talkative types, won't please Shere Hite either.

A PARABLE

The Greeks used to tell each other a scandalous story about Teiresias, the most famous prophet of the Heroic Age, he who set Heracles on the path to herohood and brought the bad news to Oedipus. was immediately turned into a woman!

Determined to make the best of a bad lot, and curious (as all of us are), he became a celebrated courtesan for seven wonderful years. Then he happened upon the same sight in the same place as before, struck out and this time killed the male. Bingo! He could pee standing up again.

Some time later, Zeus and Hera got into a row over his womanizing. She claimed he was inconsiderate, thought only of his own pleasure and never talked to her any more (plus ça change!). He stoutly denied it and claimed that he gave far more pleasure than he received. There was really only one person who knew for certain and Teiresias was sent for to settle the matter.

He answered; "If the parts of love-pleasure be counted as ten, 'Thrice three go to women, one only to men.'"

Hera got so mad at that she struck him blind. Zeus, however, compensated him with second sight and a lifetime spanning seven generations.

RIDICULOUS OF COURSE

Shere Hite and her shriller sisterhood of man-haters will ridicule this fable, of course, and point to it as the sort of thing you can expect from a man - yet their excess has the women's movement. Feminism, as was pointed out last week in the *Stanstead Journal*, has become an "f" word.

The National Action Committee on the Status of Women began in

1971 with 30 groups and now represents 3 million women and 543 organizations all over Canada yet still doesn't speak for them all. It is being pulled in all sorts of directions at once and threatens to fragment.

NOW, ABORTION IS A CLEAR CUT ISSUE

Abortion is one issue on which battle lines are clearly drawn and the conflict appears beyond compromise - something like Northern Ireland and Palestine. Tadeusz Letarte went out of his way to give me a warm welcome as the new editor of *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN* (see *Record* July 7) his vote of confidence was much appreciated, however his predictions of my early demise may prove to be only wishful thinking.

Mr. Letarte continues to expound the falsehood that only quasi-animal lovers can have any concern for the environment and the wildlife that lives there.

Strangely enough although, yes, I am a hunter and have regularly defended the rights of hunters, I too deplore the killing of songbirds and pointless slaughter of animals and birds. I too have been inconvenienced by hunters and would welcome major changes to the present hunting regulations.

However, unlike some who seem content to pay only lip service to their convictions I became a gun-safety instructor to help teach young people about safe gun handling. I have sat in cold cars for hours in my capacity as an Auxiliary Game Warden physically protecting wild animals. I have worked in my local land owner's association and founded

an alliance of associations to protect the rights of Township land owners and the animals and birds found on their land.

My mandate as editor of the *Townships Sun* is to report honestly, in an interesting manner, the concerns all of us have for the ecology, the English community and the history of the Townships. I certainly hope to raise uncomfortable questions for both hunters and non-hunters and not pre-judge any situation, unlike those who continually pre-judge me and put words into my mouth.

Things will definitely be interesting. Readers of my column in the *Record* (which I'm not abandoning) will agree I have always tried to treat every subject in a straightforward, logical manner without concerning myself too terribly much about those who might disagree.

John Oakley resembles the greatest radio jokers

MONTREAL (CP) — From "high atop the less-than-lavish Mercantile Tower overlooking lovely St-Laurent Boulevard," John Oakley returns to the days when comedy was the king of radio.

The fictitious tower is actually a ground-floor studio a stone's throw from Old Montreal where Oakley broadcasts talent as diverse as Bob Newhart, the Marx Brothers and Weird Al Yankovic in a fast-paced "coast to drift" radio show.

"It burns a lot of material," Oakley said of the weekly one-hour *Just for Laughs* Comedy Network.

"The idea of the show is to make it move."

An offspring of the *Just for Laughs* international comedy festival, running from July 13-23 in Montreal, the program recalls radio's Golden Age, spanning the 1930s to 1950s, when Jack Benny and Fibber McGee and Molly dominated the airwaves.

But while Oakley salutes comedy legends, he doesn't dwell in the past.

"The adage now is that comedy is the rock 'n' roll of the '90s and that's true to a large extent," said the amiable Oakley, who started in

talk radio 10 years ago in Toronto.

"It's probably supplanted rock in its original intent. It's sort of a rebellious thing, it's honest, it appeals to more than the mainstream. It really cuts to the quick."

The program, which was the brainchild of Andy Nulman, the comedy festival's English programming director, draws on tapes of performances at the festival, the organization's archives, interviews conducted by Oakley, and his own collection of about 500 comedy albums and tapes.

Factual inaccuracy & malicious intent

Editor:

The two legal requirements for proof of libel are factual inaccuracy and malicious intent. Tadeusz Letarte, meets both requirements with his remarks about my work for *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN* in the *TOWNSHIPS WEEK* of July 7.

First, when *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN* was sued for libel by the Conseil de la Sante et des Services sociaux de Richelieu, the issue was not "intemperate remarks by Merritt Clifton"; it was my refusal to disclose the identity of a confidential source to the CSSR administration. Only after I repeatedly refused to reveal my source, over a six-month period, was the suit filed, as a pressure tactic, in the last week that it could have been filed.

Second, *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN* did not lose. The suit was dropped without any finding of fault, and I never did reveal the identity of my source. *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN*'S only concession was to acknowledge that the article in question was published without prior discussion with the CSSR administration. My only concession was to give the CSSR some other information about the case, which by that time could no longer have led to my source and which they needed to correct the situation I had written about.

Third, *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN* was not "Almost crippled by legal fees." Every red cent spent on that case came out of my own pocket, inasmuch as I waived payment for my articles for the entire two years the case dragged

along. When I had waived an amount equal to the legal fees, I received a receipt for payment of same, which I believe I still have, signed by then-TOWNSHIP SUN editors John Boudreau, Jessica Perkins, and Linda Henderson (now Lake.) The cash flow problems the *TOWNSHIPS SUN* had then, it would have had, regardless of whether it was paying me or someone else. Both John and Linda are still in the community, and can so attest.

P.S. - It might also be worth mentioning, in recounting my work for *THE TOWNSHIPS SUN*, that my articles there received three national and provincial awards for investigative writing (1979, 1983, 1984.)

Canadians now have their own 'Quick Lick' stamps

As mentioned in the last article, Canada Post issued four .38 stamps in se-tenet form to commemorate the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the first photograph ever taken by a Canadian.

The unveiling of the stamps was a joint venture of Canada Post and Kodak Canada Inc. The event took place in the ball room of the Château Frontenac Hotel in Quebec City.

Quebec City was chosen in order to honour Jules Ernest Livernois, who is featured on one of the stamps. Livernois is considered to have been one of the most artistic photographers in Canada.

About three hundred and fifty invited guests from the media, philatelic associations, and the photographic industry were present for the ceremonies. Mr. André Ville-neuve, General Director, Quebec Division of Canada Post lauded the works of Livernois and introduced Jules-Ernest Livernois' two Grandsons Maurice and Victor who still carry on the family business.

Mr. Arthur Lamothe, a premiere Quebec film-maker, presented a film "Jules-Ernest Livernois Photographe". All three were presented with a souvenir package of the first day of issue. The three were also presented with mementos from Mr. Gilles Gaudet, Kodak Canada's Director of Operations, Eastern Region.

CANADA DAY STAMP

Although the stamps were in commemoration of photographers, they were also issued in celebration of Canada Day.

The second in the Masterpieces of Canadian Art series was issued on June 29. The fifty cent stamp designed by Montreal graphic designer Pierre Yves Pelletier, depicts a Ceremonial Frontlet.

MUSEUM OF CIVILISATION STAMP

The stamp was issued to commemorate the opening of the new Canadian Museum of Civilization building in Hull, Quebec.

Great care will have to be taken in handling this stamp. As in the first of the series, there is a two colour foil stamping which makes the stamp very easy to crease.

SELF-ADHESIVE FLAG STAMP

On June 30th, Canada Post issued yet another stamp. This is a thirty-eight cent definite depicting a Canadian flag that is self-

adhesive, available in a booklet form of twelve stamps only, with stamp costs forty-one and two thirds cents each. I suppose the three and two thirds cents is for the privilege of not having to use your own saliva to adhere the stamp to the envelope.

I was quite happy to hear that we were to have a definitive stamp depicting a Canadian flag. However, I certainly thought that something a little more conventional would be in order. The design of the stamp is actually very attractive. It shows a Canadian flag of vivid red and white on a background of a multi-green wooded hillside. There are no perforations. You simply peel them off and stick them to your parcels and letters. Canada Post has termed them as "Quick Sticks".

The United States experimented with this type of stamp a few Christmases ago. It didn't go over too well and they haven't issued any others since. I for one am hoping most Canadians will avoid using



these stamps if for nothing else but the additional cost.

CANADIAN POETS STAMP

July 7 will see Canada Post issue yet another two commemorative stamps honouring Canadian Poets Louis-Honoré Fréchette and Archibald Lampman.

The stamps come in se-tenet form and designed by René Milot. The perforation is 13 and there were 15,000,000 printed. The printing process is in six colour lithography.

Park Safari has lots of new attractions

Parc Safari way out in Hemmingford has a whole new look and program of activities to see and do as well.

This year there's a wild west show twice every day with cowboys and indians and all the trimmings. A new walking tour on elevated passageways has been added to see the cats and monkeys compound.

It used to be a bit tricky driving through the monkeys climbing all over the cars, while everyone sat steaming with windows closed as they travelled ever so slowly through the compound.

But now the walkways are designed to accommodate safely small children and wheelchairs, giving visitors a panoramic view that was not possible from a vehicle.

There is now also a carnival park where rides and games of chance abound. The rides come from the now defunct Belmont Park in Montreal and include some of the latest in thrills. Food and souvenir concessions also abound.

The driving trail is 6 kilometres long through reserves where open windows allow you to photograph and even touch the animals.

Because of the almost natural habitat the animals live in, this year there has been a tremendous increase in the animal population and visitors will be able to watch the antics of young fawn, baby cats and many others.

The children can also visit the petting farm, and a unique family water play area features a 200-meter-long tunnel, a waterfall,

fountains and sandy beaches and an outdoor theatre where comedy reigns every day until Sept. 4.

Admission is \$11.95 per person, children three and under get in for free and there's the special price of \$39.95 for four people or more packed into one car. The park is open daily from 10 to 5 until Sept. 4.

Bernice Sorge: undaunted artist of Dunham East

FARNHAM CORNERS — The gateway is barely visible. A smaller than usual black mailbox marks the driveway which is almost hidden by overhanging shrubbery. Because a vehicle must enter slowly, passengers and driver have time to notice the orange lillies and other flowers peeping through the undergrowth, a subtle clue to the personalities waiting for us just around a grassy curve.

There's an old farm building just ahead, and behind trees and bushes, a renovated farm house, the lines and style maintained while more modern comforts were added.

A dog greets us, and in spite of a sudden downpour, Bernice appears in the mist, wearing a motley assortment of rain gear and a welcoming smile.

The rain goes away, the sun bursts out and a new friend extends a warm handshake, willing to tell us some of her secrets of success.

Bernice Sorge can't remember when she started sculpting. "I was always forming things with my hands and only natural objects would do," she chuckled reminiscing about some of the bones and carcasses she picked up to incorporate in her work.

Sorge has a collection of animal skulls and various pieces of the same scattered about her studio both at home and at the old church.

"Old church"??

"That's right," this bubbly, enthusiastic promoter of the arts replies. "Actually my home is near Dunham. This church at Farnham Corners or Dunham-East, an old United Methodist, complete with a cemetery across the road, caught my eye several years ago."

The building, now 95 years old, was in a sorry state of almost complete collapse. "One wall was tilting inwards at a crazy angle and there were six inches of water on the floor, and no basement, just crumbling stone and mortar walls supporting the old building."

But Sorge fell in love with it. "I discovered the owner had moved away to Boston where he changed professions to become a developer rather than an artist. I had fallen completely in love with the church and was already dreaming up plans to turn the building into my very own studio."

But the owner wasn't selling. "I waited a couple of years when I really did discover a 'For Sale' sign out front. I phoned him and offered half his asking price and of course he refused."

But Sorge doesn't give up easily no matter how long it takes. Another two years passed, and by this time, the church was seriously threatening to fall down. "I called him again and discovered he was now asking the price I had offered first, so of course I offered less again... and, just when I had given up hope at last, he called to say I was the winner," she laughed.

This talented artist and sculptor donned work clothes, enlisted help

from every professional and amateur builder and carpenter she could find and unflinchingly shouldered the task of renovating the historic building, "while most folks judged me fit for the nut house or some equally restrictive place where these crazy whims of mine would go unnoticed."

Today the church houses Arts, Sutton School and a group of print-makers who have formed an association called *l'Estampille*. With government subsidies and lots of neighborly assistance, Sorge has successfully fixed the roof, dug out a basement, cemented and finished it — that's where Estampille is — installed plumbing and partially completed the actual church area upstairs where the arts classes are held.

At the same time, this mystical personality with endless energy has continued working in her home studio where her sculptures and paintings attest to her spiritual relationship with art itself.

"I sometimes look at a blank canvas and feel a desire to splash some color here and there. It's as though my spirit takes over and as time and effort go on, the image I have in my mind is sometimes quite different from the image you see on the canvas," she explained.

We stood in awe as Sorge placed one canvas after another on her easel. Several which she had prepared for an exhibition that finally

never happened are named *Network of Pearls*. Muted tones, ethereal human figures, gossamer

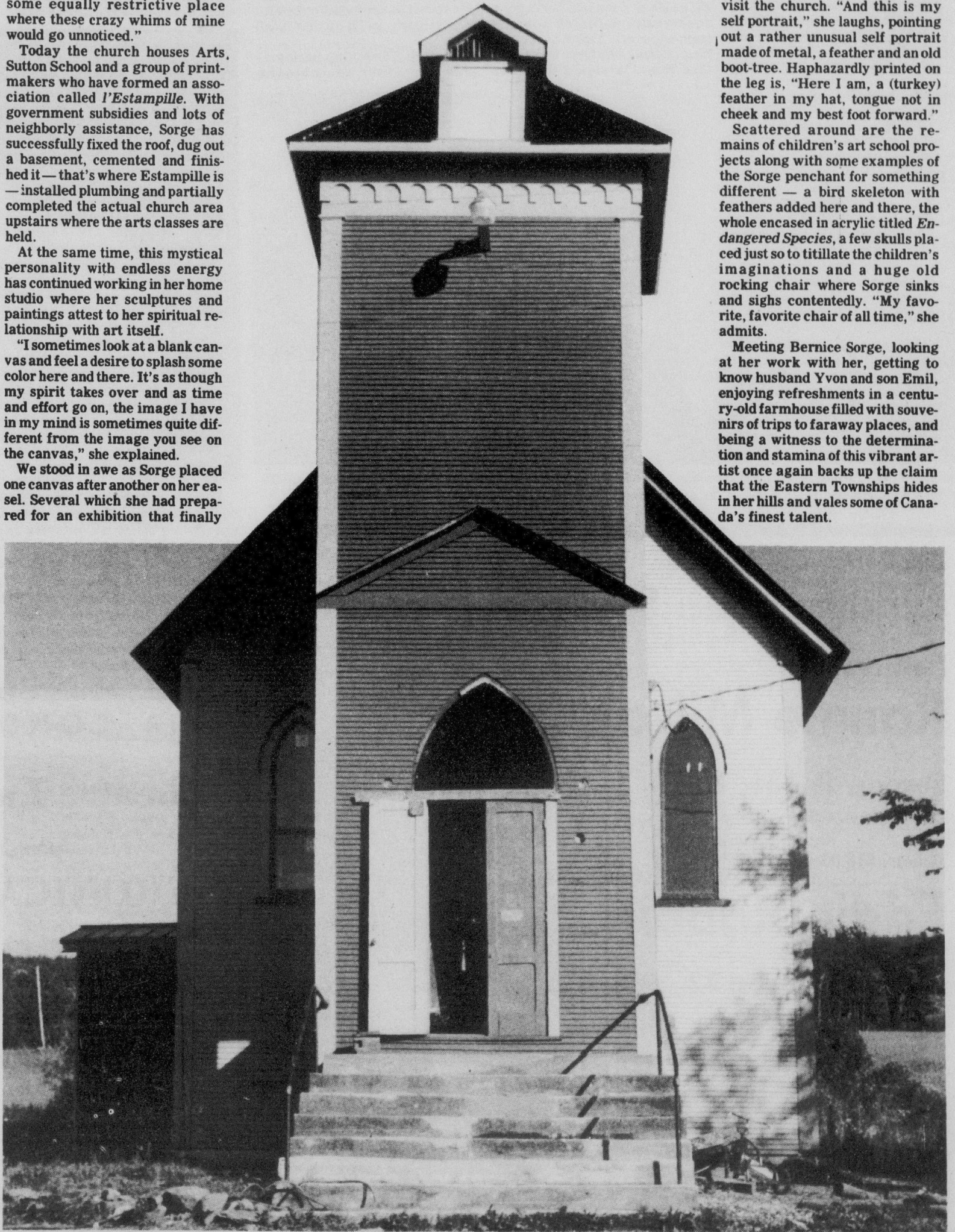
wings and pearls appear often in her work. "It reflects my interest in Buddhist philosophy and science

as well as being an homage to my mother, a passionate Syrian woman to whom I feel profoundly attached."

Then the Sorge mythical side changes to one of humour as we visit the church. "And this is my self portrait," she laughs, pointing out a rather unusual self portrait made of metal, a feather and an old boot-tree. Haphazardly printed on the leg is, "Here I am, a (turkey) feather in my hat, tongue not in cheek and my best foot forward."

Scattered around are the remains of children's art school projects along with some examples of the Sorge penchant for something different — a bird skeleton with feathers added here and there, the whole encased in acrylic titled *Endangered Species*, a few skulls placed just so to titillate the children's imaginations and a huge old rocking chair where Sorge sinks and sighs contentedly. "My favorite, favorite chair of all time," she admits.

Meeting Bernice Sorge, looking at her work with her, getting to know husband Yvon and son Emil, enjoying refreshments in a century-old farmhouse filled with souvenirs of trips to faraway places, and being a witness to the determination and stamina of this vibrant artist once again backs up the claim that the Eastern Townships hides in her hills and vales some of Canada's finest talent.

The Museum of Civilisation — a heritage showcase

Did you know the picture on the reverse of the Canadian \$1.00 is a view from the **Canadian Museum of Civilization** which officially opened its doors to the public at a gala, official opening ceremony recently?

Located on a 24 acre site in Hull, the 100,000 square metre building is designed in two distinct structures: The Canadian Shield Wing and the Glacier Wing. The CMC

mandate is to promote among all Canadians the advancement of intercultural understanding and make known the cultural legacy with special, but not exclusive, reference to Canada.

There's also a History Hall as well as space for a variety of other related exhibitions. There are many services offered: strollers, wheelchairs, audio-guide rental, etc.

the opening — not only getting a first hand view of the immense facility but spending sometime in company with renowned photographer Josef Karsh who was looking over a special corner dedicated to an exhibition of his work.

Plus. Seniors and Students (16 to 21) — \$3, \$4 and \$4. Children under 15 are free except for films and specials at \$4 and \$3. Thursday admission is free throughout the year. They are closed Mondays, open daily from 10 to 8.

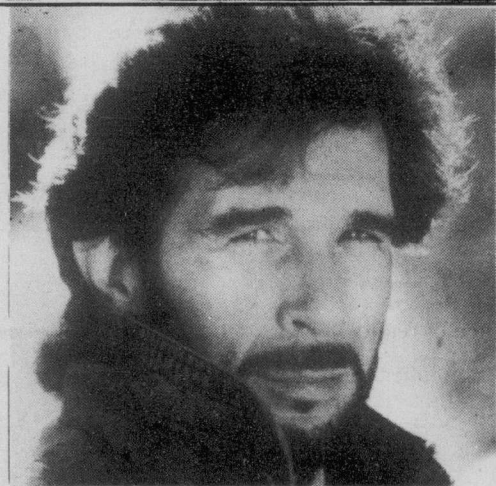

CONCERT REVIEW of
THE ROCK LEGENDS

It was billed as the gala concert that would feature the Rock Legends and simultaneously initiate the marvelous Skydome in Toronto into the leagues of stadium rock with a flourish. Six — count em — six of the legends of the early and middle days of rock and roll would assemble for one spectacular night of old style rocking on a Sunday evening in midsummer, only quitting in the wee hours of the morning of the following day.

Shades of Alan Freed's old style rock tours with the likes of the Everly Brothers, Buddy Holly, Fats Domino, Chuck Berry, the Drifters etc., this one would feature as headliner Jerry Lee Lewis, along with the Fatman from New Orleans, Antoine Domino, the baddest of them all, Chuck Berry, with help from Little Richard, Bo Diddley and Franki Valli & The Four Seasons. Quite a line-up.

Upwards of 35,000 eager fans thronged to Toronto's Skydome on Sunday July 9th, anticipating a memorable night of rock nostalgia. The disappointments began early and continued throughout the evening. Host for the evening, Rompin' Ronnie Hawkins, introduced the opening act, Bo Diddley, and the show immediately began to self-destruct. It was not so much the fact that Bo Diddley was not the performer that everyone had come to see, but that Bo managed to milk his one hit, the eponymous rock ditty with the telltale rhythmic riff, for almost an hour of excruciatingly boring rock ephemera.

With a guitar noticeably out of tune throughout most of his set, the amiable Bo also treated the audience to about five minutes of re-stringing, while the gigantic video-board (much more about this technological asset later!!) recorded his slow progress. Bo did not exactly get the night off to a rousing beginning.

After the first of four or five elongated delays while equipment changes were effected, the **Rock Legends** show soared up out of mediocrity with the best and least expected visual and aural delight of the extravaganza. Although he withdrew from the ranks of the rockers to pursue his religious calling along about the time the Beatles were sharing bills with him in England, Richard Penniman, the outrageous Little Richard, was an archetypal rock figure.

The word on Richard was that he would not be performing rock music on stage — ever — because it was decidedly the work of the devil and his faith could not reconcile the extreme ribaldry of rock with his new "calling". Well, score one up for rock, because the bounding, jeering, prancing Little Richard lit the Skydome up on the past Lord's Day with the kind of abandoned, raucous, shrieking rock and roll that so endeared him to Paul McCartney and the Beatles.

With a racing, pumping left hand

bass boogie that aficionados instantly recognized as the grinding vamp to the classic "Lucille", Richard revealed with his piano dexterity that those were never studio musician turns on his great records. Richard preened, shouted ("say ooh-mah soul! — shadduppp") and teased his audience as he worked through "Good Golly Miss Molly", "Long Tall Sally", "Tutti Frutti", "Rip It Up", and many other bona fide rock classics. Richard truly stole the show and deserved to be the closer to this aborted evening of rock and roll that he singlehandedly almost saved.

At this point Rompin' Ronnie and his latest Hawks took the stage to announce that "the Killer", Jerry Lee Lewis, had unfortunately suffered a minor heart attack and that the Hawks would be playing an entire set dedicated to the rocker from Ferriday, Louisiana. Whether the sympathy for Jerry Lee's recent medical horrors such as bleeding stomach ulcers and a Memphis hospital deathwatch shook this audience is hard to say — but there was nary a sign of displeasure from the crowd, or even a massive groan that might have been expected.

The Hawk played, to be followed by Franki Valli, whose Four Seasons appeared to be recent recruits hired only to serve as back-up to the reputed ego of the diminutive Vali. He worked through many of his solo "hits", and only managed to throw in a few of the Seasons tunes that were really what the audience appeared eager to hear.

With Jerry Lee a medical no-show it was left to the inimitable Chuck Berry to bail out this decidedly unlegendary show. Chuckie made a large tactical error when the busy Videoboard flashed the sign: "At Chuck Berry's request the videoboard will be turned off during his show". The booing almost lifted the dome off the magnificent facility as the hords of unwashed in the cheap seats were suddenly to be deprived of the visual evidence that indeed this would be Chuck Berry the original on stage, and not some imposter.

The boos grew louder as Berry took guitar to back and began to clear a duck-walk channel between the tangles of wires and cables. "Roll Over Beethoven" only served to heighten the booing, and oddly enough over half of the paid patrons scattered to the doors, most disgruntled and continuing their chorus of rude boos and catcalls. Berry appeared nonplussed, trotting out song after song, with none of the excited singalong activity that buoyed Richard's earlier triumph. Fighting a losing battle, Berry relented and had the videoboard lit up, but with only about

three tunes of his show remaining he had unfortunately lost half of the house and a great deal of rock respect.

Just when the audience felt that perhaps the little pianist from N'Orleans might bail out the final hour of this six hour long extravaganza, Hawkins announced that a "special guest" would be appearing — the innovator of the "twist", Chubby Checker. More than a few of the fifteen-odd thousand masochistic spectators were skeptical enough to wonder aloud, "where's Fats?", "Chubby isn't even on the bill, what's going on?" There was never a mention of the name Fats Domino anytime throughout the night's developments, although Little Richard did work about 16 bars of "Blueberry Hill" into his parade of hits, so he may have known something that the crowd did not.

Chubby rode the evening out in a feeble whimper of a set, managing to dissipate all of the energy flashed out by Little Richard, while the bewildered, deprived audience shared the stunned, silent stare of somebody who's been gang-raped.

The next day's reports that Jerry Lee and Fats had both been only mildly ill — which a day later changed to the news that Fats was experiencing "personal problems" — did nothing to dispel the bad flavour that this Skydome stroll down memory lane left on everyone's palate. The promoters of the evening's charade will have a tough time selling another such ticket in Hogtown, and those lined up to buy a Jerry Lee Lewis ducat for La Ronde in mid-August may well wonder whether they get to see the Killer or a reasonable facsimile.

MOVIE REVIEW

Great Balls of Fire (ORION PICTURES)

Call it a small piece of rock confectionary, a cute cartoon about what befell one of rock & roll's most explosive performers, but don't call Jim McBride's film about Jerry Lee Lewis any kind of an accurate portrait of the rocker known as "The Killer". With a peroxided Dennis Quaid (who also worked with McBride on *The Big Easy*) jumping around like an antic jack-in-the-box, mugging, indulging in countless head-shakes and cartoon-like gestures, the portrayal of Lewis lacks any semblance of reality.

Publications such as *Newsweek* claim that this is exactly what the movie's director was attempting to do, but the meticulous attention to the details of Lewis's late 1950's career might belie that analysis. What we get in the story of Jerry Lee's sudden surge into national

prominence in the fall of 1957, is the ambience of the Sun Records studios, with Sam Phillips, and his brother Judd, who later became a power with Mercury Records, vying over the talents of the mercurial Lewis.

Quaid's broadly slapstick portrayal of Lewis is so blatantly cartoonish that the audience expects him at any moment to cock his grinning puss and blurt out "thufferrin' thuckatash", rather than indite some insight into any of the film's strong musical numbers. Wynona Ryder, who plays Lewis's thirteen-year-old cousin Myra (whose autobiography fueled part of this script), is being seized upon as one light of interest in this rather simplistic movie about an obviously troubled and mysteriously southern rock performer.

An attempt is made to offer obvious parallels between the rock singer and his evangelist cousin Jimmy Swaggart, but this bit of timely promotional gimmick cash-in has lost the impact it might have had a few months ago. The screeching halt in Jerry Lee's meteoric rise in rock notoriety brought on by his attempt to tour stodgy Britain is well documented here with a pas-

ty-faced Peter Cook playing one of the notorious Fleet Street ink-stained wretches who dogged the "cradle-robbing" rocker's every English footstep.

Jerry Lee's rock career was indeed blunted by the bad press about his marriage to Myra (when he had been reportedly already married twice before, with some question about whether one of these unions was indeed legally still in effect!) but in this movie the lowest common denominator appears to be the lascivious nature of this rock rebel — forgetting that the rural south viewed 12- and 13-year-old girls as ready for marriage as was Romeo's underage Juliet.

If the movie resembles the *Beach Blanket Bingo* epics more than it does something as grittily real as *Sid & Nancy*, the Sex Pistols saga, it is McBride's fault for letting Quaid's exaggerated mannerisms replace any kind of accurate character portrayal. At least the one tune in which Quaid attempts to sing a duet with Jerry Lee justifies the pic's final decision to keep the actor's voice off the soundtrack and go with the Killer's remake of the classic rock songs.

Trying to describe a week-long visit to a country as thought provoking as Morocco is no easy task. First of all, you're hardly there long enough to even scratch the wealth of information the country offers or hope to demystify a people so steeped in their traditions and culture.

But we managed to digest quite a bit, apart from tasting camel, goat, North Atlantic fish, Moroccan chicken and other unidentifiable and delicious dishes. These quiet people are proud of their 'good cookin'. But, although some of the main ingredients may start looking like something we use, the final result is often quite different.

Cutlery is not very common outside the well-travelled tourist areas. Moroccans sit at low round tables, food is served in one main dish, bread comes in the form of a flattish, round cake and everyone uses three fingers and a thumb, cupped together to scoop up portions of food directly in front of them. If it's a roast or stewed meat, still in one piece, then you manage the best you can, tear off a chunk, add a pinch of salt from a side plate and let your fingers do the walking. Delicious!

COOK ALL DAY

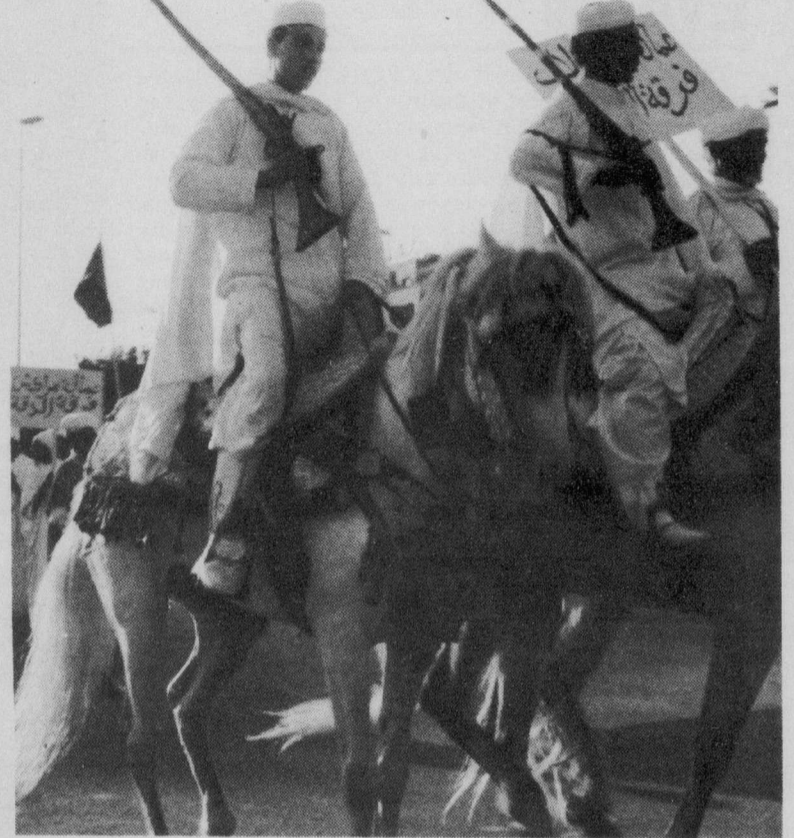
Traditional dishes cook all day or longer in huge clay cookers, tightly covered and buried in hot ashes. Favorite spices include lots of cumin, saffron, coriander and a wide range of herbs, so, let your imagination wander and picture the feasts they turn out.

A feast such as this is really only part of an evening. When Moroccans plan on company for dinner, there are many more traditions than just cooking. Sprinkling rose-water on one's guest is a time-honored tradition for example. Providing music and entertainment in the form of acrobats and dancers is another bonus of eating out.

The Tourist Bureau spoiled us all one evening with an outing at a place called the Chez Ali. About ten miles from Marakesh, through barren desert where the only thing moving was a solitary burro or the fronds of a tall palm, we finally approached a gateway where, from a distance we could already discern the outer walls and tent tops of our destination. Little did we realize the Arabian Night style of dining that awaited us.

FORTRESS

At the gate which resembled a fortress palisade pictured in children's story books stood mounted Arabs, carrying quaint, flintlock rifles, mounted on the dashing arabian horses. Every mount was resplendent in traditional costume, embroidered and sequined blanketed steeds, wearing the traditional

flat arabian saddle and bridles made of tooled and decorated leather with tassels completing a colorful picture.

As our bus proceeded along the drive, the horses led the way, coming to a stop in a courtyard where costumed men, women and children waited. Garbed in the white and blue desert robes of the region and wearing the decorated caps and veils that identify which tribe they belong to, dancers welcomed us, showered us with rose petals, beginning a series of tribal dances and music that continued as long as we were there.

We had hardly finished a delectable 'Cous Cous of Chicken' when the call sounded to join other guests outside the tent. It was Fantasia time.

A Fantasia in Morocco seems like a rather risky ritual to perform. But the Arabs, in quiet good humour, once more astride their horses have taken advantage of the color and excitement of re-enacting a battle to show visitors in condensed form what bloody battles and terrible struggles have taken place in their 2000 year history.

CAMELS AND BONFIRES

At Chez Ali they had an arena prepared complete with camels and bonfires. While the tribespeople danced, and riders gathered at one end, an announcer pre-

pared the audience for a sight to remember.

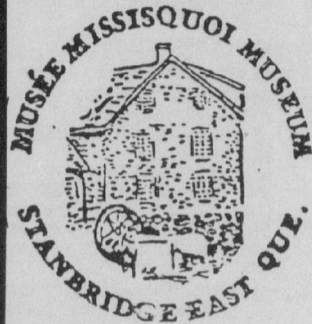
Spotlighted in center ring, a Moroccan dancer, at the sides the blazing campfires and thundering down the length of the walled space, at a full gallop, came the warriors, rifles in the air. At the last possible moment, they wheeled to stop, firing the rifles in the air and generally stirring up a tremendous cloud of dust and gunsmoke.

Morocco is filled with this kind of hospitality. Every outing is not only an adventure but these people never stop sharing and showing their traditions to visitors from what to them must seem another world.

Moroccans leave their homeland with great difficulty. Passports need sponsors from the country of their destination and even then, it takes up to three years before clearance comes through. The border between Algeria and Morocco is also closed to these people so that in a way, they are a different type of prisoner in their own country.

Perhaps that explains in part the joy and warmth that greets visitors. They have developed a healthy tourist industry that serves a dual purpose, visitors see and enjoy a charming land where fairy tale magic seems to be everywhere and Moroccans meet and learn about the cultures of other lands too.
